BEYOND A SHADOW OF A DOUBT

Of the talented field of 10 to go postward, the Saratoga bettors were pretty sure Shadow Caster (Future Storm) wouldn't be the one getting his picture taken after yesterday's GII Forego S. at Saratoga. They were wrong. At 50-1, the longest shot on the board was edging clear late en route to a one-length victory over graded stakes winners Intidab (Phone Trick) and Successful Appeal (Valid Appeal). Shadow Caster ran third in the J B Moseley H. at Suffolk in June before winning a June 26 Rockingham allowance and a July 28 Saratoga allowance in his last two starts. Making his second start for trainer John Terranova, the strapping chestnut pressed the pace as favored Richter Scale (Habitony) reeled off fractions of :21.71, 44.37 and 1:08.53. The "Shadow" fell back at the top of the stretch, but fought back to take control at the furlong marker and was striding clear at the wire. "He's definitely been an improving horse since we got him," said Terranova. "We had a chance to get a piece of it today, but we were in with some nice horses like Richter Scale, Successful Appeal and Intidab. I never thought we had a horse that could really compete solidly with them. We didn't want to take him away from his running style, which is true speed. We told [jockey] Jorge [Chavez] to take a long, loose lead." Terranova said the Breeders' Cup Sprint could be in Shadow Caster's future plans.

BARROW CREEK CARRIES GOLDEN WHIP

As the prize is a whip of solid gold with the winners' names engraved upon it, and since the race represents Germany's leading sprint, it is no surprise that the Goldene Peitsche is a race which is highly coveted. Barrow Creek (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who has a reputation in Germany of being an underachiever, got over the hump to land top honors at Baden Baden yesterday. His best efforts this year came when winning the G3 Premio Tudini Piero E Ugo at Rome May 14, and last time when third behind yesterday's opponent Kaka (Sharpo {GB}) in the Listed Silberne Peitsche at Gelsenkirchen Aug 12. Here he was the recipient of a masterful ride from Terence Hellier, who made this win his tenth of the Baden-Baden meeting this week, and benefitted from a suicidal early pace. Settled in last place early as the Italian-trained Development (Dancing Dissident) scorched off in front, Barrow Creek was allowed to race at his own pace, while Kaka and last year's winner Areion (Big Shuffle) tried to follow a more prominent course of action. As the leader ran out of rope in the straight, Hellier was still last on the rails, as Areion paid for his earlier efforts, and Kaka looked the likely winner. Never in danger of losing his head, Barrow Creek was manoeuvered through a gap to lead with a furlong and a half remaining, before proving too strong for his rivals and going on to glory in style.

On the basis of his previous form, proven speedster Iron Mask was the bettors' confident even-money selection and did not give his supporters a moment's worry to record his first Group success in smooth style and in doing so shattered the course record by 0.40 seconds. Never worse than second in his previous five starts, he filled the runner-up spot in the Listed Prix La Fleche at Maisons-Laffitte June 14, the G3 Prix du Bois at Chantilly July 4, and the G2 Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte July 29. His busy season continued with a smooth win in the Listed Prix de la Vallee d'Auge at Deauville Aug. 15 and the confidence of that win was again portrayed here. Jockey Olivier Doleuze maintained a watching brief, in fourth, for the first half of the race as British-trained challengers Racina and Red Millennium (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) disputed the lead with Never Loser (Fr) (Neverneyev), but positioned his mount in third on the outside to challenge at the quarter-mile marker. Iron Mask was ridden into the lead approaching the final furlong and only needed to be pushed out in the closing stages for a comfortable victory. "We will now consider the Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp [G1, Oct. 1] against older horses, or the Middle Park S., for two-year-olds, at Newmarket [G1, Oct. 28]," said winning trainer Criquette Head. "He is in both races and the ground could be a key factor, as he likes it good. He is a consistent, professional horse who always gives his best and has learnt how to settle. He thrives on racing and he is a real pleasure to be around." Season's Greetings, next to last in the early stages, ran on well inside the final furlong to finish a never threatening second. He was, however, safely clear of Racina who kept on best of the remainder for third.

Likely favorite **Harmony Lodge** (Hennessy), who equaled the track record for 5 1/2 furlongs when winning her career debut by open lengths Aug. 13, will not make the race. The 1/2 sister to GII Jim Dandy winner Graeme Hall is recovering from a "small bug," according to trainer Todd Pletcher.

STEPHEN GOT EVEN RETIRED Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy--Immerse, by Cox's Ridge), winner in his only start this year of the GI Donn H. in February, has been retired and will stand at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, for a fee of \$30,000. Bred by Lane's End owner William Farish in partnership with the late W.S. Kilrov. Stephen Got Even won three of his first four career starts, including the GII GalleryFurniture.com S. The 5-1 second choice in the 1999 Kentucky Derby, he finished a well-beaten 14th, before coming home fourth in the Preakness and fifth in the Belmont. The \$325,000 Keeneland July yearling purchase ran a solid third in the GI Woodward last fall, before closing out the season with a fourth in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. The fouryear-old was gearing up for a fall campaign for trainer Nick Zito when he injured his ankle and the decision was made to retire him. "We are very excited to have Stephen Got Even return to Lane's End," Farish commented. "He is an outstanding looking individual with a sire pedigree that is a complete outcross to Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector." Owned by Stephen and Tomisue Hilbert, Stephen Got Even retires with a record of 11-5-1-1 and earnings of \$1,019,200.

HENNESSY TO JAPAN IN 2001 Hennessy (Storm Cat), among this year's leaders among freshmen sires, will stand at East Stud in Japan in 2001 upon completion of his duties at Coolmore Stud's Australia operation this fall. Coolmore will lease Hennessy's services to the Japanese stud for one year. The deal is similar to the one struck with East Stud to stand Coolmore stallion Spinning World for the 2000 breeding services.

PLEASANT BREEZE OUT FOR SEASON Pleasant Breeze (Pleasant Tap), who pulled up lame after winning Sunday's GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup, has had a small chip removed from his left front ankle and will be out the rest of the year. The five-year-old had to be vanned off the track following his victory. Early indications were that he had done nothing more than wrench his ankle, but trainer Jim Bond took extra precautions and sent the horse to Cornell, where a CAT scan revealed the injury. "The chip was very hard to find," Bond said. "It was so minute that most people would probably just inject him and go on, but I'd rather do the right thing, then bring him back next year and have a nice six-year-old."

CIRO TO CLEMENT Jayeff B Stables' Ciro (Woodman), winner of the GI Secretariat S. in his U.S. bow while under the care of Irishman Aidan O'Brien, has been turned over to New York-based trainer Christophe Clement. Clement has not decided where the three-year-old will start next, but will work the colt Friday and then formulate a plan for the fall. "I've got to get to know him and he's got to get to know me," Clement said.

AVERAGE UP AT TEXAS SALE The Fasig-Tipton Texas Summer Yearling Sale concluded its two-day run Tuesday night at Lone Star Park. The sale average of \$10,424 marked a 5.7-percent increase over the 1999 average of \$9,862. "We couldn't have been more happy," Fasig-Tipton's director of sales Tim Boyce said. "It's not surprising for this sale to become increasingly popular since it's done well in producing stakes winners. Like racing in Texas, this sale is going in the right direction." During Tuesday's second open session of the auction, two yearlings tied at the top price of \$32,000; hip number 362 and hip number 363. Hip 362, a son of Well Decorated--Miss Blackhawk, by Stutz Blackhawk, was consigned by J. Archer Farms with Huisache Farm as agent. Ken Murphy made the final bid. Hip 363, named Pancho Pancho (Pancho Villa--Miss Presto, by Loom), was consigned by S F Henderson and purchased by Becky Thomas.



ADOLF FURLER DIES

Adolf Furler, one of Germany's leading racing experts, died from complications following spinal surgery at a Cologne clinic yesterday. He was one of the very first sport commentators with Germany's first and leading TV station ARD at Hamburg, before specializing in thoroughbred racing. His last official commentary was on this year's G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg July 2, when Samum (Ger) won in the colours of his friend Franz Gunther von Gaertner's Stall Blankenese.
