# SON OF CARAVAGGIO HEADS GOFFS OPENER



Lot 88, a son of first-season sire Caravaggio topped Monday's Goffs

KILDARE, Ireland--A bright, crisp morning at Kildare Paddocks greeted breeders, buyers and sellers on Monday for the opening session of Part 1 of the Goffs November Foal Sale. Trade resembled the outside temperature at times but held up reasonably well when compared with the corresponding day 12 months ago. Last year, a son of No Nay Never held sway when selling for  $\[ \in \]$ 125,000 and it was another Coolmore son of Scat Daddy in Caravaggio who supplied the sale topper this time around when lot 88 sold for  $\[ \in \]$ 100,000. Monday's clearance rate of 68%, while not a figure to get too excited about, was certainly a step back in the right direction after last year's figure of 59% while also encouraging was the 7% rise in the aggregate to  $\[ \in \]$ 2,871,100. The average of  $\[ \in \]$ 18,172 (-2%) and median of  $\[ \in \]$ 14,000 (-7%) represented just minor decreases on 2018.

There were plenty of positive chatter about lot 88 throughout the morning and there was a noticeable increase in the audience numbers in the sale ring as the son of Coolmore's first-crop stallion Caravaggio made his entrance. The bids came hard and fast for the Altenbach Bloodstock-consigned colt and it was Peter Doyle who ultimately emerged on top with a bid of €100,000.

"He has been bought for resale," Doyle confirmed of the son of Cape Joy (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}). Cont. p2

#### MASTER DINO TOPS ARQANA AUTUMN

Demand for horses-in-training, both Flat and National Hunt, resulted in a strong session during Monday's Arqana Autumn Sale. The dual Grade 1-winning hurdler **Master Dino (Fr)** (Doctor Dino {Fr}) (lot 189), offered by La Motteraye Consignment, was knocked down to Herve Bunel of BHB Agency for €420,000 to top proceedings. A winner of the G1 Prix Renaud du Vivier and G1 Prix Cambaceres, the 5-year-old gelding was put through the ring to dissolve a partnership.

Trade was lively all day, with 183 sold (88%) from 183. The gross rose 45% to €5,607,500, while the average rose by even more at €34,829 (+47%). Another index to show a positive result was the median of €14,000, a 40% increase on 2018's equivalent session.

Coming in as the second dearest lot on the day was the hurdler **Gentleman de Mee (Fr)** (Saint des Saints {Fr}). **Cont. p5**

He added, "This is a lovely colt with a good walk and the Caravaggios look like nice horses and I'm looking forward to buying plenty more of them."

This was the third six-figure lot that has been sold out of the mare following the three-time winner Motajaasid (Ire) (Harbour Watch {Ire}) in 2015 and the as of yet unraced 2-year-old Edge Of Town (Ire) (Showcasing {GB}) who sold to Joe Foley last year for 130,000gns.

Altenbach's Alex Whitehead, wife of Powerstown Stud's Tom Whitehead was thrilled with the price the colt made for breeder Brigid Doyle.

"It's a great result, the mare has been very lucky and Caravaggio is obviously a very exciting young stallion," Whitehead said.

On what was a great day for Coolmore stallions, a son of Starspangledbanner (Aus) became the session's second-highest priced foal late in the day when selling to Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud for €88,000.

Lot 262, presented by Cloneymore Farm as the first foal out of the dual winner Rely On Me (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}) will make a return trip to the sales ring next year. Lot 190, a filly by Camelot (GB) and one of only two foals by the sire catalogued in the session proved popular when selling to Jamie Railton for €72,000. Railton got the better of Joseph O'Brien for the daughter of the Jim Bolger bred Lucht Na Gaeilge (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}).

Afterwards Railton commented, "She will hopefully come back here for the Orby Sale next year. Joseph [O'Brien] knows more about Camelot than I do so hopefully it's a good sign that he liked her too."

The filly was consigned and prepped by Joe Rogers of Ballintry Stud on behalf of breeder Noreen Maher who was delighted with the result.

"I'm very pleased," Maher said. "I really want to thank Joe [Rogers] for the wonderful job he has done, it's all down to him. We were hopeful of a good sale as she has been very busy with lookers and one of the things that impressed me about her was her energy. She showed no signs of tiredness despite being in an out of her box for the last couple of days. I hope she does well for her new owners and the mare is in foal to Ribchester so we are also looking forward to that." Cont. p3

as lot 1037, in foal to El Kabeir, and comes from the speedy family of G1 Golden Shaheen winner Muarrab (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Bungle Inthejungle (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}).

The Scat Daddy influence may also have been a factor when a son of Yeomanstown Stud's first-crop stallion El Kabeir sold to Barry Mahon of Goodwill Bloodstock for €52,000. Lot 159 was offered by Redmarble Farm out of the unraced mare Impasse (GB) (Dansili {GB}). The mare got a nice pedigree update earlier in the year when her half-brother Raa Atoll (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) won the G2 Oleander Rennen in Germany and this colt will no doubt be

targeted at a yearling sale next year.

Monday provided an early flavor of how the progeny of a

range of first-season sires would be received by the market and

another to find favour was lot 58, a daughter of Irish National Stud stallion Decorated Knight (GB), offered by the same farm. The chestnut filly by the three-time Group 1 winner was knocked down to Blue Diamond Stud for €50,000 and hails from the famous INS family of the champion Desert King (Ire).

It wasn't a huge surprise to see Blue Diamond's Imad Al Sagar and Tony Nerses at Goffs to help support the stallion they bred and raced and they further

demonstrated their commitment to Decorated Knight by adding lot 73, a colt from Limekiln Stud to their haul for  $\le$ 30,000 and lot 116, a colt from Olive O'Connor for  $\le$ 24,000.

Another to make a good start with a brace of foals was

Mondialiste (Ire), the dual Group 1-winning son of Galileo (Ire) who stands at his owner Geoff Turnbull's Elwick Stud in Yorkshire for a fee of £6,000. They were headed by lot 208, a colt from Railstown Stud out of Moghrama (Ire) (Harbour Watch {Ire}) that sold to Mags O'Toole for €50,000. The 5-year-old mare is a half-sister to stakes winners Mythical Magic (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}) and Esentepe (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) and was bought by Elwick Stud at Tattersalls in

Tally-Ho Stud put their weight behind several foals by their own Cotai Glory (GB) picking up three by the first-crop sire including lot 222 from Collegelands Stud. This colt is out of the stakes performer New Magic (Ire) and was knocked down to Tony O'Callaghan for €43,000. The mare has bred two winners from two runners including this year's promising debut juvenile winner Theotherside (Ire) (Dandy Man [Ire}) while her Dragon Pulse (Ire) yearling filly was bought by Eddie Lynam for €42,000 in September.

Meanwhile Kildaragh Stud's Roderic Kavanagh set the early pace of the sale when giving €48,000 for lot 35, a Teofilo (Ire) filly from Corrin Stud. The foal is the second produce out of the Acclamation (GB) mare Wedding Wish (Ire) from the family of G1 Nassau S. winner Favourable Terms (GB) (Selkirk).

The same price was achieved late in the session for lot 250, a daughter of Starspangledbanner (Aus) from Derek Veitch's Ringfort Stud bought by Brendan Hollland of Grove Stud.

The sale continues on Tuesday from 10 a.m. when trade is expected to take a leap forward.



The sophomore AQPS gelding, sold as lot 225 from trainer Guillaume Macaire, brought €280,000 from Hubert Barbe of Horse Racing Advisory and Charlie Swan. Twice second in two starts, he is a half-brother to fellow AQPS and Group 3 winner over hurdles As de Mee (Fr) (Kapgarde {Fr}).

"He is a lovely big horse who looks a real chaser in the making, a staying chaser," said Swan of the wildcard entry. "Hopefully he'll do well. We'll put him away for this year."

Swan was also in action for lot 217b, the placed hurdler Capodanno (Fr) (Manduro {Ger}). Consigned by Daniela Mele, the 3-year-old gelding brought €185,000 and was second at Compiegne on Nov. 1.

Guy Petit made the winning €260,000 bid on fellow Mele trainee **Stratagem (Fr)** (Sunday Break {Jpn}) (lot 207b). A winner of his lone start over hurdles in mid-October, the 3-year-old gelding is a half-brother to the listed chase winner Ziga Boy (Fr) (Califet {Fr}).

Grade 2-placed AQPS **Gaillard du Mesnil (Fr)** (Saint des Saints {Fr}) (lot 214) will now be trained by Willie Mullins, after Pierre Boulard of PB Bloodstock Services and Harold Kirk joined forces to secure the grey on Mullins's behalf for €250,000. From the consignment of Isabelle Gallorini, the sophomore gelding was runner-up in the G3 Prix de l'Avenir (AQPS) on Oct. 26.

#### **ROBIN OF NAVAN TO BARBOTTIERE**

G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud hero **Robin of Navan (Fr)**(American Post {GB}--Cloghran {Fr}, by Muhtathir {GB}) has been retired to Haras de Barbottiere in France where he will stand for €3,000, *Racing Post* reported on Monday. Set to cover mares in a dual-purpose role, the Italian highweight, who also captured the G2 Meilen Trophy this year, was trained by Harry Dunlop for Haven't A Pot and Richard Foden. Bred by Monique Lepeudry, the chestnut also won the 2015 G3 Prix de Conde and G3 La Coupe Longines among his six victories. A €10,000 ARQOCT yearling turned €47,000 ARQMAY juvenile placed in the G1 Premio Roma and G1 Prix d'Ispahan earlier in his career and retires with a mark of 36-6-8-4 and \$722,442 in earnings.

"We were attracted to the horse himself, his performances and his origins," said Haras de Barbottiere's Stephane Werle to *Racing Post*. "What he achieved at two and then all the way through to six, he had great longevity." His studmate, G1SW **Donjuan Triumphant (Ire)** (Dream Ahead), will command €4,500.

#### **DETTORI TOPS STAR-STUDDED LINE-UP FOR LONGINES IJC** by Alan Carasso


Frankie Dettori, riding in arguably career-best form and whose 19 worldwide Group 1 victories in 2019 include three atop the sensational Enable (GB) (Nathaniel {Ire}), is among eight foreignbased jockeys who will converge on Hong Kong's Happy Valley Racecourse for the 2019 renewal of the Longines International Jockeys' Championship Wednesday, Dec. 4.

A three-time winner of the IJC, Dettori--who turns 49 Dec. 15-will participate in the series for the first time since 2011, when he defeated New Zealand-born, but Sydney-based James McDonald with a then-record 30 points. McDonald, who secured a third Sydney premiership last season, also filled third spot behind Japan's Yuichi Fukunaga in 2014.

Yuga Kawada represents the Land of the Rising Sun as he makes his first IJC appearance.

#### **IJC Cont.**

One of only nine jockeys in the history of the JRA to win all five Classic races, Kawada is currently second in the Japanese premiership, trailing perennial champion Christophe Lemaire by just seven winners through last weekend's action. Kawada claimed this year's World All-Star Jockeys competition at Sapporo Racecourse, defeating Lemaire and Hong Kong's Karis Teetan.

The Mauritian-born Teetan is fresh off a victory aboard the exciting 3-year-old Aethero (Aus) (Sebring {Aus}) and earned his first win at the international meeting courtesy of Mr Stunning (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) last December. South Africa's champion apprentice of 2008, he sits third behind 2012 IJC hero Joao Moreira and three-time Hong Kong champion and 2017 IJC victor Zac Purton in the local standings. Vincent Ho, third in last year's competition, should secure his spot in this year's field as well as the top 'homegrown' rider.

Silvestre de Sousa accumulated a record 34 points with a pair of victories and placings in the other two legs of the series and is back to defend his title. Ryan Moore won the IJC in 2009 and 2010 and along with IJC debuter Oisin Murphy will represent Britain. Colin Keane, runner-up last year, will look to build on that success and two-time French champion and Arc-winning rider Pierre-Charles Boudot, third in the 2017 IJC, completes the field.

"This year's Longines International Jockeys' Championship has all the factors in place to be a classic edition," said Andrew Harding, Executive Director, Racing, for the HKJC. "We have a fantastic line-up of gifted riders, champions of great merit and huge appeal, and Frankie Dettori's return to the Valley off an

incredible year of achievement with rare champions like Enable and Stradivarius adds even greater excitement to what is always a thrilling contest.

"The Hong Kong Jockey Club has succeeded again in putting together an outstanding cast of riders and we are looking forward to a great night of sport at what is not only the richest jockey challenge in the world but also the most spectacular."

Total prize money for the IJC totals HK\$800,000, with HK\$500,000 to the winner, HK\$200,000 for second and HK\$100,000 for third.

#### WATSON GAINS US DUO AHEAD OF DWCC

MGSW & GISP Quip (Distorted Humor) and Keeneland maiden winner Liam's Legend (Liam's Map) will now race under new ownership out of Dubaian-based trainer Doug Watson's Red Stables at the upcoming Dubai World Cup Carnival. Previously campaigned by WinStar Farm LLC, China Horse Club and SF Racing LLC, the former Rodolphe Brisset-trained Quip won the GII Tampa Bay Derby as a sophomore and the GII Oaklawn H. this term, and reported home second in the 2018 GI Arkansas Derby. A private purchase by His Highness Sheikh Rashid bin Humaid Al Nuaimi, he was last seen running sixth in the GIII Lukas Classic S. at Churchill Downs on Sept. 28.

"When we saw that Quip was available to buy, we were pretty excited about that," Watson said. "The one thing is that I know he can probably get into [is] the [G2] Godolphin Mile on rating, but we'll also obviously look at the [G1] Dubai World Cup with a horse like him because he's won at nine furlongs.

"He had time off at WinStar and just arrived into quarantine in Ocala with Dave Scanlon," Watson said. "I think we'll look at one or two spots for him to return—either the [Feb. 13 G3] Firebreak over a mile or the [Feb. 6 G2] Al Maktoum Challenge Round 2 over 1900m). He's joined by Liam's Legend and Moshaher."

Also trained by Brissett, Liam's Legend, who sold for \$325,000 during the recent Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, will now race in the colours of Khalid Mishref after making two starts for Niall Brennan, Mike Ryan and Mike Anderson Racing LLC. The grey was fifth at first asking at Churchill Downs on Sept. 20, but returned to break his maiden in the slop at Keeneland Oct. 26.

"For me, the one thing I really liked about Liam's Legend is he hit the front and was going away and that was a nine-furlong race," Watson said. "I know it was on a sloppy track, but I believe he probably would have won like that either way and it shows that he wants to stay the trip, which is key here when the distances get longer in races like the [G2] UAE Derby." He added, "We will try to make the [G3] UAE 2000 Guineas with him and I'm sure his owner will probably want to run in the new Saudi race for 3-year-olds before the UAE Derby."

Returning to the Emirates is the winning **Moshaher** (Goldencents) for Hamza Dourda and Elbashir Elhrari. The \$87,000 OBSAPR alumni made two prior starts Stateside at Belmont this fall and was fifth in an Oct. 14 allowance. He returns to the UAE and Watson's yard after being gelded.

# MAHER/EUSTACE DREAMING OF CHELTENHAM



**Big Blue racing for Godolphin in Europe** | Racing Post

Ciaron Maher and David Eustace have shown a willingness to forge new territories in the past 12 months, expanding their training operation to new bases in Ballarat and Sydney, while continuing to celebrate success at the recently completed spring carnival. But the pair is set to take their ambitions global, with **Big Blue (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) heading off to the United Kingdom on Wednesday, with a view to a possible shot at the famous Cheltenham Festival in March.

Maher is a former jumps jockey himself and has experienced success as a trainer in Australia's biggest jumps races with the likes of champions Bashboy (Perugino {USA}), Al Garhood (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) and Regina Coeli (Pure Theatre).

He attended the Cheltenham Festival in 2018 and immediately hatched a plan to try and come back with one of his better credentialled jumping horses from Australia. Finding the right candidate wasn't easy, but the imported stayer Big Blue, talented enough on the flat to have been placed in a French Group 1 race as a 2-year-old, fits the bill.

"The horse leaves on Wednesday. He goes over there and he's pretty fit at the moment. He had a good run on Cup day and we will work toward Cheltenham," Maher told *TDN AusNZ*.

"Obviously it's hard to work out where they fit in and it's hard to line up the form, but I think he's got the credentials needed to have a crack over there. He stays well, he handles wet ground and jumps well."

Initially imported by Godolphin after racing for Andre Fabre in

France, Big Blue had six runs in Australia before Maher picked him up for \$102,000 at the 2017 Inglis Melbourne December Thoroughbred Sale. Maher set him for a jumps career and he debuted over the hurdles at Ballarat in August last year before winning another hurdle race at Casterton.

He then reverted back to flat racing and caused a huge upset in the \$500,000 St Leger at Randwick, leading all the way on a very wet track. A couple of unplaced flat runs later and Maher sent him back over the obstacles, capturing the feature \$150,000 Galleywood Hurdle at his hometown Warrnambool carnival.

From there, the plans for Cheltenham were hatched and he was given a three-run flat spring campaign culminating in his third place in the 2800-metre race on Melbourne Cup day as a launching pad to England.

#### Getting There Only Half the Battle

It's an ambitious plan, with Big Blue needing to earn a spot in the feature festival with strong performances in the lead-up.

"I am working with the handicappers now, they are finding it difficult to give him a rating. There is no real correlation between over there and here," Maher said. "That's the first thing and there's a number of races he could run in, I wanted to kick him off in a race in mid-December and then run him every month leading into Cheltenham."

Sarah Webster, who is from the UK but has been working with the Maher and Eustace stable, will oversee Big Blue's preparation over the next few months. **Cont. p2**

#### Big Blue to Cheltenham Cont. from p1

Maher has circled the G1 Stayers' Hurdle, held on the third day of the Festival, as the race he'd like to target with Big Blue. Held over three miles and featuring 12 hurdles, it was won on four consecutive occasions by the legendary Big Buck's (Fr) (Cadoudal {Fr}) when known as the World Hurdle.

"Providing he's good enough and settled in well, and does everything we hope, I thought a race like the Stayers' Hurdle would suit him," Maher said.

Maher had previously entertained thought of a UK campaign with Bashboy, who won three consecutive Grand National Steeplechases from 2013-2015, but said you have to have the right horse.

"This horse (Big Blue) has really good form in Europe over decent staying trips. You don't always get the right horses, they need to handle wet ground and be very stout stayers. You don't get a lot of those types of horses in Australia," he said.

#### **Looking to Create History**

While there have been a handful of Australian jumps horses to head to the UK in the past decade, success has been limited. Zabenz (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) was a Grand National Hurdle winner in Australia who contested the G1 Novices Chase at Cheltenham, finishing fifth in 2006. Further back, the legendary Crisp (Rose Argent (GB) won the 1971 Champion Chase at Cheltenham by 25I, two years before his famous battle with Red Rum (GB) (Quorum {Ire}) when second in the 1973 Grand National at Aintree.

Maher said the possibility of an appearance by Big Blue at Cheltenham is very much anticipated by the horse's ownership group, headed by the trainers' biggest supporter Colin McKenna.

"They've had a great ride with this horse," Maher said. "They are pretty excited by the possibility."

Maher too, admits a measure of excitement after what has been another successful spring carnival for he and Eustace. They



celebrated a Group 1 victory with 3-year-old filly Loving Gaby (I Am Invincible) in the Manikato S. and tasted 2-year-old stakes success with Tanker (Pride Of Dubai) and Ideas Man (Brazen Beau). On Saturday they had a stakes double with imported stayers Southern France (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) in the G2 Zipping Classic and Azuro (Fr) (Myboycharlie {Ire}) in the Listed Sandown Cup.

"We had a great Moonee Valley carnival, and then the Derby horse (Thought Of That) didn't handle the wet, and the Cup horse (Southern France) didn't go to plan, but I thought the 2-year-olds did very well and then we rounded it off well at Sandown obviously," he said. "It's been a big year for the team. We expanded quite a bit, taking over Darren Weir's stables at Forest. Success like we've had puts a bit of clarity and strength behind it all."

I know I shouldn't do it. Nothing good ever comes out of it, but I can't help myself sometimes: I read the comment sections on horse racing websites.

Typically, I have no proverbial horse in the race in regards to the arguments I read in almost every article. I remember always leaving Beyond the Waves and her colt towards the end when bringing in mares in the morning because I knew they wouldn't cause any trouble.

A few weeks into his life, Beyond the Waves required a small medical procedure done at the clinic, so her foal was separated from the herd for a while. Because his dam required stall rest, Bricks got a lot of one-on-one time with me, an overly eager intern living his dream in the Bluegrass. After a few days of stall rest, Beyond the Waves graduated to hour-long stretches in a small paddock where she could hand-graze while her bouncing colt could stretch his legs. During

these sessions, I would brush Bricks and tell him about a horse from my home state who was on the Kentucky Derby trail.

"You know, California Chrome was on stall rest when he was a baby, too. Don't forget me when you're famous like him, bud."

As he grew and developed from a foal to a lanky weanling, he continued to impress me. I worked with over 40 foals that breeding season, including a tenacious (and *stubborn*) colt that would later be named Mastery, but Bricks was always my

favorite.

He wasn't one to bully the other colts around or always be in front when they started to chase each other. What drew me to him was his quiet confidence. A level of maturity I hadn't seen in such a young horse before.

I moved back to California a few days after Bricks was weaned, a poetic way to end our time together. I made sure to keep track of my foals through the years and was surprised when he went for a "bargain" of

\$200,000 during Book 1 of Keeneland September.

"Wow, someone just got a steal," I thought to myself.

Watching my favorite foal develop into the strong competitor he has become today has been a thrill. *Cont. p4* 



Watching him win the Breeders' Cup brought a literal tear to my eye.

He has made me so proud and I can only hope he keeps up his end of the promise and still remembers me.

#### Gary West cont. from p1

On May 14, West, who co-owns Maximum Security with his wife Mary, sued the three stewards assigned to Churchill Downs, plus the 14 board members and the executive director of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC), based on allegations that "the final [Derby] order is not supported by substantial evidence on the whole record" and that the DQ violated the plaintiffs' Fourteenth Amendment rights. On June 8, the defendants filed a motion to dismiss the suit.

On Nov. 15, United States District Court Judge Karen Caldwell agreed with the defendants that the lawsuit should get tossed out. She wrote in her court order that, "Kentucky's regulations

make clear that the disqualification is not subject to judicial review. Further, the disqualification procedure does not implicate an interest protected under the Due Process Clause of the U.S. Constitution. Accordingly, the Court must grant the motion to dismiss."

After taking the weekend to mull his options, Gary West issued the following statement on Monday:

"The Court's decision holding that disqualification decisions by Kentucky's stewards are never 'subject to judicial or any kind of review' literally puts Kentucky's stewards above the law.

"Stewards' decisions are of momentous financial and intangible importance to owners, breeders, trainers, jockeys, and the betting public. The transparency and reviewability of decisions by stewards is essential to the integrity of racing in America and is critical to the public's confidence in the sport.

"Sadly, the Court's opinion allows secret deliberations by Kentucky's stewards that affect millions of people and billions of dollars to forever go unreviewable by any court; indeed, by anyone, no matter how negligent, reckless or nefarious such secretly-made decisions may be.

"The opportunities for abuses under such a bizarre and un-American system are self-evident. This is an outrageous state of affairs that does irreparable damage to the 'trust' in the sport of Thoroughbred racing in Kentucky. *Cont. p5*



"As important as it is to me to have a court review the stewards' disqualification of Maximum Security, this case has now become much bigger than that. It's now a case about Due Process and the fundamental fairness of how racing is conducted in Kentucky. The secret and unreviewable actions by state actors that have been authorized by the Court's opinion are the way things are done under totalitarian regimes in third world countries.

"The Kentucky State Racing Commission should be ashamed to have created a 'rule' like this; it is no wonder most people routinely question stewards' rulings on disqualifications. I, and nearly everyone, have been operating under the belief that in America, 'Due Process' was an inalienable right. But that is simply not true in Kentucky racing.

"I cannot and will not allow such a dangerous precedent to stand unchallenged. I have, therefore, authorized my attorneys to immediately appeal."

Hours after the ruling came down Friday, Barry Stilz, an attorney for the Wests, wrote in an email to *TDN* that, "As regards the result, I can say that we are disappointed and believe that we have strong arguments for a successful appeal."

In the May 4 Derby, Maximum Security led almost every step and crossed the wire first.

But there was bumping and shifting in close quarters behind Maximum Security as he led the pack off the final turn. Two jockeys filed post-race objections, but there was no posted stewards' inquiry.

The three stewards who officiated the Derby—chief state steward Barbara Borden, state steward Brooks "Butch" Becraft, and Churchill Downs steward Tyler Picklesimer—launched a post-Derby adjudication process that played out on national TV as they debated whether Maximum Security's shifting out while leading on the far turn caused crowding that affected rivals in close pursuit and almost triggered a clipping-of-heels accident.



After 22 agonizing minutes, Maximum Security was judged to have fouled Long Range Toddy (Take Charge Indy), and thus placed behind that rival in 17th place. Country House (Lookin At Lucky), who crossed the wire second, was elevated to first place via the DQ process.

The Wests' May 14 suit claimed that they were denied their allegedly rightful part of the \$1,860,000 share of the Derby purse "as well as a professional accomplishment that any horseman would cherish for life, plus the very substantial value that a Kentucky Derby winner has as a stallion."

Beyond the three Churchill stewards named above, the other defendants in the suit are KHRC executive director Marc Guilfoil, chairman Franklin King, vice chair Mark Simendinger, and board members Gatewood Bell, Jr., Larry Bisig, Stuart Brown II, DVM, Kerry Cauthen, Kiki Courtelis, Pat Day, Douglas Hendrickson, Lesley Ann May Howard, Kenneth Jackson, Bret Jones, Foster Northrop, DVM, and J. David Richardson.

#### MAXFIELD HAS SURGERY TO REMOVE **ANKLE CHIP**

Godolphin's Grade I-winning juvenile Maxfield (Street Sense), who was revealed last week to be getting the rest of 2019 off, had surgery Monday at Rood & Riddle to remove a "mildly displaced chip" from his ankle and will get 60 days away from the track, Godolphin announced in a press release.

An impressive winner of the GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity, the undefeated colt was preparing for a start in the GI TVG Breeders' Cup Juvenile before being scratched the week of the race. Following his two-month respite, the bay will return to trainer Brendan Walsh's Palm Meadows base.

"While it was obviously disappointing to miss the Breeders' Cup, the welfare of the horse comes first and we brought him home for a full evaluation with Dr. [Larry] Bramlage," said Jimmy Bell, president and director of racing for Godolphin in the United States. "We will give the horse all the time he needs before resuming what we hope to be an exciting season for him next year."

# FEINSTEIN TO CO-SPONSOR HORSERACING INTEGRITY ACT

U.S. Senator Dianne Feinstein (D-California) has become a cosponsor of the Horseracing Integrity Act, a bill introduced in mid-June by her fellow senators Martha McSally (R-Arizona) and Kirsten Gillibrand (D-New York).

According to a release from Feinstein, the Horseracing Integrity Act sets out to establish a uniform, national standard to prohibit doping and medication for racehorses; creates a new, independent body to oversee the use of drugs and medication, a body to be overseen by the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency (USADA); and bans the use of Lasix and other medication 'dangerous' to racehorses.

The statement reads: "I'm co-sponsoring the Horseracing Integrity Act because it's past time that we end the rampant doping that plagues horse racing and is contributing to racehorse fatalities. We can't sit idly by while these magnificent creatures continue to die.

"Drugs, including the much-prescribed Lasix, allow trainers to mask illnesses and push horses beyond their physical limitations. The result is too often a catastrophic injury requiring the horse to be euthanized. There is no reason a healthy horse should need drugs to race. If a horse is sick enough to require

medication, it's too sick to race. Period.

"The tragic deaths of racehorses at Santa Anita and Del Mar only scratch the surface of the sport's serious issues. Doping is a problem bigger than any track. It demands a national solution.

"Banning doping is one of the biggest steps we can take to clean up the problems with horse racing. It will save horses' lives, and that's something we should all support."

As far back as April, Feinstein engaged in discussions with the California Horse Racing Board, at the time calling for the suspension of racing at Santa Anita while the cause of a rash of deaths was investigated. As recently as Nov. 4, just two days after Mongolian Groom (Hightail) broke down in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, the senator renewed her call for the cessation of racing and pledged to work with California Governor Gavin Newsom towards a resolution of the problem.

#### PRINCESS DORIAN EUTHANIZED

Despite the best efforts from her owner and trainer to save her, Princess Dorian (Idiot Proof) was euthanized Monday after developing acute laminitis in both hind legs.

The story was first reported by *Daily Racing Form*.

Princess Dorian was co-owned by trainer Andrew Lerner and Colorado Avalanche defenseman Erik Johnson. She broke down in an \$8,000 claimer Nov. 10 at Del Mar, but Johnson, determined to save her, had her sent to the San Luis Rey Equine Hospital, where surgery was performed last Monday.

"[Sunday night] Princess Dorian's condition rapidly deteriorated," Johnson said via text. "She developed severe acute hind limb bilateral laminitis and the humane thing to do was euthanize her. My heart breaks for her and for everyone who loved her. I commend the on-site vets at Del Mar, the team at the San Luis Rey Equine Hospital and trainer Andrew Lerner for their terrific care of her. If there was anything more to be done for her, I would have done it. I loved Princess Dorian and will miss her greatly."

Lerner, who was not available for comment Monday afternoon, told DRF: "She became very uncomfortable behind. It happened so quickly. It took everyone by surprise, owing to the way she had been doing."

Three horses broke down on the Nov. 10 card at Del Mar. Two were euthanized shortly after being injured, but there was considerable hope that Princess Dorian could be saved. Huddling with Lerner, Johnson told his trainer to "do whatever you can to save this horse's life. I don't care what it costs. She deserves it."

The initial prognosis was optimistic as Lerner said the 5-yearold mare had come out of the surgery in good shape.

"She was a good patient and has such a big heart." Lerner told the TDN Saturday. "That fighting spirit has helped her get better. She has a long way to go before she is fully recovered and we are all aware of that. We cleared one hurdle with the surgery. She's bearing weight on it now. We're hopeful she'll come out of this OK and lead a fun life on the farm."

#### **TAA GRANTS \$3.42 MILLION TO ACCREDITED ORGANIZATIONS**

The Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance will award \$3.42 million in grants to 74 Thoroughbred aftercare organizations that currently hold TAA accreditation, the TAA announced Monday. Since its inception in 2012, the TAA has now awarded more than \$17.2 million in grants to accredited Thoroughbred aftercare organizations.

"The TAA is pleased to be able to award more than \$3 million this year, especially with a growing list of accredited organizations," TAA President Mike Meuser said. "We know these funds will help our accredited organizations retrain, rehome, and retire more Thoroughbreds. However, there is still work to be done and we urge racing industry stakeholders to continue to invest in Thoroughbred aftercare for the long-term survival of our sport."

Earmarked specifically for equine care, TAA grants have helped accredited organizations assist more than 10,300 Thoroughbreds since 2012.

TAA-accredited organizations undergo a thorough application and inspection process prior to accreditation being awarded to ensure they meet the TAA's Code of Standards, which covers five key areas: operations, education, horse health care management, facility standards and services, and adoption policies and protocols. Facility inspections are conducted at all facilities housing Thoroughbreds for each organization. Ongoing updates and re-inspections are required of all organizations as a condition of TAA accreditation.
