

Extreme weather events affecting Portugal



ccording to a study by the European Environment Agency (EEA), extreme weather events, which are expected to increase in the coming years as a result of climate change, have cost 142,000 lives and almost €510 billion in Europe over the past 40 vears.

These extreme events include

meteorological events, such as storms, hydrological events, such as floods, or climatological, such as heat waves, cold waves and droughts, and in Portugal they also have a significant impact. In a list of 32 European countries analysed, Portugal ranks 5th in terms of premature deaths with 9,267 human losses in that period. On the other hand, extreme

Portugal is one of the European countries most affected in the last 40 years by extreme weather events in terms of premature deaths and economic losses.

climatic events over the last four decades have cost the country €13.4 billion, placing Portugal in 7th place in economic losses, with only €478 million in losses covered by insurance (in this indicator, the country occupies 16th place).

High cost

The environmental association Zero, which highlights this data in a statement, expressed concern over the conclusions, warning of the high costs of climate change. "This data shows that Portugal is one of the countries most affected by the damages associated with extreme weather events associated with climate change or even climate change already underway," the association points out. The AEA report also shows that between 1980 and 2020, climate

change represented on average costs of between €25 and €37.50 per person per year, and that Portugal is one of the countries where the economic impact on GDP is more pronounced, representing 1.5 percent to 2.5 percent between 2005 and 2014. With losses between €100,000 and €200,000 per square kilometre, it is also among the countries with the highest values in this indicator and, on the other hand, with less damage coverage by extreme weather event insurance (less than 5 percent of the value of the damage).

In view of this data, Zero considers it essential to ensure funding for the implementation of climate change adaptation measures and to call for the adhesion to insurance that covers extreme weather events.

Lisbon

The north

Travel to Portugal now easier



The presentation of a mandatory negative test to enter Portugal has now ended, bringing hope to the tourism sector.

ow, to enter the country, "only the presentation of the Covid Digital Certificate of the European Union in its three modalities or other duly recognised proof of vaccination is now required", according to the office of the Minister of the Presidency.

The Council of Ministers also approved changes regarding the Covid digital certificate and adjustments to proof of vaccination to be presented for access to certain establishments.

Now, the digital certificate requires that rapid antigen tests be performed within the previous 24 hours, instead of the 48-hour deadline, and in the case of a molecular nucleic acid amplification test (TAAN), the deadline is 72 hours.

To enter Portugal by land or sea as well as the need to present the certificate or proof of a negative test must also be accompanied by a passenger locator form. Regarding vaccination, the Covid-19 digital certificate now attests to the completion of the primary vaccination programme for more than 14 days and less than 270 days since the last dose,

or the booster dose. The rules regarding the recovery certificate remain unchanged.

Welcome news

The end of the obligation to present a negative test for Covid-19 on arrival in Portugal is "very positive" and has led to a "significant" increase in demand for the Algarve region.

The president of the Association of Hotels and Tourist Enterprises of the Algarve (AHETA), Hélder Martins, told Lusa that this upward trend has been confirmed in areas such as meetings, congresses and golf, but acknowledged that it is too early to quantify the increase.

"For our part, we see it as very positive and it is one of several measures that will have to appear. It is a sign, first, that the pandemic is losing ground and that we are able to resume our freedoms and, on the other hand, for a tourist destination like the Algarve, it is extremely important that tourists have the fewest possible barriers for entry into the destination", he said. According to the new president of AHETA, despite the low season, "the indicators that exist for the coming period are positive", because "demand has grown". He added that he hopes that the lifting of restrictions will continue and "that this will bring the stability that the Algarve needs to continue the recovery of a destination that has been so affected in the last two years" by the restrictive measures applied to travel and entry into the country due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Hélder Martins said that "an increase in demand is already being noticed"and "a greater interest on the part of tourists and operators".

Optimistic

The news of the lifting of restrictions has also been welcomed in Lisbon. The Tourism Entity of the Lisbon Region is optimistic and confident in the sector's recovery with the easing of restrictions adopted because of the pandemic.

Speaking to Lusa, the president of the Regional Tourism Entity of the Lisbon Region, Victor Costa, considered that the measure that facilitates the entry

of passengers by air into Portugal, "is quite important" and will "contribute to entering a phase of tourism recovery", but noted that, after two years "of a very hard pandemic", there is still "a long and difficult phase" to go through. "Our view is that this measure is quite positive. In fact, over this two-year period we noticed that whenever there is a relief from restrictive measures, there is a positive response from demand", he stated.

Victor Costa considered that

First Burger King in Lagoa



The council has given green light to the project, which will be concluded this year.



t's official. Lagoa, in the Algarve, will have it's first fast food restaurant. The works started a month ago in Rua dos Vales, Lagoa, on one side of the N125 road behind the playground.

The establishment will definitely be a Burger King,

definitely be a Burger King, according to Restaurants Brands Iberia, the Spanish company that owns this Burger King. The company also told **The Portugal News** that the burger restaurant will open this year. The new Burger King will create 25 jobs (which may increase over the summer) and might attract more

young people to the county. "It's a kind of space that young people usually choose to go in to. At the moment, many people from Lagoa have to leave the municipality to consume this type of food and now they will have this offer within the municipality, which is much better for all of us", the Mayor of Lagoa, Luís Encarnação told 'The Portugal News.

Additionally, "it is an anchor investment that can be beneficial for small and large companies in the county. It will not directly compete with what is being done in our local businesses. In fact, people who pass along the

N125 road will stop to eat and perhaps visit other spaces in the city, which can boost the county's economy", he added.

Business owners' views

The Portugal News sought to find out what small restaurant owners think of the opening of this new fast food restaurant in Lagoa. Mónica Teodoro, owner of Dona Ana Restaurante, agrees with the mayor about the point that the new Burger King will attract more young people to the municipality. "People who live in Lagoa and consume

this kind of food consume it anyway, but in other municipalities. With the new restaurant they will start spending money in Lagoa", she said.

In addition, she believes that she won't lose her clients. "We should think positive. Everyone needs to earn money and that fast food restaurant will develop the county and attract more people," she added. On the other hand, Marcia Sousa, co-owner of Lagoa Sol Cafe, didn't seem happy with the idea of having a Burger King on her doorstep. "This is a big fast food chain, we can't compete with them," she said

In her establishment, she works mainly with customers who work or live nearby, but also with children from the school, which is just a few metres away. In Marcia's opinion, adults will keep going there because they tend to prefer a healthier meal, such as soup. However, she is worried that the kids will start to opt for the burger restaurant and won't stop at her snack-bar.

Fast Food near schools

The new Burger King will be located just 800 metres from the Jacinto Correia 2nd and 3rd Cycle School. However, the mayor guaranteed that all legal requirements are

being me

the principle of the Espamol Group of Schools, which includes Jacinto Correia, said that "it doesn't make sense to forbid children to eat this type of food if they go with their parents to these restaurants after school hours," she said. From her point of view, it's not about banning, but about educating, giving them the tools to make good decisions. In this sense, the school has been doing a great effort to reinforce nutritional education among students. However, this is not enough. Parents also need to help in this process.

In addition, Emília Vicente,

"At school we play our role. We develop several food education programmes, but if we don't have support from families on these topics, it's not worth it", she said.

The first, but not the last

This is the first fast food restaurant in the entire county. "There was already a smaller one, but in an unauthorised space and that ended up closing, - we weren't in the chamber yet but with this dimension and properly allowed, this will be the first one", said the mayor. However, it won't be the last. According to Luís Encarnação, this was the first request with the new Municipal Master Plan (PDM) in force. "A previous request was made, which was not allowed due to the limitation of the previous PDM, but now the new PDM allows us to go further", he explained, adding that there are new projects in pipeline for other areas of the municipality, but without giving details.

Foreigners boosting luxury property market

The pandemic and teleworking have helped to whet the appetite of foreigners looking to settle in Portugal and the demand for high quality houses is helping to boost the already buoyant sector.



he increasingly accentuated imbalance between the new supply and demand for housing in central Lisbon, together with the growing trend towards the acquisition of ready-to-live-in properties, is boosting the resale housing market in the premium segment.

According to international consultancy Athena Advisers, the demand for this type of product began to intensify after the lockdown, when international buyers "not only were able to return to the Portuguese market, but they did so in strength and were willing to accelerate the purchase of housing, establishing

themselves in Portugal as quickly as possible", says Marta Salgado, responsible for resale and leasing at Athena Advisers. These buyers, who according to the sales made by the consultant in 2021 are essentially American, French and British, want "practically new or renovated houses, often with significant improvements and updates compared to the initial project, well located and in about 50 percent of cases already furnished. Basically, they are looking for turnkey housing, ready to be inhabited overnight without having to invest or worry about remodelling", explains Marta Salgado.

Scarcity

The offer of houses for resale with these characteristics is very scarce, especially in the more traditional areas of Lisbon and which tend to be more sought after by foreign families, such as Lapa, Estrela, Santos and Príncipe Real. According to Marta Salgado "this shortage is even more evident in apartments with typologies above T3, as they are also the ones that best meet the requirements of these families". In addition to these more traditional neighbourhoods, there are others that stand out in this type

of demand, such as Marvila and Beato, where currently there is also a lack of product. The prices of these houses are in line with the general market: between €350,000 and €500,000 for T1; €500,000 and €800,000 for T2; from €1,000,000 for T3 and higher typologies. Athena Advisers believes that the offer of this type of products in Greater Lisbon will tend to grow, especially in the city centre in neighbourhoods that, due to their characteristics, are highly sought

"For a few years now, Lisbon, and Portugal in general, has been a destination of choice for foreigners to reside and buy a home, and with the arrival of the pandemic and teleworking, it has become even more desirable. As such, there are many owners who see a business opportunity here", comments Marta Salgado.

According to SEF, in 2020 the country witnessed an increase in the resident foreign population for the fifth consecutive year and, even in a pandemic year, the number of residents increased by 12.2 percent compared to 2019, with 71,747 new foreign residents arriving in the country.

Property 50% more expensive than in 2016

House prices rose most in the Porto Metropolitan Area and in the northern region of the country, INE data shows.

Houses in Portugal are almost 50 percent more expensive than they were five years ago, with the median price of housing reaching 1,250 euros/m2, taking into account the 12-month period ending in September 2021, the highest value since

records by the National Statistics Institute (INE) began.

The most recent data from the INE proves that houses in Portugal are becoming increasingly more expensive. The median value of family accommodation in Portugal increased by 2.6

percent compared to the previous quarter and 7.8 percent compared to the same quarter of the previous year. And going back to the third quarter of 2016 - the year in which this statistical series from the INE began, the increase is much more

expressive: the median house price jumped by around 46 percent.

This is the result of the average price increase of around 1.9 percent per quarter. Now, buying a house of 100 square metres (m2) in Portugal can cost €125,000,

while five years ago its value would have been much lower: €85,500.

Biggest price hikes

The price increases have been seen across the country but it is in the Porto Metropolitan Area and in

the northern region of the country that the most significant increases were seen in the country – 65 percent and 55 percent, respectively. Next is the Algarve (+50 percent) and the Lisbon Metropolitan Area (+49 percent).



Negative impact of Brexit on Portugal

Economy Minister Pedro Siza Vieira has acknowledged that Brexit had a negative economic and political impact on Portugal, in an interview published by The Times.



Brexit had an adverse impact (...) for Portugal, Brexit was not good news", he said, stating that "some exports were very negatively affected".

Although he admits that it is difficult to quantify the economic damage

caused by Brexit because the pandemic also had consequences, the minister said that exports from Portugal to the United Kingdom were harmed, namely automotive and textile components. According to the Association of Manufacturers for the Automotive

Industry (AFIA), in the period between January and November 2021, exports to the United Kingdom fell by 49.9 percent compared to the same period in 2019, the period before the pandemic.

The newspaper cites statistics for 2021 that show that while Portugal's exports to the European Union (EU) increased by 1.3 percent, to the United Kingdom they fell by more than 15 percent. The value of goods imported from the UK dropped by 56 percent, compared with a 10.3 percent drop for the remaining 26 member countries. "The UK is one of our main trading partners, one of our main investment partners", stressed Siza Vieira. The two countries celebrate the 650th anniversary of the Luso-British Alliance this year, the oldest diplomatic alliance in the world, which was first formalised with the signing of the Treaty of Tagilde on July 10, 1372.

Portugal petrol 8th most expensive

The price of petrol increased by 1.7 percent in Portugal in the fourth quarter of 2021, compared to the previous quarter, placing the country in eighth position among the European Union Member States with the highest prices.

According to the Regulatory Authority's price bulletin of Energy Services (ERSE), the price with taxes of 95 gasoline in the last quarter of last year was €1.7 per litre, higher than in Spain and also compared to the European average. However, "Portugal practiced a lower average sales price without taxes than in Spain", but "the tax burden applied in Portugal (57 percent) justified the lower price competitiveness in the context of the Iberian Peninsula", explains the regulator.

The scenario is the same when looking at the prices of simple diesel, which were €1.52 per litre. "The tax burden in Portugal justified the practice of prices 25 cent/l higher than in Spain. Excluding taxes, average national prices are 1.3 cents/l lower than those in the neighbouring country," ERSE notes again.

"Portugal is in the tenth position of the countries that sell expensive simple diesel in the EU-27, with the price charged corresponding to a difference of 32 cent/l and 35 cent/l compared to the country with the lowest prices and the country with the highest prices, respectively", adds the regulator.

Lack of trust has helped fuel the Covid-19 pandemic

Low levels of government and social trust, as well as higher levels of government corruption, are strongly correlated to higher Covid-19 infection rates around the world.



ccording to a new peer-reviewed study published today in The Lancet, other indicators, including pandemic preparedness indices, democracy, income inequality, universal health care, and hospital capacity, failed to show a significant relationship with Covid-19 infection rates or infection-fatality rates. Covid-19 has been called an "epidemiological mystery," with

mortality rates higher in many wealthy countries with greater health-care resources than in poor nations, and deaths varying dramatically, even among countries within close geographical proximity.

A matter of trust

The study of 177 countries, conducted by a team of researchers from the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation (IHME) at the University of Washington School of Medicine and the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR), found that the wide variation between countries in Covid-19 infection rates cannot be explained by many often-cited factors in politics (e.g., democracy and populism), state capacity (e.g., government effectiveness), health care (e.g., hospital beds or universal health coverage), or social factors (e.g., economic inequality or trust in science). The findings suggest that if all societies had trust in government at least as high as Denmark, which is in the 75th percentile, the world would have experienced 13 percent fewer infections. If social trust (trust in other people) reached the same level, the effect would be even larger: 40 percent fewer infections globally. "Many of the factors that influence Covid-19 outcomes, such as seasonality, age structure, and population density, are out of the hands of decision-makers," said Director of CFR's Global Health Program Thomas J. Bollyky, a lead author of the study.

"Trust is an area where governments can move the needle, and the fact

that it outweighs traditional measures of health-care capacity and pandemic preparedness should be a wakeup call for all of us as we face the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic and the threat of future disease outbreaks." High levels of government and social trust as well as lower government corruption were all associated with higher vaccine coverage. Lower levels of government corruption were associated with reductions in mobility during the pandemic, suggesting greater compliance with social distancing rules.

Promoting better health

The findings also suggest that promoting better health, such as reducing body mass index and lowering smoking rates, may help prevent illnesses and deaths during future pandemics.

The researchers analysed a dozen pandemic preparedness indices, seven health-care capacity indicators, and ten additional demographic, social, and political conditions, and adjusted for many known biological drivers of infection like age and seasonal effects. A high ranking on

the leading health system capacity and pandemic preparedness measures has not only been insufficient for success in this pandemic, but it also has been unnecessary. Countries like the Philippines and the Dominican Republic, which rank relatively low on pandemic preparedness and health-care access and quality, maintained low rates of infections and deaths throughout the study period, while other nations with higher rankings, including the United States and France, faced much worse outcomes for both infections and fatalities. "Trust can be fostered by governments during a crisis," said Erin Hulland, a researcher at IHME and co-first author of the study. "Clear risk communication and community engagement strategies have worked to build trust during other disease outbreaks, even in post-conflict West

African countries during the Ebola

Fines for failing to fill in a passenger location form

Failure to comply with the obligation to present a passenger locator form from passengers who are entering Portugal, will now constitute as an administrative offense for airlines and passengers.

In a joint statement, the ministries of Economy and Digital Transition, Internal Administration, Health and Infrastructure and Housing state that the passenger location form (PLF) must be completed by all passengers on flights to or from mainland Portugal, including passengers on flights from the Autonomous Regions of the Azores and Madeira.

According to the Government, the PLF must be filled out

electronically after checking in and before boarding time.


"Failure to comply with the obligations to submit and verify the completion of the PLF constitutes an administrative offence, sanctioned with a fine that can vary between €20,000 and €40,000, when practiced by the airlines or the entities responsible for the management of the respective airports or between €300 - €800 when practiced by passen-

gers", says the statement.

The executive also emphasises that the completion and presentation of the PLF by all passengers allows the health authorities, "with full respect for the personal data protection regime, to carry out the tracing of contacts regarding confirmed cases of Covid-19, and to interrupt possible chains of transmission".

A hot and dry January

January was the fifth hottest month since 2000, with the highest maximum temperature in the past 90 years being recorded during the month.



ccording to the Portuguese Institute of the Sea and Atmosphere (IPMA), the average air temperature stood at 9.5 °C last month, the fifth highest value since 2000.

The daily values of maximum temperature were almost always higher than the average monthly value, with emphasis on the periods between the 1st and 3rd and 27th and 31st of January, in which deviations of more than 4 °C were recorded.

On the other hand, since 1931, there has not been a January with an average maximum temperature so high, as it reached 15.29°C, some 2.20°C more than the normal value recorded in the period 1971-2000.

The average minimum air temperature was 4.02°C, lower than normal (minus 0.52°C) and, according to the IPMA, despite having started with values above the average, it was almost always lower from the 13th, with emphasis on the

period from January 17th to 26th.

As for precipitation, last month was the sixth driest in 90 years and the second worst since 2000, surpassed only by January 2005.

The IPMA report adds that the average amount of precipitation was much lower than normally recorded between 1971 and 2000, corresponding to only 12 percent. "There was a very significant worsening of the meteorological drought situation, with an increase in area and intensity, with the entire territory in drought at the end of the month with 1 percent in mild drought, 54 percent in moderate drought, 34 percent in severe drought and 11 percent in extreme drought", says the institute. Regarding the percentage of water in the soil, there was a significant decrease compared to the end of December, and the IPMA highlights values below 20 percent in the Northeast and South regions.

Lynxes thriving in Portugal

About 200 Iberian lynxes are currently living in the wild in the Guadiana Valley, Alentejo and Algarve, after the birth of 70 cubs in 2021, 10 more than the previous year.

In a statement sent to Lusa, the Institute for the Conservation of Nature and Forests (ICNF) states that the "2021 monitoring of the population of Iberian lynx reintroduced in the Guadiana Valley reveals that there are 70 new cubs out of a total of 24 breeding

This is "10 more births and six more breeding females" compared to 2020, stresses the ICNF, admitting that these numbers can still be "revised upwards, given the vast area now occupied by the species".

"Seven years after the start of the reintroduction process, around 200 lynxes are now spread over a vast territory".



Putting Ilha Graciosa on the map

Ilha Graciosa has been classified by Unesco as a Biosphere Reserve.

lha Graciosa is one of the nine islands that make up part of the Azores Archipelago. The island is 64km² and is home to 4,200 inhabitants. The president of the parish of Vila da Praia da Graciosa, Manuel José da Silva Ramos told **The Portugal News** about the various customs of the island as well as future projects.

Vila da Praia da Graciosa has plenty of traditional customs such as a "philharmonic band, folklore groups and the natural talent of the inhabitants for musical arts," said Manuel Ramos, who also mentioned that it is usual to hear "during summer afternoons" people playing the piano in their houses. The president of Vila da Praia da Graciosa also highlights that the habitants are "proud of their traditions" and try to keep them alive.

Development

Manuel José da Silva Ramos started his mandate in 2013, being elected again after every new election until the current day. The president wanted to embrace a project that would enhance the "economic, social and cultural fields." The first two works were aimed to serve the population of the

> parish. First, there was free beach furniture placed at the beach, such as umbrellas and sun loungers as well as leisure equipment for the bathers to use. The other "important project" led by the parish was the "total makeover of the Parque de Campismo do Pinheiro." After the works, the camping park, according to Manuel Ramos, became a place of "excellence" where direct contact with nature will greet

every visitor.
The president of Vila

Assembly, the deputy has
already presented "various
proposals" to enhance the
development of his island.



To get to Ilha Graciosa there are "daily air connections with Lisbon", however, travellers may wait a few hours at one of the "lay overs" in São Miguel or Terceira, depending on the time of the year of the flight. This only happens because the Ilha Graciosa airport does not have the capacity for bigger aeroplanes to land or take off. Still concerning the transport and the connection between the island and continental Portugal, Manuel Ramos mentions that "there is still a lot to do", to facilitate the connections, especially reducing the waiting times and making the prices more affordable.

When arriving on the island, visitors may choose between "pedestrian trails, boat trips, a visit to the caves, diving, direct contact with the island culture and gastronomy" as well as beach areas with warm water "in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean." All in a place that was classified by Unesco as a



Biosphere Reserve. Manuel Ramos believes that Ilha Graciosa has great touristic and economic potential, however, "it has not been exploited much." On the island eight million litres of milk are produced per year and the fishing activity with gains above a million euros every year. Ilha Graciosa also produces wine and garlic, which according to Manuel Ramos both have "expanding potential." The traditional sweets may also

be a feature when it comes to expanding the visibility of the island. The Queijadas da Graciosa are a sure delight to everyone that tastes them. For now, the president of Vila da Praia da Graciosa intends to "continue the projects initiated in 2013." Enhancing the potential of the parish and investing in touristic promotion, as well as to start a "digital transition" next to the population by offering training in using new technologies, which are "a

fundamental tool to combat the geographical isolation.' Manuel Ramos told **The** Portugal News that Ilha Graciosa "deserves better promotion", especially in the touristic sector. It was also stated by the president that it is necessary "to sell in bigger quantities" the products of the island, while it is also needed to "find markets that value the products" that will make this little paradise in the middle of the Atlantic" more well known.

The most expensive and cheapest places to buy a house

Buying a house in Portugal is becoming increasingly expensive, especially in large urban centres, idealista/news has put together the 10 Portuguese municipalities that are the most and least expensive places to buy a house.



he most recent data from the National Statistics Institute (INE) shows that: "Taking as a reference the sales made during the 12 months between October 2020 and September 2021, the median price of family accommodation in Portugal was €1,250 m², increasing 2.6 percent".

Of the 306 municipalities with data collected by INE, 49 registered median house prices above the national value. And they are mostly located in the Algarve (14 out of 16 municipalities) and the Lisbon Metropolitan Area (16 out of 18), adds the institute. Note that the municipalities of Corvo and Santa Cruz das Flores are excluded from this analysis, as they do not have accounted data.

The counties with the most expensive houses are...

Analysing the 10 municipalities with the highest median house prices, it is clear

that the three most expensive are located in the district of Lisbon: the municipality of the Portuguese capital itself is the most expensive of all (3,427 euros/m²), followed by Cascais (2,971 euros/m²) and Oeiras (2,536 euros/m²).

There are a total of four municipalities in the district of Lisbon in this top 10. What is also observed in this analysis is that five belong to the district of Faro. In other words, the Algarve is dominating the top 10 of the most expensive municipalities to buy a house, contrary to what was verified in the analysis carried out by INE between July 2020 and June 2021 (12 months), in which the municipalities of Lisbon had greater weight.

In the North of Portugal, the municipality of Porto leads the way and is isolated in this area, where the median price of houses reached 2,264 euros/m². And it remains fifth highest in the country.

The cheapest places are...

The cheapest houses to buy are mainly located in the interior of the country: there are three municipalities that belong to the district of Guarda, another three to Bragança and one to Castelo Branco. Further to the Centre we find a municipality in Viseu and to the North another in Vila Real. The cheapest place to buy a house in Portugal is in the municipality of Fornos de Algodres, in Guarda, where the median price in the period under analysis did not exceed 169 euros/m². Following this is the municipality of Sernancelhe, in Viseu, where buying a house costs 190 euros/m2. These are the only municipalities in the country where the price per m² is less than 200 euros.



Golden visas bring Madeira €60 million

The investment gained through golden visas in Madeira was €60 million between 2017 and 2021, mainly in the real estate sector, and corresponds to 50 residence permits.

Economy, Rui Barreto, stressing
that the outlook from the real
estate agents is of "confidence"
and "growth".

The secretary of state, who was speaking at the opening of a seminar on gold visas in Funchal, believes that the recent changes in the Residence Permit for Investment (ARI) programme, which exclude Lisbon and Porto, are an "enormous opportunity" for Madeira.

The citizens who have made purchases over €500,000 in the autonomous region since 2017, under the ARI, are mostly Russians and Americans, with Brazilians, Chinese, South Africans and Bolivians also registered.

"We are talking about investments in the luxury residential area, but the Regional Government is also concerned about the supply in the real estate market for residents and people who have low income," said Rui Barreto, admitting that golden visas inflate the price of houses.

The Secretary of Economy pointed out that the Recovery and Resilience Plan (RRP) for Madeira provides €136 million for housing construction at controlled prices and for rental support.

According to data from the Foreigners and Borders Service (SEF) released in January, investment gained through golden visas increased 52

percent nationally in December, compared to the same period in 2020, to €42.1 million. In December 2020, the investment amounted to €27.7 million

Compared to November 2021 (€46.6 million), the amount raised through the Residence Permit for Investment programme fell by 9.6 percent. In cumulative terms, investment by golden visas fell 28.7 percent last year, compared to 2020, to €460.8 million.

Since the ARI granting programme was launched in October 2012, €6.099,799,479.59 has been

raised via this instrument. Of this amount, most corresponds to the purchase of real estate, which totalled €5,507,194,225.00 until December, and the acquisition for urban rehabilitation amounted to €362,502,992.45. In over nine years, 9,585 visas have been granted for the purchase of property, of which 1,009 are for urban regeneration. There were 649 visas granted for capital transfers and 20 for job creation.

Since the beginning of the programme 17,221 residence permits have been granted to regrouped families, of which 1,171 were in 2021.

easyJet announces new Porto routes

Low-cost airline easyJet has announced that it will base two more aircraft at Porto airport, which will enable it to open three new routes to Porto Santo, Madrid and Cologne, boost capacity by 350,000 seats and creating 70 direct jobs.

With this reinforcement, the company increases its fleet in Portugal to a total of 15 aircraft based (five in Lisbon, six in Porto and four in Faro) and

jobs to more than 520 people, of which 214 are based in Porto, said the director general of easyJet for Portugal, José Lopes, at a press conference.

In addition to the 15 aircraft based in the country, the low-cost airline also has an additional capacity of 16 aircraft not based in Portugal (five in Lisbon, four in Porto, six in Faro and one in Funchal).

Fines for MEO, NOS and Vodafone

The Autoridade Nacional de Comunicações (Anacom) has imposed fines of €1.5 million on MEO (Altice Portugal), NOS and Vodafone for improperly cutting services last year.



n a statement, Anacom points out that, in 2021, "it imposed fines in the global amount of €1.5 million to MEO, NOS and Vodafone, for non-compliance with the rules laid down in the Electronic Communications Law applicable to the suspension and termination

of services for lack of payment of invoices". MEO's fine, of €712,000, "was imposed in December 2021, for the practice of 104 offences", Anacom adds, referring that "in addition to the violations of the rules applicable to the suspension and termination of services provided for non-payment

of invoices, in 2015 and 2016, Meo also illegally suspended services due to high consumption".

MEO, from Altice Portugal, filed an appeal to challenge Anacom's decision with the Court of Competition, Regulation and Supervision (TCRS), adds the regulator. In the case of Vodafone,

the regulator decided "to impose a fine in the amount of €425,000" due to the "practice of 58 offences, for violations of the rules applicable to the suspension and termination of services provided for non-payment of invoices, in 2013, 2014 and 2015".

NOS "was sanctioned with a fine of €369,000, for the practice of 54 offences, in question is the violation of the same rules, in 2015 and 2016", details the regulator led by João Cadete de Matos.

"NOS and Vodafone appealed against Anacom's decision to the TCRS", he adds.

Anacom points out that, "in the infringement proceedings brought against MEO, NOS and Vodafone, the infringements found were related to the abrupt suspension of subscriber services, as they were not notified of the respective notice; with the nonmandatory suspension of services; and with the failure to terminate the contract after non-compliance with one of the instalments of the payment agreement concluded with consumers".

Protecting users

The rules on the suspension and termination of the services provided "aim to protect users of the essential public service of electronic communications and to promote the timely fulfilment of contracts concluded with consumers, avoiding indebtedness and, thus, increasing the use of

judicial means for recovery of the respective credit". The regulator stresses that, "given the importance of the protected interests and the situation of economic fragility in which many subscribers find themselves, Anacom will continue to pay special attention to this issue, especially after the repeal of the exceptional measures defined within the scope of the pandemic - currently in effect until 31.03.2022".

These exceptional measures prohibit operators from suspending the provision of services due to lack of payment when this is motivated by situations of unemployment, a drop in household income equal to or greater than 20% or by infection by Covid-19.

CGT and a Portuguese Swing Greene Nominee Company: Create, Transform, Liquidate Part 1 of 2

Property purchased a decade or two ago is often liable to substantial Capital Gains assessment at today's market prices. There are numerous reasons for this trend. First and foremost is the obvious fact that property prices have risen far ahead of inflation over the years. In addition, since capital improvements can only be deducted in the 12 years prior to sale, many renovations have, in effect, "expired" and no longer count in the calculation of CGT. A second element comes in changes in reporting practices. Twenty years ago, it was common to understate selling prices to reduce the impact of the then existing property transfer tax, "SISA", which was levied at the rate of 10%.

Another factor was the failure of professionals in the building trades to issue correct invoices; often no VAT was paid nor income reported on annual tax declarations. While these components typically reflected pervasive forms of tax evasion that were common at the time, tougher enforcement today has reduced substantially these once common fiscal abuses.

Whatever the reason, the reality today is much the same: if you purchased your property years ago, you are likely to be in line for a considerable Capital Gains Tax. If you are lucky enough to have a modest rateable evaluation ("VPT" - Valor Patrimonial Tributável), the creation, transformation and liquidation of a Portuguese Nominee Company may prove to be a viable solution to mitigate your Capital Gains tax liability.

Example

Suzanne and Chris bought a ruin in the hills

of the Algarve in 1989 for 10,000,000.\$ escudos (today's equivalent of ±€ 50,000). In those days, few builders readily produced proper invoices. The couple was focused on the refurbishment project, not on preparing for the eventual sale. In short, there was no documentation to support many of the construction expenses.

Last year, they put the property on the market for €350,000 and were fortunate to find a buyer. They realised that they would be faced with CGT of over €50,000. The purchasers were also coming to grips with considerable taxation on their acquisition: over €20,000 between Property Transfer Tax ("IMT") property and Stamp Duty on the deed.

Buyers and Sellers quickly agreed to use a Portuguese Nominee Company to their mutual benefit. First, a simple form of Company ("SABP" - Simples Administração de Bens Próprios) with no share value was created to buy the property at "VPT", thereby keeping taxation to a minimum.

Next, the Company was transformed into its final structure ("sob forma comercial") with a share value of €350,000, based on a formal appraisal of its newly acquired asset. These shares were then sold to the buyers for the same price of €350,000. With no transfer of the property – only Company shares changing hands – the final transaction suffered no Capital Gains Tax.

Moving to Portugal post Brexit - visa options for UK nationals



Whether you are 'for' or 'against', Brexit has had a wide-ranging impact on our daily lives.

major consequence has been to the rights of British nationals to move freely around Europe to travel, live and work; especially so for those with holiday homes who now find themselves limited to 90 days in every 180.

To be clear, if you are an EU citizen, you have the right to freedom of movement and can therefore come and go as you please. So, what are the options for those Brits lucky enough to be able to commit to a permanent move to Portugal? You will have to apply for a visa.

Portugal has made it fairly easy to qualify for a visa by offering several options, obviously wanting to continue to attract foreigners to boost investment in the country. The most common are the Golden Visa (residency by investment) and the D7 visa (residency by passive

Both visas allow non-EU/EEA or Swiss citizens and their families to live, study and work in Portugal

and ultimately apply for permanent residence or Portuguese citizenship. They also allow access to the Portuguese healthcare and education system, as well as free access to the Schengen area, and are a gateway into the advantageous Non-Habitual Residence (NHR) tax scheme. The key difference between the two programmes comes down to one of cost versus flexibility.

Validity

The Golden Visa (GV) is initially valid for 2 years. This can be renewed, and the renewal permits are valid for 3 years. After 5 years, you can apply for permanent residency or citizenship, or you can continue to renew the GV every 3 years. Your family can also obtain permits and the same benefits. The D7 visa is valid for a stay of 4 months. After this, you apply for a D7 residence permit that will allow a stay of up to 2 years and this can be renewed for a further 3 years. After 5 years you can apply for

permanent residence or citizenship. Your family can also obtain permits and the same benefits, assuming minimum criteria are met.

Minimum financial commitment

The GV has one of the lowest 'residency by investment' thresholds in Europe. There are many investment options, but the most commonly used is investment in real estate of at least €500,000. Changes at the start of 2022 restricted the location of the property purchase to low-density areas, excluding metropolitan and coastal areas such as Lisbon, Porto and much of the Algarye. The D7 visa only requires the applicant to prove a minimum level of income equal to the Portuguese minimum wage. This can be in the form of dividends, rent, interest or pensions. If they are also supporting family, an additional 50% for a spouse and 30% for each child is required.



Minimum stay & tax dimension

The GV has a short minimum stay period in Portugal of only 7 days in the first year and 14 days in subsequent years. This is ideal for those who might not wish to trigger tax residency.

The D7 has a minimum stay of 6 months, therefore triggering tax residency.

If tax residency is triggered, you can apply for the NHR scheme which can result in substantial tax savings.

Cost of applications

Excluding 3rd party fees, the $\ensuremath{\mathsf{GV}}$ is approximately €5,900 for the main applicant and €5,400 per

additional family member. Renewal is approximately €2,668 per person. The D7 fees are much lower at approximately €255 per applicant and family member. Renewal is approximately €165 per applicant and family member.

BPI bank cuts jobs and closes branches

BPI reduced, in net terms, the number of employees by 144 last year, bringing it to 4,478, and cut 76 points in the distribution network, including 63 in the branch network, announced the president bank executive.

In a press conference, João Pedro Oliveira e Costa indicated that at the end of 2021 the bank had 4,478 employees (144 less in net terms compared to December 2020), with the distribution network totalling 349 commercial units, a reduction of 76, of which 63 were in the branch network. eight in 'premier' centres and five in corporate and institutional centres.

According to the bank's president, of this set of workers' departures, 139 were through early retirements and voluntary terminations.

"Recurring structural costs remained almost unchanged (+0.4 percent), reflecting: the 2.9 percent drop in personnel costs and general administrative expenses; and the

What do rising interest rates mean for UK savers?

Financial news sites are full of speculation for the past couple of weeks about the possibility of central bank interest rate rises.





ith the US Federal Reserve announcing plans for interest rate increases in 2022 and the Bank of England (BOE) Monetary Policy Committee voting 8:1 in favour of a 15 base point increase before Christmas, investors might be wondering what's in store for deposits in the coming months.

What do we know so far?

In the UK, base rates have been between 0.1% and 1% for over 12 years. This unusually lengthy period of very low rates has resulted in a market where money is cheap to borrow and high street bank deposits have paid such minimal interest that savings are reducing in real terms due to rising inflation. The rate of inflation has risen to a 30-year high in the past couple of months, the BOE is under pressure to further increase rates to keep inflation

Cost of living increases in the UK are putting the average resident under financial strain as global energy costs rocket and items such as everyday shopping, furniture and clothing also fuel the rise in inflation.

What might happen in the UK next week?

Financial analysts expect inflationary pressures to continue through Q2 2022, probably peaking in April or May and believe that the target of 2% will not be achieved until sometime in 2023. As a result, Reuters predicts that Britain's central bank will add another 0.25% to bring the interest rate to 0.5% when it meets in early February.

What does that mean for personal finances?

When interest rates rise, the immediate impact is felt by those who are borrowing money. BOE sets the base rate at which it will loan money to other financial institutions and those banks and building societies need to factor in their margin, which is usually 0.5-2%. This means the cost of borrowing on mortgages and other credit is increased, usually at the same rate as the BOE base rate increase. The impact for borrowers on standard variable rate products often comes within a few days of the announcement. For an average homeowner in the UK with a £140,000 mortgage, the 0.15% increased their monthly mortgage payment by around £15. With another hike likely in February, this could further increase monthly outgoings by an additional £25. For savers, the picture is reversed but it is not uncommon for banks and building societies to be slow to pass on interest rate rises to their deposit account holders - this is another way for them to make more

money. Since the rate rise in mid-December, only a handful of banks have passed on any of the rise to savers. This is because they have plenty of cheap money from the BOE and are in no hurry to attract new deposit savers. It seems likely that if the expected 0.25% interest rate rise is announced in February, that savers could see a modest increase in the interest on deposit accounts. The best rates are found on regular savings accounts. These are accounts where you have limited ability to withdraw, and you must commit to making a minimum deposit every month. The rates are usually fixed for just one year. Currently the best product available pays 5%interest, so with inflation running at 5.4%, even this account isn't protecting the real terms value of savers money. More flexible savings accounts pay between 0.7-2% but often require notice to withdraw.

10% of the global population owns cryptocurrency

According to data acquired by Finbold, about 10.2 percent of the global population using the internet owns some form of cryptocurrency (as per a survey carried out in Q3, 2021 and published on January 26, 2022).

Thailand accounts for the highest share at 20.1 percent, followed by Nigeria at 19.4 percent, a similar percentage to Philippine users. South Africa ranks fourth at 19.4 percent, followed by Turkey at 18.6 percent in the

Other countries in the top ten category that recorded a significant share of crypto owners include Argentina (18.5 percent), Indonesia (16.4 percent), Brazil (16.1 percent), Singapore (15.6 percent), South Korea (13.4 percent), and Malaysia (13.2 percent).

United States users ranked in the 14th spot with a share of 12.7 percent, while Russia ranked last at 2 percent among the surveyed countries.

Elsewhere, the ownership is more contracted among individuals aged between 25-34 years, with males accounting for 15.5 percent while the female share stands at 9.5 percent. Internet users aged 16-24 years saw males account for 13.3 percent, while female owners stood at 6.4 percent.

In general, most crypto ownership is centred among individuals aged between 16-44 years.

The ownership figures follow an increase in cryptocurrency penetration, with different assets being utilised for various roles. According to the research report: "The increased adoption has resulted in cryptocurrencies becoming part of people's daily lives, replacing some of the roles played by the traditional monetary systems. For instance, the cryptocurrency sector offers services like lending and emerging as alternatives to conventional finance aspects like paying salaries.'

Timex Portugal, Clive Sinclair and Maggie Thatcher



he American watch company, which operated a modern assembly plant 15 miles south of Lisbon, employed about 2,000 people, mostly women and teenage girls. The Timex watch was a famous brand producing low-cost wrist watches. Established in 1854 as the Waterbury Clock Company. In 1901 they brought out their first pocket watch, it sold for one dollar. Mark Twain bought two. These days you can get a TIMEX watch from Amazon in Europe for less than €50. Timex produces pieces for volume brands in Asia while its luxury division manufactures in Switzerland. So what were they doing in Portugal and what went wrong? The factory was opened by the then President Almirante Américo Tomás in March 1970, initially with 400 workers. Timex were attracted to pre revolution Portugal as they saw political stability (i.e. a dictatorship) and cheap labour. As a wholly owned subsidiary of Timex America, they started assembling mechanical watches, but the evolution of digital watches

The revolution changed everything

changed everything. Digital watch production

was switched mainly to the Far East where

labour was cheap.

In May 1974, following the revolution, Timex announced plans for the dismissal of 668 workers, reduction of the workweek to three days and the closing of the factory for two weeks starting immediately. The Timex workers took over the factory in protest about low wages and what they said were poor working conditions and long hours. This was known as 'saneamento', workers in many industries evicted their bosses and took over running the company. The Timex workers continued making and selling watches. Their demands for a forty hour week instead of the forty five hour week they worked were refused by the management and the workers continued to occupy the factory for a month.

The strike and factory takeover caused considerable publicity at the time, not least to the high-profile name Timex and the large workforce. The company suspended regular bus transport to the factory. The workers —mostly women and teenage girls — came in buses and cars lent by the Lisbon Shipyard and other companies, or hitchhiked.

General Antonio de Spinola, who assumed the presidency of Portugal after the military coup, was one of the people involved in resolving these strikes that were going on throughout Portugal. It was reported that Military 'armtwisting' was also used to end a month-long walkout at the Timex plant.

"It wasn't me or Microsoft who created the cultural change allowing the computer to go home. It was Sinclair and Timex". Bill Gates. What became obvious was that a new product was needed now that mechanical watches had little or no demand. This is where Clive

Sinclair and the Spectrum ZX computer came into the picture. The Spectrum computer was a hot seller. Micro computers were new and everybody wanted one.

Sinclair had a large factory in Dundee but demand outstripped supply and there was a waiting list of several months, so Sinclair looked to Portugal and the Timex factory in Portugal. Labour was still relatively cheap and the Timex factory had excellent facilities and the work force were highly skilled. It was a natural fit.

What went wrong?

Sinclair Scotland had tied up supply to Europe, (except Poland), but America wanted these new miracle home machines. Portugal was the answer. As with many new 'inventions', the microcomputer or 'home computer' came with more than a few problems. The machine would become famous for the games that entertained a whole generation of pioneers. Problem number one was that it came with only 48k of RAM. This was later increased to 72k. Problem number two was that the only way to load the software was by a cassette tape, very slow and unreliable. The Portuguese engineers were up to resolving many of these problems and started to develop their own 3" floppy disk. These machines were in no way capable of any business applications, games were about its limit.

The T/S 1000 was introduced in July 1982, with Timex Sinclair touting it as the first home computer to cost under \$100 in the U.S. market. In spite of the flaws in the early versions, 550,000 units were sold by the end of the year. The Portuguese factory was turning out over 5,000 units a day.

Then companies like IBM, Atari and Commodore came onto the market. They could see a good idea and had the resources and marketing power to take it to the next stage. Sinclair's clever 'invention' was soon overshadowed by the new players who could see the future of computers for the mass market. It's interesting to note that Clive Sinclair was a great inventor, he also invented the first pocket calculator and even the electric 'three wheel car', the Sinclair C5. His ZX Spectrum computers brought affordable personal computing to the masses and sold in their millions across the world until the big manufacturers spotted the potential of the microcomputer. None of his inventions lasted very long, others copied and improved.

The Maggie Thatcher connection

What follows is a rumour that has been kept 'under wraps', it can't be definitely confirmed. It is rumoured that in 1991 Margaret Thatcher came to Portugal to meet with then Prime Minister Cavaco Silva. People close to the Timex Portugal operation claim that Maggie convinced Cavaco Silva to transfer all the technology and expertise that Timex Portugal

Timex Portugal was one of the first casualties of the revolution, but strangely, although they started making watches in Portugal, they then switched to making computers through until the late 80's.



had developed to the Sinclair factory in Scotland. This was to save the jobs in Dundee, but jobs were lost in Portugal, though according to some reports some workers at the Portuguese factory returned to making watches for some time.

The remaining stocks of the ZX Spectrum were sent to Argentina. How did Maggie achieve this, maybe she 'hand bagged' Cavaco Silva into losing a lot of jobs and expertise from Portugal. Scotland's gain was

he duo has lived in the beautiful Algarve for 15 years and are born entertainers, they are looking to get back at playing more shows post Covid-19 and would love your consideration next time you are planning an event. Collar&Cuffs have a varied

repertoire that they perform live with no backing track, meaning they can adapt the performance to fit the audience at the time. "We never do the same show twice so it is a unique experience" whereby they bring audiences great popular music from the 60's and 70's including

the Old Farts present: NTAGE VARIET possibly the best music and laughter show ...ever Rock n Roll, Country, Ballroom, Swing, Ballads, Reggae and Latin. They mostly cover big hits from a particular artist; some of the songs that Nigel covers are by Jerry Lee Lewis, Neil Sedaka, Buddy Holly and Elvis Presley and Sarah covers Dusty Springfield who is one of her favourite singers and Bonnie Tyler who is a favourite amongst the Portuguese audiences, humorously adding "maybe one day I'll meet her here in the Algarve but it hasn't happened yet", as well as The Carpenters, Connie Francis.

Musical history

Nigel became a musician when he was just eleven years old, "my dad was a drummer in an army dance band and after he always had small three or four-piece bands and when I became old enough, I joined them and I taught myself piano", proudly saying "I got my first payment at eleven years old." Sarah then told me "He has now been doing music longer than Cliff Richard and any of The Rolling Stones", further affirming that Nigel "lives and breathes his music and is very passionate about what he does and to have done it this long".

Creating Collar&Cuffs

Towards the end of playing in the UK, Sarah got involved and became part of Collar&Cuffs. Sarah explained that "I was in the choir at school but singing was never my thing, it wasn't until Nigel and I got together that I started helping him and coming along to gigs. He then asked me to sing one song with him and when you get great feedback from the audience, it keeps you going" with Nigel adding "Sarah comes alive when she gets out on stage and that she is definitely a performer". Nigel also said "We did a few New Year's eves at Vivenda Miranda Hotel in Lagos which was a great place to work and we have done Christmas dinner dances for Afpop and Charity fundraisers for the children's home in Lagos as well as the local firemen." Nigel also played piano with the New Orleans Jazz Band at The Tivoli Hotel in Lagos They also told me that they

organise a show here in the Algarve which includes a music quiz which they have done previously to raise money for a charity, which

they do at a restaurant with a meal, followed by a quiz then live music for dancing or singing-a-long to. For example, you would need to guess the name of the song from the intro or instrumental break from original tracks.

Looking to the future

The famous TIC-TAC UFO





engagement Senior Chief Kevin Day had been seeing the weird radar contacts for the previous two weeks.



t first, he thought it was the new radar that they were using. The SPY-1 radar was the newest state-of-the-art Naval radar in the US inventory. The contacts were traveling almost five miles in less than a second? That was MACH 30?! And they were stopping? It had to be a mistake with the system.

Gary Voorhis, the officer in charge of the radar system on the Princeton, decided to take the radar offline and recalibrate it. He got approval from the ships Captain to take it off line. When they turned the radar back on after checking it in all modes they still saw the contacts. And now they were even clearer! It was November 2004. Kevin and Gary were aboard the Princeton guided missile cruiser, one of the US Navy's most technologically advanced ships designed to defend Carrier Group 11 from air and space attacks. Their carrier group was spinning up for a deployment to the middle east. According to a 2019 study published by the Scientific Coalition for UAP studies

(SCU), Estimating Flight Characteristics of Anomalous Unidentified Aerial Vehicles, the Ballistic Missile Defense radar tracked the contacts in low earth orbit. The Princeton radar then

picked up the contacts at 80,000 feet north of their carrier group, near San Clemente Island off the coast of San Diego.

The unknown contacts arrived 10-20 in a group at 80,000 feet (above 60,000 feet is considered astronaut qualification), and then they would drop down to 28,000 feet and track south at a speed of about 100 knots. "Periodically, the UAPs would drop from 28,000 feet to sea level, or under the surface, in 0.78 seconds," said the report.

Something was there

Crewmen from the Princeton and the Nimitz were able to confirm with binoculars something matched the locations of the contacts. Something was there. "We were able to see them through binoculars. And that confirmed for me it was an object...something was there," Gary Voorhis said.

For two weeks the radar operators wondered about the contacts. They talked on the ship about what they could be. They watched them from the top decks, tracked them on the radar.

But then the fighters arrived to start their training. And now, the contacts were in the same training airspace as the fighters. Senior Chief Day convinced the Princeton's Captain to ask the first fighters to check out the contacts.

On 14 November 2004, Commander Fravor was leading out a two-ship of F-18 Superhornets. He was a Top Gun graduate and had recently taken command of his first fighter squadron, a major achievement for any fighter pilot. He was preparing the squadron for war and it was a beautiful clear day to fly. All his years of combat and high-intensity training at Top Gun didn't prepare him for this particular mission.

When his two-ship entered the training airspace, the radar controllers asked if he had any live weapons. That was an interesting question he thought. No, it was a

training mission and he didn't have any live weapons. The controller gave Fravor a vector towards the nearest contact. Fravor pointed his twoship towards the heading and started searching for the target. "Off the nose 20 miles," the controller called out. They were closing quickly on the position and looking in their radars. "15 miles to merge....10 miles, 5 miles..." All pilots were looking outside now frantically. It could be at any altitude "Merge plot!" the controller said.

White water

Fravor noticed a 75-metre area of white water far below them on the otherwise clear blue sea.

"It almost looked like a breakwater. About the size of a 737. I thought at first it was a crash. Then I saw it." Fravor said on the Fridman podcast. He saw a clear white object about the size of a fighter, moving east and west, and north and south in quick movements. "Ahh, it's a helicopter, I thought," Fravor said. "Except it wasn't a helicopter. It didn't move with inertia, it just bounced around."

After 2-3 minutes of watching the object, Fravor decided to go down for a closer look. He left his wingman up high at 20,000 feet while he started a slow spiral descent down. At 15,000' Fravor noticed the object stop its search pattern and point right at him. The object then executed an impossible maneuver. From a standstill it climbed without effort up to his altitude in seconds. Something a modern fighter could never do. Fravor then flew across the circle (imagine going around opposite sides on a large merry-go-round) less than 800 metres from the object. He was close enough to clearly see no signs of wings or propulsion. What he saw was just a slick white cylinder, about the size of a fighter, "it looked exactly like a white Tic-Tac candy."

Fravor moved in to get a closer look. As he closed onto the craft it accelerated so fast it disappeared. LCDR Slaight from the

backseat of the plane above said it accelerated "like a bullet," and was gone. All four aviators looked back down at the water and the break water was gone. They were alone over the clear blue sea. Flabbergasted, the Fravor led the jets back to their combat air patrol (CAP) point and

accomplished their training mission. On the way home the controller said, "you're not gonna believe me Sir but that thing is back at your CAP." "What?" Fravor thought. "How did it know where our CAP was?"

When Fravor landed he quickly talked with the weapon's system officer of the next fighter launching, Chad Underwood. Chad launched towards that CAP point and recorded the famous "FLIR1" video of the Tic-Tac UAP. The visual engagement was corroborated by four trained observers with decades of experience. It was a crystal clear day with unlimited visibility. The contacts were confirmed by radar, video, and visual. For this reason, the Nimitz encounter is the most authentic and corroborated modern UAP case. Standby next week for what happened during Underwood's intercept of the Tic-Tac.





ally has been a "full- time resident for the last two years but I have actually been visiting the Algarve since 1980's and I bought my first property here in 1989. I have got a long association with the Algarve and I absolutely love it. My business there, is boutique Hotel Quinta

Iacinta between Vale de Lobo and Quinta do Lago which I will go back to in the summer after having met the challenge I have set myself."

Sponsored walk

Sally sadly lost her brother, Andy, to MND four years ago and she is on this journey due to the loss

of her brother. "For many years I have travelled back and forth to the Algarve, mainly thanks to the numerous available flights, although sometimes by car. I have always enjoyed driving through Portugal, Spain and France and it was this that gave me the idea of fund raising by a sponsored walk from the beaches in Portugal to Salisbury, where I was born and my brother

"The last 18 months of life was awful for both himself and his family. Since then, too many friends and acquaintances have told me about family members or friends that have been affected by MND and the sadness of this particular disease." Sally is hoping her walk will raise awareness and will fundraise for very much needed research into the disease. For those who may not know, "MND affects the nerves called motor neurones in the brain and spinal cord which gradually stop reaching the muscles and can affect adults of any age, but is most likely to affect people over 50. MND is lifeshortening and there is currently no cure."

"It was not a disease I knew a lot about but I have to say it was pretty devastating when someone is diagnosed with an illness which is essentially terminal and there is no

"When we first heard the news, I actually spent a lot of time researching what work has been done globally and whether there were alternative treatments or cure and the answer was no. I then made a silent promise to him that at some stage I would do what I could to raise awareness of MND and raise funds for research to prevent others having to suffer as my brother did and to hopefully see a cure found for MND. The UK Government has recently promised 50 million pounds to this end so let's hope all the work that is being done will provide the solution we seek."

The start of the journey

Initially, in late November 2019, Sally set off on a six month walk of around 2,100 kilometres "in the hopes that in some small way I can contribute to raising much needed funds for research into potential cures for MND. Whilst planning my trip, I was in contact with the MND association in the UK who are an excellent organization but, in the end, have opted for fund raising through the "My Name's Doddie Foundation".' George "Doddie" Weir is a Scottish former rugby union player who made 61 international appearances for the Scotland national team. "Since being diagnosed himself with MND, he set up a Charitable Foundation and has already raised over £1million. I like the idea of supporting a small organisation where one can be assured the money raised will go to research projects with the minimum spent on administration." family and brother lived so After starting the walk they are hoping "to have an evening song to finish the walk, in memory of her brother and all who have MND.

The great railway journey



A trip down memory train - happy days are made of this.

ast week I returned to a beach that I haven't been to for many years and that I have extremely fond memories of visiting with the whole family when I was little. It's called Praia do Barril but we always called it 'the little train' beach. There's just something about going there that feels like an adventure. Maybe it's the fact that you can't just 'step on' and you have to embark on what feels, even now, like an epic journey or quest - before you can even get one foot in the sand.

Cross the bridge when you come to it

First, you have to cross the bridge. I remember feeling a bit like Indiana Jones in the Temple of Doom on this bit. Luckily, there was never any need to go 'full-Indy' (cutting the ropes with a machete and hanging on for dear life) and anyway, these days it's a lot more sturdy and modern - even Harrison Ford at his most frantic wouldn't be able to make it budge. But it's still a lot of fun. And the thing you might not realise is that once you get to the other side - you are officially on Ilha de Tavira (so this might be the perfect way to try out island life if you don't like boat

Catch the train

Originally created to support the tuna fishermen, the tracks are now used to run this almost magical little train that ships tourists back and forth to the beach. The journey is a bit more than a kilometre and takes about 10 minutes.

I remember that my cousins and I would eagerly hop aboard with my granny and grandpa, meanwhile, I could never understand why, but my parents and aunts and uncles would absolutely insist on walking.

A walk for the senses

Having grown considerably longer legs since then (and so the journey



seems a lot shorter these days) their decision to walk doesn't seem so crazy or boring anymore. It's a lovely walk past the marshes and through the forest with all kinds of things to see, hear and smell. There are all sorts of interesting fragrances in the air. For instance, there's a plant called Perpétua das areias (Helichrysum stoechas) that during the summer months has yellow flowers and smells like curry.

Wave at the crabs

You also get to study the many interesting inhabitants of the marsh. At low tide you are sure to spot, scuttling sideways away into its mud hole, an unusual crab called the bocas-da-cava terra. You know the ones? The male has one massive claw (there's actually a great metal statue of one at a roundabout on the way into Faro beach). My grandpa always used to say that if you stay very still they will come out and wave at you.

All kinds of wonderful Algarvian avifauna spend their days wading around there too - so no wonder the crabs never venture too far away from their holes. Our beloved Algarvian chameleon also lives here (although good luck

The sea-side of the island

spotting him).

The sand I had forgotten is remarkably soft and white and with the sea being generally quite calm and shallow makes it yet another reason why it's a good choice to come here with kids. As I said at the beginning, you are on an island and there are actually three beaches. If you walk east you will eventually get to Praia da Terra



Estreita in the centre and if you carry on you'll get to Praia da Ilha de Tavira at the end. If you decide to walk west instead though, then in around two kilometres there's a beach called Praia do Homem Nu.

The Anchor Graveyard

Another unusual feature of this beach that makes it so different and interesting is the Cemitério das Âncoras or Anchor Graveyard. Over 100 of these huge old rusty anchors are scattered amongst the dunes making a rather epic memorial to the tuna fishing industry that used to thrive here. An interesting thing to note is that these anchors weren't used as you might imagine to secure boats, but rather to hold massive fishing nets in place.

From fishing to bathing

Now that there's no tuna to be found here anymore, the beach has done a wonderful job of using the facilities they previously used to trap tuna and turn the place into, well ... a 'tourist trap' instead. The old and beautiful buildings that the fishermans used to use have now been turned into various cafés, bathrooms (with showers - that's a plus) and there's even a museum called the Museu do Atum where you can find out more about the history of the beach, as well as see pictures from the tuna fishing days.

So, it's just a suggestion, but maybe now would be the time to embark on this 'great railway journey' yourselves? After all, I wouldn't dare call it a 'hidden gem' in the summertime

raditional Portuguese musicians know just how to get everyone onto the dance floor during the traditional parties in August, complete with lots of grilled sardines and, of course, a few glasses of wine. For the perfect party the final ingredient has to be "Pimba", a traditional style of Portuguese music.

Fado is internationally known for its splendour and imposing way of singing, as are other styles of Portuguese light music sung around the world and is internationally successful, such as Dulce Pontes or even the pop music

of the Portuguese-descendant Nelly Furtado. Pimba music is however the type of music that is often heard in Portugal, or among Portuguese communities abroad due to its very distinct characteristics. In addition to the electrifying rhythm of the songs to the sound of the accordion and being influenced by the Portuguese folk style, the songs are accompanied by lyrics written in a way that only the Portuguese language allows for. The style has also been evolving and currently some songs are influenced by African rhythms such as Funaná, as can be heard in the songs of the group Némanus.

The history of Pimba The genre began to have

a greater expression in the 1980's, reaching its peak of popularity in the 1990's. The cultural framework, after the Portuguese dictatorship, gave artists greater artistic. Pimba music is full of sexual metaphors throughout the lyrics, which often appeals to those who listen and can understand the messages conveyed by the songs. The opening verses of the songs always refer to common everyday stories. It can all start with eating ice cream, washing the dishes or even parking the car in the neighbour's garage. But it's in the chorus that it all really happens. The Portuguese language allows for sounds and the meaning of the words to almost always have a double meaning. This is what makes the audience laugh the most when listening to the song, as well as livening the mood of those who may be more conservative at the dinner table.

The calmer side

Despite the lively rhythms, there is also a calmer side of the genre, sung by, for example, Ágata or Mónica Sintra. In these cases, the lyrics no longer have as sexual connotation as previously mentioned. Anyone who listens to Ágata's greatest hits from the '90s will hear songs about complicated divorces and the pain of a breakup. In her repertoire, the artist even has songs dedicated to the Virgin Mary. Also following these lines, in Mónica Sintra's musical portfolio, the song "Afinal Havia Outra" should be highlighted. With this song,

it is clear that, despite not seeming like it, Pimba music needs a poetic intelligence that is difficult to find in more modern music. Mónica Sintra's single portrays a betrayal, but only the most attentive ears will be able to understand that it is from the point of view of a lover who did not know that her boyfriend was married to another woman.

A bad reputation

Despite animating the lives of many Portuguese, some musicians interpret the genre as pejorative and of poor quality. Even singers of the Pimba genre at various times say they feel discriminated against by the other side of Portuguese music. Singers such as Romana, who started singing Pimba, was prevented from restarting her career singing in another genre of music because she has a great track record as a popular music singer, despite being recognised as one of the best Portuguese voices.

The prejudice with Pimba music is due precisely to the lyrics, which can sometimes have a discourse that can be considered homophobic and sexist, in several aspects. As was the case with the song by Quim Barreiros "O Casamento Gay", released after the approval of same-sex marriage in Portugal, where words considered homophobic were sung. At the time, the singer told the newspaper Correio da Manhã, that he did not know the meaning of the words "homosexual" and "homophobic", and that he only knows the words that are normally used with a pejorative content.



Remaining popular

Pimba music accompanies the Portuguese to this day. Currently, songs from the 90s are still played at family parties or during traditional Portuguese pilgrimages, which always have a stage dedicated to an artist who sings the Pimba genre. Portuguese Pimba artists such as Emanuel, José Malhoa and Rosinha make almost weekly appearances on television programmes dedicated only to the genre. As a rule, on weekends, the general channels dedicate an afternoon to publicising the work of Pimba artists, as well as remembering the older works of those who already have a more established


Also, singers are called to sing at several university

parties, such as Queima das Fitas in Coimbra. It is almost mandatory to have a day where Quim Barreiros will perform at every university party in the country. The same happens in August, usually, when emigrants visit their families in Portugal, there are a lot of parties where Pimba artists will be performing. Therefore, August is their most busy month, when it comes to singing live. Recently, RTP produced a

documentary dedicated to the genre. The documentary "O Pimba é Nosso" can be seen on the free online platform RTP Play and has three episodes. https://www.rtp.pt/play/ palco/p9117/e576399/opimba-e-nosso - The first

to typical teenagers undeniably nocturnal and enthusiastic eaters who will devour anything! As vermin, they are unwanted guests in your home. A single nest could contain over 20 mice, and can become a severe problem, bringing diseases in with them. Plus the mess. Mice mature in less than 35 days, and can produce offspring within 60 days, so keeping on top of an infestation is important. Your first hint will be droppings, small and black, the size of a grain of rice. Bad smell is another hint - mice communicate with urine, and a dominant male mouse may mark his territory with thousands of microdroplets each day. Mice will travel no more than 30 meters from their homes, so you can be sure they aren't far away if you find any evidence. They will eat any food consumed by you and your pets. And not just content

to live in your cupboards,

oh no, they will get behind baseboards, in through tiny holes you didn't even know were there, and will look for somewhere sheltered, warm and dry to make a nest that cupboard full of last year's receipts will do nicely, thank you very much. They will get in your car, and maybe your first hint of a mouse in your car might be the morning it won't start. They will eat through wires to keep their teeth sharp, and apparently some wires are coated in a sovbased product instead of plastic, so wiring becomes even more attractive. I have had mice in my car – they can get into the engine compartment very easily and they were ripping out the insulation in the bonnet of the car, leaving shreds of fabric behind. A friend left his car standing outside for some months, only to find a whole family must have moved in and had a field day in the boot and engine, with damage so widespread it was irreparable.



How to get rid of them?

So the problem is, how to get rid of them? Well, firstly don't leave food sources easily available, sealing everything in plastic or glass containers will help. Check around for likely entrance points and block any holes, even a screw of wire wool or chickenwire will help. Keep your paper and cardboard for recycling outside. For a humane way of repelling

them, try essential oils, as mice have a very strong sense of smell, and hate the aroma of peppermint oil, cayenne, pepper, and cloves. Soak some cotton balls in any of these, and place them anywhere you've had problems – like under appliances or in the backs of cabinets. Toothpaste, bleach, and vinegar will also work. Another method is to make a mixture of apple cider vinegar and water, and spray around the perimeter of your house, as well as in any indoor access points. Re-apply any natural deterrent you use at least once a month. You can also try fabric softener sheets stuffed into entry points to stop mouse traffic immediately, but be aware once the smell has faded, the sheets make good

mouse bedding! Ultrasound devices are said to be good deterrents, plugged in around the house, and are safe for pets and children.

Next are traps and poisons efficient and effective, but less humane. Traps mean you will have to deal with disposing of dead bodies, and if your infestation is widespread, several traps will be needed. The downside is the safety of your pets or young children, so make sure they are set well out of reach. There are numerous poisons available, liquids, granules or sachets, where the mice eat the bait and die back at their nests, but again care should be taken on where the bait is placed so your pets can't get hold of it.

If all else fails – get a cat!

HAVE YOU SEEN?

This small seed-eater, only about two thirds the size of a Greenfinch or a cagebird Canary, is common throughout the Mediterranean region. It is the only widespread European member of a large Genus occurring mainly in Africa. Only the males are bright yellow on the head and breast but the feature to note in all but the youngest juveniles is the yellow rump, which is obvious in flight.

Some are kept as cagebirds but the high-pitched, 'tinkling' song cannot match that of the Canary (which derives from the Azores and Madeira, not the Canary Islands). In winter Serins can be found in sizeable, wandering flocks, mainly in open scrubby areas. At this season they can be confused with the northern Siskin which reaches Iberia in variable numbers each year. These are more arboreal and have striking yellow or pale wing bars and additional yellow at the sides of the inner tail. Fortunately, Siskins have a very distinctive, penetrating flight call, frequently uttered, whilst Serins make a buzzing trill or a soft

Another similar species occurring in Iberia is the montane Citril Finch. This is larger, longer-tailed and less streaked than the Serin and also has quite different calls. Some breed in the Spanish sierras and their range is expanding in response to new

afforestation. Although considered rare in Portugal, they are easily overlooked and a few have reached the Algarve in at least two of the last four winters. It is uncertain whether these were of Spanish or Alpine origin.

In the south of their range, male Serins can commence singing in early February, often from exposed perches or during butterfly-like song flights. Further north these displays will start later but, in common with many other songbirds, spring activity is getting ever earlier as a result of global warming. Until recently, Serins were restricted to continental Europe but birds have been occurring with increasing frequency in southern Britain, where it is likely to become fully established.

and on heart, I can honestly say I love garden centres - there's something very satisfying about the anticipation, the circling round, the inspecting, the choosing, and ultimately the struggle to get your new selection into the car without bending or chopping off twiggy bits with the closing door. when you want to sit out, but it's really too cold... from things powered by


gas with space-age shapes giving a lazy mesmerizing flame, to chimineas fueled by wood or charcoal, some of which you can even cook on.

The equipment in some of these garden centres is for everyone, from spades and rakes in every shape or size for every job. What makes a good wine glass?

Does the shape really matter?

ortugal produces a fantastic array of good quality wines, so is it important to drink them from the right glass?

They say you should first take account of the shape of the bowl to match it to the type of wine you want it for, then look at the stem, then the rim. But does it really matter? Wine is still wine isn't it, whether from a tumbler or a posh glass? Well, apparently even small subtle differences in your glass design can affect how you experience your wine. Apparently, the glass shape impacts on how much air comes in contact with the wine, how much aroma is released to reach your nose and ultimately how it tastes. A glass with a wide bowl, typically used for red wines, exposes much of the wine to the air, and a lot of the aroma is able to waft up to your nose. Red wines typically have bigger, wider bowls to help release those bolder flavours, with the wide bowl helping to aerate the wine. A narrow bowl is normally used for white wines, and because most white wines have a more delicate aroma, a narrower glass helps channel these subtler smells more toward your nose. It also exposes less of the wine's surface area to air and helps preserve white wines' chill. So what about bubbly? Once exposed to oxygen, sparkling wines lose their effervescence, so choosing a tall narrow fluted glass best preserves all those lovely bubbles.

Stem or not?

A stem or not? Mostly it's a matter of personal preference, but a stemless glass increases the temperature of the wine, because of the warmth of your hand holding the bowl, so ok for red, not so ok for white. It's a bit tricky to hold a glass by the stem only – but not impossible!

The rim

Apparently, a thin cut rim with no lip allows the wine to flow smoothly onto your tongue, whereas thicker rolled rims inhibit smooth flow and can accentuate acidity and harshness in the wine.

So what about port?

Portugal is famous for its port, so what should it be drunk from? There are traditional port glasses that are shaped like a small red wine glass, but some say it should be served in a larger glass, to enable you to swirl the port to appreciate the best aromas and colours.

Should a wine glass be crystal or plain old glass?

It doesn't necessarily have to be crystal, but it does have its good side. Crystal stemware really plays the senses by giving it a better appearance. Crystal stemware, especially those containing lead, refract light, creating a prism that makes the wine in the glass look more enticing. Crystal stemware can have lead or be lead-free, and despite crystal glasses being thinner, they are a strong material and are more durable, with the newer crystal glasses even being dishwasher-safe.

Do keep in mind, though, that all the guidelines about matching wine glasses to wines are simply that: guidelines. Ultimately the best wine glass choice for any

particular wine is the one in which the wine tastes best to you.

Personally, I am of the opinion that good wine does taste better from a good glass, but what do I know, my cupboard is a hotchpotch of mis-matched glasses due to my ability to break them, so most wines taste good to me in any of them!

But if you don't like the way that new wine tastes – try changing the glass before you blame the wine!









Immerse yourself in a traditional Portuguese village



Neither in the Algarve nor in Lisbon, this hidden gem is a place where you can enjoy a true taste of Portugal and where peace is its greatest asset.



f you have never heard of this village, São Brás do Regedouro is a small place with only 70 inhabitants in the Alentejo, which gives its name to a recent local accommodation project located in São Brás do Regedouro's hearts.

Arriving at São Brás do Regedouro we were welcomed warmly by the locals and by Margarida and Ricardo (the owners). But not only humans welcomed us, we were also very well received by a cute puppy and two ducks that walked freely through the stream that passes directly by the properties. It was the beginning of a wonderful story in this charming hidden village! As a tiny village, São Brás do Regedouro has a low economy and an ever diminishing population. However, this new tourism village project brings new a life to the site and is helping the local producers. All this has been possible thanks to the efforts of siblings Ricardo, Margarida, Carlos and their father, Vítor Ribeiro.

"They have already ordered fruit. They always buy my fruit for the breakfasts, which helps a lot!", said the owner of the only cafe in the

village when we went to buy water. "Casa do Vitoriano"

All houses have names. Our house was called "Casa do Vitoriano" the name of the previous owner. When Ribeiro's family started this project, these properties housed residents like Vitoriano and his wife. However, these people lived without basic living conditions such as electricity and bathrooms. Now the houses have been renovated to welcome tourists and the previous residents have moved into new modern homes. Furthermore, the promoters of the project have decided to keep their names on the doors, something the locals are very proud of. However, not all houses have the names of the residents on the door, as some of them were not used for housing, such as the "posto medico" or "casa do forno". For example, the 'casa do forno", which means the "house of the oven", still has a large oven inside - that was once used as a community oven in the village. On one of our walks through the village, we had the pleasure of meeting Vitoriano, who was working in his vegetable garden, where he spends all day. He is

retired but continues to grow his own vegetables. "My wife tells me I can buy potatoes cheaper at the market, but I keep working the land anyway."

Countryside house of your

When we got inside the house, it was like breathing fresh air. The house was very well decorated, with artist's artworks that make some pieces look gorgeous such as the wardrobe.

Although traces of the house's antiquity have been preserved, such as the stones on the walls or the oven of the "casa do forno", the owners have made it very comfortable and homely to receive guests. "We wanted to recreate the village experience while maintaining the comfort people are used to", they told The Portugal

With 15 houses spread throughout the village, the properties have a traditional Alentejo façade and are fully integrated into the space. There are one-bedroom, twobedroom houses and studios - all well fitted with everything we needed.

However, the best was still to come. Casa do Vitoriano has a lovely patio - perfect for a good read or having a Portuguese wine in the evening. It's almost hard to put into words how wonderful we felt there. With such a cosy outdoor space, you won't want to leave, especially because in the Alentejo even on winter days the sun shines.

What to visit in São Brás do Regedouro?

São Brás do Regedouro has a lot to enjoy. You can stay for a walk, meet the locals who will do their best to chat with you, or relish the beautiful pool which has all the amenities as well as music all day. In addition, São Brás do Regedouro has two small museums (Cabanas de Memória) where you can enter for free and find a lot of information about the population of the Neolithic period that lived there before and that left traces that can be seen in some of the tourist attractions. If you fancy that, just check the São Brás do Regedouro App (where you'll find several touristic points) and get on the road. By car or by bike, it's hard not to fall in love.



In addition to all the points that you can find out in the surroundings of the village, São Brás do Regedouro is 20 km from Évora, which is a beautiful city to discover, full of history and romance. In fact, Évora has been classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site and has many monuments, museums and ruins to visit, of which I really suggest the famous Roman Temple of Évora.

Where to eat?

For breakfast you have nothing to worry about. Every morning Margarida and Ricardo knocked on the door (at a time that suits you best) with a breakfast basket. The breakfast seemed like a brunch. It was a very pleasant surprise to be taking the food out of the basket and discovering what was inside. In addition, it was one of the best breakfasts we've ever had - not only

for the delicious food, but because of how it touched our hearts. It was all prepared and delivered with

For lunch or dinner, Margarida and Ricardo will give you some insights of traditional food restaurants in the next village called Alcálçovas, which only takes 10 minutes by car. You can also have lunch and dinner in Évora. Also, eating at home is always an option as all kitchens are fitted with literally everything you might need.

Indeed, Margarida and Ricardo, the owners, are always very helpful, nice and passionate about this village like it was their own homeland – you can see it by the genuine way they talk about the people and how they really want to help the community. All in all, it was an immersive

experience that we are looking forward to repeat soon!





Obesity and eye health

Weight that is higher than what is considered healthy for a given individual's height is described as overweight or obese. A Body Mass Index (BMI) over 25 is considered overweight and over 30 is usually considered obese. A high BMI can be linked to chronic systemic health conditions such as diabetes mellitus, stroke, cardiovascular disease, etc. In recent years, there is increasing evidence that a high BMI is associated with ocular health disease.

verweight and obese individuals are at an increased risk for diabetic retinopathy, age-related macular degeneration, and glaucoma. Other conditions such as retinal vein occlusions, floppy eyelid syndrome, stroke causing visual loss, and thyroid-related eye diseases have also been linked to obesity.

While the cause is not yet certain, researchers believe this may be due to the peripheral artery disease prevalent among people who are obese. When the tiny blood vessels around the eyes are compromised, they may have trouble delivering oxygen and other nutrients to the eye area.

Obesity is also a risk factor for developing cataracts (the clouding of the eye's natural lens). Poor nutrition or high blood sugar levels, which are commonly found in people with obesity, may contribute to the cloudiness. Make sure to get a supply of nutrients such as vitamin C, vitamin E, zinc, omega 3, lutein, and zeaxanthin, as these have been shown to decrease the progression and severity of eye diseases such as macular degeneration.

However, protect your vision by making smart decisions every day with these quick tips:

Watching lots of movies? Sit at a distance equivalent to at least five times the width of your TV screen.

Include eye healthy foods in your meal.

Get regular...with your eye exams! There is no better way to protect your vision than an eye

exam, as many eye diseases have no easily detectable symptoms. Children have their first eye exam between ages six and nine months, and annually after that. Adults should have eye exams every two years.

Butt out! Smoking contributes to a number of eye related health issues, Stop this.

Take 20. Take a 20 second break from your computer screen every 20 minutes and focus your eyes on something at least 20 feet away.

Protect your baby blues (or greens or browns). Wear proper protective eyewear when undertaking major indoor or outdoor work, and wear sunglasses outside even when the sun isn't shining – UV rays are harmful to your eyes year-round.

Have the conversation. If you



have eye irritation from allergies, inflammation, infection or injury, don't assume it will go away on its own. Unusual visual

symptoms can require treatment to resolve, or, in some cases, indicate a more serious vision problem.



How relaxation can help tinnitus





round one in three people experience tinnitus at some point - often a ringing, buzzing or whooshing sound in the ear, when there's no external cause. However, about 13% of the population live with persistent tinnitus - and it can have a big

impact.

According to the British Tinnitus Association, 9.3% of people living with tinnitus have experienced thoughts of suicide or self-harm in the last two years, with 87% saying they think about their tinnitus every day. The charity, who surveyed 2,600 people, also found a third admit to withdrawing from social situations and feeling like their partner and family 'don't understand'. "We've noticed during Covid, more people telling us about their tinnitus,"

says BTA's communication manager Nic Wray. "The stress of living through the pandemic does seem to have exacerbated lots of people's tinnitus."

Tinnitus and stress

Most of the time, tinnitus doesn't have a clear cause (although it's often associated with hearing loss and sometimes occurs due to other health conditions). However, stress and anxiety can be big factors. Wray says tinnitus is a "very individual" thing: "Some people are not distressed by it, but for some people it can have this impact." Audiologist Farah Kiani, of high street clinic Hidden Hearing (hiddenhearing.co.uk), agrees - and like Wray is keen to highlight that help is out there: "The main thing is

for people to know they are not alone, and you can talk to somebody.' If you have hearing loss, Kiani says "having a hearing aid can help reduce your awareness of tinnitus. That's because hearing aids amplify sounds that you want to hear, and that distracts your brain from the tinnitus".

ways to 'tune out' can be immensely helpful.

How can you help tinnitus?

Wray says: "A lot of tinnitus management is around relaxation techniques. When we're under lots of stress, our system is automatically more alert, it's monitoring our senses more – and hearing is one of those. So, if we're hyper-alert and stressed, our body is monitoring sound more closely and that includes the tinnitus." Kiani adds: "There are lots of techniques you can try. For example, deep breathing exercises, meditation, and even something like visualisation exercises.."

Yoga and tai chi can be helpful, and mindfulness meditation is also worth a try. "That has been shown - and the research is fairly new - to be very effective, and more effective than standard relaxation techniques," says

She also suggests "just generally looking at your physical and mental wellbeing, so making sure you're getting enough sleep, exercising regularly" etc, as all these things can influence how stress affects us.

CBT for tinnitus

Cognitive behaviour therapy, or CBT - a form of counselling weaving in coping strategies and helping people reframe things - is a recognised

treatment option. Wray says it can provide a helpful "framework for understating how you're feeling about the tinnitus, and how tinnitus and stress are linked", while Kiani adds "tinnitus retraining therapy can be very helpful".

Apps and podcasts

For all these things, there are lots of apps and podcasts - and many of them are free (for example, search for 'bedtime stories' or 'visualisation' in whichever podcast platform you use). Dr Ed Farrar, an ex-RAF and NHS doctor who developed tinnitus in his 20s, co-founded an app specifically for tinnitus, called Oto (joinoto.com). It combines all these techniques, guiding people to build daily self-help habits. "Whilst I've been fortunate enough to adjust and manage [my tinnitus], learning to live with the ringing was tough at times. My co-founder George Leidig had a similar experience," explains Farrar. "During our time as doctors, we saw many patients with tinnitus who weren't as lucky. We saw how tinnitus had a huge impact on their quality of life and mental health."

They designed Oto with this in mind. "The app provides instant access to science-based support and is backed by world-leading tinnitus experts," adds Farrar. "Oto's tools train your brain to respond differently to the sound and, gradually, the changes in your neural network mean you hear the ringing less and less, bringing you to a point of habituation, when someone no longer notices it at all.





Could you benefit from talking therapy?

We all have bad days. But the stress of the pandemic has turned those bad days into weeks and months, and huge numbers of people are struggling with their mental health.

the NHS in the UK suggest more than 50 percent of people were concerned about their mental health last year – and around half also experienced stress, anxiety, low mood or depression. However, the majority didn't seek professional help. Stephen Buckley, from mental health charity Mind, says: "The pandemic has taken a huge toll on the mental health and wellbeing of the nation. Many people tell us they're worried about asking for help with their mental health, because they don't think their problems are serious enough to bother the NHS. But the sooner people start treatment for their mental health, the more likely they are to recover. Treatment becomes more intensive and expensive as people become more unwell." Buckley says different types of talking therapy work for different people, so it's important they have a choice about whether they receive support face-to-face or virtually. But he stresses: "If you've been struggling with your mental health for more than two weeks, or your symptoms keep returning, speak to your GP." But how can you tell if the way you're feeling is bad enough to warrant professional help? "There are times when the signs you may need some extra professional support aren't obvious," explains Dee Johnson, a therapist at mental health care provider

The Priory Group, who is a

cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) and mindfulness practitioner. "This is because our own perception of how we're thinking and feeling adapts over time, and some people just start to accept that's how they'll always feel. They acclimatise to what are, in reality, mental health issues.

Johnson says signs you should seek professional help for your mental health include...

Withdrawal

You feel more withdrawn and spend more time alone.

Declining social invitations

You say no to invitations, or make last-minute excuses not to engage in something. "This happens when we think avoidance is better than facing something that feels overwhelming," explains Johnson.

Feeling more anxious, nervous and/or worried

"When things that never caused you anxiousness before - such as driving or social gatherings – start to do so, over time, the sense of not feeling safe and secure spreads to almost every aspect of your living, and becomes overwhelming," says

You don't enjoy things any more

Johnson says a condition called anhedonia means you no longer find pleasure or joy from activities, or even people that you used to enjoy. "This is actually a very distressing place to be, and increases worry levels," she says.

You feel lonely and empty

Johnson says people with mental health issues may have an internal sense of shame, lack of worth, and feel emptiness and loneliness. "This can affect you, even if you have people you love in your life," she warns.

You don't feel connected to other people

Mental health issues can present as a feeling of being disconnected from others, says Johnson.

How do interest rates affect families?





When the interest rate goes up, for some families continuing to meet all the monthly repayments can start to be a nightmare.

n increase in the interest rate will cause an increase in monthly payments, which will lead to the lowering of your monthly budget to meet your living expenses. The Portuguese Consumer Protection Association (DECO) presents some suggestions to help combat this situation. According to DECO Algarve, for people facing an increase in mortgage interest, it would be better to "start asking the bank, where you have your mortgage, for a simulation that reflects the increase in the Euribor". Then do your math and

calculate the effort rate (the weight that monthly credit payments have on family effort budget income) that you would start to have. If it is above 35 percent, DECO suggests that you negotiate with your bank in order to promote a solution that brings you more financial balance, reinforcing your ability to pay in the event of a possible increase in mortgage interest

Also, DECO recommends assessing the consequences that the increase in the interest rate will have on your family budget. "For many households, both short and medium term,

the increase in the interest rate means the worsening of their financial situation", DECO

Whenever you find it hard to pay the bills, try to find a viable solution. Usually, the bank has the legal duty to monitor the loan contracts, preventing cases of non-compliance. However, in case of default, the credit institution must contact you to negotiate payment solutions. Whenever you need, DECO provides advice in managing your finances and supports the over-indebted consumers, through DECO's Financial Protection Office, ask for support through gasdeco.net.

Madeira commercial lockdown

During the pandemic, many consumers from Madeira complained about not having access to e-commerce purchases, as some companies refused to deliver orders to the island.

These restrictions reached the Portuguese Association for Consumer Protection (DECO) that required policy-makers to adopt new measures that would eliminate the possibility of discriminatory practises due to a place of

With pressure from DECO and after the discussion by the Parliament of Madeira, the Assembly of the Republic ended up drawing up a new law that bans discrimination of any kind regarding online sales based at the consumer's place of residence or establishment.

According to DECO, regardless of the consumer's place of residence, companies in Portugal:

- Are banned from limiting consumer access to their websites, or from redirecting to another website without their consent;
- · Cannot apply different conditions to online payment transactions due to the consumer's place of residence or establishment.
- They must provide delivery conditions for their goods or services throughout Portuguese territory. However, they may have different conditions depending on the place of delivery, namely in terms of the delivery or transport costs.

Despite the European Regulation on this matter, the truth is that since it only applies in cross-border relationships, it prevents many consumers from having access to goods at a national level. Cross-border geo-blocking was forbidden, but not at a national level", DECO added.

According to the consumers association, DECO will monitor the implementation of the law to ensure that no consumer living in Portugal is discriminated against based on their place of residence or place of establishment.

Insolvency will last three

years

New laws have been announced to give a second chance to insolvent companies and individuals.

An insolvency proceeding is the last resort for over-indebted individuals and families. It has effects on the debtor's assets, as the court orders the sale of the debtor's assets to pay the debts.

In this sense, the Parliament and the European Commission felt the need to create laws in this matter, aiming to save some companies and individuals in over indebtedness situations. "Among the measures, the one that has the most impact is the reduction of the insolvency period from five to three years", DECO explained.

With the reduction of the term of the insolvency period for three years, it is supposed to guarantee the possibility of a second chance after these three years if the company or the individual have met all requirements. Also, these new rules apply not only to new insolvency proceedings, but also to those already in progress.

However, from DECO's point of view, there is still a lack of reinforcement of financial information to educate the insolvent. "The Parliament did not take advantages of the opportunity to create new mechanisms that would allow access to

financial re-education".

Can you crack a VINCICODE®

Vincicode is a three digit number (eg.384), presented in alphabetic figures, like ABC, in which 'A' represents the first digit (number 3), 'B' represents the second digit (number 8) and 'C' represents the third digit (number 4).



After all, the measure of a player is how many majors he has won. Will they be able to muscle in and put a major championship in the Middle East? That would



Denmark and Italy complete the group of five teams that will be in competition, in a format in which the two teams with the most points and the best goal difference after two games go to the final, scheduled for 23 February.
