Goldspotted Sand Bass

Fun Facts:

- Goldspotted Sand Bass is named, aptly, due to the golden-orange spots covering its body and most fins.
- These fish typically dwell in and around rocky and coral reefs at depths between 100-500 feet and can be found from Cedros Island south along the west coast of Baja, through the Sea of Cortez, and along the coast of the mainland south to Guatemala.
- ✓ In Baja, goldspotted sand bass is harvested mainly from fishing coops based in villages on the Baja Penninsula. Working together, these fisherman still use the traditional methods of hand lines and low-impact hand-drawn nets from small, open panga boats.

Cooking:

- Goldspotted sand bass is often compared to grouper and is an excellent alternative to more expensive snappers and sea bass.
- ♂ These fish have a firm, moist texture that flakes larger than most small fish.
- ♂ These fish have a mild flavor and moderate fat content.
- ✓ Goldspotted sand bass can be prepared using many different applications but are particularly great to batter-fry. Its clean flavor also makes it a great choice for ceviche!
