MK Nino Abesadze Chairperson, Lobby for Disabled Veterans of World War II. Before entering politics in 2009, MK Abesadze had a long career in journalism. In her native Georgia, she worked for Georgian State Television, where she eventually became the anchor of the evening news. Since making aliyah in 1996, she has held many positions in both print and broadcast journalism. She wrote for publications like *Novosti Nedely* and *Vesti*, contributed to Russian language programs on Channel 33, and reported on former Soviet Union immigration affairs for Channel 10 and Channel 1. She holds an MA in Literature and Russian Philology from Tbilisi State University.

Mr. Yossi Abu CEO, Delek Drilling. Prior to joining Delek, he served as a senior consultant for Israel's Minister of Finance, active in the development and reform of social, economic, and budgetary policies. He coordinated activities between the Finance Ministry and other government offices and the private sector on a wide variety of commercial and domestic issues. Since joining Delek Energy as Regulation Manager, he has, inter alia, managed the company's interface with government bodies and its LNG arm. Arad received a PhD in international relations from Princeton University

(1975), which he attended as a Fulbright Fellow. Prof. Arad's work in government and in academia covers Israeli foreign policy, intelligence, national security, strategic affairs and arms control, the Atlantic Community and Israel's relations with it, and energy security.

Holds a PhD in History from Moscow State University.

Hon. Robert B. Zoellick The 11th President of the World Bank Group since July 1, 2007. Prior to joining the Bank, Mr. Zoellick served as Vice Chairman, International of the Goldman Sachs Group. He served in the President's Cabinet as the 13th U.S. Trade Representative from 2001 to 2005 and as Deputy Secretary of State from 2005 to 2006. From 1985-1993, Mr. Zoellick served at the Treasury and State Departments, as well as briefly in the White House. He earned a JD Harvard Law School and an MPP from the Kennedy School of Government.

Dr. Oren Zuckerman Founder and Co-Director of the Media Innovation Lab (milab) at the Ofer School of Communications, Interdisciplinary Center Herzliya. His research areas include cross-platform interactive experiences, contextual media, and analysis of participation patterns in online and mobile communities.
