There is plenty to play for in Saturday's 142nd running of the \$600,000 GI Alabama S. at Saratoga, where **Nest** (Curlin) and **Secret Oath** (Arrogate) face one another for the third time head-to-head--each with one victory to their credit--with divisional supremacy awaiting the winner.

An 8 1/4-length tour-de-force tally in Keeneland's GI Central Bank Ashland S. accorded Nest the role of favoritism in the GI Longines Kentucky Oaks, but she was no match for the somewhat forgotten Secret Oath, dropping a two-length decision. A meritorious second to stablemate Mo Donegal (Uncle Mo) in the GI Belmont S., the \$350,000 Keeneland September grad reversed the Oaks form with a 12 1/4-length thumping of Secret Oath in the GI CCA Oaks July 23.

LOVELL RIDING HIGH AFTER A SPECIAL

SARATOGA WIN by Katie Petrunyak

In 1993, Michelle Lovell rode five races at Saratoga. Then known as jockey Michelle Hanley, she came home with three second-place finishes, but never got that win at the Spa. Twenty-nine years later, she finally made it to the winner's circle. This time it was with the brilliant GII Saratoga Special S. winner **Damon's Mound** (Girvin), her first Saratoga starter as a trainer.

How do the two experiences compare?

"Riding here back in the day, I was just super in awe of the place," Lovell explained. "Obviously who wouldn't want to come here and have a go at it? But honestly, bringing Damon's Mound as my first Saratoga starter, I mean that's what dreams are made of, right?"

Damon's Mound is a sixth-generation homebred for Cliff and Michele Love and the first horse Lovell has trained for the Texasbased owners. The horsewoman said her connection with the couple started early this year with a cold call from Cliff.

"Thank goodness I answered the phone," she said with a laugh. "I knew his name because I used to race in Texas. It was just a really nice person on the other end of the line who said they had a 2-year-old training in Ocala that they thought a lot of. He said he had done a lot of research and decided he wanted me as a trainer if I had a stall." **Cont. p7**

That effort was good for a 104 Beyer, a figure that is a halfdozen points stronger than anything her six rivals has earned and nine more than Secret Oath's top. A GI Runhappy Travers S. start was an option next weekend, but she sticks with a path of lesser resistance for the Alabama.

"Whenever you're running four weeks off a huge effort like that, you're always concerned about if you're running back too soon," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who won his third Alabama with **'TDN Rising Star'** Malathaat (Curlin) last year. "But, in her case, she's done so well since the race there's no reason not to."

Wayne Lukas, who won the Alabama twice in the 1980s with Life's Magic in 1984 and with Oaks winner Open Mind five years later, looks to equal his former pupil. Secret Oath's second clash of the season with the boys in the GI Preakness S. resulted in a non-threatening fourth and she figures to strip fitter off the CCA Oaks, her first start in 63 days.

"She's really had a good month since that debacle in the [CCA Oaks]," Lukas said. "In fact, I feel like she's better now than any time I've had her. She's really flourished here at Saratoga. [Jockey] Luis [Saez] has worked her three times since that race so he's getting more familiar every day with her, too. So, that should help us as much as anything. We're anxious to run her."

Gerrymander (Into Mischief) defeated next-out GIII Monmouth Oaks heroine and 'TDN Rising Star' Shahama (Munnings) in the GII Mother Goose S. June 25, but will probably need to find a few lengths to trouble the heavy hitters.

Saturday Preview cont. Spendarella Vulnerable in Del Mar Oaks?

Gainesway Stable's **Spendarella** (Karakontie {Jpn}) took her career record to three wins from as many starts with a convincing 1 3/4-length success in the GII Appalachian S. at Keeneland in April and, with trainer Graham Motion unafraid to tackle the deepest of deep waters, took that undefeated mark into the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 17. The \$220,000 Keeneland September purchase had the misfortune of running into her fellow flawless rival Inspiral (GB) (Frankel {GB}), who scored by 4 3/4 lengths first off the layoff and has since defeated the boys in the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at Deauville.

But Saturday's GI Del Mar Oaks figures something other than a walk in the park for Spendarella, who faces a fresh challenge from Euro import **Txope (Fr)** (Siyouni {Fr}).

The bay, previously trained by Philippe Decouz, was stakesplaced in France earlier this season on the synthetic and on the turf and was last seen posting a mild upset when proving 3/4 of a length too strong in the G2 German 1000 Guineas at Duesseldorf June 12. The bay most recently topped the Arqana Summer Mixed Sale on a bid of \in 1.2 million from the BBA Ireland on behalf of Yulong Investments. She makes her U.S. debut for the John Sadler barn and can be the fly in the favorite's ointment.

With The Moonlight Backs Up For Lake Placid

McKulick is missing this time around, but the Chad Brown barn is represented by a quartet--each lined up next to the other-including GIII Lake George S. one-two finishers **Dolce Zel (Fr)** (Zelzal {Fr}, gate 5) and **Eminent Victor** (Mr. Z, post three); **Consumer Spending** (More Than Ready, post four), winner of the GII Wonder Again S. and third in the Belmont Oaks; and **'TDN Rising Star' Haughty** (Empire Maker, gate six).

In non-graded stakes action Saturday, Grade I winner **Rattle N Roll** (Connect), who lost all chance at the start of the GIII Indiana Derby July 9, looks to return to winning ways in the \$250,000 St. Louis Derby at FanDuel Racing (results in Monday's *TDN*), while 2-year-old males and females prep for next month's GI Pattison Summer S. and GI Natalma S., respectively, in the Soaring Free S. and Catch a Glimpse S. at Woodbine.

BACKGROUND CHECK: ALABAMA

In this continuing series, we examine the past winners of significant filly/mare races by the lasting influence they've had on the breed. Up today is the GI Alabama S., one of the oldest stakes races in the country.

Dating to 1872, eight years after the first Travers S. was run and 12 years after the first Queen's Plate (the oldest stakes race in North America), the Alabama is the last leg in New York's Triple Tiara following the GI Acorn S. and the GI Coaching Club American Oaks. The major-league 3-year-old filly contest was run at different distances early, but has remained a constant at 1 1/4 miles since 1917. It's a safe bet anyone with a good sophomore filly would love few things more than adding the Alabama to their win column. As with most races this old, a few years were skipped owing to various circumstances, but history has recorded 141 individual winners of the Alabama. How have they fared as broodmares?

Several Alabama winners through the years also won the GI Test S., GI CCA Oaks, GI Diana S., or GIII Schuylerville S.; please see those previous profiles for notes on broodmare phenomenons Sky Beauty, November Snow, Tempted, Busanda, Vagrancy, and Cleopatra. Following are the some of the other most important Alabama winners by what impact they have had on the breed through their sons and daughters.

Pretty Discreet (1992, Private Account--Pretty Persuasive, by Believe It): Her three stakes winners were all colts--GISWs Discreet Cat and Discreetly Mine, as well as MSW & MGISP Pretty Wild--and her three daughters to stay in this country are all stakes producers. She is also the granddam of GISW Awesome Maria, who sold for \$4 million at the 2013 Keeneland November sale, and June 9 Astoria S. winner Devious Dame, the first black-type winner for freshman sire Girvin.

Heavenly Prize (1991, Seeking the Gold--Oh What a Dance, by Nijinsky II): One would expect a mare descended from Blitey and Lady Pitt to do great things and Heavenly Prize held up her end of the bargain. Her sons included MGISW Good Reward and GSW Pure Prize, while her descendants thus far include GISWs Persistently, Queen Goddess, and Instilled Regard, plus GSW & MGISP Stays in Vegas.

Versailles Treaty (1988, Danzig--Ten Cents a Dance, by Buckpasser): GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner George Vancouver is out of this mare, as is GII Remsen S. winner and GI Met Mile runner-up Saarland. Her daughters and granddaughters have produced GISW Mongolian Groom, MGSW Dragon Bay, and several other stakes performers.

Maplejinsky (1985, Nijinsky II--Gold Beauty, by Mr. Prospector): Her daughter, Sky Beauty, won the Alabama and the CCA Oaks in 1993, was named champion older mare in 1994, and captured a total of nine Grade I races before producing MGSW Hurricane Cat and a daughter who would later be granddam of GISW Violence. Maplejinsky didn't stop there. Other daughters and granddaughters have produced MGISWs Guarana, Point of Entry, Pine Island, and Tale of Ekati, as well as GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Pleasant Home and a slew of other high-quality stakes winners. Her great-granddaughter Magical World sold for \$5.2 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale, while Magical World's daughter Guarana brought \$4.4 million at the same sale. **Cont. p6**

It's in the Air (1976, Mr. Prospector--A Wind Is Rising, by Francis S.): This mare, often remembered as her sire's first of many champions, has had some very significant activity among her female descendants in the last year. Her MGISW granddaughter, Music Note, produced the 2021 G1 Dubai World Cup winner Mystic Guide, while another unraced granddaughter is the dam of 2021 GI Saratoga Derby Invitational S. winner State of Rest (Ire), who is also a G1 winner in England, France, and Australia. Other GI/G1 winners produced by her daughters include Musical Chimes and Storming Home (GB).

Lauries Dancer (1968, Northern Dancer--Its Ann, by Royal Gem II {Aus}): Although she didn't produce a stakes winner, this Canadian Horse of Year's daughters and granddaughters have produced MGISWs Will's Way and Tizway, as well as GISW Willa On the Move, and GISP and excellent Maryland sire Citidancer.

Fanfreluche (1967, Northern Dancer--Ciboulette, by Chop Chop): This Canadian Horse of the Year, even more famous for her abduction than for her race record, was also a remarkable producer with long-reaching influence on multiple continents. Honored as Canadian Broodmare of the Year in 1978, her own foals included two-time Canadian Horse of the Year and U.S. GISW L'Enjoleur, additional Canadian champions La Voyageuse and Medaille d'Or, GSW D'Accord, and MSW Grand Luxe. Her female-line descendants have thus far included French highweight and multiple G1SW Holy Roman Emperor (Ire), as well as European G1SWs Majestic Roi and Erupt (Ire); U.S. GISWs Aube Indienne (Fr) and Combatant; Australian G1SWs Russian Revolution (Aus), Flying Spur (Aus), Encosta de Lago (Aus), and Duais (Aus); and New Zealand G1SW Sherwood Forest (Aus). Natashka (1963, Dedicate--Natasha, by Nasrullah {GB}): Named Broodmare of the Year in 1981, Natashka sports a long list of black-type winners tracing to her, including leading U.S. sire Elusive Quality and a number of champions.

High Bid (1956, To Market--Stepping Stone, by Princequillo {GB}): This Wheatley/Phipps mare is on this list for one very sound reason. Her first foal was Bold Bidder, not only a champion on the racetrack, but sire and broodmare sire of several luminaries. His two Kentucky Derby winners in a six-year span included one considered among the Top 10 runners of the 1900s: Horse of the Year Spectacular Bid.

Parlo (1951, Heliopolis {GB}--Fairy Palace, by Pilate): Her daughters included 1969 Broodmare of the Year All Beautiful, who produced Horse of the Year Arts and Letters and is greatgranddam of dual champion and five-time GISW Silverbulletday.

Salaminia (1937, Man o' War--Alcibiades, by Supremus): A number of stakes winners trace to this daughter of Man o' War, none more notable than English Horse of the Year and excellent sire Sir Ivor. He lives on particularly through his daughters, although his sire son, Sir Tristram (Ire), redefined the breed in Australia and New Zealand.

Risque (1928, Stimulus--Risky, by Diadumenos {GB}): 1980 Broodmare of the Year Key Bridge traces to her, as does U.S. Horse of the Year Fort Marcy and Canadian Horses of the Year Izvestia and With Approval. Champion Key to the Mint, MGISW Touch Gold, and excellent European sire Wootton Bassett (GB) are just a few on the long list of other high-class descendants of Risque. **Cont. p7**

Escutcheon (1927, Sir Gallahad III {Fr}--Affection {Fr}, by Isidor {GB}): In addition to producing Kentucky Oaks winner Mars Shield, this mare is the ancestress of Broodmares of the Year Levee and Delta, champions Shuvee, Slew o' Gold, Bayou, Smart Deb, Talking Picture, Sacahuista, Playful Act (Ire)--and many more.

Malachite (1913, Rock Sand {GB}--Miss Hanover, by Hanover): A number of stakes performers trace to this mare, most importantly 1943 Horse of the Year and Triple Crown winner Count Fleet. He was ranked among the leading sires and broodmare sires in the country for many years.

Sallie McClelland (1888, Hindoo--Red and Blue, by Alarm): This wonderful producer of yesteryear is the dam of 1904 Kentucky Oaks winner Audience and ancestress of Horses of the Year Whisk Broom II and Crusader, as well as dual champion Top Flight.

Lovell continued, "We get these calls as trainers every so often and sometimes the horse doesn't pan out or the owners don't call back, but they kept in touch and when Damon's Mound was ready, he showed up at my barn--this big, beautiful 2-year-old."

Lovell took an immediate liking to the striking bay colt, who is named after a 146 foot-tall limestone formation outside of the town of Damon, Texas.

"He was obviously raised right," she said. "He was broke by Ocala Stud's David O'Farrell and I had lots of contact with him after I got him in. He told me that he was always professional and that he really liked him. We got him in the spring and he never missed a day. He was obviously well-broke. "He was actually fit for a half-mile as they said, which sometimes doesn't happen."

When Damon's Mound was named a 'TDN Rising Star' after his stunning 12 1/2-length obliteration of maidens at Churchill Downs on July 2, Lovell and the Loves were inundated with inquiries about purchasing the promising juvenile. All were turned down.

"We had dozens of calls and text messages," Lovell shared. "We had some really nice offers from good people that have been in the business for a long time who said they would be happy to be a silent partner along for the ride, but Cliff just said he was going to share this with his wife."

Despite Love's initial words, Lovell said she couldn't help harboring a few thoughts that the owner's mind might change if Damon's Mound was just as brilliant in his second start as he was in his debut.

"It was always in the back of my mind," she admitted. "I just thought that I would have to wish them well and understand that it's a business and it happens. I was just grateful to have him to begin with."

Before leaving for Saratoga, Lovell had the conversation with the Loves of what would happen if they came back with a win in the Saratoga Special.

"We really didn't think we would be worse than second," Lovell said. "With Gulfport (Uncle Mo) in there we knew we had our work cut out for us, but we thought we could be in the winner's circle. Cliff just told me, 'If he wins they're going to be calling again, but he's still not for sale. You're my spokesperson and he's not for sale.'"

A caravan that included Lovell, Damon's Mound, Elwood (Lovell's speckled pony with a following of his own) and Roy Seales (Lovell's groom with a background working in New York racing) made the journey from their summer base at Colonial Downs Racetrack in Virginia to Saratoga. They shipped in to Mike Maker's barn, which overlooks the main track's far turn.

"The first day we were here, he could see the racing and it kind of got him excited," Lovell said. "He watched really intensely, but then the next day, he slept all day."

Two days before the big day, Damon's Mound had a similar laid-back attitude as he schooled in the paddock alongside his highly regarded competitor Gulfport.

"He walked in through the crowd with such confidence and poise," Lovell said. "Especially for a young horse in his second time out, he just owns it. I couldn't have been more proud of him."

Damon's Mound got another look at 2-5 favorite Gulfport as he trailed the rest of a four-horse field through the opening stages of the Saratoga Special, but after being asked by jockey Gabriel Saez, Damon's Mound made his move at the far turn and accelerated to a 3 1/4-length victory.

"We were confident going in, but you get a little nervous," Lovell admitted as she reflected on the race. "He gives you all the confidence because his demeanor is great. He's humble, too. He's proud of himself, but he's a humble horse. It was an awesome day. It couldn't have been more perfect."

Of course, more offers came in for the new Grade II victor, but Lovell said word has spread that for now, the colt is in her barn to stay. "It's a great thing that people are interested because obviously he's a very talented 2-year-old with a great future in front of him, but it's refreshing not to have to field those calls and text messages," Lovell admitted. "I'm truly grateful to Cliff and Michele that they want to be on this journey. They've been waiting for it for a long time, so kudos to them for sticking to their guns. It's a great story for them."

The Loves were not present for the victory in Saratoga, opting to enjoy the race together at home and plan to attend their stable star's next start.

Damon's Mound returned to Colonial Downs late on Sunday and Lovell reported that he has come out of the race in perfect form. She is still weighing her options for where the Florida-bred could make his next start, considering either the GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill on Sept. 17 or the GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland on Oct. 8.

While Damon's Mound has already resumed light jogging at Colonial Downs, Lovell is back in New York this weekend with her second Saratoga starter. On Saturday, Change of Control (Fed Biz) will race from post one in the Smart N Fancy S. The 6-year-old mare finished fourth by three lengths to eventual GI Fourstardave H. winner Casa Creed (Jimmy Creed) in the GI Jaipur S. and followed that effort with a stakes win at Colonial Downs on July 18.

"She's coming into this race really well off her win at Colonial," Lovell reported. "It was nice to get a little class relief there and that will set her up well for this race. There are some good mares in there, so there's no doubt it will be a nice race. Hopefully we get a nice trip."

It certainly can't hurt that while in Saratoga, Change of Control is staying in the same stall that Damon's Mound occupied last weekend.

"It would be awesome to be two-for-two up here," Lovell said. "That would be the cherry on top."

I guess the whole point is that ours is a world apart, a sanctuary from the cares of the "real" one. But it still feels unnerving, to see a new cycle of the sales calendar open with such blithe indifference to a wider consensus that the global economy is scrabbling along the top of a precipice.

But it was ever thus, and the market at both Fasig-Tipton and Argana exhibited remarkable buoyancy when measured against historic standards.

We know that bloodstock tends to lag somewhat behind other indices of recession, and conceivably this will prove to be some final, decadent flourish before the bulls start to draw in their horns. But it may also turn out, as when bloodstock showed such startling resilience during the pandemic, that the outlook simply looks different to the affluent elite on whom our industry so candidly depends. Inflation may be a bolting mustang; there may be wars and rumors of wars; political discourse may be ever more acrimoniously polarized. None of it seems to matter to these guys.

To be fair, in certain states American investors can increasingly entertain the possibility that their racetrack programs can aspire to something vaguely resembling viability--even if some benighted horsemen appear masochistically determined to erode that equation with their stubborn litigations. But the parallel strength of the market over the water suggests that a lot of people must also be animated by less tangible dividends.

That being so, we must always remember how destructive to our sport is the contamination of bad publicity. No shortage of that, of course, in an average week--and this one has been no different. Equally, however, we must acknowledge our debt to those priceless horses and horsemen that do succeed in capturing the public imagination; to those that intrigue outsiders, and inspire them to enter and contribute to our community, whether as fans and handicappers or as buyers of seven-figure yearlings. And it's also been a week, either side of the ocean, that has magnified those positives.

First and foremost, we have had a fresh reminder of the captivating grandeur within the compass of the Thoroughbred. Raised in distance for the first time, Baaeed (GB) (Sea The Stars {Ire}) also raised his game anew to reach a pantheon lately shared, on European turf, perhaps only by his sire and Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

Someone as tediously insistent as me, on the importance of a transatlantic cross-pollination, is hardly going to neglect the opportunity to highlight the way Baaeed's pedigree combines gene pools that have since become disastrously bisected. No fewer than 11 of the 16 contributors to this grass titan's fourth generation were bred in North America. Mr. Prospector is sire not only of Baaeed's fourth dam; but also of his damsire, Kingmambo; and of Miswaki, whose daughter Urban Sea gave us Sea The Stars. And look who's here, as sire of the third dam: the great enigma himself, Arazi! Cont. p10

Sea The Stars, specifically, combines two transatlantic cocktails. Start with his sire Cape Cross (Ire). He's by Green Desert, himself a son of Danzig out of a daughter of Sir Ivor and Courtly Dee; and out of Park Appeal (Ire), whose genes (by Ahonoora (GB) out of a Balidar (GB) mare) are no less evocative of a completely different world. As for Urban Sea, the epochmaking dam of Sea The Stars (and Galileo, of course), she similarly blends a classic American brand (Miswaki was by Mr. Prospector out of a Buckpasser mare) with a mare whose parents both channelled doughty German blood.

Much the same kind of thing happens along Baaeed's bottom line. That Mr. Prospector fourth dam we just mentioned, for instance, is actually out of the British matriarch Height Of Fashion (GB), who was by Bustino (GB) and saturated with other indigenous influences. So, really, can anyone look at Baaeed's pedigree and still understand why most breeders, either side of the Atlantic, no longer want to mix turf and dirt lines?

So much for Baaeed's past. As far as his future is concerned, we must naturally yield to the judgement of those who have brought him this far with such skill. But it must be said that the horse stands in danger of leaving us with the same wistfulness as did Frankel, who similarly spent most of his career beating up proven inferiors at a mile before stepping up in trip only in his penultimate start--and in the same York race that Baaeed won this week. The plan has long been to remain in step with Frankel by also bowing out over 10 furlongs at Ascot, but the door is apparently still ajar to going to the Arc instead.

In declining to run either at Longchamp or at the Breeders' Cup, Frankel was left exposed to the charge that he never went looking for trouble. Suspecting him to be one of the best of all time, everyone was comparing him to specters past--yet he never measured himself against plenty of good ones then alive and well, and available for racetrack competition. The fact is that Baaeed finished the new trip at York ravenously, and is a full-brother to a Group 1 winner at 12f (and Group winner at 14f). So let's hope that the desire to preserve his immaculate record does not discourage connections of another great horse from exploring the full range of his brilliance.

If a sporting gamble happened to misfire, it wouldn't take a cent off his value. In terms of his legacy, he has nothing to lose and much to gain. And, as we've been saying, there's a wider consideration--one might almost say, a wider obligation--to make this game as engrossing as we can; to showcase charisma, and retrieve the news agenda from the bad guys.



D. Wayne Lukas | Coady

Happily, that is just what is happening at Saratoga this summer, with D. Wayne Lukas back on center stage Saturday with his latest Classic winner Secret Oath (Arrogate) squaring up for her decider with Nest (Curlin). Last week we highlighted the way Lukas appears to be reversing the ageing process, as a rejuvenated force in the sales ring as well as on the racetrack. He promptly produced another exciting juvenile in Bourbon Bash (City Of Light), who won his second start by eight lengths and looks eligible to extend his trainer's record of eight wins in the GI Hopeful S.

This is the first foal out of a stakes-winning Violence mare named Buy Sell Hold. Sell or hold is an adequate conundrum for most people right now, trying to read the alarming runes in less singular markets. How long our own marketplace can remain insulated by such unquantifiable factors as horses like Baaeed, and horsemen like Lukas, remains to be seen. But history tells us that we will find out soon enough.

NESS RECEIVES SIX-MONTH SUSPENSION IN PENNSYLVANIA; HAS APPEALED by Bill Finley

Jamie Ness, a prolific winner in the Mid-Atlantic states and the third-leading trainer in the country in wins, has been handed a six-month suspension by the Pennsylvania Racing Commission after a horse he trained tested positive for Bufotenine.

Ness was also fined \$5,000. The suspension is scheduled to begin Sept. 5 and runs through March 3, 2023.

Ness, who is being represented by attorney Andrew Mollica, has appealed the suspension.

"We are in the process of appealing," Mollica said. "We will take this the whole way. He obviously vehemently denies any wrongdoing. The law and the facts are on our side."

The positive test occurred in a Feb. 23 race at Parx and involves the horse Crabs N Beer (Blofeld). The 3-year-old gelding won the race, a starter-optional claimer by 2 1/2 lengths as the 3-5 favorite.

According to britannica.com, Bufotenine is a "weak hallucinogenic agent active by intravenous injection, isolated from several natural sources or prepared by chemical synthesis. Bufotenine is a constituent of toad poison, the poisonous, milky secretion of glands found in the skin on the back of the animal." Bufotenine is often referred to as a toad venom and, in humans, is used as a hallucinogen with properties similar to mescaline and mushrooms.

Mollica provided the *TDN* with a document issued by the Association of Racing Commissioners International (ARCI) that lists Bufotenine as a substance that has "no effect on the physiology of a racing animal except to improve nutrition or treat or prevent infections or parasite infestations..."

The document also notes that the substance is found in reed canary grass and may be found in the urine of horses eating this grass. "We already know it's a contaminant, not because I say so, but because ARCI says so," Mollica said, "ARCI went out of their way to carve it out and say it should not result in a positive. I thought this was pretty straight-forward. I am shocked we are here. How this got to this level is unfathomable to me. Our position is quite clear."

Mollica also questioned why Pennsylvania regulators were relying on a blood test but did not conduct a urine test. He said that if the substance had shown up in a urine test, that would not have resulted in a positive.

Ness is enjoying another banner season. Through Friday, he had 198 wins on the year from 711 starters, for a winning rate of 28%. He has been particularly dominant at Parx, where he has run away from the pack in the race for leading trainer. Ness's 107 wins at Parx puts him 67 wins in front of runner-up Louis Linder, Jr. Ness also runs regularly at Laurel, where he six wins on the meet.

Ness, who been training since 1999, has 3,703 winners and a career winning percentage of 25%.

In 2012, his Tampa Bay Downs barn was searched. It appears that nothing illegal was found.

"It's something I'm not used to, but it comes with the territory of being on top, I guess," he told the *Paulick Report* at the time. "The higher your win percentage is, the more detractors you get. But I sleep well at night, and not because I'm tired. I know everything gets done right and it doesn't bother me when I walk through the grandstand and hear people say, 'Oh, they're cheating,' but it bothers the people who work for me, and that's what I care about. I'm used to it, but some of my grooms get very defensive when somebody says, 'You guys are cheaters,' or something like that."

RICH STRIKE TUNES UP FOR RUNHAPPY TRAVERS

With exercise rider Gabriel Lagunes in the irons, GI Kentucky Derby upsetter **Rich Strike** (Keen Ice) breezed five-eighths of a mile in :59.82 (3/34) (video) over the Saratoga main track Friday morning in advance of his appearance in the \$1.25-million GI Runhappy Travers S. at the Spa Aug. 27.

"He worked really good. He worked faster than we thought he would, but he did it easily," trainer Eric Reed said. "I think my question on him liking the track was answered this morning. He came home well. It is probably as good as he worked, even since before he did going into the [Kentucky] Derby. He was supposed to go :49 or :50. He did it all on his own. He was galloping over the track."

After besting the Travers-bound Epicenter (Not This Time) and Zandon (Upstart) beneath the Twin Spires, Rich Strike somewhat controversially passed on the GI Preakness S. and trained up to the GI Belmont S., where he was sixth to Mo Donegal (Uncle Mo). The chestnut worked three times at Reed's Mercury Training Center in July and twice at Churchill Downs earlier this month before arriving in Saratoga the afternoon of Aug. 14.

"Everything is in good shape," Reed said. "All we have to do is do some paddock schooling and keep him happy and healthy. He'll go to the paddock Sunday morning after he gallops. He will walk through it on Monday. Then, on Wednesday and Thursday, we'll plan on taking him there in the afternoon."

ROSARIO SET FOR RECORD-BREAKING

SARATOGA MEET By Mike Kane

SARATOGA SPRINGS, NY - It's not your imagination that jockey Joel Rosario is having a big summer at Saratoga.

Rosario, 37, is very much in the hunt for the overall title, a competition led by Irad Ortiz, Jr. Through Thursday's program, Ortiz had 37 wins, eight more than Rosario. However, in graded stakes races, Rosario is far and away the leader with 10 victories from 19 starts, a remarkable 53% win rate. Ortiz is next with five.

With the 10, Rosario is in position to smash the current record of 11 graded stakes wins in a Saratoga season. According to Equibase stats, Hall of Famers Javier Castellano and John Velazquez share the record of 11. Castellano won 11 of 31 graded stakes starts in 2015 and Velazquez, who is nearing 1,000 wins at the track, finished first in 11 of 23 graded stakes in 2005. At 10, Rosario is on level with Castellano (2016) and Jerry Bailey (2001). "It's unbelievable what we've done early," Rosario said. "Thanks to all the people who gave us the opportunity. My agent, Ron Anderson, has done a really great job for me. We appreciate the opportunities from the owners and the trainers."

Rosario is no stranger to success. The native of the Dominican Republic has finished in the top 10 in North American jockey earnings for 13 years, has a resume filled with graded stakes wins, including 13 in the Breeders' Cup. Last year, he had a career year, riding horses that earned \$32,956,215 and secured his first Eclipse Award as champion jockey.

In 2020, Rosario was the leading graded stakes winner at Saratoga with seven. Last summer, he finished in a tie with Luis Saez for the top spot at six. This year, he had seven graded wins in the first 13 days of the 40-day season.

"We always are looking for a good meet," Rosario said, "But, we've been doing really well this year."

During the first four days of the meet, Rosario won the July 15 GIII Forbidden Apple S. with **City Man** (Mucho Macho Man) for trainer Christophe Clement; the GI Diana S. on **In Italian (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) for Chad Brown July 16; and the GIII Quick Call S. on **Big Invasion** (Declaration of War) for Clement July 17. He completed the month with three wins for Steve Asmussen: the GII Shuvee S. on **Clairiere (Curlin)** July 24, the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt S. on **Jackie's Warrior** (Maclean's Music) and the GII Jim Dandy S. on **Epicenter** (Not This Time).

In August, he won the GII National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame S. on **Ready to Purrform** (Kitten's Joy) for Brad Cox Aug. 5 and the next day won the GI Test S. on **Chi Town Lady** Verrazano) for Wesley Ward and the GII Glens Falls on **War Like Goddess** (English Channel) for Bill Mott. Six trainers. Dirt. Turf. Sprints. Routes.

Starting on Saturday with the GI Alabama and the GII Lake Placid, there are 17 graded stakes left in the Saratoga season. Rosario has the mount on **Haughty** (Empire Maker) for Brown in the Lake Placid and will ride **Gerrymander** (Into Mischief) for Brown in the Alabama. He is likely to be up on contenders in most of the remaining graded stakes, including the Asmussen triumvirate of Epicenter in the GI Runhappy Travers S., Jackie's Warrior in the GI Forego S. and **Clairiere** in the GI Personal Ensign.

In 2015, six of Castellano's 11 wins were in Grade I races. Velazquez had five Grade I winners in 2005. So far, Rosario has three.

OP/ED: THAT BURTON SIPP IS STILL RACING

IS INDEFENSIBLE by Bill Finley

Take the time to read colleague Dan Ross's extensive and detailed story on the sordid career of trainer Burton Sipp and you might conclude that, in horse racing, enough is never enough. The story is about a lot more than the many controversies that have shadowed Sipp throughout his career, it is about how racing somehow always let Sipp back in, to give him a third chance, a fourth, fifth chance. It is about the sport's inability to police itself and its failure to permanently ban someone who has no business training horses.

Yet, on Monday night, Sipp, who has sent out 117 starters so far this year, will have two runners in at Mountaineer Park. This is the person that, in a 1993 story I penned for the *New York Daily News*, was called the "most deplorable person I have encountered on the backstretch of a racetrack," by former Pennsylvania Racing Commission commissioner Hart Stotter. That he is still actively training is a beyond embarrassing. Worse yet, it plays right into the hands of racing's many critics who argue that the sport doesn't do nearly enough to keep the horses safe or to rid itself of its worst elements. When it comes to Sipp, how do we defend against that? We can't.

The latest firestorm surrounding Sipp involves allegations that he knowingly funnels his horses into the slaughter pipeline. That could have led to his permanent banishment from Mountaineer, which, in 2010, notified horsemen they will lose stalls and may be excluded from the track if any horses racing at Mountaineer end up at the Sugarcreek auction in Ohio, which is frequented by killer buyers who send horses on to slaughter. Proving such allegations can be tricky, but there's no evidence to suggest that Mountaineer racing officials have so much as launched an investigation. Perhaps they just decided to look the other way. Ross reached out to James Colvin, the director of racing at Mountaineer, about the recent scrutiny on Sipp and got a nonanswer answer. "I have no information for you to discuss on Burton Sipp, the WV Racing Commission has licensed Mr. Sipp and has also investigated him and to my knowledge have found no wrongdoing as to date," Colvin wrote in an email.

Ross had more questions for Colvin, but he did not respond to subsequent emails.

With the allegations that Sipp sent horses to the auctions frequented with killer buyers gaining more and more traction, Churchill Downs Inc. took action, announcing on Tuesday that it was banning Sipp from its tracks. Sipp has started 25 horses this year at Presque Isle Downs, which is owned by Churchill. The company is to be commended for taking action against the trainer, but it's fair to ask them what took them so long. It's also fair to ask how they could have banned Bob Baffert for two years for nothing worse than medication overages while, until this week, taking no action against Sipp.

Sipp has been training since 1968. He carved out a niche for himself, winning a lot of races on the leaky roof circuit. He won a career best 272 races in 1981, but he would soon become embroiled in a controversy that should have meant the end of his career. In 1984, Sipp was indicted by a grand jury in New Jersey on charges of inflating insurance claims on nine horses who died in his care over a four-year period. Sipp eventually pled guilty to the lesser charges of witness tampering and was fined \$7,500 and sentenced to five-years probation. When interviewed in 1993, Gregg Shivers, the assistant Burlington County prosecutor at the time, said that his office could have easily proven the earlier charges, but that the plea bargain was driven in part by the anticipated cost of the trial, expected to be one of the most expensive in Burlington County history.

Insurance fraud is a serious offense and so is witness tampering. Sipp had also been charged around the same time with forging a scratch card on another trainer's horse. Collectively, the industry acted and Sipp did not start any horses between December of 1984 and September of 1993.

"From my experience as Director of Enforcement for the Pennsylvania Racing Commission, I am aware of a number of actions and activities (Sipp) was involved in, all of which are a matter of public record," Roger Marciano told me in 1993. "I thought and fully expected that he would never race again or be involved in any way with pari-mutuel racing."

But Sipp never gave up on the idea of making a comeback and in 1993 found a racing commission willing to give him a license. With a license in hand from the Pennsylvania Racing Commission, he was back, entering horses at the track then known as Philadelphia Park. Ken Kirchner, the executive secretary of the Pennsylvania Racing Commission said that Sipp "deserved a second chance." **Cont. p14** After making 136 starts in 1994, Sipp disappeared, and it's not clear why. He did not return to racing until 2004. It appears that he spent some of that time operating Animal Kingdom, a 32-acre zoo and pet store in Burlington, N.J. According to a *Philadelphia Inquirer* article, Sipp was under investigation by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for alleged animal welfare violations at the zoo. According to the *Inquirer*, citations stemmed all the way back to 2002, when five emaciated giraffes reportedly died at the zoo.

Having returned to training, Sipp settled in at Suffolk Downs. When asked by a *Boston Globe* reporter in 2005 why Sipp had been licensed Suffolk Downs steward Bill Keene said: "There's nothing in the rule book that keeps him from getting a license because he has a past." That Keene believed that a person's past transgressions should have no bearing on them getting a license says a lot of about the sport's attitude toward rule-breakers. Of course a person's past matters.

Sipp has been operating ever since resurfacing at Suffolk Downs. But it appears that there are some racetracks that have refused to accept his entries as all of his 2021 and 2022 starts have come at Mountaineer, Presque Isle and Thistledown. In at least one state, he has been permanently banned. Since the mid 1990s, Sipp has been barred from applying for a racing license in New Jersey.

On the surface, Sipp is a nobody. He is 78, competes only at low-level tracks and has won just eight races this year. His stable has earned just \$112,861. When he makes headlines it is only for the wrong reasons. Perhaps the tracks that have allowed him to run thought no one would pay attention. But that hasn't been the case. There are plenty of good people who care and plenty of good people who want to see Burton Sipp permanently banned from every racetrack in the country. That that hasn't happened yet is simply inexcusable.

HIGHFIELD PRINCESS DOMINATES THE NUNTHORPE

Placing herself in a different stratosphere of sprinters on Friday, John Fairley's Breeders' Cup-bound homebred **Highfield Princess (Fr)** (Night Of Thunder {Ire}) powered to glory in York's five-furlong G1 Coolmore Wootton Bassett Nunthorpe S. only a dozen days after her *tour de force* in the 6 1/2-furlong G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest.

Returning to the scene of her emphatic G2 1895 Duke of York S. success May 11, the 5-1 shot enjoyed an ideal lead throughout the early stages from the three-years-younger **The Platinum Queen (Ire)** (Cotai Glory {GB}) before taking the measure of that juvenile a furlong from home.Giving everything for Jason Hart, the John Quinn-trained bay hit the line with 2 1/2 lengths to spare over the long-time leader, with **Emaraaty Ana (GB)** (Shamardal) regaining his form 1 1/2 lengths further away in third. **Cont. p3**

ROSE FAMILY IN BLOOM FOR HEALD

During a long, hot summer, one family which has been blooming rather than wilting is that of Soho Rose (Ire), a daughter of Hernando (Fr) who has been represented by two Group 2-winning offspring in the last three weeks.

The mare's 4-year-old daughter **Sea La Rosa (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) struck first in the G2 Lillie Langtry S. at Glorious Goodwood having already landed the G3 Pinnacle S. in May, and she was followed by her full-brother **Deauville Legend (Ire)** in Wednesday's G2 Voltigeur S. He too was backing up a Group 3 win earlier in the season in the Bahrain Trophy at Newmarket, and the consistent colt has also twice been runner-up this season, at Royal Ascot and Goodwood. His performance at York saw Deauville Legend, owned by Bon Ho, shoot to the head of the betting for the G1 Melbourne Cup in November.

The man responsible for breeding these two rising stars is Guy Heald, whose immense modesty prevents him from taking any credit for a burgeoning family which stems from the first horse he ever had in training back in the 1990s. Soho Rose's dam Russian Rose (Ire) (Soviet Lad) was picked up at Tattersalls in 1994 by former trainer Tony Hide for 5,200gns, and in the ensuing years she has established a pretty impressive dynasty.

"We were lucky enough to buy Russian Rose as a yearling," Heald recalls. "She was a late developer but distance was never an issue with her. She would run over any distance she was asked to and I suppose she just put plenty of stamina into her offspring." Cont. p9

"She's definitely getting quicker," Hart said of the winner, whose win guarantees her an entry into the \$1-million Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint, with the Nunthorpe part of the Breeders' Cup Challenge Series. "She gave me my first Group 1 winner a couple of weeks ago and it probably means more today to do it on home soil. I was really confident, the 2-year-old was giving us a nice tow and I thought I'd be able to pick her up whenever I wanted really. I thought if I could just hold her together for the middle part of the race she'd finish her race off."

Not only is Highfield Princess the first to complete the Maurice de Gheest-Nunthorpe double, this second career outing over Britain's minimum trip also resulted in her becoming the first since Handsome Sailor (GB) in 1988 to follow up a win in the Duke of York here. Her trajectory is one of the year's great racing stories, with a sixth in Royal Ascot's G1 Platinum Jubilee S. June 18 her only reversal since a second to the handicapper Tone The Barone (GB) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) in a conditions event which was a belated first try at this distance on Wolverhampton's Tapeta Mar. 19.

Harnessing all the indomitable spirit which saw her conquer Royal Ascot's Buckingham Palace H. over seven furlongs last June, the bay who had also captured the Listed Queen Charlotte Fillies' S. on Chelmsford's Polytrack early the next month and finished second to Space Blues (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G2 City of York S. at this festival 12 months ago has achieved a level of versatility which few can manage. **Cont. p4**

Four runs on from her success over seven in Newcastle's All-Weather Fillies' and Mares' Championships Conditions S. Apr. 15, she was readily handing one of the season's fastest juveniles The Platinum Queen a remarkable 24 pounds advantage en route to subduing a clutch of five-furlong specialists like **Royal Aclaim (Ire)** (Aclaim {Ire})--the disappointing 5-2 favourite who was sixth--and **Khaadem (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}).

John Quinn has his sights set on Keeneland in November, with a trip to ParisLongchamp beforehand. "It took her quite a while to learn her trade," he said. "We put her in the Foret and the Abbaye, so all being well two more runs in either of those and then the Breeders' Cup. She's got loads of tactical speed and five and a half furlongs around two bends will be right up her alley."

"When she was starting out, I said to John [Fairley] that she won't win a maiden so we'll get her categorised and go from there. When they gave her 57 I thought 'oh heck, we can't get her in a 0-55!'," Quinn added. "Her progress year in and year out and been astounding. This means everything. It's better than winning the lottery. To win here at York, with all my family here, it's fantastic." Fairley added, "Her story is one of the most epic stories in the history of thoroughbred racing. To do what she has done in two years is incredible and to win a Nunthorpe by two and a half lengths! Hardly anyone does that. She bit me this morning, that's how I knew she was feeling good, but I didn't think she'd win like that."

Tim Palin, syndicate manager for Middleham Park Racing, said of The Platinum Queen, "The weight-for-age might be a little bit generous and whether we can come back and replicate that in the future only time will tell, but I think she's going to give us plenty of fun. She's got the Abbaye entry and you wouldn't know whether the ground in Paris will suit her or not. You would have thought that would be the logical place to go."

Kevin Ryan's son and assistant Adam said of Emaraaty Ana, "He's taken his time to recover from running in Dubai earlier in the year, but he was more himself in the July Cup and has come here a fresh horse and has run his race. Hopefully now he can go on to Haydock now and defend his crown in the Sprint Cup."

Shorn of its main protagonists **Stradivarius (Ire)** (Sea The Stars {Ire}) and **Trueshan (Fr)** (Planteur {Ire}) in the build-up, the complexion of Friday's G2 Weatherbys Hamilton Lonsdale Cup may have changed since declaration time, but nonetheless played host to a performance of note as Lady Blyth's 5-year-old gelding **Quickthorn (GB)** (Nathaniel {Ire}--Daffydowndilly {GB}, by Oasis Dream {GB}) stepped into the void, leading his rivals a merry dance throughout, and registered a pillar-to-post victory in the Knavesmire's extended two-mile test.

The March-foaled bay, who lined up off victories in the G3 Henry II S. and G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil, led passing the judge first time and had established a wide-margin buffer by the time the field turned onto the backstraight. Untroubled throughout, the 9-4 second choice's lead proved to be an unassailable one as he hit the line, geared down, in a different postcode to the remainder. His margin of superiority was a facile 14 lengths as 5-4 favourite **Coltrane (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) just held on for second, by a short head, from **Reshoun (Fr)** (Shamardal).

Rose Family In Bloom For Heald Cont.

A winner over 10 furlongs for Hide, and later showing her staying credentials when landing a 2m1f handicap at Bath for James Toller, Russian Rose retired after 11 starts with a mark of 78 and was an instant hit at stud. Her first foal, Hanami (GB), who like Soho Rose is a daughter of Hernando, followed her mother to Toller's stable and won the Listed Montrose Fillies' Stakes at two before running fifth and sixth in the 1000 Guineas and the Oaks respectively, then winning the G2 Pretty Polly Stakes at the Curragh. She is now the dam of three black-type performers.

Born six years later, Russian Rose's daughter by Dubai Destination, Dubai Rose (GB), was sent into training with Henri-Alex Pantall in France, and won listed races in Switzerland and Germany in Heald's colours before going on to produce The Juliet Rose (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}), whose four stakes wins included two runnings of the G2 Prix de Royallieu, which has subsequently been elevated to Group 1 status.

While those two have established their own branches of the dynasty, it is arguably their sister Soho Rose, also the winner of a German listed contest while under the tutelage of Pantall, who

is currently doing the most to keep the family in the spotlight. As well as Deauville Legend and Sea La Rosa, Soho Rose is the dam of dual winner and Group 3 runner-up **Dean Street Doll (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}). Heald splits his broodmare band between his own Egerton Stud on the outskirts of Newmarket and La Motteraye in Normandy, where Soho Rose resides. Now 13, the mare has a yearling filly by Golden Horn (GB), who will be retained to race, most likely in France, and a foal by Sea The Moon (Ger), to whom she is now back in foal.

Reflecting on his own introduction to racing, the breeder, whose background is in international banking and property, says, "I suppose it all started when I went racing to Yarmouth with my father aged about seven. Then I hibernated until I bought Russian Rose and she was the first horse I had in training. Tony Hide bought her on spec without an order and then sold her to us."

Other members of the family remaining within the Heald fold include Hanami's daughters Harbour Of Hope (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and **Evania (GB)** (Golden Horn {GB}). The latter, bred along similar lines to Sea La Rosa and Deauville Legend, has had "some hiccups" since winning her sole start on debut at two but remains in training with John and Thady Gosden. **Cont. p10**

Heald is clearly a breeder who takes the patient approach, with a focus on middle-distance stock. Indeed, some years ago he was part of the Ptarmigan Bloodstock partnership which bred, with Kirsten Rausing, the brilliant five-time Group 1 winner Fame And Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}).

He says of the two most recent high-profile graduates of his breeding operation, "It was lovely to see Sea La Rosa stay in training as a 4-year-old. Her owners were very wise to do so as she is still improving.

"And it has been wonderful to see the progression of Deauville Legend because James Ferguson has had a clear plan of what to do all along."

The siblings are currently close neighbours in Newmarket, trained respectively by Ferguson and William Haggas, but they spent their formative years in Normandy. Sea La Rosa was sold at Arqana's August Sale by Ecurie des Monceaux for €200,000, the same amount paid by Mark McStay on behalf of Bon Ho a year later for Deauville Legend, who was consigned by Gwen Monneraye and Lucie Lamotte of La Motteraye Consignment, who board "six or seven mares" for Heald.

In Newmarket, Heald owns Egerton Stud and its neighbouring training yard, which has recently seen a change of trainer from the now-retired David Elsworth to Kevin Philippart de Foy. Bordering Newmarket's two racecourses and the National Stud, Egerton is an estate steeped in history, whose regal former equine residents include the the Prince of Wales's Derby and St Leger hero of 1896, Persimmon (GB).

Heald, who was himself on the return journey from France and the Arqana sale as the well-named Deauville Legend struck at York, is quick to deflect the praise for this success to others.

"I do very little apart from expend the nervous energy," he says. "The horses are very well cared for by Gwenael and Lucie.

They also prepared The Juliet Rose for sale for me. We're advised on breeding by Ecurie des Monceaux and I rely very much on the expertise of Henri Bozo. I think it's important to be involved in racing on both sides of the Channel."

From one modest purchase of a filly almost three decades ago, Heald has now become a significant, if understated, owner and breeder in various European countries, and that influence could yet extend to Australia by the end of the year.


