Things are progressing well on the Village Hall refurbishment front; quotes are being obtained, plans drawn up and we are looking at making our first grant applications shortly. Initially we will be focusing on the basics; damp proofing, energy efficient heating and lighting and window glazing. The damp proofing needs time to take effect before structural work can start, which means the next round of grant applications will focus on the toilets and kitchen in the new year.

The Fundraising Committee held their first event for the Village Hall – **a Quiz Night which raised £815**. Thanks to everyone involved and all those supporting this amazing village effort to raise money for the Village Hall. **THANK YOU**

Reflection from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

I can't believe we're hurtling towards Christmas already. In the Blackthorn Chase Benefice there is a Christmas Fair at Beachampton Church on Saturday 19th November and one at Whaddon Village Hall on 26th November. Dates have also been set for four Carol Services across the benefice. The pre-school and infant school have booked the church for their nativity plays. It's obvious to see the value of having a Parish Church at Christmas time.

As a young child church took place in my parent's home and I was taught that church meant the people who gathered together and not a particular building. There is a lot of truth to this and when I pray for the different churches in the benefice, it is the faces of those who are beginning to feel like family who come to mind, rather than the four distinctive beautiful listed buildings.

However, since I last wrote a reflection, I have seen two of the Churches packed full with standing room only as people came to pay their respects to someone in their respective village who had died. We also had close to hundred people in Thornborough Church commemorating the Queen. There was the Remembrance Sunday Service and the Harvest Supper and Harvest Festival Service in the church. There was the baptism (christening) of a 9-month-old who gave a stunning smile as we clapped to welcome her as part of the church. Every week children from the Infant School visit for WOW (Wonder on Wednesday) as studies have shown that awe and wonder and experiencing 'magical moments' can help children thrive in the world around them. We also have Porch Sales on the second Saturday of each month, where I got to meet two new families who had recently moved into the village, and share a laugh with the regulars. What I don't know is how many people go to sit in the church to pray or swap a book or simply soak in the deep peace. Clearly, I'm biased but I wonder how many of you also think having an ancient beautiful church building within walking distance is really, rather special.

If this is you, perhaps you would be willing to consider joining the Parochial Church Council which is responsible for ensuring the church stays open and active - if so please speak to me. Another way you could show your appreciation is by supporting the '*keep your church alive, support the big five*' initiative. We hope to have the church full with all ages as we gather together to build faith, hope and love at least five times a year. Why not start by attending the Carol Service on 18th December at 6pm. Hope to see you there.

The Methodist Church is organised into circuits and Thornborough Chapel is part of a circuit that covers the towns of Buckingham (which includes Lace Hill, Wells St, Gawcott, Steeple Claydon & Thornborough), Bicester and Brackley. Worship in the local church may be led by the minister who has pastoral charge of the church, but will frequently be conducted by a local preacher, who is a trained lay person, i.e. not ordained. 


TPC back to full strength

The playground clean up

A BIG thank you to the residents who joined some of the councillors for the much needed playground clean up at the end of October.





The play equipment was pressure washed, the pesky weeds that insist on selfseeding in the surface were blasted out of existence and lots of leaves were removed from playground and surrounding area. **TPC hopes to arrange more volunteer events to help with maintenance of the playground and the sports field – so please watch this space and Thornborough eNews**. Volunteer events are vital for all local council because they help contain the cost of maintaining the parish assets. Employing contractors is costly and understandably generally not eligible for grant funding. As a village we need to work together to curb expenditure particularly in the current cost of living crisis.

Trees on parish land

TPC has now appointed a contractor to undertake the high priority work. The first of which is scheduled for 6 and 7 December at the sports field. Further work will be undertaken by the pond just before Christmas.

Buckingham and Villages Community Board (B&VCB)

TPC was delighted to welcome Alice Williams, Manager of B&VCB, who recently visited the parish. Coincidentally, Alice's visit fell on the afternoon of the November Community Café. In addition to enjoying a superb piece of cake, Alice was able to experience an important vibrant community event. The visit was an opportunity for the TPC team to showcase the village, plus we were able to talk about B&VCB, TPC's current agenda and some of the challenges small rural local councils routinely face.

The community boards, which were set-up when the unitary authority came into being in 2020, operate under the banner 'Working together, local voices, local choices, local action'.

Last year TPC successfully bid for four B&VCB grants for the new pavilion floor, LED streetlight lanterns and dredging the pond. The fourth grant is the most significant in terms of funding and is yet to be delivered. This grant is for the Buckinghamshire Council highways provider to instal parking facilities on the verge outside of the pavilion for the preschool parents and children. TPC has been told the work won't be undertaken before April 2023 and unfortunately there is no guarantee it will be undertaken in the 2023/4 financial year. There is at least one exciting TPC project at the early-planning stage which may be eligible for funding from B&VCB in financial year 2023/4.

The annual budget and precept setting is now upon us. The TPC Finance Group met recently to discuss the initial draft budget-build. TPC will discuss the draft budget at its November meeting and provide advice to the Finance Group so that the budget can be finalised for approval. In addition to approving the 2023/4 budget TPC will also set the precept when it next meets in January.
