



MAC SWINEY TOPS BIG DAY FOR BOLGER

Saturday was unofficially Jim Bolger day, with his breeding operation excelling with two Group 1 successes and a trio of pattern-race wins across three countries. Chief among them was **Mac Swiney (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}), who sported the family silks as he carried off an attritional renewal of Doncaster's G1 Vertem Futurity Trophy. As the ground deteriorated on Town Moor, the race which has so often been a key pointer to the following season's Classics lost a vital player with Ballydoyle withdrawing the likely favourite Wembley (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). What resulted was a survival-of-the-fittest encounter and the leading pugilist was one of Bolger's already battle-hardened juveniles as Mac Swiney proved he had the requisite amount of class and stamina combined. Trading at 12-1 having run eighth in The Curragh's G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. last time, the G2 Futurity S. winner tracked the G3 Autumn S. winner and 6-4 favourite One Ruler (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) as Cobh (Ire) (Kodi Bear {Ire}) pressed on at the front. Apparently booked for a place only as Baradar (Ire) (Muhaarar {GB}) took over travelling smoothly passing two out, the chestnut was only halfway through his day's graft and his travails paid off as he wore down that rival inside the final 200 yards.

FIRST EURO GROUP 1 FOR AMERICAN PHAROAH AS VAN GOGH STRIKES

A fortnight after Harvey's Lil Goil provided American Pharoah with a first top-level triumph as a sire in the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup, there was another landmark in his remarkable story as **Van Gogh** supplied him with a first in that grade in Europe in Saturday's Criterium International at Saint-Cloud.

Highly tried by Aidan O'Brien this term, the son of the G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Imagine (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) had been second in Leopardstown's G3 Tyros S. and G2 Champions Juvenile S. and in the Oct. 10 G3 Autumn S. at Newmarket and traded at what in hindsight appears generous-looking odds of 18-5. Anchored in rear early by Pierre-Charles Boudot, the bay was delivered on the hedge in the home straight to overtake all rivals and assume command with 300 metres remaining. Drawing away from there, he had enough in the tank to jink near the line and had four lengths to spare there over the longtime leader **Normandy Bridge (Fr)** (Le Havre {Ire}), with the 17-10 favourite **Jadoomi (Fr)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) a neck away in third. **Cont. p3**

At the line, he had 3/4 of a length to spare over One Ruler, with the non-staying Baradar fading to be 2 1/4 lengths back in third. "Go back to his Futurity win and put a line through his last run and he was a leading player," winning rider Kevin Manning said. "When he won the Futurity it was soft, although not as testing as this, and the extra furlong was always going to suit him. He's a real 3-year-old in the making and I think when he steps up in trip next year with another winter under his belt you'll see the real horse."

In a feat of foresight which is hardly surprising given that we are talking about Irish racing's talisman Jim Bolger, the homebred was coming to England to conquer the day before the 100th anniversary of the death by hunger strike of Irish playwright and politician Terence Macswiney. "I must have known he was good back in January when I called him Mac Swiney, as it wouldn't have been good to name him after such an important Cork man if he wasn't capable of delivering," quipped his owner-breeder." "He was one of our outstanding patriots and I'm thrilled for his memory and for his extended family." Introduced in the sevenfurlong Curragh maiden won by 'TDN Rising Star' Hudson River (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) on June 28, Mac Swiney was fifth keeping smart company with Wembley ending up third. When they reengaged over the same course and distance on July 18, it was the Bolger representative who held the bragging rights as he dealt Wembley a 1 1/2-length defeat only to flop when ninth in the G3 Tyros S. at Leopardstown on Aug. 6. Getting the better of Cadillac (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) when 28-1 for the Futurity back at The Curragh on Aug. 22, he was again off piste in the National on Sept. 13 but was back on his A-game on his first try at this trip that was always going to prove a perfect fit.

"To use the cliche, he ticks all the boxes and certainly does so after today," added Bolger, who had just watched the juvenile he also bred but sold, Gear Up (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), win the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. "I was hoping he could win, as he's been improving steadily over the last six weeks and I thought he'd get through the ground today. I bought the third dam [Amoura (Northfields)] for \$4,000 in America after both The Aga Khan and Khalid Abdullah had finished with her. I've been regarding him as my Derby horse since he first went to the races and I'm not about to change that opinion. Five minutes earlier, we had another Group 1 winner at Saint-Cloud and it is down to the brilliant staff I have both at the farm and at the training centre." Charlie Appleby said of the runner-up, "One Ruler has run a very solid race and toughed it out in testing conditions. He has rounded off his 2-year-old season with two excellent efforts and goes into the winter with a lovely profile for next year."

Inbred 2x3 to Galileo (Ire), Mac Swiney is out of the unraced Halla Na Saoire (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}), who is a full-sister to the G2 Derrinstown Derby Trial winner and G1 Irish Derby third Light Heavy (Ire) and a half to Halla Siamsa (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who produced a trio of black-type performers by Teofilo headed by the surprise G1 Dewhurst S. hero Parish Hall (Ire).



"This horse was very impressive and gave me a very good feel," commented the unstoppable "PCB" as he racked up another big-race double. "Aidan called me before the race and said it was important to get a good trip and get him cover, but he was still a bit keen early on. I made my move along the rail, which is always a big help here and he showed a very nice turn of foot. He was a bit tricky and green in front and was looking around, so he can only improve and has run on all grounds so the signs are positive for next year."

Introduced over seven furlongs at Leopardstown on July 11, Van Gogh--who is the 12th foal out of the operation's 2001 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Epsom Oaks heroine--was fourth behind Khalid Abdullah's Masen (GB) (Kingman {GB}) but turned that form around next time in the course-and-distance Tyros on Aug. 6.

Second to his stablemate Military Style (War Front) there as Masen was back in third, the Ballydoyle blueblood was belowpar next time when sixth in The Curragh's G2 Futurity S. on Aug. 22 but rebounded back at Leopardstown when runner-up to Cadillac (Ire) (Lope de Vega {Ire}) on his first try at this trip in the prime juvenile contest on Irish Champions Day on Sept. 12. Making most to get off the mark in a seven-furlong Curragh maiden on Sept. 27, he was out again for Newmarket's Autumn S. on the "Future Champions Day" but was no match for Godolphin's authoritative One Ruler (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in that Oct. 10 contest.

Minutes prior to that contemporary finishing a game runnerup in the G1 Vertem Futurity Trophy, Van Gogh was putting himself in an aptly priceless bracket in the Saint-Cloud mud with arguably the day's most impressive display.

The Oct. 2 G3 Prix Thomas Bryon scorer Normandy Bridge, who looked set to be swamped in midstraight having over-raced in front only to rally and get back up for second, is a work in progress according to trainer Stephanie Nigge. "He didn't have an ideal race, as we would have preferred cover but that's the way it is," she said. "I thought he'd finish fourth or fifth at one point, but he is very courageous and kept finding which is a very good sign. I feel he is very immature and there is quite a lot of work to do over the winter. He's a nice prospect for next season."

GEAR UP ON TOP IN THE CRITERIUM DE SAINT-CLOUD

Bred by Jim Bolger and trained by a Brit who stands comparison in Mark Johnston, Gear Up (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) had all the right credentials on a special afternoon for Redmondstown Stud and duly made all for G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud glory. Tough and resilient when successful in the seven-furlong G3 Acomb S. at York on Aug. 19 before finishing fourth in Newmarket's G2 Royal Lodge S. tackling a mile on Sept. 26, the Teme Valley 2 syndicate's €52,000 Goffs Orby bargain relished this step up to 10 furlongs in testing conditions as James Doyle executed a masterclass from the front. Shaking off the attentions of Ballydoyle's 'TDN Rising Star' Bolshoi Ballet (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) turning into the straight, the 27-1 shot saw off the non-staying G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine Tiger Tanaka (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}) and Jessica Marcialis but that was not all. Tackled latterly by Godolphin's Botanik (Ire) (Golden Horn {GB}), he had to dig deep to prevail but was equal to the task for a short-neck verdict from that rival, with the previously unbeaten 13-10 favourite Makaloun (Fr) (Bated Breath {GB}) 1 3/4 lengths behind in third.

"It wasn't necessarily the plan to make the running, but he was very comfortable there and Franny Norton told me that last time in the Royal Lodge they went very slow and he was caught for speed," the winning rider explained. "He was still very green turning for home and tried to hang left most of the way up the straight, but it was only inside the last furlong that he was finding his best stride. He's very tough and courageous, a typical Mark Johnston horse, and he stays well and has now won on all sorts of ground so hopefully he has a bright future."

On a day when Godolphin just missed in two of the leading contests, the runner-up put up an improved performance and Lisa-Jane Graffard said, "Botanik ran a superb race and we are delighted with him. Mickael Barzalona said that he ran very nicely--he felt that Botanik was very honest and still slightly immature, so he should hopefully progress further next year."

Jean-Claude Rouget said of The Aga Khan's impressive G3 Prix de Conde winner Makaloun, "It was a different race to what he is used to--he is normally closer to the pace or in front but this time because of the draw we waited and he finished well. He was bumped a few times, so nothing was ideal and as he has had five runs we'll give him a long break and see where we start off next year."

Dispute is a full-sister to the GI Champagne S. and GI Cowdin S.-winning sire Adjudicating and a half to the GI Flamingo S.-winning sire Time For a Change (Damascus).

Gearanai's yearling full-brother to the winner topped the recent Tattersalls Ireland September Yearlings Sale at Newmarket when sold to the Hong Kong Jockey Club for £325,000, while she also has a colt foal by Parish Hall (Ire).

FLYING FORM

Jim Bolger may have had to wait until Saturday for a belated red-letter day in 2020, but when it fell right it did so in sensational fashion with the stable's **Flying Visit (Ire)** (Pride of Dubai {Aus}) putting the cherry on the cake for the Coolcullen maestro in Leopardstown's G3 Eyrefield S. Following a spell of less than 10 minutes that saw the colt he had bred win the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud and the stable's Mac Swiney (Ire) (New Approach {Ire}) take the G1 Vertem Futurity Trophy, the hardy campaigner Flying Visit capped yet another big Saturday for his esteemed handler with a game success in this nine-furlong test. Ridden with a prowess beyond his years by the up-and-comer Luke McAteer, the homebred who had three days earlier finished runner-up to Ballydoyle's Sandhurst (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in a seven-furlong conditions race at Gowran Park sealed a fifth renewal since 2014 for his yard. Settled behind the leading trio early, the 10-3 second favourite was committed approaching the furlong pole and gave generously for whipless cajoling to hold 'TDN Rising Star' **Wuqood (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) by a head, with Ballydoyle's 6-4 favourite **Carlisle Bay (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) 3/4 of a

"Kevin [Manning] told me, if I could, to win without the stick as he felt he was resenting it a bit," McAteer commented after steering a first group winner. "He stuck at it well, in fairness. length further back in what proved to be a Derby pointer.

Flying Visit was having his 10th start here, having been placed in decent contests including a Curragh maiden behind the subsequent G2 Beresford S. winner High Definition (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) on Aug. 22. In contrast, Wuqood was only on his third career outing and his trainer Dermot Weld was understandably encouraged by his effort. "He's the horse I'd take out of the day for next year," he said. "I was delighted with him. You'll see a lot of improvement in him next year. We were obviously disappointed with his run at The Curragh [when seventh in the Beresford], but he ran too far too free. Today he probably switched off too well and we had a lot of ground to make up in the straight. He was coming home. He's still a big baby and hopefully he can make a lot of progress next year, especially going a mile-and-a-half."



If there is a colt capable of making an impact it is **Subjectivist** (**GB**) (Teofilo {Ire}), who showed how much he appreciates testing ground and a staying trip when scoring by 15 lengths in Goodwood's G3 March S. on Aug. 29.

Trainer Tony Mullins said of Princess Zoe, "Hopefully it's not too quick a return. We wouldn't be here if we saw any evidence that it was, but you're not really going to know until the last 200 metres on Sunday--that will be the acid test. Everything has gone according to plan and we don't see any problems at the moment. We think we're in as good a form as we were the last day, if not better."

"We see the Aga Khan filly and Mark Johnston's horse as the two dangers," he added. "I think more the Aga Khan filly, who is a possible improver. She'll have to improve again, I think, but it's very possible that she will." Charlie Johnston said of Subjectivist, "If you had asked me a month ago where he was going to go, I would have said the Long Distance Cup at Ascot last weekend--that was Plan A, but then when Stradivarius turned up and Aidan declared everything he did, it looked a deeper field than we expected it to be so at the last minute we decided to give it a swerve and go for the Royal-Oak. Looking at it, I think it's the right decision. The trip is a little bit of an unknown--you are always a little bit hesitant with him, because of his run style and how he likes to get on with things. Princess Zoe needed every yard of the two and a half miles last time and I would like to think over this trip we might have too much class for her. Our horse will handle the conditions and goes there with a good chance."

In the 11-furlong G2 Prix du Conseil de Paris, Gestut Schlenderhan's 3-year-old colt **Mare Australis (Ire)** (Australia {GB}) is running for the first time since making hard work of winning the Listed Prix de l'Avre over 12 furlongs at Chantilly on June 14. He faces the vastly-more experienced **Nagano Gold (GB)** (Sixties Icon {GB}) who will be hard to beat if able to reproduce the form of either his second in the June 28 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud or his third placing behind **Anthony Van Dyck (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Foy at this venue on Sept. 13.

HOKKAIDO AUTUMN SALE WRAPS UP JAPANESE YEARLING SEASON By Kate Hunter

With the Hokkaido Autumn Sale's conclusion on Oct. 22, it was a wrap for the 2020 yearling sales season in Japan. While the world reels from the impact of the COVID-19 crisis, the Japanese yearling market held strong in 2020.

The Autumn Sale was in the spotlight this year thanks to 2018 graduate and G1 Kikuka Sho contender Babbitt (Jpn) (Nakayama Festa {Jpn}). He won G2 St Lite Kinen in September, setting him up to be one of undefeated Triple Crown hopeful Contrail (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn})'s biggest threats. Babbitt goes into the Kikuka Sho with a four-race win steak that includes two graded stakes victories, both of which came after the Japanese Derby. He will take to the lead and not look back, making him a new kind of rival for Contrail to contend with.

The 2020 Autumn Sale saw a rebound from a dip in the market last year, grossing \$1,259,940,000

(\$12,033,235/£9,224,051/€10,143,929), a 23.1% increase from 2019. A total of 365 yearlings sold for a record-breaking 78.3% clearance rate. The average and median of ¥3,451,890 (\$32,967/£25,271/€27,791) and ¥3,190,000 (\$30,466/£23,354/€25,683) also saw significant increases from 2019.

The sale topper, Hip 198, was an Espoir City (Jpn) filly out of Koyu Nomichi (Jpn) that sold to Yujiro Inutsuka for ¥12,100,000 (\$115,562/£88,584/€97,418). A close second was Hip 174, a Pas de Trois (Jpn) colt out of Ocean Lady (Jpn) that was bought by Narutoshi Hasegawa for ¥11,220,000

(\$107,158/£82,141/€90,333). The sale had six horses go over the ¥10,000,000 mark; considerably higher than the two that crossed that threshold in 2019.

Asia Express (Henny Hughes) saw all eight of his yearlings sell for an average of ¥5,678,750 (\$54,235/£41,574/€45,720). He currently has a promising filly in the NAR, Solo Unity (Jpn), who won the Edelweiss Sho at Monbetsu against JRA company just a few days prior. It is a promising start for the young stallion's first crop. Asia Express stands at Yushun Stallion Station alongside his sire Henny Hughes.

Also popular was World Ace (Jpn) (Deep Impact {Jpn}). He had 13 out of 13 sold for an average of ¥3,469,230

(\$33,133/£25,398/€27,931). With a pair of open class 2-year-old winners last year and a NAR stakes winner this year from his first crop, this young son of Deep Impact (Jpn) has proved versatile early on. Espoir City (Jpn) was a champion dirt horse in his day and he has proved a powerhouse on the NAR circuit. With four crops to race, he continues to improve with 149 winners from 196 starters. His six lots at the Autumn Sale averaged \pm 6,966,666 (\pm 66,536/£51,003/ \in 56,089).

Japan's racing industry has been fortunate during the COVID-19 pandemic. Through an early response and vigilant safety protocols racetracks, training centers and sales have managed to escape much hardship. The diligent efforts have allowed the Japanese racing industry as a whole to maintain a healthy cycle of life: betting, high purses, and buying horses.

SIR DRAGONET'S DAY AT THE VALLEY



Irish import Sir Dragonet takes out the Cox Plate with Glen Boss Bronwen Healy

Glen Boss was at his brilliant best aboard **Sir Dragonet** (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) to claim his fourth G1 Cox Plate in an internationally-themed finish to the weight-for-age champion at The Valley.

Boss guided the European import Sir Dragonet to victory in Saturday's Ladbrokes Cox Plate for new trainers Ciaron Maher and David Eustace and a syndicate of owners that includes Ozzie Kheir, who purchased the horse from Coolmore.

Ironically, Sir Dragonet was formerly trained for Coolmore by Aidan O'Brien and defeated their representative **Armory** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to deny them a second Cox Plate after previous success with now Group 1-producing stallion Adelaide (Ire) in 2014.

Boss won the great event with the mighty mare Makybe Diva (GB) (Desert King {Ire}) and now successful stallions So You Think (NZ) and Ocean Park (NZ) and partnered the former to successive G1 Melbourne Cup victories from 2003 to 2005.

The 51-year-old Boss believes Sir Dragonet has all the qualities to add the Flemington feature to his record.

"He just might go a little bit better in the Melbourne Cup I'm telling you, he was only just starting to get warmed up near the post this horse. The feel he gave me is that he might be running in a Melbourne Cup and running very well," Boss said. Sir Dragonet settled in midfield and when the pressure went on and the field began to break up, he improved between runners and came with an undeniable finish between runner-up Armory and third placegetter **Russian Camelot** (Ire) (Camelot {GB}) to land the big prize.

"Every time I moved my pinkie, he was waiting for me and my command and when the run came he was very strong through the line," Boss said. "This is a really proud moment for me and I grew up watching this race.

"The Cox Plate was ingrained into my psyche as a young boy and it's a special race. I just couldn't have scripted the run any better. I was twitching my fingers throughout the race and he was there for me.

"To think I've now joined Babe (Brent) Thompson and Hugh Bowman as the most winning jockeys in this race, a race that I love and cherish is so special."

Timing Is Everything...

Racing is about timing and opportunities and Boss made the most of his as Bowman was originally booked to ride Sir Dragonet, but suspension ruled him out of the Cox Plate.

"Obviously, I feel sorry for Hughie and I got the call up and he was part of that. They put up a few names and Hughie said put Bossie on it."

Since arriving in Australia, Sir Dragonet has been working at Werribee where retired Group 1-winning jockey James Winks has been riding the 5-year-old. **Cont. p2**

"I have been in constant contact with James and he's an incredible judge. He's very intelligent and articulate and he never minced words about this horse and told me straight up how good he was."

Boss said he had also further warmed to his chances of adding another Cox Plate to his record after talking with Maher.

"Ciaron was very confident about this horse and so was I once the rain came--I thought this is the right horse and he's got great form and he got the job done."

Sir Dragonet was a two-time winner under O'Brien's care, most notably in the G3 Chester Vase S. at his second appearance, and finished fifth behind subsequent G1 Caulfield Cup runner-up Anthony Van Dyck (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 English Derby.

He made his final European appearance when runner-up in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup behind Magical (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) before relocating to Australia.

"This is really unbelievable and I can't thank Ozzie and all of the rest of the owners enough who have given us the opportunity to train a horse of this calibre," Maher said.

"Also Dave's (Eustace) brother Harry and their father James who looked after him at Newmarket. Dave is a really hard worker and we gel well together and thank you to the whole team, it's a big operation with the Sydney stable as well."

Armory was gallant in defeat as was Russian Camelot, who was in front before the turn, with **Mugatoo** (Ire) (Henrythenavigator {USA}) fourth and fifth-placed Arcadia Queen (Pierro) the best of the Australasian-breds.

So long, old big head.

Most who fit that description are good; just not quite as good as they think. But you showed an indomitability rooted, not in arrogance, but in an awareness that the odds of life are seldom easy; that the crown must be earned, not just ceremonially conferred. In your case, it just needed a little extra by way of circumference.

The retirement from stud of Tiznow (Cee's Tizzy), announced this week, is poignantly timed. In a few days' time, a fresh name will be carved on the roll of honor for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, on which Tiznow remains the only one to recur. It looks a vintage edition, but for many of us it will be difficult to suppress an inner hollowness to match the empty stands.

Tiznow was a monster of a racehorse--starting, of course, pretty literally with his daunting physique. His unique double in the Classic, in fact, was secured by an aggregate roughly commensurate with that triceratops skull of his: a neck verdict over Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) in 2000 and a nose over Sakhee (Bahri) the following year. Either of those duels would qualify among the most stirring you'll ever witness; to share authorship of both makes Tiznow one of the most memorable Thoroughbreds of the modern era. **Cont. p3**

BREEDERS' CUP CONTENDERS LIGHT UP SATURDAY'S WORKTAB

The worktab at Churchill Downs Saturday morning was replete with many of racing's biggest names scheduled to make an upcoming start during the Nov. 6-7 Breeders' Cup at Keeneland, including champion **Monomoy Girl** (Tapizar), GI Preakness S. heroine **Swiss Skydiver** (Daredevil) and Grade I-winner **Tom's d'Etat** (Smart Strike). Targeting the Distaff, the 2018 3year-old champion filly completed six furlongs in 1:12. Working in tandem with GSW and GISP Owendale (Into Mischief, 6f 1:13), the 5-year-old carved out eighth-mile splits of :12, :24.40, :36.20, :47.80 and 1:00, galloping out in front of her stablemate in 1:26.40 for seven furlongs.

"Anyone you put with Monomoy, she seems to always out work them," said Florent Geroux. "She's worked with a lot of really good horses in the past and Owendale is a really good horse. She just always gets the better of them." **Cont. p5**

WITH MULTIPLE CONNECTIONS TO THE BREEDERS' CUP, SHARED ACCOUNT TO SELL AT FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

When it comes to the Breeders' Cup, Shared Account, Hip 207 in the Fasig-Tipton November sale, has pretty much done everything a horse can do.

During her racing career, she won the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. As a broodmare, she has produced a Breeders' Cup winner, Sharing (Speightstown), the winner of the 2019 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf. Never before has a Breeders' Cup winner who is also the dam of a Breeders' Cup winner been offered at public auction. Making Shared Account even more attractive, she is in foal to Speightstown-himself a winner of the Breeders' Cup Sprint-and so carrying a fullbrother or sister to Sharing.

Sam-Son Farm bought Shared Account at auction in 2018. Also the winner of the GII Lake Placid S. and the GIII All Along S, she got off to a solid start as a broodmare. She had three winners from her first four foals, including Riley's Choice (Distorted Humor), the winner of the All Brandy S. at Laurel. At this year's yearling sales, Sam-Son sold a yearling filly out of Shared Account by Mastery for \$400,000.

But Sharing pushed her to another level. Not only has she won a Breeders' Cup race, Sharing is a four-time stakes

winner who nearly pulled off a win this year at Royal Ascot, where she was second in the GI Coronation S.

Sensing that Shared Account's value has never been higher, Sam-Son has decided to sell her.

"In this business, you have to strike while the iron is hot," said Dave Whitford, Sam-Son's stallion and broodmare manager. "We felt the time was right and that everybody would be in on her. She is a big, attractive mare. There is no downside to her. It's a great opportunity for someone to pick up a mare like this. I think people will be fighting for her."

Most runnings of the Classic, naturally enough, will not measure up to those two years. Yet simple iteration, the renewal of a ritual in our calendar, makes every Breeders' Cup an authentic milestone on the road of life; and a true pilgrim of us mere railbirds. I will never forget watching the 2000 Classic alongside one of the nicest people I know, another Englishman, who had bet Tiznow to win; halfway down the stretch, he suddenly started hollering for Giant's Causeway. Here, wonderfully, was someone renouncing financial gain for the sheer excitement he would have discovered in a success as bold as the one that so nearly fell within the reach of the Iron Horse.

For it was to the Europeans that Tiznow was most truly

monstrous. By a desperate margin, his ogre's snout consecutively confounded two of the most audacious adventures undertaken by the rival powerhouses of racing in Europe. Giant's Causeway admittedly carried some versatile influences, but Sakhee, who had won the Arc by six lengths 20 days previously, was saturated with staying grass blood. Yet the connections of both understood the essential transferability, between different surfaces, of class.

Nonetheless I soon found myself borrowing and reversing my friend's generosity of spirit. Who could begrudge a horse as lion-hearted as this? After all, when he went to WinStar, Tiznow invited the whole business to see the bigger picture. Because the whole package demanded a fresh look at what makes a Hall of Fame dirt runner: this hulking Cal-bred, offering to extend the perilously attenuating Man o' War line through a mare whose frankly peculiar antecedents (first four dams by Seattle Song, Nice Dancer, Pia Star and Tompion) would meanwhile coalesce into something quite remarkable. At the time, even such a terrific record on the track could not qualify a son of Cee's Tizzy, who had himself stood for \$1,500, for a higher opening fee than \$30,000. And nor could the success of Tiznow's stock, including 14 Grade I winners and many bombshell sales yearlings, ever get him into the six-figure club.

Though he landed running, with first-crop champion Folklore sealing the freshman's championship, his rugged and rangy foals had the ostensibly uncommercial virtue of thriving with maturity. Tiznow himself was unraced at two and Well Armed, for instance, waited until six to gild that debut crop with the G1 Dubai World Cup.

But as Tiznow began to replicate his sterling attributes (often through fairly mediocre mares), so we all grew in admiration for the work of Cecilia "Cee" Straub-Rubens, who had purchased both his sire and dam as yearlings.

Cee's Tizzy (Relaunch) ended a light career with third in the GI Super Derby, in which runner-up Unbridled would also achieve a more enduring distinction than winner Home At Last. Besides Tiznow, his serial matings with Cee's Song (Seattle Song) also yielded Grade II winners Budroyale and Tizdubai; Grade II-placed Tizbud; the unraced dam of GI Preakness winner Oxbow (Awesome Again); and the unplaced dam of GI Haskell scorer Paynter (also by Awesome Again).

A real dynasty, then, blossomed unfeasibly in the strips of sunlight cast between the steel-girder limbs that supported the raking stride of its principal scion. Who knows which layers of soil have been most fertile?

Some credit, perhaps, can go to the second dam of Cee's Tizzy: the prolific Chilean import Tizna was not only still operating at a high level at age seven, but apparently also set a template with a blaze and four white feet. Cee's Tizzy fractured a knee in the Super Derby but standing opposite Tizna in his pedigree is Relaunch's very influential dam Foggy Note, also familiar in the pedigree of Tapit; between them, these mares made 88 starts.

Behind Cee's Song, equally, you find conspicuous durability in her Argentinian roots. Her fourth dam, for instance, made 133 starts across seven years; and her half-brother was none other than Crimson Satan, whose footprint we recently noted in the family of the flourishing Dialed In. He, too, had teak qualities as a champion juvenile who proceeded to win 18 of 58 starts. Other siblings raced 92, 89 and 72 times respectively.

Such are the goods filtering into the 21st Century through Tiznow. Obviously the stakes are pretty high for one of his sons to

maintain the viability of a sire line ultimately tracing to the Godolphin Arabian--soon, perhaps, in as much danger of

asphyxiation by the Darley Arabian hegemony as that of the Byerley Turk. In Kentucky, Tourist and Strong Mandate still retain every chance; and of course another heir may yet emerge from Tiznow's final crops, conceivably even Dennis' Moment (back on the worktab and eyeing the GI Pegasus World Cup) if

> he retrieves his juvenile promise. In the meantime Tiznow is advancing his reputation as a broodmare sire, the 37 stakes winners already out of his daughters including a leading candidate for his Classic mantle in Tiz The Law (Constitution).

One way or another, there's a legacy here worth preserving. Because Tiznow, in both build and background, reminds us always to resist lazy assumptions.

The skittish domestic market of today didn't give much of a

chance to another Cal-bred, California Chrome, before exporting him to Japan.

His Breeders' Cup duel with Arrogate was right up there with those won by Tiznow, and I'll never tire of remarking that his conqueror's sire Unbridled's Song was out of a three-parts sister to the dam of his own father, Lucky Pulpit. Yet one was deemed commercially impossible, and the other a bona fide Classic influence. Much like Ride the Rails and Indian Charlie, respectively sires of Candy Ride (Arg) and Uncle Mo, Cee's Tizzy gave us all a rebuke along with his greatest gift. No less than with mares like Leslie's Lady (Tricky Creek), we can't just declare "exceptions to the rule." We can't pick and choose when pedigrees are relevant. If anything, we should always be more interested in the ones that are hardest to explain.

Regarding Monomoy Girl, Cox added, "There's not much really to say about her other than she's just really, really, really good right now. We'll see what the future holds for her, but as a 5-year-old, she's showing how mature she's become."

Cox's morning started at 5:30 a.m. **Arklow** (Arch)worked outside of GSW Plainsman (Flatter) through splits of :12.60, :24.80 and :47.80. Plainsman completed five furlongs in :59.80. Arklow, accompanied by Geroux, galloped out six furlongs in 1:11.80. The GI Breeders' Cup Turf will mark Arklow's 30th career start, but only the second with the addition of blinkers.

"I wish I would've added the blinkers in start 19 instead of 29," Cox joked. "He's really turned the corner since we put them on for the [Sept. 12 GIII] Kentucky Turf Cup Classic last out. This year has been interesting with this horse."

Continued Cox, "He ran a good race in June [in the \$100,000 Louisville] and we ran him back in the Elkhorn where he didn't run bad but I had the not-so-great idea of sticking him on a plane and running six days later at Monmouth [in the Grade I,

\$315,000 United Nations]. After he finished fourth that day, I said we have to make a change and add blinkers. It really worked out in the Kentucky Turf Cup, which in and of itself turned out to be a really interesting race when there was a torrential downpour before the running of the race."

Also in the first set of Cox horses was GI First Lady S. runner-up **Beau Recall (Ire)** (Sir Prancealot {Ire}), who appears likely to face the males in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. She worked by herself through fractions of :13.20 and



With Robby Albarado in the saddle, the Ken McPeek-trained filly breezed through initial fractions of :12.40 and :24.40. "She was pulling today and feeling really good with the cool

weather," said Albarado. "No complaints, she feels amazing...I'm

going to gallop her the last five days before the race as I did at Pimlico. We're going to see how she's doing and make a decision [about the Classic or Distaff] from there."

McPeek also worked Juvenile Fillies probables **Simply Ravishing** (Laoban) and **Crazy Beautiful** (Liam's Map). The one-two finishers, respectively, in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. worked separately, posting internal fractions of :12.20 and :24.20, and capping off the move in :48 flat.

:25.60, galloping out five furlongs in 1:03.80.

Among the leaders of this season's crop of sophomore fillies, the Oct. 3 Classic winning Swiss Skydiver continued her march toward Breeders' Cup day with a four-furlong move in :47.80. Tom's d'Etat, who has been off since a troubled third in the Aug. 1 GI Whitney S. in early August, posted a solid six-furlong move under jockey Miguel Mena in preparation for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.



Breezing in tandem with Oak Hill (Distorted Humor), last year's GI Clark winner worked six panels in 1:12.80, with internal splits of :12.20, :23.80, :47.20 and 1:00. Oak Hill completed five furlongs in 1:01.

"The schedule with the pandemic got a little awkward with everyone," trainer Al Stall, Jr. said. "The races didn't quite work out in the calendar quite right for him. My gut feeling said to go into the Classic fresh anyway and when the last round of stakes races came out, I didn't like the way they were placed so we stuck with the plan to train up to the race."

The fastest recorded five-furlong dirt breeze of the morning was registered by Classic contender **By My Standards** (Goldencents), who completed the task in a crisp :58.60. Rolling through initial fractions of :12, :23.40 and :34.80 with jockey Gabriel Saez aboard, the winner of the Sept. 4 GII Alysheba S. galloped out six furlongs in 1:11 and rounding out seven panels in 1:24.80.

"Last week was the first work we did a little bit something serious with him [since he won the Alysheba]," said trainer Bret Calhoun. "He was full of energy and bounced around great after it. It's been a different year for sure losing a few races here or there. We were fortunate to have [the Alysheba] on the undercard of the rescheduled Derby. We probably could've shipped somewhere around the country, but our goal was how to get him to the Breeders' Cup Classic. We decided to stay here run in the Alysheba and point to the Breeders' Cup from there.

Also making an appearance on Saturday's worktab, recent GI Woodward H. winner **Global Campaign** (Curlin) (4f, :48; Classic), GII Dinner Party S. scorer **Factor This** (The Factor) (5f, 1:02; Mile), 2018 GI Breeders' Futurity winner **Knicks Go** (Paynter) (5f, 1:00.20; Dirt Mile), GSW **Sally's Curlin** (Curlin) (4f, 1:01.40; Filly & Mare Sprint), and **Spanish Loveaffair** (Karakontie {Jpn}) (5f, 1:04.20; Juvenile Fillies Turf).

Chief among them was **Jesus' Team** (Tapiture), who breezed five panels over a muddy track in 1:00.80 in advance of the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile and Grade I winner **Ollie's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}), who is slated to contest the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

"It was a good work and he will come back again next Saturday [Oct. 31] and work a half-mile," said trainer Jose D'Angelo. "I have only been in this country a year. I have not been here to race, but I have been to the sales."

Third in the Preakness, the former claimer also finished third in the GII Jim Dandy S. Sept. 5.

Ollie's Candy, runner-up in her latest start in the Oct. 4 GI Juddmonte Spinster S., will try to improve on a fourth in last season's Distaff. The first worker over the freshly harrowed track at 7:30 a.m., the John Sadler-trainee posted a bullet five furlongs in :59 over a muddy track. The 5-year-old reeled off internal splits of :23, :47.40, galloping out six furlongs in 1:12.60. Juan Levya, assistant to Sadler, was aboard.

"She got over the track really well and galloped out well," Leyva said.

Ollie's Candy has been cataloged as a racing or broodmare prospect (Book 1, Hip 83) in Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale. The sale begins Nov. 9. Following Keeneland's second morning renovation break Saturday, **Bellafina** (Quality Road), who is expected to make her next start in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint, worked five furlongs on her own in 1:00.60 with Nick Bush aboard.

Second in the Filly and Mare Sprint to champion Covfefe (Into Mischief) last year, Bellafina posted fractions of :11.40, :23, :35.40, 1:00.60 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14.20.

Undefeated TDN Rising Star Princess Noor (Not This Time) breezed six furlongs in a bullet 1:11.80 in preparation for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Victorious second time out in the GI Del Mar Debutante Sept. 6, she returned to score in the Sept. 6 GII Chandelier S. Fellow Baffert trainee, Grade I-placed **Spielberg** (Union Rags), posted a five-furlong move in :59.80 in advance of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, while **Gamine** (Into Mischief), winner of the GI Acorn S. and GI Test S. this summer, completed five furlongs in a bullet :58.80 ahead of the GI Breeders' Cup F & M Sprint. The filly is currently under investigation for a medication positive detected in a sample following a third in the Sept. 4. GI Kentucky Oaks.

Also at Santa Anita Saturday, trainer Richard Mandella sent out GII John Henry Turf Championship S. winner **United** (Giant's Causeway) for a mile work in 1:37.80 under Flavien Prat in preparation for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, a race in which he finished second in 2019.

"He went very nice," said Mandella. "I think we have a little better line on him now, more than we ever did, and hopefully, it will pay off at the Breeders' Cup."

Mandella also breezed **Jolie Olimpica (Brz)** (Drosselmeyer) Saturday, indicating the latter "got a little tired" negotiating five furlongs in :59 flat and will bypass the Breeders' Cup in favor of the Nov. 29 GI Matriarch S. at Del Mar.

Recent GI Rodeo Drive S. scorer **Mucho Unusual** (Mucho Macho Man), expected to contest the GI Breeders' Cup F&M Turf, worked five panels for trainer Tim Yakteen in 1:00.60 (XBTV Video), while **Sharp Samurai** (First Samurai) completed the same distance in a minute flat. The multiple graded stakes winner is expected to make his next start in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile or Mile.

GISW MO FORZA TO MISS BC MILE

Mo Forza (Uncle Mo) will miss the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Keeneland Nov. 7 due to a 'minor issue,' according to Peter Miller Saturday.

"If all goes well, we'll run in the Breeders' Cup next year at Del Mar," the trainer said. "What happened is just bad timing. I think he's the best turf miler in the world and I'm disappointed he won't be able to prove it this year."

Mo Forza is co-owned by Onofrio Pecoraro, who races as OG Boss, and by the estate of former trainer Barry Abrams, who died Oct. 9 after a 15-year battle with cancer. Abrams, who campaigned as Bardy Farm, also bred Mo Forza.

"This horse kept Barry going," Miller said. "It gave him something to look forward to. It meant a lot to Barry and meant a lot to me, so we were crossing our fingers and hoping he could 'Win One for The Gipper.'"

A four-year-old, who has a 6-3-1 record from 12 starts with earnings of \$734,460, won six of his last seven races, including last fall's GI Hollywood Derby and the Oct. 3 GII City of Hope Mile at Santa Anita in his most recent outing.

PINE RIDGE HOPES TO END YEARLING SALES SEASON ON HIGH NOTE AT OCTOBER SALE

When the global pandemic propelled the world into chaos and uncertainty earlier this year, perhaps no industry group was impacted more by cancellations than New York breeders, who saw all three Saratoga-based auctions cancelled and who were forced to find other outlets for their stock. The up-and-down yearling sales season concludes with next week's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearlings Sale which features over 100 New York-breds, including four well-bred youngsters from Marty Zaretsky's Pine Ridge Stables.

"I would say, not as I would have liked," Zaretsky admitted when asked to assess results from the yearling sales. "Highquality horses sold really well--I had one of my horses sell at Keeneland, a Ghostzapper, for \$400,000. So I shouldn't say I'm disappointed, but I'm not excited about the sales. We didn't have the Europeans or the Asian buyers, so it was bad because of that. It's COVID and COVID has messed a lot of things up."

Zaretsky will look to end the sales year on a positive note with his October sale quartet. All consigned by Paramount Sales, the group includes a filly by Street Sense (hip 325) (*Thorostride video*), a colt by Quality Road (hip 539) (*Thorostride video*), a colt by Gun Runner (hip 692), and a colt by Curlin (hip 1031).

"I have done fairly well in the past at the October sale," Zaretsky said. "You want your horse to stand out and I'm hoping that's what will happen with the four of them in October."

Zaretsky has a commercial broodmare band of 15 head at his upstate New York farm and, like his October yearlings indicate, focuses on sire power when making his mating plans.

"I think it's a bonus in New York-breds," Zaretsky said of the sire power represented in his operation. "The stallion population in New York is mediocre. As a breeder, if you want to bring up

the quality of horses to be in graded races, high-end stallions are the way to go with New York-breds. And there are a lot of opportunities at the track when they are New York-breds. Look, a New York-bred [Authentic {Into Mischief}] just won the Derby."

Parlaying sire power into the sales ring, Zaretsky explained, "The hope is that you can sell for three times the cost of the stallion when you get into those realms. If you look at the averages for Into Mischief, [the stud fee is] \$100,000 and their [yearling] average is over \$400,000. So a three-time factor is a decent amount because to feed and take care of them is the same for a \$5,000 mare or a \$100,000 mare."

He continued, "But you need the quality of the mare to hold it. You need a lot of black-type in its bloodlines. Whether it's a runner or a producer or a daughter of a producer. Our Curlin that is in the October sale is a 3/4-brother to Connect. We bought the dam with a Candy Ride (Arg) in her belly absolutely with the thought of breeding her to Curlin after she foaled because of the bloodlines and the nicks to Connect."

Hip 1031 is out of Whisper Wisdom (Rockport Harbor), a halfsister to GI Cigar Mile H. and GII Pennsylvania Derby winner Connect (Curlin). Zaretsky purchased the mare for \$275,000 at the 2017 Keeneland November sale.

The Curlin yearling will be making his second trip through the sales ring next week after RNA'ing for \$255,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Selected Yearlings Showcase in September. The youngster was offered during the auction's opening section of New York-breds, which was in the unenviable position of leading off the entire yearling sales season.

"I would have not gone in the New York portion of that sale if I could do it again," Zaretsky said. "I would have gone in the second portion of the sale. People who opted out of the New York portion to go in the second portion of the sale, they did better because they were mixed in with the higher-quality horses."

Zaretsky's highest-priced yearling this year was a filly by Ghostzapper (hip 242) who sold for \$400,000 to Mike Pegram, Paul Weitman, and Karl Watson. The yearling is out of multiple stakes placed Lady of the Nile (Pioneerof the Nile), a mare Zaretsky purchased for \$100,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November sale. Her first foal, the 3-year-old Chocolate Cookie (Declaration of War), is now two-for-three following a Belmont allowance win at the beginning of the month.

Zaretsky offered a filly by Into Mischief out of Indian Rush (Indian Charlie) at the Keeneland sale, but bought her back at \$140,000. He re-routed the filly to last week's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's October Sale where she brought the auction's second-highest price of \$200,000.

"I sent her to that sale to stand out," Zaretsky said. "There were a lot of Into Mischiefs in Kentucky in the October sale and I think she was the only Into Mischief in Florida. Florida has a tendency to like New York-breds also. So I sent her with Stuart Morris and it was a good result." Zaretsky purchased Indian Rush for \$80,000 at the 2012 Keeneland January sale and sold an Into Mischief colt out of the mare for \$750,000 to Shadwell Estate Co. at the 2017 Keeneland September sale. She is also the dam of stakes winners Harlan's Honor (Harlan's Holiday)–whose first foal is already stakesplaced--and March X Press (Shanghai Bobby).

Of his success with the family, Zaretsky said, "It's fabulous. You dream to take a horse that has potential and to have the horse deliver black-type. It's very exciting. Indian Rush has an Into Mischief by her side. He's beautiful, looks exactly like the one I sold for \$750,000. So I'm pretty excited about next year with him."

Zaretsky's plan is to sell all his foals, but he is content to pick and choose the best time to offer his stock.

"I'm not going to let horses go for nothing," he said. "You've got to believe in what you're doing. I am in the business of breeding and selling and if I don't feel I'm getting adequate money, I'll go to the 2-year-old sales."

The Brooklyn native also has a pair of 2-year-olds set to go racing with trainer Linda Rice.

"I have an Honor Code out of Indian Rush (hip 1179) with Linda Rice," Zaretsky said. "He did great in the 2-year-old sale, he worked in :9 4/5 at the OBS Spring sale, but he had a chip, so I took him home and fixed everything. He's doing really well and I think he'll run this year. And I have an Uncle Mo [out of Lady of the Nile] who will go to Linda probably next month. He hurt himself in the March sale (hip 176, :10 2/5)--he is a very big horse, he's every bit of 17 hands, so it's hard to push those types."

Zaretsky began breeding horses in partnership with Dr. Jerry Bilinski of Waldorf Farm decades ago before eventually deciding to take over sole ownership of his breeding operation.

"I was big into horseback riding," he explained of his first foray into the breeding industry. "I used to go in the foxhunts. I was going to retire one of my horses and breed her, but my friend Dr. Bilinski said, 'Why would you go and breed a horse just to have a baby because you love the horse. If you want to breed horses, go buy yourself a mare in foal or a mare you could breed and at least get some economic reward. So I went out and I bought a mare in foal. I think it was \$5,000 at the time-this was over 20 years ago--and I sold that yearling out of her for \$22,000. Then I partnered with Jerry for at least 10 years. We had a lot of horses together and we did well. Eventually I said, 'I think I'd like to do it on my own.' I wanted to make my own decisions, my own economics at my own farm. He's still my friend, but I do everything alone."

Zaretsky, whose primary business is in consumer packaging for cosmetics and pharmaceuticals, generally splits his time between New York city and his upstate farm. But he has been harboring upstate since the outbreak of the pandemic in the spring.

"I still live in the city, but I have the farm upstate," he said. "I used to spend half a week in the city and half a week upstate, but I've been upstate since Mar. 12. It's fun seeing the horses every day. It is really a pleasure."

He continued, "I have 13 weanlings at my farm now in New York--two Empire Makers, an Uncle Mo, I have a Pioneerof the Nile and two Into Mischiefs."

Despite the ups and downs of 2020, Zaretsky is planning to continue to pursue sire power in his 2021 matings.

"Some of the horses that are perhaps not producing, I'll breed down because of the virus," Zaretsky said. "I do have a contract for Into Mischief for one of my horses already and I think I'll go to American Pharoah with another mare. We'll see how we go. The good news is a lot of farms are lowering their fees to make up for the way the industry is going. It takes a lot of the pressure off for spending all of our money with the results not being what we hoped. The virus is not gone, the tracks are not open yet, per se, so you have to be somewhat cautious and they still need numbers. If you can breed to a stallion for \$50,000 who was \$75,000 last year, it gives you a lot more flexibility in overhead."

The Fasig-Tipton October sale will be held next Monday through Thursday at the company's Newtown Paddocks in Lexington. Bidding begins each day at 10 a.m.

BELICHICK UPSETS TRIPLE CROWN BID

Heading into Saturday's final jewel in Canada's 2020 Triple Crown, trainer Josie Carroll appeared poised to collect the 129th renewal of the Breeders' S. and while most thought that Queen's Plate S. and Prince of Wales S. hero Mighty Heart (Dramedy) was the most likely to accomplish the feat as evenmoney choice, it was his stablemate **Belichick** (Lemon Drop Kid) who landed the Canadian Classic in fine style. Given a 3-1 chance here, Belichick raced two wide in mid-pack as his favored barnmate--prompted by longshot Kunal (Temple City)--blazed through swift early fractions of :23,69, :47.45 and 1:13.02. The field began to converge on the leaders, with Contreras steering Belichick to the outside to take aim at the tiring front-runners. Just before the turn for home, Belichick took command as Mighty Heart began to fade to the inside. Full of run from there, the \$300,000 KEESEP buy struck the front in early stretch and charged clear to win by an easy four-length margin over 54-1 longshot Meyer (Singing Saint) and English Conqueror (English Channel) back in third. Mighty Heart tired through the lane, finishing seventh.

"They kind of broke early in the race so I just tried to see them and relax my horse as much as I can," said winning rider Luis Contreras of the early speed up front. "He was very uncomfortable; this horse has a different style to run, so I just let him be happy wherever he wants to be. Turning for home, I was just in hand all the way to the quarter pole and I asked him to run from the stretch home and he did. I was just watching, just feeling my horse at the same time. And he was doing great the whole way. He came into this race very ready, good thing for Josie and all the crew."

Third on debut sprinting on the local lawn July 4, the NK Racing and LNJ Foxwoods representative was second next out in a nine-panel maiden special weight on the synthetic here Aug. 1. Most recently, he finished second--beaten 7 1/2 lengths--to Mighty Heart in the Queen's Plate Sept. 12.

"I've said from the very start that Belichick is a very, very special horse that's just coming into his own and I think he showed that today," said Carroll. "He's a powerful horse. The Queen's Plate was a breakout race for him and we couldn't come back that quickly in the Prince of Wales. A horse needs a little time to regroup from something like that, a young, inexperienced horse. And regroup he did."

As for the beaten favorite who was looking to become the first Canadian Triple Crown winner since Wando in 2003, Carroll said, "I told him [jockey Daisuke Fukumoto], 'Let's see how this falls out. If you make the lead, watch your fractions..it's a long, long race.' The horse broke well, he found himself up there, unfortunately, another horse dogged him the whole way and he couldn't get the horse to come off the bridle and relax."

Belichick, a \$300,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, is a full-brother to the stakes-winning filly Season Ticket and a half to Broken Game (Broken Vow), a listed winner and group placed filly in Peru. Game produced a colt by Distorted Humor in 2019 followed by a full-sister to Belichick earlier this season. The French-bred mare was returned to Flintshire (GB) this year.

Biddy Duke (Bayern), sent off at 9-1, powered to the front in the early going and had to dig deep late to fend off the second choice **Jo Jo Air** (Scat Daddy) in the final strides of the GIII Senator Ken Maddy S. at Santa Anita Saturday. Comfortably clear through an initial quarter mile in :21.80, the 3-year-old watched her advantage dwindle as the 5-2 chance was just off her outside hip turning for home. Collared by her rival midstretch, the Doug O'Neill trainee fought back courageously late to gain her first taste of black-type by a head over Jo Jo Air.

"She's really fast and she's one of the smallest horses I've ever ridden," said winning rider Juan Hernandez, who was riding the filly for the first time. "I knew we were going fast, but she was comfortable, so I let her go. When she saw that other filly come to us, she really fought back. She's small but she's got a big heart."

Claimed for \$40,000 out of a winning race May 23, she hit the board in four subsequent starts, including a pair of Del Mar wins sprinting over the main track this summer. Most recently, she finished third in the Sept. 26 Unzip Me S.

"This filly has been so honest ever since we got her," said Leandro Mora, assistant to O'Neill. "The idea was just to not go to the lead, just go close to the lead..Juan said she never quit, when he asked her, she just came back and that's all you see."

Pedigree Notes:

With the victory, Biddy Duke becomes the first graded stakes winner for her sire Bayern. The winner's dam Ghostslayer is also responsible for Ghostlyprince, a juvenile colt by Cairo Prince, in addition to an unnamed yearling filly by Street Sense. Earlier this term, she produced a colt by City of Light and was bred back t Arrogate.

KEENELAND'S BECKER POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Keeneland track announcer Kurt Becker has tested positive for COVID-19 and missed the final day of the track's fall meet Saturday, according to a statement from the track. Churchill Downs's Travis Stone replaced Becker in the booth Saturday.

According to the Keeneland release, Becker is experiencing only mild symptoms and is resting at home.

"We look forward to his speedy recovery and to welcoming him back for the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Keeneland on Nov. 6-7," the release says. Becker became the first (and only) announcer in the history of Keeneland in 1997 and is also an integral part of Keeneland's sales team, having worked for several years as a sales announcer.

GRAND SLAMS FOR GREAT NOTION, SHELDON RUSSELL ON MD MILLION DAY

Great Notion, Maryland's annual leading sire by earnings since 2018, showcased the prowess of his progeny on the 35th Jim McKay Maryland Million program at Laurel Park Saturday by accounting for four of the eight winners of stakes carded for the offspring of stallions standing in Maryland. The grand slam marks the 11th consecutive year that Great Notion has sired at least one winner on Maryland

Million day.

Not to be outdone, jockey Sheldon Russell blasted home a quartet of winners as well, three of them in stakes. He captured top honors in the afternoon's feature with a nervy, forwardly placed 3 1/4-length victory aboard the 6-1 **Monday Morning Qb** (Imagining) in the \$150,000 Classic S.

Laurel's second-leading rider in both wins and earnings at the current meet also rallied from last to nail the \$100,000 Turf S. by a length with 15-1



Code), all of whom went on to either win or hit the board in Grade I stakes.

After an 11th-place turf try in a stakes on the GI Preakness S. undercard, trainer Butch Reid Jr. refocused on the Maryland Million's calling-card race for Monday Morning Qb, and the large-framed colt ended up being the only 3-year-old in the Classic.

"We'll digest this one a little bit. I'm hoping we can find one more 3-year-old race before the end of the year, but they're going to be difficult to find," Reid said. "I've taken some stalls at

> Palm Meadows this winter so he'll probably end up down there with us." This year the Turf was elongated from a mile to nine furlongs, and Pretty Good Year, who was third in the 2019 edition, showed he appreciated the added real estate by uncorking a wide-and-driving tailgate move under Russell to earn the win for Lead Off Stable, whose principal, Bobby Goodyear, is the racing manager for the 4-year-old gelding's breeder, The Elkstone Group.

Pretty Good Year (Great Notion). And Russell seemed like he was just along for the front-running ride about the day's most impressive winner, the \$100,000 Distaff H.'s 1-2 favorite, **Hello Beautiful** (Golden Lad), an 11 1/4-length victress trained by the jockey's wife, Brittany Russell.

Owner/breeders came out on top in three Million divisions Oct. 24. But none championed the cause for smaller outfits better than Great Notion's final winner of the day, **Karan's Notion**, who wired the \$100,000 Sprint H. field by a length at 16-1 for owner/breeder/trainer Nancy Heil and jockey Yomar Ortiz.

"I don't believe it's real yet. I've been training 50-some years, but I've never had a [Maryland Million] eligible horse," said Heil, who entered the day with two wins from just 15 starters in 2020. "When he was a baby, he had these long legs, like spider legs, and we said, 'I think he's going to be the one.'

"Never give up," Heil added emphatically.

Monday Morning Qb apparently took Heil's advice to heart in the nine-furlong Classic. Earlier this season, the Cash is King and LC Racing color bearer held his own in open-company races behind deeper-end-of-the-pool sophomores like Happy Saver (Super Saver), Ny Traffic (Cross Traffic) and Max Player (Honor Beyond the play-on-words naming that ties together owner and horse, Pretty Good Year also happens to be Goodyear's only campaigner.

"Distance has always been his thing," trainer Kelly Rubley said. "We keep hitting these one-turn miles here and he hits the board and he picks up checks, but the longer the better for him. At the three-eighths pole, I'm thinking, 'Oh my God, we have a lot of horse."

A return to her home court after a last-place stakes foray to Ellis Park and a Grade II stakes sixth at Saratoga Race Course was the turnaround spark that ignited Hello Beautiful's dazzling romp in the Distaff H. over seven furlongs.

Owned in partnership by Madaket Stables, Albert Frassetto, Mark Parkinson, K-Mac Stables and Magic City Stables, all of the 3-year-old filly's five wins have now come over the Laurel main track--by a gaudy aggregate of 40 1/2 lengths.

Brittany Russell said that last year's champion Maryland-bred juvenile filly is not only special in her own right, but that Hello Beautiful's sparkling career arc has enabled her training business to grow in Maryland by attracting the attention of new owners who have entrusted Russell with fresh stock. "It's huge. It's very emotional. She's been a big part of my career. I have clients and horses in the barn because of her," Brittany Russell said.

In the Maryland Million's pair of six-furlong juvenile stakes, the male division produced the flashier winner from a visual perspective. But the filly division produced the faster clocking.

In the \$100,000 Maryland Million Nursery, trainer Dale Capuano saddled the one-two finishers.

Owned in partnership by with Louis Ulman and Neil Glasser, **Kenny Had a Notion** (Great Notion) ran his lifetime record to 3-for-4 with an inside stalking bid during which he first had to be ridden with restraint by jockey Jorge Ruiz to avoid running up into a tight pocket at the rail. But when given his head and clear passage, "Kenny" slipped deftly through at the fence, spurted clear, and left a number of legit chasers sputtering in his five-length wake.

Stablemate **Alwaysinahurry** rounded out the Great Notion-sired and Capuano-trained exacta.

"They're both nice," Capuano said. "Kenny is getting better and so is Alwaysinahurry. [Kenny] showed more speed than I thought he would. He was on the bit very early and the rider had to just get a seam and lucky the rail opened up and he got through."

In the \$100,000 Maryland Million Lassie, **Miss Nondescript** (Mossler) stalked from fourth in a strung-out field, advanced at will on far turn, then responded to deep-stretch urging from Trevor McCarthy in a long outside drive to prevail by a hard-fought neck.

Now 2-for-2 for owner/breeder Barak Farm, Miss Nondescript followed up her pace-pressing Monmouth Park maiden victory by showing a new dimension in rating from farther back.

Her victory represented the first stakes winner for freshman sire Mosler, who was a GSP turf sprint and middle-distance specialist. Although primarily based in New York for trainer Bill Mott, one of Mosler's two stakes wins occurred over the Laurel grass course at six furlongs in the 2016 Laurel Dash.

The final clocking in the Lassie (1:10.13) bested the same-distance time produced three races later in the Nursery (1:10.55).



Stablemate **Belichick** (Lemon Drop Kid) halts Mighty Heart's Triple Crown bid in Breeders' S. This year marked the return of the \$100,000 Turf Sprint H. to the Maryland Million program following a seven-year absence. It had been won in each of its final three years by the late Maryland fan favorite Ben's Cat.

Fiya (Friesan Fire), who began his career last November as a \$25,000 maiden-claimer but was purchased for \$400,000 at the Wanamaker's July online sale after a 98-Beyer win that was .25 seconds off the Laurel turf course record for 5 1/2 furlongs, got pounded to 1-10 odds for the grass dash over the same distance on Saturday. He delivered with a 2 1/4-length tally that lifted his 2020 record to 4-for-4. Tom Albertrani trains for owner Robert Masiello. It was one of three wins on the day for jockey Trevor McCarthy.

Vivian Rall's homebred **Epic Idea** (Great Notion), a two-time winner sprinting on the turf, successfully stretched out to 1 1/8 miles to win by three-quarters of a length, garnering her first career stakes win in the \$100,000 Maryland Million Ladies S. The 5-1 wire-to-wire victress was ridden by McCarthy and trained by Ann Merryman.

V. E. DAY'S FIRST CROP OF KENTUCKY-BREDS BOUND FOR FASIG-TIPTON

Grade I-winning millionaire **V. E. Day** (English Channel) will be represented by his first crop of Kentucky-bred yearlings at the upcoming Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Yearlings Sale scheduled to be held Oct. 26-29.

Owned by Magalen Ohrstrom Bryant, the son of English Channel won the Curlin S. at three before capturing the 2014 GI Travers S. over Wicked Strong (Hard Spun). At four, he ran second in the GII Brooklyn Invitational S. He stood his first season at stud at Waldorf Farm in New York before relocating to Doug Arnold's Buck Pond Farm for the 2018 season.

Arnold says that while V. E. Day hasn't yet bred an abundance of mares, his first few crops have proven to be classic-looking individuals.

"As a group, they're very good," Arnold said. "He's producing size in his foals, as well as big shoulders and big hips. They look like they'll be able to run late in their 2-year-old year and be more of two-turn-type horses going forward. All the foals look like him. He's a beautiful horse. All the things you need to have to be a good sire--wide chest, plenty of bone, good feet--he's throwing."

Arnold added that he believes the millionaire's pedigree has all the makings of a successful sire. His second dam, Our Dear Sue (Roberto), is a stakes producer and full sister to champion grass horse Sunshine Forever.

"V. E. Day comes from a great stallion family," Arnold said. "The blood in the family is impeccable. English Channel has ended up being a great sire of horses that have an outstanding turn of foot on the turf. A lot of the genetics on both sides are incredibly strong towards producing a big-time stallion."

Six yearlings by V. E. Day will be offered through the Buck Pond consignment at the Kentucky October Yearlings Sale.

Arnold said that while the entire group shows promise, he

finds Hip 116 to be a particular standout.

The yearling filly is out of the Irish-bred mare Hope Cross (Cape Cross), a Grade III-placed winner of over \$250,000 that hails from the family of British-raced Group 3 winners Sir Ron Priestley (Australia) and Subjectivist (Teofilo).

"Hope Cross is a lovely mare and this filly is a very classic, twoturn-looking filly that I think is a great representation of the best parts of V. E. Day," Arnold said.

Johnathan Miller serves as advisor to Bryant and co-owns a Fasig-bound yearling with the stallion owner. The colt out of the Holy Bull mare Holy Beast will sell as Hip 105.

"This is only her third foal, but Doug told me he's an absolutely awesome-looking horse," Miller said. "Of the six V. E. Day yearlings that are selling, this is one of the ones we're highest on."

While the dual stakes winner shone brightest on the dirt, V. E. Day was also a winner on the turf and his sire line shows all the potential for him to pass on such versatility.

"We're hoping that not only can they be precocious enough to win at two, but also that they can follow in their father's footsteps and be able to run a Classic distance," Arnold said. "Hopefully they'll run on the dirt and the turf as the English Channels have."

GAFFALIONE, COX & M AND M RACING TOP STANDINGS AT KEENELAND FALL MEET

Keeneland's fall meet concluded Saturday with jockey Tyler Gaffalione, trainer Brad Cox and Mike Sisk's M and M Racing topping the standings in their respective categories.

Gaffalione was the clear leader in the rider standings with 24 victories, including a win aboard Got Stormy (Get Stormy) in the GIII Buffalo Trace Franklin County S. Cox edged out Mike Maker and Steve Asmussen on the final day of the meet, scoring 15 wins, highlighted by Essential Quality's (Tapit) victory in the GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity S. Earning its first Keeneland title, M and M Racing accounted for five winners at the fall meet.

"On behalf of Keeneland, our sincerest thanks to our fans across the country and around the world, and our racing participants, sponsors, industry and community partners and employees who enabled us to hold a safe, competitive Fall Meet during these unprecedented times," said Keeneland President and CEO Bill Thomason, who presided over his final race meet before his retirement Dec. 31. "The silver lining of this pandemic has been the collaboration and creativity of various constituencies in their steadfast support of Thoroughbred racing and our philanthropic mission. There is a true spirit of coming together for the good of all."

The fall meet was closed to the public due to COVID-19, but fans wagered \$148,229,708 during the 17 days of racing from Oct. 2-24. The average daily handle was \$8,719,395. Last year's all-sources wagering handle was a record \$160,207,916 for a meet also lasting 17 days, albeit with fans.

With the limited on-track attendance, on-track handle was \$2,477,890 with average daily on-track handle at \$145,758. In comparison, the 2019 fall meet had an on-track handle of \$17,320,852.

"Historically, Keeneland ranks among the top tracks in North America in terms of average daily attendance and enjoys some of the highest on-track handle figures," Keeneland Vice President of Racing Bob Elliston said. "The difference in all-sources wagering this fall versus last comes down to the loss in on-track wagering."

MONMOUTH MEET CLOSES ON A HIGH

Monmouth Park showed increases in both the daily transmission of its signal and in total average handle compared to 2019 during the combined 44-day meet that concluded Saturday. Monmouth Park's average daily simulcast handle increased 27.09% to \$3,604,413 daily compared to \$2,836,148 last year. The overall average handle was up 20.81% to \$3,807,082 daily compared to \$3,151,201 last year.

"We are so grateful to everyone for supporting this extraordinary meet and, more specifically, the Governor's Office and the New Jersey Racing Commission for allowing us the ability not only to race, but to do so with fans," said Dennis Drazin, Chairman and CEO of Darby Development LLC, operators of the racetrack. "And once we were green lit for racing, the entire Monmouth Park staff worked tirelessly to ensure not just great racing, but a safe environment for everyone. We couldn't be more proud to report zero cases of COVID-19 over the course of our entire meet, and the credit goes to the horsemen and fans who not only followed the necessary guidelines, but collectively cooperated to ensure each person's safety.

Drazin continued, "[Track Medical Director] Dr. Angelo Chinnici and his entire team deserve special recognition for their efforts and, literally, around the clock work. Our success this season is rooted in their dedication and Monmouth Park is better off because of Angelo."

The Monmouth Park meet that ran from July 3 to Sept. 27 consisted of 36 racing days after one live card was lost due to weather. The Meadowlands-at-Monmouth in the month of October provided an additional eight days of racing after one was canceled to weather as well. Last year's racing season was 68 days.

The track operated with attendance restrictions throughout the 2020 season under COVID-19 guidelines. Opening day was delayed from its original starting date of May 2 to July 3 due to the coronavirus, with racing calendar reduced from 56 days to 37 as a result.

During the abbreviated Meadowlands-at-Monmouth Park meet jockey Jose Ferrer was the leading rider with 11 winners over the eight live racing cards. Wayne Potts topped the trainer standings with seven winners.

Trainer Kelly Breen, who captured his third Monmouth Park training title during the summer meet, ended the New Jersey racing season with a flourish by winning three races on Saturday's 11-race card, including two of the three Jersey-bred stake races.

JAMES BRADY PASSES AWAY AT 85

James C. Brady, a longtime Thoroughbred owner and breeder and officer of The Jockey Club, passed away at his home in Bedminster, N.J., Thursday, Oct. 22. He was 85.

On behalf of his brother, Nicholas Brady, a former chairman of The Jockey Club, U.S. Senator, and Treasury Secretary, and sisters Lisa Richards and Eliot Stewart, Brady managed Mill House Racing Stable, which raced prominent runners America Alive (American Chance), Brilliant (War Chant), Trappe Shot (Tapit), and Rattlesnake Bridge (Tapit).

Born in New York, N.Y., to parents James C. and Eliot (nee Chace) Brady, he attended St. Paul's School in Concord, N.H., and Yale University in New Haven, Conn., where he played varsity ice hockey.

Brady served as general partner of Mill House Associates, successor to Brady Security & Realty Corporation and he began work at Bankers Trust Company in 1957, resigning to take a position in New Jersey Governor William T. Cahill's Cabinet as commissioner of banking, where he helped plan the development of the Meadowlands Sports Complex, including Giants Stadium and the Meadowlands Racetrack.

In 1983, Brady was appointed secretary-treasurer of The Jockey Club, joining newly elected chairman Ogden Mills Phipps and vice chairman William S. Farish. The trio led a three-decade period of growth of The Jockey Club, establishing new commercial business, including Equibase Company and several technology-based service and data businesses. Proceeds from the commercial subsidiaries fueled increasing investments in the marketing of Thoroughbred racing and research and advocacy for improved safety and integrity of the sport. Brady's nephew, Ian Highet, succeeded him as secretary-treasurer of The Jockey Club in 2010, and Brady remained on the board of stewards until 2013.

The Brady family has been involved in Thoroughbred racing for more than 100 years, beginning with Brady's grandfather, financier James Cox Brady, who developed the 5,000-acre Hamilton Farms in New Jersey and bred and raced the champion War Feathers. Brady's father, also James Cox Brady, was a steward of The Jockey Club and bred and raced 16 stakes winners, including Classic winners in England and Ireland, in addition to a champion in America. He was chairman of the New York Racing Association for eight years, during which Belmont Park was built, and also a founding director of the Monmouth Park Jockey Club.

He is survived by his wife of 63 years, Joan Babcock Brady; his siblings; son James C. Brady III and his wife, Anne Lusk Brady; daughter Joan "Nonie" Brady and her husband, Wilhelm Merck; and daughter Kerry Chace Brady and her partner, Brock Dolman. He had two granddaughters, Audrey Slade Brady and Millicent McKay Brady.

A private family funeral was held [Saturday, Oct. 24] at St. Brigid's Church in Peapack, N.J. A memorial service celebrating his life is to be held in the spring of 2021. In lieu of flowers, donations in Brady's memory may be made to LifeCamp, a summer camp for inner city youth, long supported by the Brady family.

BC ANNOUNCES SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR '20 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Breeders' Cup Limited outlined a detailed set of health and safety protocols put in place to mitigate the risks associated with COVID-19 for the limited staff, participants and essential personnel who will be onsite at the 2020 Breeders' Cup World Championships at Keeneland Race Course Nov. 6-7.

This plan was developed in consultation with Keeneland, local and state government officials, and public health experts, including Dr. Richard Greenberg--Professor of Medicine, Division of Infectious Diseases, at the University of Kentucky School of Medicine. The plan closely follows the guidance established by the Healthy at Work requirements for venues and event spaces, bars and restaurants established by the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Last month, Breeders' Cup announced that the event will be run without spectators and attendance would be limited to racing participants and essential personnel only.

"The health and safety of our participants, employees, athletes, associates and the broader Lexington community are our top priorities," said Breeders' Cup President and CEO Drew Fleming.

Dr. Greenberg added, "The important health and safety measures and capacity restrictions that Breeders' Cup and Keeneland have put in place for this year's event, including testing, face coverings, physical distancing and medical screening requirements, will go a long way in protecting the wellbeing of the limited number of attendees."

INTO MISCHIEF FIRSTER OVERCOMES TROUBLE TO BECOME A 'RISING STAR'

Juddmonte Farms homebred **Mandaloun** (Into Mischief) took the lion's share of the pari-mutuel activity at 11-10 and the bay managed to overcome an eventful trip to graduate at first asking in the Saturday finale from Keeneland, good for the '**TDN Rising Star**' designation.

Away in good order from the middle of the gate, Mandaloun raced in and among rivals down the backstretch, never looking entirely comfortable in transit and lost several spots into the turn. Under a ride fully 3 1/2 furlongs from home, the colt was taken hold of while short of room and with only two rivals beaten at the quarter pole. Hard-ridden into the final furlong and a half, Mandaloun brushed on a couple of occasions with Americanrevolution (Constitution) at the eighth pole, but he was ultimately steered down to the inside by Florent Geroux and fought his way past a game Bob's Edge (Competitive Edge) to score by a hard-fought half-length.

Mandaloun is bred on the same Into Mischief cross over Empire Maker as Juddmonte's late MSW '**Rising Star**' Taraz and is bred similarly to fellow '**Rising Star**' Honest Mischief, whose dam Honest Lady (Seattle Slew) is a half-sister to Empire Maker. Mandaloun's female family also includes G1 Matron S. winner Emulous (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and the globetrotting German Group 3 winner Alounak (Fr) (Camelot {GB}), runner-up in the GI Canadian International S.

Brooch, a dual group winner while under the care of Dermot Weld in Ireland, produced a full-brother to Mandaloun in 2019 which sadly passed away this year and is represented by a weanling Into Mischief colt. She was most recently bred to War Front.

AVENGERS UNVEIL ANOTHER SPEEDY EMPIRE MAKER COLT

Classier (Empire Maker) became the latest flashy colt unveiled by Bob Baffert and the stallion-making conglomerate nicknamed The Avengers as he streaked home an impressive winner at Santa Anita Saturday worthy of a '**TDN Rising Star**' **nod**.

Having tuned up for this with a head-turning six-furlong work from the gate on Monday (6f, 1:12.40, 1/3, XBTV Video), the bay was let go at generous 7-2 odds as two foes with experience took more attention. Off a bit sluggishly from his rail draw, Classier quickly recovered to take command and zip away take a clear lead. He blew the race apart through a :45.68 half, and was never for catching as he continued on to the wire four lengths clear in a display of speed reminiscent of the connections' 2019 GI American Pharoah S. winner and '**Rising Star**' Eight Rings (Empire Maker). Second timer Go On (Nyquist) completed the exacta.

Classier is out of a half-sister to the dam of French and U.S. GSW/MGISP Homerique (Exchange Rate). His third dam produced Group 1 winner White Moonstone (Dynaformer). Dam Class Will Tell, by one of the hottest broodmare sires on the planet in Bernardini, has a yearling colt by Tiznow who sold for just \$12,000 at KEESEP and a foal filly by Union Rags. 

Defending Empire Classic H. hero Mr. Buff strung together a trio of dominant performances at Aqueduct over the winter, including a 20-length romp in the restricted Haynesfield S. Feb. 22. He settled for second to Funny Guy (Big Brown) in the June 12 Commentator S. over a one-turn local mile, and was fifth in both the GII Suburban S. July 4 and Saratoga's GI Whitney S. Aug. 1. Wresting the lead from Sea Foam down the backside, the strapping chestnut snuck away through six furlongs in 1:11.50 and continued on powerfully in the stretch.

"He really didn't come back to the form he showed last spring for [awhile], so to see him run this race, it was [satisfying], because he was breezing very well," said winning conditioner John Kimmel. "Even though horses can show it's coming to them easy in the mornings, doing it in the afternoon can be a little trying on your nerves because he's a 6-year-old and you wonder if it's getting to the tail-end of his career. But we're really happy for Mr. Buff and the Bromans. This horse looks like his nice career will continue."

Kimmel added, "He's a 17.1 [hands] horse with a huge stride length. When he gets out there and gets in that comfortable rhythm, the key is to get to the top of the lane and switch to his outside lead turning for home. I knew then it was over and there was no way there were going to beat him at that point."

Of owner/breeders Chester and Mary Broman, "They have been with me since their inception in the Thoroughbred game. They've been big supporters and sent me a lot of top well-bred New York-breds over the years... They have really taken the New York-bred program to another level. No one has done what they've] done and bred [their] mares to the best stallions in the marketplace--Tapit, Storm Cat, American Pharoah, Justify--[they've] really tried to prove that you can raise a good horse in New York."

Mr. Buff's sire Friend Or Foe (Friends Lake) took this event in 2010 by five lengths for the Bromans and Kimmel. The Bromans paid \$80,000 for his dam Speightful Affair at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky February Mixed Sale. At the half mile I asked her to pick it up and she responded really well."

Laobanonaprayer graduated in style with a decisive victory in the Maid of the Mist S., becoming the second black-type winner for her freshman sire (by Uncle Mo), who was recently relocated from Sequel New York to WinStar. Rallying to be third on debut sprinting at Delaware Sept. 14, she was second when extended to a mile there Oct. 5 and added blinkers for this black-type bow. The bay kept an eye on the tightly bunched quartet of front runners from fifth through a :22.93 opening quarter with her only other rival trailing behind her by several lengths. Keeping close to the group through a :46.5 half-mile, Laobanonaprayer ranged up two wide to tackled pace-setting Frost Me and wore down that rival, who was drifting in and out, in mid-stretch, drawing off in the final sixteenth to win as she pleased.

"What a way to break her maiden," said winning trainer Daniel Velazquez, who was scoring his first stakes victory. "We knew coming in that adding the blinkers was key; we were a little unhappy about her not switching leads last time. Kendrick [Carmouche] rode a perfect race. There was a hot pace up front."

He continued, "Laoban [sire] is extremely hot. We're just happy. We enjoy the New York breds. We have two New York-breds [also Velazquez also trains Sleepy Hollow S. winner Brooklyn Strong (Wicked Strong)]. It's a successful program."

The bay raced at the back of the pack, but well within range of the leaders through an opening half-mile in :47.17. Advancing two wide on the backstretch run, the gelding reeled in Eagle Orb in the final sixteenth and kicked clear to score under Jose Ortiz.

"He was five grand," said owner Mark Schwartz. "I was at the OBS during COVID. It started at \$50,000 and went down. I bid \$5,000 and got the horse and Danny [Velazquez] said I got a good one. It's very exciting for me. I've been doing this seven years. I've had a lot of claimers and I love horse racing so much."

"We came in very confident with both horses," Velazquez said. "We loved the distances for them. Jose [Ortiz] put this horse in the perfect spot and I knew when I saw him at the three-eighths pole just sitting, we got him."

Murphy S. at Pimlico Oct. 3.
