Professor T. M. Luhrmann (Anthropology, Stanford University) recently wrote:



LIBRARY CORNER

With the most famous example being Stieg Larsson's series beginning with *The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo*, mysteries by foreign authors have been increasingly popular over the past several years, possibly because, in addition to the mystery, they offer readers a glimpse into the life of a different society. Now, with D.A. Mishani's *The Missing File*, Israel enters the fray.

A teenage boy has gone missing in a suburb of Tel Aviv, and, at first, Inspector Avraham (Avi) Avraham, is not too concerned. This may be a case of a simple runaway, and even if it isn't, most criminal activity on his path is relatively straightforward. As time goes by, however, and no clues whatsoever are found, it becomes clear that this is an unusual case. Things are complicated by the suspicious behavior of Ze'ev Avni, a neighbor of the boy's family who once tutored him in English, and who seems to know more than he is telling.

Told by alternating between the viewpoints of the detective and the tutor, the story slowly builds to a surprising solution, and then ends with yet another twist that even the detectives have missed.

Like many modern detectives, Mishani's detective is a thoughtful, serious type, with professional insecurities and a troubled personal life, which leaves much room for development in future books. He and Inspector Avraham Avraham are definitely worth watching.



The Road to a Successful Career is Always Under Construction

Just as our congregations Temple Beth Am and Temple Sinai, felt many endogenous and exogenous forces in the last few years, which resulted in the birth of this new and reenergized Congregation Shir Shalom. The health care industry, health care professional, and specifically myself were feeling seismic forces that required me to internally reflect on my career. Almost 25 years ago, after four years of college (UC Berkeley), four years of medical school, (UC San Francisco), seven years of general surgery and fetal surgery training (UC San Francisco), and two more years of pediatric surgical training (U of Washington), Drucy (Borowitz) and I moved our family to WNY, so both of us could specifically join the UB School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences faculty and the Children's Hospital of Buffalo staff. Ironically, even after all that training, I was naïve and unprepared to completely understand the business of medicine. So, with the incredible understanding of my wife and children (Zoey and Zack), I went back to get an MBA (Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University) in 2003, commuting to Chicago every other weekend for two years. Just as my medical training changed the way I think, so did my MBA experience. This knowledge base, skill set, greater than 35 years of clinical practice, and almost 24 years of teaching and research (Professor, UB School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences) allows me to level the playing field in the evolving landscape of health care and health care policy. All of us are in the second of a five year roll-out of the Affordable Care Act (ObamaCare), and medicine will never be the same. But, my patients, my trainees and I will be optimally equipped to face these changes, and to continue to provide high-quality care in a responsible and sustainable manner.

And, then the phone rang. In the late summer of 2012, the UB VP of Health Affairs (Michael Cain) and the Dean of the UB School of Management (Arjang Assad) asked Associate Dean for the UB School of Management (Katherine Gerstle-Ferguson) and me to better prepare all of our Health Care Schools' (University at Buffalo Academic Health Center) (Medicine, Nursing, Dental Medicine, Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences, Public Health and Health Professions, and Basic Science PhD candidates) students, trainees, faculty, and working health care professionals in financial and business literacy and health care policy. After analyzing the status and the skill sets that will be necessary for their successful careers, I am co-championing a multifaceted set of new initiatives. Beginning immediately, we are offering Health Care School students, residents, faculty, and working healthcare professionals the opportunity to get a dual degree (adding an MBA with a concentration in Health Care Management and/or focused course work in leadership, informatics and entrepreneurship, MBA - New York - Dual Degree Programs - UB School of Management) or special non certificate programs in financial literacy, health care policy, and or interprofessional education. In most cases, this MBA can be obtained in ~ one year of full-time class work, ~ two years of weekend classes, or three to five years of part time night classes. These efforts fit seamlessly in the Realizing UB2020 initiative, which includes: 1) Seeking excellence for students and stakeholders; 2) think as one institution across units and disciplines; 3) enable innovative "out of the box" thinking; 4) be inclusive of every willing voice; 5) reach beyond building strength to problem-solve important societal and economic problems; 6) enhance diversity of our students, partners and friends; 7) be the best community partner in the Western New York region and in the city of Buffalo, as a distinctive national public research university and; 8) develop implementable plans that are achievable and deliverable (Realizing UB 2020 - UB 2020: University at Buffalo's strategic plan). These new responsibilities have been invigorating and quite challenging.


