FROM CLAIMERS TO CLASSICS FOR AUMONERIE

While it was the multi-million Euro mares who stole the limelight at Arqana's December Breeding Stock Sale two weeks ago, there were successes to be celebrated beneath those top prices. Among the most remarkable of those has to be Haras de l'Aumonerie's Starspangledbanner (Aus) colt (lot 145), who was bought by Yeomanstown Stud for €170,000.

The colt, already named Captain Star (Fr), had plenty going for him on both sides of his pedigree, being by a popular sire and a brother to two stakes horses, including none other than this year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches victress Coeursamba (Fr) (The Wow Signal {Ire}). Captain Star and Coeursamba are out of the 15-year-old Marechale (Fr) (Anabaa), whose five foals thus far were all bred by Julie Mestrallet at her Haras de l'Aumonerie just outside Deauville.

With the recent high-end breeding stock sales still fresh in the memory, it is easy to become desensitized to mares commanding millions. But we are likewise reminded at every sale that there are diamonds in the rough, and Marechale certainly represents the latter scenario, having been bought by Mestrallet out of the claiming ranks for $\[\in \] 2,500$, having failed to win in 16 starts.

The path from claimer to breeding Guineas winners is not the most well-trodden one, but Mestrallet has done things her own way since taking over her mother, Francine Mestrallet's, Aumonerie 10 years ago and converting it from a reputable nursery for showjumpers and ponies into a Classic-producing Thoroughbred operation. An accomplished showjumper herself who also worked as a groom for Olympic-level riders, Julie Mestrallet then shifted her sights to the veterinary field, taking a job at a clinic.

One of the clinic's clients was Haras du Quesnay, and it was through visits to the Head family's historic stud that Mestrallet got to know the accomplished sires Anabaa and Bering. With her interest in racing suitably piqued, Mestrallet went to work for trainer Jennifer Bidgood, and it was during a trip to the small racecourse Niort in the West of France on June 13, 2010, that Mestrallet laid eyes on Marechale for the first time.

"I found Marechale in a claiming race, and even though she had no performances, I was interested in her because she is by Anabaa out of a Bering mare and bred by Quesnay," Mestrallet said. "I'm a huge fan of the Quesnay pedigrees and Alec Head."

Marechale, a full-sister to the multiple listed winner Maxwell (Fr), had been raced by the Head family through her first 10 starts, after which she joined trainer Philippe Le Gal. She was upped in trip by her new trainer, but that did little to turn Marechale's fortunes around, and she finished fifth at Niort that day for a €5,000 claiming tag.

Mestrallet recalled, "I went to see the trainer on the day and asked him how much the mare would cost. He said he wanted to

continue to run her in claiming races, but I gave him my phone number and said, 'the day you want to get rid of her, call me.'"

Just a month later, Mestrallet's phone rang.

"He said, 'I don't want her anymore,'" Mestrallet said. "He said he was going to race her one last time, and then he would let me buy her for €2,500."

The reasoning behind Marechale's first mating was relatively

straightforward: Mestrallet held a free nomination to Alexandros (GB), won through the French TBA's stallion seasons draw. The result was a filly, later named Comme Une Grande (Fr), that Mestrallet sold for €26,000 to Yohann Gourraud at Arqana's October Yearling Sale in 2014–not a bad return on an initial €2,500 investment. Meanwhile, Mestrallet's luck at the French TBA's stallion seasons draw had continued;


she won a nomination to Mr.

In addition to turning a few tidy profits for Mestrallet in the sales ring, Marechale soon proved a hardy producer. Comme Une Grand was a winner who ran 35 times, while Lady Sidney, all told, would run 56 times for seven wins, including a third in ParisLongchamp's Listed Prix Zarkava. After Lady Sidney, Marechale foaled the winning La Grande Zame (Fr) (Zambezi Sun {GB}), sold for €8,000 as a foal. The following season, Mestrallet once again returned victorious from the stallion seasons draw, securing a covering for Marechale to Sinndar (Ire), and that resulted in the ultimately unraced filly Twelveoclock (Fr), sold for €5,000 as a yearling in 2017. By that time, Marechale was in foal to G1 Prix Morny and G2 Coventry S. winner The Wow Signal, a decision based not on a free draw, but on Mestrallet's intuition. "I loved The Wow Signal's head, the way he walked, everything about the physical of the horse," she said.

Despite a very successful start to life, The Wow Signal's second career proved star-crossed; he was subfertile, and after getting a very small number of mares in foal during two seasons, died as a result of complications from laminitis. Among his second crop was Coeursamba, who was born at Aumonerie on Mar. 25, 2018. Like Marechale's latest Starspangledbanner colt, Captain Star, Mestrallet soon had a name picked out for the filly.

"She was something special from the day she was born," Mestrallet said. "I had named her, 'Wow She's Great,' but the people that bought her changed the name. When we saw Coeursamba, we liked her so much that we decided to breed the mare to Starspangledbanner immediately, because we were so happy with the filly that we thought the mare deserved to go to a good stallion." Coeursamba sold to Marc Antoine Berghgracht on behalf of Jose Delmotte's Haras d'Haspel for €24,000 at Arqana's December Sale of 2018, and was pinhooked to Jean-Claude Rouget for €40,000 at Arqana August the following summer, four months before Marechale's Olympic Glory (Ire) colt Senza Malocchio (Fr) sold for €14,000 to Marco Bozzi at the December Sale.

Senza Malocchio is raced by Mike Pietrangelo and John D'Amato, who were also co-owners of Olympic Glory's best progeny, Grand Glory (GB). Grand Glory sold for €2.5-million at Argana on the same night that Captain Star went through the ring. A winner in her second start at two for owner Jean Louis Tepper, Coeursamba was twice Group 3-placed at two and fifth in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac, the evening prior to which she

had changed hands for €400,000 at Argana's Arc Sale, bought by Abdullah bin Fahad Al Attiyah. Third in the Listed Prix du Louvre going a mile at ParisLongchamp in April, she shocked the G1 1000 Guineas winner Mother Earth (Ire) (Zoffany {Ire}) when winning the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at 38-1, and was later purchased privately by Katsumi Yoshida.

Coeursamba's Classic win provided the perfect springboard for her Starspangledbanner three-

quarter-brother to be one of the top-priced foals at Argana, and he is set to return to the ring next year as a Yeomanstown pinhook prospect. Marechale is currently in foal to another Group 1-winning sprinter, Haras d'Etreham's Hello Youmzain (Fr), and her foal's arrival will be keenly anticipated by not only Mestrallet but also her three young children; Mestrallet's daughter, Agathe, and twins sons Henri and Baptiste, born this past March. Agathe has been listed as co-breeder along with her mother and grandmother on Coeursamba, Senza Malocchio and Captain Star, but she will have to share Marechale's future progeny with her brothers.

"It was to pay for her car when she turns 18," Mestrallet laughed. "I had twin boys this year, and they'll all be marked down as breeders in the future: the boys will get the colts, and Agathe will get the fillies."

Today, Aumonerie is home to some 30 mares, the majority of which are boarders. Among Mestrallet's own mares are the 10year-old Caramanta (Fr) (Zamindar), who Mestrallet bought for €7,500 from the Aga Khan Studs at the 2014 Argana December Sale. Caramanta's third foal is Caracal (Fr) (Zelzal {Fr}), who was bought by Al Shaqab Racing for €25,000 at Arqana October last

year. Caracal won a pair of races at Bordeaux Le Bouscat for trainer Jean-Claude Rouget this autumn and is reportedly highly regarded by the trainer. Mestrallet has also repatriated two of Marechale's daughters, Comme Une Grand and Twelveoclock, to Aumonerie, such is her belief in her foundation mare. Comme Une Grand had a colt by Seahenge this year, while Twelveoclock was purchased at this year's Julie Mestrallet and daughter Agathe, co-breeder of Coeursamba Argana July Sale in foal to

Recoletos (Ire). Mestrallet also

has O'Keefe (Fr) (Peintre Celebre), a Wertheimer-bred mare that she purchased for €19,000 in 2012. Using her tried and true system of French TBA draw nominations, Mestrallet bred O'Keefe to Jukebox Jury (Ire) for her first mating, and the result was the G3 St Leger Italiano winner O'Juke (Fr).

And of course there is Marechale, the €2,500 former claimer turned Classic producer. Asked if she has considered cashing in on the mare's success and selling Marechale, Mestrallet was resolute in response.

"I have had offers for Marechale, but I am keeping her," she said. "She has given everything to my farm."

Dubai Warrior, winner of this test in 2019 and third last year, was unsuccessful in five outings since garnering last term's Listed Churchill S. over this strip and stepped forward in his third start for the David Loughnane stable to embellish a resume which also includes a 2020 G3 Winter Derby success. Steadied behind the leaders to occupy a midfield berth in fifth after breaking with the front rank, he went forward into second approaching the home turn and kept on resolutely under a drive once taking over at the top of the straight to just hold the late bid of Regal Reality (GB) (Intello {Ger}) for a fourth black-type score.

"Dubai Warrior's a class horse, he's very good around here and it is brilliant to get a winner on the board for his owner," said Loughnane. "He is a very easy horse to train, we don't have to do too much with him at home and he maps out his own races.

Richard [Kingscote] gave him a great ride and, once this horse gets rolling, it takes a good one to go with him. The aim now will be the [G3] Winter Derby and then Finals Day itself will be a long-term target. I would think he will come back here for the [Listed] Winter Derby Trial as well."

Dubai Warrior, the third of five foals, is one of three winners produced by G1 Golden Slipper-winning South African champion Mahbooba (Aus) (Galileo {Ire}). The March-foaled homebred bay is a full-brother to G3 Diamond S. victor Mootasadir (GB) and hails from a family featuring GISW US champion Shamrock Rose (First Dude) and MGSW sire Slew the Red (Red Ransom).

THOROUGHBRED COMMUNITY RAISES TORNADO RELIEF FUNDS



Destruction from the Dec. 11 tornado in Mayfield, Kentucky

LEXINGTON, KY--Kentuckians across the Commonwealth woke up with a text on Saturday morning: 'Are you okay?' For most, it was an uneventful night aside from perhaps being awakened once or twice to the sound of high winds. But for some, unimaginable destruction and immeasurable damage occurred overnight as a catastrophic tornado hit western Kentucky.

As of Friday, 77 Kentuckians have lost their lives due to a storm that is expected to have affected an estimated 227 miles, *according to WLKY News*.

Bradley Boyd, a professional Quarter Horse trainer based in Princeton, Kentucky, sent his children to the basement Friday evening when he heard news of the approaching tornado.

"The tornado passed about a mile behind our place," the horseman recounted. "I watched it pass at 10:21 that evening; I'll always remember the time. By 10:40, I'd had a phone call from one of my best friends. It had killed three of his horses and his place was just gone."

As Americans awoke the next morning to news of the devastation, Boyd drove to what was left of his friend's farm.

"By the time I got there, they had caught their horses so we just went digging stuff out of their house," he said.

"It's heartbreaking to see people who build and build and have it all taken at one time. It's heartbreaking. But to watch the horse community come together since this has happened, it has been incredible. It's one of my favorite things about the horse community, that when it comes to these horses, everyone steps up."

It didn't take long for the Thoroughbred community to jump into action. On Sunday, the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association (KTA) launched a GoFundMe page to aid in the relief efforts, kicking the fund off with a \$7,500 contribution.

"It's something that the Thoroughbred industry has done in the past, most recently this February when there was some major flooding in Southeast Kentucky," said KTA Executive Director Chauncey Morris. "We have a bit of experience not only in raising funds, but in figuring out what exactly to do with them when emergency strikes."

As funds started to pour in, Morris got in touch with Don Campbell, a Thoroughbred trainer from Princeton and the next-door neighbor to Boyd, to find out what the immediate needs were for horse owners and farms in the area.

"Our farm didn't really have any damage," said Campbell. "You can't even count it compared to what other people have. Most of the people who got hit lost everything--houses, barns, fencing, all their supplies, trailers, cars. It wasn't a typical Kentucky tornado where something gets torn up and something else gets left behind. It was more like if you were in the path of it, you just got wiped out. You can see the pictures, but it's nothing like it is in person. It's like a war zone."

Chauncey, Campbell and Boyd arranged to open up Boyd Performance Horses as a supply distribution center.

"Chauncey had told us to be ready because they were going to send a bunch our way," Boyd said. "I told them to bring it on and

that we would make it happen one way or another."

Since Tuesday, the KTA has organized shipments of hay, grain, water hoses, dog food, fencing and various supplies, working with agricultural centers in the area to help distribute incoming supplies to surrounding communities.

"The ag centers are sending people here to come pick things up and everyone is just overwhelmed with how much support we're getting," Campbell said. "But still, we're getting more calls than we have stuff. I had 40 buckets sitting in a barn that I had kept over the years. I took them over to the distribution center and they were gone after an hour."

"Just today alone, we've probably sent out almost 20,000 pounds of feed between hay and grain," Boyd said on Thursday. "We're glad to be able to help in any way we can, but without Don and the KTA, we wouldn't be able to do any of this right now."

"We just heard that a semi load of treated fence posts will be here on Monday," Campbell said. "Chauncey has been ringing my phone off the wall to see what our needs are. I'm not talking about them sending a few pickup loads. Everything they're wanting to do is with semis. The way the Thoroughbred industry has stepped up has been unbelievable. That's the best way for me to put it and I'm proud to be a part of it."

While the KTA will continue to provide necessary supplies for farms in western Kentucky, they are also beginning to look toward the future to determine how to best allocate their growing funds as the rebuilding process begins.

"We're taking care of immediate needs now, but for the medium and long term, we know that historically, federal disaster relief doesn't always pay for everything and some people fall through the cracks," Morris said. "FEMA and SBA programs do not generally pay for people who are renting their apartments, homes or trailers. So that's where hopefully we can come in and help."

Morris explained that the custodian for the funds raised through their GoFundMe will be the Foundation for Appalachia Kentucky. The Hazard-based organization is the same group the KTA worked with when they raised money for flood relief earlier this year and the program has already partnered with another organization in Paducah called the Community Foundation of West Kentucky.

"The scale of this disaster is so big and our industry generally has a very big heart," Morris said. "Here in Kentucky, it's not lost on anyone just how good things are in the Thoroughbred business since the HHR bill was passed. We have a lot to be grateful for and this is our way of being good citizens of the Commonwealth of Kentucky."

The KTA's GoFundMe has received major donations from outlets including The Jockey Club, Juddmonte Farms,

"This is a terrible tragedy and our donation represents our entire farm and our dedication to our brothers and sisters in need," said the farm's owner Eric Gustavson. "We so appreciate the KTA, UK and every other organization that has stepped up to serve."

Claiborne Farm also contributed to the relief fund.


"It's awesome to see the Thoroughbred business come together and raise so much money for those whose lives have been turned upside down," Claiborne President Walker Hancock said. "In times of need, we are quick to lend a hand, which makes me so proud to be a part of this wonderful business."

Hancock was featured on a local news outlet this week after discovering a family photo in one of the farm's paddocks on Saturday morning and suspecting that it might have come from an area affected by the tornado.

"I saw some mares sniffing it, I thought it might be a piece of trash I didn't want them to ingest so I jumped the fence and grabbed it and sure enough it happened to be this picture," Hancock told *WKYT* on Wednesday.

Relatives of the two children in the photograph saw the story run on *WKYT* and notified the family, who lives over 100 miles away from Claiborne in Campbellsville, Kentucky.

Another high-profile stud farm in Lexington has helped raise awareness for the KTA relief fund as Coolmore's Ashford Stud auctioned off a 2022 season to Triple Crown winner Justify with the proceeds benefiting the fund. The bidding was announced on Monday and closed on Friday, with a winning bid of \$95,000

from Craig Bernick. Additional bidders included Ken Donworth, Dennis Drazin and Bobby Rankin.

Coolmore will be making an additional donation along with the proceeds raised from the Justify season.

"One of the greatest things about this business is that even though we are competitors in certain aspects, when times are tough and the need is there, the horse business shows great solidarity," said Coolmore's Adrian Wallace. "It's great to see farms, veterinary practices, breeders and trainers come together to help out. Western Kentucky has been very good to the horse business and it's time that we show our appreciation and help out where we can. Even though it won't bring these lives back, hopefully it will help ease the suffering that a lot of these people are going through."

Other racing organizations have also stepped up in the past week. Breeders' Cup donated \$50,000 to disaster relief efforts, splitting the donation evenly between the KTA fund and the University of Kentucky's "Kentucky United for Tornado Relief" telethon, and the Kentucky HBPA donated \$25,000 to the Team Western Kentucky Tornado Relief Fund organized by Governor Andy Beshear's office.

Several fundraising events have been organized by Lexington's equine community and will be happening in the coming weeks.

Multiple equine-related groups including the Kentucky Horse

Council have joined forces to organize a supply drive for equine-specific needs. Donations including buckets, winter blankets, halters, lead ropes, wheelbarrows and water hoses can be dropped off at the Kentucky Horse Park's Alltech Arena from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Dec. 18-20. Donated goods will be delivered on Tuesday by Brook Ledge Horse Transportation. Learn more here.

On Sunday, Jan. 2, Frank & Dino's restaurant in downtown Lexington will serve complimentary food and drinks from 12 p.m. to 8 p.m. All proceeds will benefit the families in Mayfield affected by the tornado. Owner/breeder/trainer and Frank & Dino's managing partner Carlo Vaccarezza spoke with *the TDN* on Thursday regarding the event.

Center Aisle, a sharp debut winner at Gulfstream for Chad Brown last March, completed the trifecta behind Frank's Rockette in last term's GIII Victory Ride S. at Belmont as well as the GII Prioress S. at Saratoga. Transferred to Paulo Lobo for her 4-year-old campaign, the bay scored in front-running fashion in her first two tries this season--a sloppy Keeneland allowance Oct. 15 over a next-out winner and an optional claimer at Churchill Downs last time Nov. 20, respectively.

Lobo said that the plan is to send Center Aisle back to Kentucky for a freshening before returning to South Florida for the seven-furlong GII Inside Information S. at Gulfstream Jan. 29.

"She was coming into this race ready from two very nice races," Lobo said. "She's a very special mare. I think she has a bright future. I felt good because the body language of Saez, she looked very comfortable outside and when they came home, my feeling was very good."

Saez added, "The other filly was running pretty fast. But I had a lot of horse, and we came to the top of the stretch, she gave me another kick. At that point, we knew we had horse to fight, and she did it. She did it pretty impressively."

Pedigree Notes:

Center Aisle, a \$1.5-million FTFMAR purchase by Larry Best's OXO Equine and the highest-priced filly out of that sale after breezing a quarter in a powerful :20 3/5, becomes the 105th stakes winner/46th graded stakes winner for her all-conquering sire Into Mischief. She becomes the 65th stakes winner/29th graded winner for her late broodmare sire Empire Maker.

The Into Mischief/Empire Maker cross is also responsible for GI TVG.com Haskell S. winner via disqualification and GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Mandaloun.

Juddmonte homebred Specification, a maiden of two career starts, produced a colt by Goldencents this year and was bred back to Vino Rosso.

The winner's dam is a half-sister to dual GI Pacific Classic winner Skimming (Nureyev). She is out of five-time graded stakes victress Skimble (Lyphard).

Specification was a \$37,000 Keeneland November purchase by Todd and Shawn Hansen in 2017 when followed into the ring by then-weanling Center Aisle.



DOSWELL DOES IT IN FT. LAUDERDALE

Joseph Allen homebred **Doswell** (Giant's Causeway) hadn't seen the inside of a winner's circle since October 2020, however, marked his return with aplomb, scoring by a frontrunning, 1 1/2-length margin over longshot **Atone** (Into Mischief) in Saturday's GII Ft. Lauderdale S. at Gulfstream.

Sent to the front by Junior Alvarado straight away, the 9-2 shot showed the way as the stalking duo of GSW **Analyze It** (Point of Entry) and **English Bee** (English Channel) kept him in their sights. Still in front and moving well with a half mile left to negotiate, Doswell ramped up the tempo as 17-1 chance Atone burst on the scene approaching the quarter pole, spurted clear in early stretch and finished up with good energy late to win. English Bee held on for third, only a half-length adrift of the runner up.

"He broke good, I put him on the engine a little bit and then tried to slow him down, and he rated kindly for me," said Alvarado. "When we turned for home, I asked him and he gave me a nice kick. I knew they were in trouble as soon as I started asking him, because he picked it up very quickly and I thought they'd have to be flying at the end to go by."

A front-running victor in a Belmont allowance in October 2020, the dark bay finished runner up in this race last December before coming home third in the GIII W. L. McKnight S. in January. Sidelined after that effort, he didn't return to racing for nine months before running third in back-to-back optional claiming allowances Oct. 21 at Belmont and most recently, at Aqueduct Nov. 19.

"It was nice and easy," added Alvarado of Saturday's effort.
"Last year, they kind of told me to try to see if he would stalk to make sure he would finish strong, and we kind of took away his main [weapon]. Today, they told me, 'You're in the one [post], just leave out of there rolling,' and that's what I did."

And is the GI Pegasus World Cup Turf in January in the cards for the 6-year-old?

"We're thinking about it. We'll probably go in it," said winning trainer Barclay Tagg. "We'll see how he comes out of this. We'll see if he freshens up and if he's got [good] energy. I don't want to take him over there and just make a fool out of him if we can help it."

Pedigree Notes:

The late, great Giant's Causeway, gone since the spring of 2018, continues to churn out stakes winners. The classy chestnut stood the whole of his career at Coolmore locations

around the globe, but had his greatest success as a stallion during his longstanding engagement in Kentucky. The 6-year-old Doswell became the 164th Northern Hemisphere-foaled blacktype winner for his sire and the 98th graded.

In contrast to Giant's Causeway was Doswell's broodmare sire Minardi, who was also a European champion raced by Coolmore connections, but hardly took the stallion ranks by storm. From 11 crops, he managed only three stakes winners from Malaysia to Europe, with Doswell's dam his only black-type winner in a major racing country (France). Doswell is the fourth black-type winner out of a daughter of Minardi. Doswell's half-brother Secretary At War (War Front) is one of the others.

In addition to her two stakes-winning sons, Ballet Pacifica has Grade III-placed Entrechat, a full-sister to Doswell, and a placed juvenile full-brother to Secretary At War named Fort Ticonderoga. Her yearling filly is named You're the Top (Into Mischief) and she visited both War Front and Not This Time for next term. Ballet Pacifica is out of Irish champion, three-time U.S. GISW, and \$1.05-million broodmare Kostroma (Ire), making Ballet Pacifica a half to 2008 GI Santa Anita Oaks winner Ariege (Doneraile Court).

SWEET MELANIA ENDS DROUGHT IN **SUWANNEE RIVER**

Robert and Lawana Low's Sweet Melania (American Pharoah), without a victory in 18 months, broke through to record her first win of the 2021 season in Saturday's GIII Suwannee River S. at Gulfstream.

She jumped well from her outside draw in post 10 to chase from second as favored Shifty She (Gone Astray) sped off on a clear advantage. Sweet Melania, off at 6-1, set her sights on the pacesetter beneath John Velazquez at the top of the stretch, hit the front shortly thereafter and had a half-length over that game foe at the wire. It was another half-length back to In a **Hurry** (Blame) in third.

Sweet Melania, heroine of the 2019 GII JPMorgan Chase Jessamine S. at Keeneland and 2020 GIII Wonder Again S. at Belmont and also the third-place finisher in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita, was winless in five prior tries this season. She hit the board in her three most recent attempts, including a second-place finish in the One Dreamer S. at Kentucky Downs Sept. 9 and another runner-up effort in a Keeneland allowance last time Oct. 15. The chestnut hadn't had her picture taken since the Wonder Again last June.

"She was super sharp coming into it," winning trainer Todd Pletcher said. "I loved the way she was training and she got a beautiful ride from Johnny. It was a good setup, and I thought she ran a good race. I felt like she had been rounding back into form and had some good performances and just didn't quite get there. She did seem super sharp, and we were hoping for an improved performance."

Pletcher added that Sweet Melania would be under consideration for the \$500,000 GIIII Pegasus Filly & Mare Turf Jan. 29.

Pedigree Notes:

Sweet Melania, a \$600,000 KEESEP graduate, is one of 23 stakes winners and 12 graded winners from Triple Crown winner American Pharoah. She is one of 12 stakes winners and three graded winners for broodmare sire Discreet Cat.

The E. Paul Robsham-bred SW & GSP Sweet N Discreet did not produce a foal in 2018 and her 2019 Carpe Diem filly died. She had a Liam's Map colt in 2020 (\$200,000 KEESEP purchase by Jackpot Farm) and a filly by American Pharoah this year. She was bred back to Tapit.

Sweet N Discreet, a \$1.1-million purchase by Crupi's New Castle Farm on behalf of Sweet Melania's breeder St. Elias Stables at the 2014 FTKNOV sale, brought \$1.6 million from Mt. Brilliant Farm, in foal to Liam's Map, at Fasig-Tipton November in 2019.

Sweet N Discreet is a full-sister to GSW and GISP Discreet Dancer and a half to GSW Travelin Man (Trippi).

Repole Stable's **Fearless** (Ghostzapper) ran to the money as the 3-5 chalk in Saturday's GIII Harlan's Holiday S., the local prep for the upcoming \$3-million GI Pegasus World Cup Invitational at Gulfstream Jan. 29.

Drawn widest of all in post six, he tracked a pair of dueling leaders in a dream spot in third as they made their way up the backstretch. This term's GII WinStar Gulfstream Park Mile S. Feb. 27 winner revved up three wide rounding the far turn, kicked for home as the one to catch and took care of business from there to score by a facile four lengths over **South Bend** (Algorithms). The pacesetting dual Canadian Classic winner **Mighty Heart** (Dramedy) was third.

Trained throughout his career by Todd Pletcher, Mike Repole purchased Fearless, previously a \$725,000 KEESEP yearling, for \$205,000 at this summer's Fasig-Tipton July Selected Horses of Racing Age Sale following a second-place finish behind next out GI Hill 'N' Dale Metropolitan H. winner Silver State (Hard Spun) in the GII Oaklawn H. Apr. 17 and a third-place finish as the favorite in the GIII Pimlico Special Match Series S. May 14. He resurfaced with a second-place finish as the chalk once again in his first start for Repole in a local \$60,000 handicap Nov. 21. Fearless previously carried the colors of CHC Inc. and WinStar

Farm.

Will we see Fearless next in the Pegasus?

"That's all up to Todd," Pletcher's assistant trainer Anthony Sciametta said. "The horse is moving forward. He's run two good races and come back good from his vacation. That's all we can ask for."

Pletcher was not present at Gulfstream Saturday due to family obligations.

Pedigree Notes:

Fearless is one of 89 stakes/48 graded winners for Hall of Famer Ghostzapper. He is also one of 102 stakes/53 graded winners for the late Street Cry (Ire) as a broodmare sire.

Fearless's dam And Why Not, who hit the board over seven furlongs as a juvenile in the 2011 GI Spinaway S. and over 10 panels in the 2013 GI Delaware H., hails from one of the deepest families in the stud book.

Second dam is GSP Alchemist, in turn the dam of GSW Far From Over (Blame), and GISW third dam Aldiza produced one graded winner and the dams of two others. Fearless's fifth dam is none other than 1983 Broodmare of the Year Courtly Dee (Never Bend).

And Why Not, also responsible for SW & MGSP Just Whistle (Pioneerof the Nile), has an unraced 2-year-old filly named Marzipan (Candy Ride {Arg}) and a yearling filly by Blame (\$500,000 KEESEP purchase by Juddmonte). She was bred to Gun Runner for 2022.

RUNHAPPY GELDING RUNS UP THE SCORE AGAIN; GARNERS RISING STARDOM

Jay Em Ess Stable's **Happy Medium** (Runhappy) dominated for a third consecutive time Saturday to become the third **'TDN Rising Star'** for the heating-up Runhappy. Third in his seven-panel unveiling here back in March, the \$300,000 KEESEP yearling and May 20 foal resurfaced at Belmont Sept. 30 to air by 9 1/4 lengths and earn a gaudy 103 Beyer Speed Figure. He was flattered when three runners who finished behind him that day returned to graduate, and further validated his big win with a five-length allowance score in the local slop Nov. 13.

Off at 3-5 this time while taking on older and far more seasoned rivals, the bay was scrubbed on from the rail to rush up and take command. He was able to clear off and settle a bit through splits of :22.14 and :45.05, and was all by his lonesome as he swung for home with a sizeable advantage. Wudda U Think Now (Fast Anna)--a four-time winner coming off a careerbest 94 Beyer--gave chase in the lane, but Happy Medium strolled home in a race of his own to report under the wire a wrapped-up seven-length winner in 1:15.88.

Yo Cuz came into the race as one of five maidens, entering off a fifth-place career debut Nov. 21 when she made a belated rally after a slow start. "But then she started to breeze at Saratoga and was training really well. We wanted to get one race in her before this and she ran fifth about four weeks ago. She broke bad, trailed the field but then wove her way between horses and galloped out past the leader. When we spoke to Jose Ortiz after the race, he said that he really liked the horse. It's nice to have continuity because he knew her."

Gallo confirmed that, at least for now, Yo Cuz would remain in New York to race against state-bred fields.


