Helminthotheca echioides (L.) Holub (Asteraceae)

General shape: Narrowly obovate with a slender stalk.

Normal size:

2.5-3.5 mm L x 0.4-1.0 mm W x 0.8 mm D

Color: Yellowish brown to dark brown.

Texture: Glossy with irregular, transverse ridges.


Distinguishing features: Broadest near the rounded apex, gradually tapers to a rounded base. Sometimes curved.

Transverse ridges are narrow and crowded at the base and become wider and deeper near the apex. Outer seeds may be enclosed in a hairy bract.

Embryo: Embryo with well-developed cotyledons and a broad stalk having a truncate top, no endosperm.
