ISLE OF JURA 'VICTORIOUS' IN KING'S CUP TO COMPLETE BAHRAIN SWEEP by Alan Carasso

Isle of Jura (GB) (New Approach {Ire}) found his best stride entering the final 200 metres and ran out a comfortable winner of Friday's \$200,000 Listed King's Cup to secure the 'Triple Crown' for Sheikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa's Victorious Racing and trainer George Scott.

Winner of a Bahrain Turf Series race Dec. 8 and second in another three weeks later, Isle of Jura saw his rating rise out of the eligibility range for those valuable handicaps and made his next start in the Listed Crown Prince's Cup Feb. 2. Duly obliging there for a first black-type success, he scooped the \$135,000 Sheikh Nasser Bin Hamad Al Khalifa Cup a fortnight later and was going for the sweep in the King's Cup.

The commonly owned, but Fawzi Nass-trained **Rollajam (Ire)** (Belardo {Ire}), ostensibly a pacemaker for Isle of Jura, bombed the start, but rolled forward with a rush to take up the running and opened a double-digit margin on his rivals down the back. Isle of Jura raced in about fifth position and one off the fence with cover, but still had plenty of ground to make up on the leader turning in. The hulking bay took time to hit top gear, but began to bridge the gap in earnest approaching the final furlong and pulled clear from there as **Sovereign Spirit (GB)** (Le Havre {Ire}) and **Panning for Gold (Ire)** (Galileo Gold {GB}) ran on for the minor prizes. **Cont. p10**

"I feel a bit awkward doing these things to be perfectly honest with you," he confesses. "It is overwhelming, talking about me,

what I do and all that--I'm more comfortable hidden behind the horse!

"I'm just keen to make sure I get across a genuine feel for what the job means to me and how important the horses are. It can be tricky vocalising it."

As it turns out, Porter-Mackrell is a lot better at the task at hand than he might think, at least from this interviewer's perspective, making a difficult job look easy, just as he has his role as head stallion man at Newsells Park Stud for the last 15 years.

ask him why this career path is the one for him and suddenly he comes into his own.

"One of the reasons why I always wanted to do stallions, apart from the magic of the horses themselves, is the fact that you're

so close to them and have such a bond with them," he explains.

"All being well, you're looking after the same horses over an extended period of time, whereas obviously the yearlings are very seasonal, they come and go, and even the mares move around different yards depending on where they're at in their cycle in the year.

"You're with the stallions day in, day out, year in, year out, and the bond that you build with them is sustained over a long period of time."

Various bonds have been built in the interim, first with the G1 Criterium International and G1 Eclipse S. winner Mount Nelson (GB) when he retired to become the first stallion to stand at Newsells Park in 2009. He was joined two years later by Equiano (Fr), the dual winner of the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot.

Both horses went on to spend at least eight years in the devoted care of Porter-Mackrell, but sometimes bonds have to be sacrificed, especially in the ever-evolving stallion business where market forces seem to rule above all else.

In 2017, Mount Nelson moved to Boardsmill Stud in Ireland to cement his position as a National Hunt stallion, while pastures new also beckoned for Equiano in 2021 when he made the transfer to the Irish National Stud.

"It's always a heartbreaker to lose one of the stallions to be honest," Porter-Mackrell says. "Mount Nelson and Equiano were both here for the best part of 10 years. That's a long time looking after a horse and then one day they're there and the next day they're not.

"Mount Nelson was the first one I lost. He was hard work and everything was hard-earned with him, so that was particularly difficult. It was hard to gain his trust.

"There was the sort of compensation that they're getting another chance in Ireland and a new market to hopefully do well in and get a bit of a second wind. You hope to see them do well, but you hope to have them for their whole career and it's always disappointing to lose them to be honest."

Porter-Mackrell can find comfort in the three stallions currently in his care at Newsells Park, headed by the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and G1 Eclipse S. winner Nathaniel (Ire), who produced the legendary racemare Enable (GB) from his very first crop conceived at the stud in 2013.

Nathaniel has since been joined on the roster by the G1 St James's Palace S. hero Without Parole (GB) in 2021 and the multiple Group 2 winner A'Ali (Ire) in 2022, keeping Porter-Mackrell on his toes with three very different personalities to contend with.

"They are all different, so different, and you learn something from all of them as well," he says. "You need to be flexible in your approach and work out what works for that individual and how you can best get the job done in a way that keeps them happy.

"The nicest thing is when you get a horse from the very beginning, when they first get off the track. They've got to learn an entirely different way of life--one minute they're in full work and training and the next minute you're asking them to be calm and relaxed and to saunter around the paddock without being stupid." **Cont. p5**

He adds, "They've got to get used to that lifestyle and make that transition. Watching them become happy with that and seeing them happy, that's where the reward is because if they're happy then you're doing a good job."

It's a job that not everybody is cut out for. And nor should the responsibility of handling 500kg of horseflesh, brimming with testosterone, ever be taken lightly, requiring a very specific skillset to make a success of it.

Explaining which quality is prized in a stallion handler above all others, Porter-Mackrell says, "First and foremost, patience. If you've got the patience and you have a genuine love and care for them, and you listen to what they're telling you, then you'll come up with the right answers.

"They can be testing, but the one thing that you always have to bear in mind is that they live quite a solitary life. They're not

mingling in a herd, like the mares, foals and yearlings.

"You are such a huge part of their life and they're so reliant on you, so if they're having a bad day they're going to tell you about it. The important thing is to listen to them and try to understand and think 'okay, what's making you unhappy here and what can we do about it?' That's the key really."

Perhaps it's for fear of making one of the others unhappy that Porter-Mackrell couldn't possibly imagine nominating a favourite among the stallions

he's looked after. "You can't even engage with that line of thought," he protests. "They're all so special and you learn something from each of them. It's nigh on impossible to single one out."

For an interviewer who lazily assumed that Nathaniel would be top of the pile, Porter-Mackrell's parently attitude towards the charges in his care gives a glimpse into why he's so valued by the team at Newsells Park, headed by general manager Julian Dollar who made the nomination for the Thoroughbred Industry Employee Awards.

Together the team has enjoyed some memorable days, such as that in 2022 when Desert Crown (GB) proved himself a top-class colt for Nathaniel when sprinting away from his rivals in the G1 Derby at Epsom.

"It's incredible and, professionally, that's what it's all about,"

Porter-Mackrell sums up. "You kind of avidly support them [the stallions], believe in them right from the beginning, and look forward to those sorts of days.

"You believe they'll come and, when they do come, it's just magic. And part of the joy of it is watching everybody else appreciate them, hopefully, as much as you do."

It's been less than two weeks since the industry came together to show their appreciation for Porter-Mackrell himself and his efforts over the years. He took home the Stud Staff award, as well as the title of Employee of the Year, not to mention £15,000 in cash and the same amount to be shared amongst his colleagues at Newsells Park.

As enjoyable as it is to talk about the horses who helped to make it all possible, now is the time to find out a bit more about the man himself, even if it means taking him out of comfort zone just a little.

"It all began with the horses as opposed to an interest in racing as such," he says of his background. "I came into contact with horses when I was about 10 or 11, just on a very casual basis, looking after them and riding.

"I was only ever an average rider and it was never something I was going to do professionally, but I wanted to be around the horses and work with them. I was lucky enough to have somebody sensible tell me that stud work was an obvious line of employment and it just went from there

really."

The 2024 breeding season is Porter-Mackrell's 16th at Newsells Park and three stallions at one time is as many as he's ever had to deal with. Typically, he expects to be working flat out in the coming weeks and months, but don't ever expect to hear him complaining about his lot.

That's simply not his way, instead preferring to focus on the plus points of the industry and everything it has to offer, from the work/life balance he's able to strike to all the boundless opportunities that are available to the right candidate.

"You know that during the breeding season the level of commitment is going to be very high and very time-consuming," he says. "But you also know that outside of the breeding season you're under far less pressure and you're able to give a bit more back at home. For me it's quite a good balance." **Cont. p6** "And you've got to be in the right environment, with the right support, to be seen to your best, in any walk of life. He says, "One of the messages I would love to get across is actually how great this business is. If you have an interest in horses and you have a care for horses, then you're kind of 90 percent of the way there.

"If you don't mind grafting and you're willing to learn, then the opportunities are endless in this job. It's a message I feel quite strongly about because it's quite difficult to attract staff in this industry at the moment and I think it's a shame because it offers a lot."

Porter-Mackrell's story should certainly be an inspiration to anyone who is thinking of following in his footsteps and pursuing a career in the industry. The rewards that come with it might not ever be as public as those he received at the Thoroughbred Industry Employee Awards, but at least then you won't have a pesky interviewer asking you to sum up how it feels.

"It's completely overwhelming to be honest," Porter-Mackrell explains. "It was over a week ago now and it's still sinking in. You don't expect anything like this and it's been incredible really. How happy people are for you is just amazing. I've had emails from clients and stuff like that, congratulating me."

Reacting to being nominated by Dollar, he adds, "From the beginning that was the most important thing, since I was first made aware that I'd been nominated.

"Just the fact that Julian has taken the time to nominate me and thought me worthy of it, that's the biggest compliment of all really. He knows me better than anybody and he sees what I do day in, day out, year in, year out.

"And you've got to be in the right environment, with the right support, to be seen to your best, in any walk of life. The fact that I've had that here [at Newsells Park] is also something to be grateful for."

As for what the future might hold, this is one question Porter-Mackrell has no problem answering, with no plans to change the status quo in the foreseeable future.

"It's what I wanted to do when I was young and it's still what I want to do now," he sums up. "There are endless opportunities in this industry and there's all sorts of directions you could divert into, but what I do here now, day-to-day, is what I want to do--long may it continue."

ARRIGO BECOMES FIRST STALLION FOR CHLOE RODDICK RACING

G2 Oppenheim-Union-Rennen winner **Arrigo (Ger)** has relocated from Yorton Farm Stud to Bullbrook Farm near Somerton for the 2024 breeding season, it was announced on Friday.

A half-brother to German champion sire Adlerflug (Ger), Arrigo has been leased from Yorton Stud and James and Jean Potter by Chloe Roddick and her husband Philip Maloney. Roddick and Maloney have experience of standing sport horse stallions and boarding mares at Bullbrook Farm, alongside running a breaking and pre-training operation.

"Standing a thoroughbred stallion has been a dream of ours for many years," said Roddick. "To stand Arrigo, a beautiful stallion with an outstanding pedigree, makes that come true and more.

"We are based in an area of the country which is well-known for jumps racing and point-to-pointing, with some leading trainers and popular racecourses." **Cont. p7**

Roddick adds, "Bringing Arrigo to this area opens up an opportunity for West Country breeders, but we will be delighted to talk to mare owners wherever they are based. The breeding season is up and running and we cannot wait to show Arrigo to prospective clients."

Yorton Farm Stud's David Futter added, "It's very satisfying for us to have this opportunity to work with Chloe and Philip and to send Arrigo to an area of Britain which has a strong connection with jumps racing, point-to-pointing and breeding.

"In the three years he has been standing at Yorton he has covered some outstanding mares, including our own and those belonging to James and Jean Potter, and he has some lovely foals on the ground. He is very much still part of our team and we will continue to send mares to him."

Arrigo will stand under the Chloe Roddick Racing banner at a fee of £2,000.

Darlinghurst, unsuccessful in two juvenile starts last year, shed maiden status at Cagnes-sur-Mer on seasonal return in January and doubled his win tally back at that Côte d'Azur venue last month. Assuming control after a slick getaway from the outside gate, he was shaken up with 350 metres remaining and refused to yield under continued urging inside the final furlong to secure a career high in this black-type debut.

"We had a bad draw and the plan was to be positive with a horse in top form, so well done to his trainer," said winning rider Mickael Barzalona. "I was able to slow it down around the bend and he responded really well in the straight. He didn't pick up immediately, it was more of a progressive response, and he lengthened stylishly in the closing stages. He is a strong, nicelooking individual and you can't fault him this season, so more improvement is a possibility."

Darlinghurst, full to a 2-year-old colt and a yearling colt, is the first of three foals produced by G3 Mercury S. victrix Dr Simpson (Fr) (Dandy Man {Ire}), who is out of a half-sister to the stakeswinning Stars Above Me (GB) (Exceed And Excel {Aus}). The February-foaled bay's third dam Kalinova (Ire) (Red Ransom) is an unraced half-sister to five-time Group 1-winning distaffer Soviet Song (Ire) (Marju {Ire}) and to the dam of G1 Prix Jean Romanet heroine Ribbons (GB) (Manduro {Ger}). Skylight Brochard, successful in two of his four freshman starts last term, ran second over this trip in his sophomore return at Deauville last month and displayed a willing attitude to claim a career high on black-type bow here.

Well away to stalk the pace in second from flagfall, he was bustled along passing the two pole and kept on gamely under continued rousting thereafter to narrowly deny long-time leader Action Point in the dying strides.

"I was delighted with his first run of the year in Deauville and, even though he was beaten, he ran an absolute blinder," said trainer Tim Donworth. "He's done one piece of work since then and has done nothing but improve. He's a tough little horse and we're going to have a fun year with him. I'm not really sure where we'll go next and it's a question of whether we look at seven furlongs or stay at sprinting trips. We might look at the [Apr. 9 G3] Prix Djebel [over seven furlongs] at Deauville, but I'd love to think we might travel abroad at the end of the year and do some of those sprinting races."

Skylight Brochard, the latest of five foals, is one of two scorers out of a half-sister to multiple Group-placed Listed Midsummer

S. and Listed Doncaster Mile victor Gabrial (Ire) (Dark Angel {Ire}). His dam is Fonseca (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire})and she is also kin to the dam of dual Group 3-placed Listed August S. winner Cresta (Fr) (New Bay {GB}). The January-foaled homebred's second dam Guajira (Fr) (Mtoto {GB}) is a half-sister to Grade II--winning sires Jaunatxo (Lyphard's Wish {Fr}) and Iron Deputy (Silver Deputy) and to the dam of G1 Premio Vittorio di Capuawinning sire Shamalgan (Fr) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}). Added jockey Callum Shepherd, "What a magic winter this horse has given us and for it to culminate in this race is huge. He's had to overcome adversity here, being virtually knocked over on the first bend. I'm enormously grateful to His Highness Sheikh Nasser, I am so pleased we could do this for him. It was his ambition to win the three races, the 'Triple Crown', and it takes some doing.

"I'd also like to give enormous credit to Rosie Jessop who's ridden him every day out here and the girls who have looked after him. They have carried out and implemented George's plans to the letter and they have been faultless in doing so."

Said Jessop, who has jumped aboard Isle of Jura in his work over the course of the last three months, "I am going to miss him dearly. He's been the life and soul of my season this year. I'm just so happy and he's made it a magical time for us."

Isle of Jura returns to Europe for a pattern campaign over the summer.

The well-related Isle of Jura is out of a daughter of French listed-winning 2002 G1 Pouliches runner-up Firth of Lorne (Ire) (Danehill), whose son Master of the Seas (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) led home a Godolphin 1-2 in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile. She is also the dam of the stakes-winning and G1 St James's Palace S. second Latharnach (Iffraaj {GB}) and Etive (Elusive Quality), a listed winner in Germany. This is also the family of Just Fine (Ire) (Sea The Stars {Ire}), popular winner of the G1 Metropolitan H. at Randwick last September. Falls of Lora is also represented by a 2-year-old Night of Thunder (Ire) colt and a yearling colt by Dubawi.

Real World Back To Winning Ways

It had been a stretch of 12 consecutive outs for Godolphin's classy **Real World (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) dating back to his victory in the 2022 G2 Zabeel Mile at Meydan. The 7-year-old earned his first placing since when third to Brave Emperor (Ire) (Sioux Nation) in the Irish Thoroughbred Marketing Cup in Qatar Feb. 17 and snapped the skid with an authoritative victory in Friday's \$80,000 Listed Al Methaq Mile.

Ridden forward by Kevin Stott, the veteran went to the front with better than 200 metres to travel and proved not for catching from there, defeating **Wowzers (GB)** (Kodiac {GB}) by a comfortable 2 1/2-length margin.

"Last time Real World ran well in Doha in Qatar, and then he worked very well last week and back at a mile, which is the best trip for him, I was confident he would run well. That was good to see," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor.

LUCKY SWEYNESSE LOOKS TO BOUNCE BACK IN QUEEN'S SILVER JUBILEE CUP

Having endured a sub-optimal trip when only sixth to Victor the Winner (Aus) (Toronado {Ire}) in defence of his crown in the G1 Centenary Sprint Cup Jan. 26--not to mention some post-race veterinary issues--reigning champion sprinter **Lucky Sweynesse (NZ)** (Sweynesse {Aus}) will look to atone for that effort in Sunday's G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup, a race he also took out 12 months ago.

The 5-year-old, victorious in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint in December, was found to be lame in his right fore the morning after the Centenary Sprint, but turned in a smooth runner-up effort in a Feb. 20 trial over the dirt track and should be a warm item Sunday. James McDonald, who was in the saddle last year, looks for another hit-and-run Group 1 in Hong Kong.

California Spangle (Ire) (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) made the running and Lucky Sweynesse did the chasing in last year's Queen's Silver Jubilee, but the pacesetter couldn't quite see it

out and settled for a sound second. The 6-year-old was very good in carrying 135 pounds to victory in the G2 Sha Tin Trophy over a mile on seasonal debut back in October, but those weight-bearing efforts can exact a toll, as he is winless in his last four, including a fourth in the G1 Stewards' Cup over the metric mile Jan. 21. A trip to the desert for the G1 Al Quoz Sprint could be in the offing with a return to something approaching his best form.

"He's entered for Dubai and we'll decide whether we will go depending on how he performs on Sunday," said Cruz. "We hope for a good result."

Zac Purton opted for California Spangle over Lucky Sweynesse last year and gets a leg up on **Beauty Eternal (Aus)** (Starspangledbanner {Aus}) from Tony Cruz Sunday afternoon. After running second to Beauty Eternal in November's G2 Jockey Club Mile, **Beauty Joy (Aus)** (Sebring {Aus}) was sixth to Romantic Warrior (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) in the G1 Hong Kong Gold Cup several starts later on Feb. 25. Beauty Eternal was an even sixth behind Golden Sixty (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro) in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Mile and exits a solid second to the Dubaibound Voyage Bubble (Aus) (Deep Field {Aus}) in the Stewards' Cup.

Cruz is a three-time winner of the Queen's Silver Jubilee, most notably with the legendary Silent Witness (Aus) back in 2005.

His dam was placed at Group 1 level in Brazil, and she foaled a full-sister to the winner in 2022. Her latest is a Justify yearling filly, and she was covered by Epicenter last spring. Baby Go Far is a daughter of G1 Grande Premio Marciano de Aguiar Moreira heroine Linda Rafaela (Brz) (Bin Ajwaad {Ire}), and a half-sister to G1 Brazilian Oaks winner Viva Rafaela (Brz) (Know Heights {Ire}). LOCKED OFF TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL WITH KNEE INJURY

'TDN Rising Star' Locked (Gun Runner), the winner of last year's GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity, has come down with a knee injury that will prevent him from running in the upcoming Triple Crown races. The injury is not considered careerthreatening.

The news of his injury was first reported by David Grening of the *Daily Racing Form*.

Aron Wellman, the managing partner of Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, the co-owners of Locked, described the injury as "a very minor ligament fray in the upper part of the left knee."

Locked was first expected to make his 3-year-old debut in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Bay Downs Feb. 10, but missed that race due to a fever. Plan B was to run in last Saturday's GII Coolmore Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream but he was scratched by trainer Todd Pletcher, who was concerned with the way the colt trained the morning of that race.

"The morning of the Fountain of Youth, he didn't train like he normally does," Wellman said. "He had trained exceptionally well in the weeks leading up to the Fountain of Youth. It was just that morning. It's a tribute to Todd's sharpness and his team for picking up on it. Any other trainer, he probably would have run. With Todd's attention to detail, we weren't comfortable sending him over for the Fountain of Youth." **Cont. p3**


DOMESTIC PRODUCT CAN GIVE BROWN A FIRST TAMPA BAY DERBY by Alan Carasso

Trainer Chad Brown has started but three horses in the GIII Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby, none of which has finished better than sixth, but in the form of Klaravich Stable's **Domestic Product** (Practical Joke), he could very well be getting his picture taken Saturday afternoon.

Having won his maiden over nine furlongs at second asking at Aqueduct in late October, the next logical step was the Dec. 2 GII Remsen S., but he caught a rain-affected strip he may not have preferred and faded through the final furlong to finish a well-beaten seventh. As has been well documented, the oftmaligned Remsen has proved productive, with Dornoch (Good Magic) and 'TDN Rising Star' Sierra Leone (Gun Runner) winning 50-point Derby preps over the last several weeks. The 8-5 morning line second pick, Domestic Product ran on well to finish two lengths behind Hades (Awesome Slew) in the GIII Holy Bull S. Feb. 3. Cont. p4

On Monday, the colt was sent to Dr. John Madison in Ocala, who detected the injury.

"We trained him the day after the Fountain of Youth and he was better, but considering his profile and importance we decided not to take any chances," Wellman said. "We sent him to Ocala and thanks to the state-of-the-art technology that exists now, they found the problem. No surgery will be required. He just needs time to let it reattach and heal, which is unfortunate because we're off the Classic trail. At the same time, we're thankful to Todd and his team for detecting it early enough so that this horse will still have a future. We're thankful to the vets up in Ocala, including Dr. Madison, who ran him through a body of tests. In the grand scheme of things we were fortunate because they are now able to detect injuries like the one he had. That couldn't have been done in the past."

Wellman said the goal now will be to make the major 3-yearold races run in the summer, including the GI Travers S. at Saratoga.

After winning the Breeders' Futurity, Locked ran third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The Fountain of Youth was to be his 3-year-old debut.

"Anybody who is in this game is in it with the dream of having a legitimate contender for the Kentucky Derby and the Classics," Wellman said. "Locked fit that profile to a tee. We've been fortunate enough to have some legitimate Derby contenders in the past. I was fortunate to be part of the team with Animal Kingdom and Team Valor and we had some other horses who ran respectably in the race. But I don't know that we ever had a horse before who came into their sophomore season with the credentials and the profile that Locked had. We were really confident and had huge convictions that we had the right type of horse to really be effective in the Kentucky Derby at a mile and a quarter. Absolutely, this is a punch in the gut."

Morplay Racing's **No More Time** (Not This Time) is the 7-5 pick on the strength of his 1 1/4-length defeat of the running-on **'TDN Rising Star'** Agate Road (Quality Road) when a surprising favorite in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. over course and distance Feb. 10. Javier Castellano takes over at the controls from Paco Lopez on a horse whose speed figures remain very light.

Juxtaposed to Brown is trainer Todd Pletcher, who has won the Tampa Bay Derby no fewer than six times, including his first with Limehouse (Grand Slam) 20 years ago and Tapit Trice (Tapit) last March. **Heartened** (Street Boss) has not missed the top three in his four trips to the race, two each on turf and dirt. The bay most recently validated a quote of 40 cents on the dollar to break his maiden by a widening 4 1/2 lengths going this track's extended mile Feb. 10, and his 74 Beyer for that effort is not all that far off the 80 earned by No More Time in the Davis.

Florida Oaks A Tasty Appetizer

An intriguing field of 12 sophomore fillies is slated to go to post for Saturday's GIII Florida Oaks, and while Chad Brown is looking for a maiden win in the Derby one race later, his runners have taken the Oaks on three occasions, most recently with Dolce Zel (Fr) (Zelzal {Fr}) in 2022.

Klaravich Stables' **Dynamic Pricing (Ire)** (Night of Thunder {Ire}) is the preferred half of an uncoupled entry. A 170,000gns purchase at Tattersalls October in 2022 by Mike Ryan on behalf of Seth Klarman's operation, the bay filly was up in the nick of time to break her maiden at first asking at Aqueduct Nov. 4. Dynamic Pricing returned to action at a generous 28-5 in the Feb. 3 GIII Sweetest Chant S. and came with a solid finish to cross the line third, beaten two necks by Life's an Audible (Audible) and the re-opposing **Style Points** (Oscar Performance).

Austere (Mendelssohn) was a debut winner on the turf at Ellis Park last August before taking out the valuable Kentucky Downs Juvenile Fillies the following month. Tyler Gaffalione managed to work out an inside trip from a high draw in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Nov. 3, and the dark bay was scarcely disgraced in fifth, beaten two lengths behind Hard to Justify (Justify).

Placed once from two sprint tries over the Saratoga main track, **Waskesiu** (American Pharoah) improved by several lengths when bounding away to graduate by 4 1/2 lengths at Aqueduct Nov. 18. Made the 9-5 favorite in the Jan. 6 Ginger Brew S., the Chiefswood homebred was a bit wayward out of the gates, then turned in a mostly even effort to be third. She has since worked well up at Payson Park.

Pletcher Ships A Pair In For Beholder Mile

Rare are the California shippers for non-Breeders' Cup events from the barn of Todd Pletcher, but the Hall of Famer is set to be represented by a pair of entrants in Saturday's GI Beholder Mile at Santa Anita.

Commenting that he 'is trying to save racing one horse at a time,' Mike Repole paid \$1.4 million to acquire the dual graded-stakes winner **Interstatedaydream** (Classic Empire) from her previous owner Staton Flurry at Keeneland November just days

after winning the Turnback the Alarm S. at Aqueduct. Frankie Dettori takes the ride on the Ontario-bred 5-year-old, while John Velazquez has the mount aboard **'TDN Rising Star' Green Up** (Flatter), who--like her stablemate--exits a victory in Aqueduct stakes company, in her case the Nov. 5 Pumpkin Pie S.

Adare Manor (Uncle Mo) is the 5-2 favorite to give her sire back-to-back Beholder Mile winners following A Mo Reay last year. Also kept in training for a 5-year-old campaign, the Michael Lund Petersen colorbearer defeated **Desert Dawn** (Cupid) for her first elite-level success in the Clement L. Hirsch S. at Del Mar and added this track's GII Zenyatta S. in October before finishing seventh, but not beaten far, in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

Arizona-bred Desert Dawn was winless in seven starts last term, including a runner-up effort in the GIII Bayakoa S. at Los Alamitos Dec. 15, but she got her 5-year-old season off on a high note with a one-length defeat of **Coffee in Bed** (Curlin) in the GIII La Canada S. Jan. 20.

Kinza Rates the Marquee in Santa Ysabel

'TDN Rising Star' Kinza (Carpe Diem) puts her undefeated record on the line against seven others in a renewal of the GIII Santa Ysabel S. that looks competitive on paper.

The \$350,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic breezer belied debut odds of 11-2 to romp home by 7 1/2 lengths going six furlongs over this strip Dec. 29 and was made the even-money choice in the GIII Las Virgenes S. Feb. 10. The New York-bred set reasonable fractions beneath Juan Hernandez and was never truly in danger, scoring by two lengths, with **She's a Tempest** (Connect) another 1 1/2 lengths back in third.

Of the five last-out maiden winners looking to negotiate the hike into stakes company, **Ultimate Authority** (Practical Joke) shapes with the most promise. She has turned in a pair of cracking efforts around two turns--each good for a 90 Beyer Speed Figure--missing by a head to She's a Tempest in a mile maiden Jan. 5 before defeating **Where's My Ring** (Twirling Candy) by a half-length over the same distance Feb. 2. The latter also takes her chance here.

ACTION REMAINS FAST AND FURIOUS DURING OBS UNDER-TACK PREVIEW

The third of four under-tack previews ahead of next week's Ocala Breeders Sales Company's March Sale of 2-Year-Olds In Training took place Friday, a session that produced the overall bullet times for both one-furlong and quarter-mile breezes.

Wednesday's opening breeze-ups were topped by a trio of horses that stopped clock in :9 4/5 for an eighth of a mile, a time that was matched by no fewer than 15 juveniles on Thursday. Those numbers were lowered Friday by a pair of horses, a Wavertree Stables Inc.-consigned filly (hip 448) from the first crop of Vekoma (Candy Ride {Arg}) and a colt (hip 529) by fellow freshman sire Tiz the Law (Constitution) consigned by Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds. Each covered an eighth of a mile in :9 3/5.

Laying Down the 'Law'

Randy Hartley went to \$375,000 for the Tiz the Law colt from the Woods Edge Farm draft at Keeneland September, but only after a not-so-subtle push from his client Rich Mendez.

"At \$350,000, honestly, I was done, but Rich goes, 'one more time,' because Tiz the Law was like his favorite horse," Hartley explained. "So I did and we got him. \$350,000 was kind of our number, but we loved him so much we stretched a little more because we were trying to find the best one there."

The approach to the September sale was fairly straightforward.

"We went to that sale to try to find the best Tiz the Law at the sale and we found him in Book 1," Hartley said. "Peter O'Callaghan had him and he might have had other horses sell for more in Book 1, but I thought this colt was the best physical he had in that book. We stretched on him because we thought that Tiz the Law was such a great racehorse, we love Constitution too, but they're harder to buy." **Cont. p8**

He continued, "But we felt like we if had one of the best Tiz the Laws in the 2-year-old market that the people that respected Tiz the Law would be trying to buy something that they like."

Just a May 9 foal, the colt is a son of the Grade III-placed Our Majesty (Majesticpefection), herself a half-sister to a pair of black-type winners. Sun Bloodstock purchased Our Majesty for \$375,000 in foal to Tapit at Keeneland November in 2019 and sold the Tiz the Law colt to Vanny Investments for \$140,000 at Keeneland January in 2023.

Hartley was duly please with what he saw on the track Friday.

"He's quick and he kept going, some people had him in :19 and change galloping out," he said. "He's a May baby. I don't push mine hard, he's even still a little chunky. I try to get my horses here sound and I feel like if I train them good, they'll give me everything they've got. Once they show me that they can take off and go, from there it's about fitness. We're super proud of him. He's only 22 months old, but he looks like a 3-year-old."

The noted reseller believes there is a good buzz about the first crop of the 2020 GI Belmont S. hero.

"We only had this one and he's been our man the whole time. I would definitely buy some more," he said. "When I see Tiz the Laws bringing \$200,000 in January, that tells me that people are liking the way they're training. People are not going to buy them if they're not hearing that buzz. We thought a lot of this colt all season."

Kight High On Justify Colt

If the Tiz the Law colt didn't exactly represent a 'bargain' price, Hoby Kight felt like the \$100,000 that he gave at Keeneland September for a Justify colt from the consignment of Joe Pickerell's Pick View LLC certainly was. The Jan. 23 foal (hip 539) was bred in New York by Chester and Mary Broman.

"He was big and beautiful and he's got some pedigree," Kight explained. "And Dr. Broman raises a really good horse, [Sequel Bloodstock's] Becky [Thomas] does a phenomenal job. He had a cut on his back leg on his pastern and his leg was still swollen from the cut. A lot of short-listers, they cut that horse and never get to see him and that's the sort of stuff I prey on. It's stuff that won't bother them and gets better, it was an old scar and was still kind of fresh. But everything else was there--beautiful horse, all the right angles. And Justify really heated up too, so everything went my way."

Bred in New York by Chester and Mary Broman, the bay is a son of two-time stakes winner and Grade III-placed Pauseforthecause (Giant's Causeway)

Hip 539 was one of two to breeze a quarter in :20.2 Friday.



"I thought he worked lights out," Kight said of the colt, who already stands 16.2 in his estimation. "Joe has done a remarkable job with him. Joe thought he was going to be sub-:21 the way he'd been training, so he was pretty optimistic."

McCrocklin At Both Ends of the Speed Spectrum

Tom McCrocklin consigns the afternoon's other :20.2 breezer, a filly by Munnings--Miss Majestic (Majestic Warrior) (hip 453), which he is offering on behalf of Florida breeder Peter Mirabelli.

"She's a beautiful filly, a great mover and she just does everything so smoothly," he said. "I generally work my horses a quarter-mile just because I think makes for a more composed breed. I am not trying to disparage anyone else, but I find sometimes that the furlong breezes can end up being pretty frenetic. When people see me breeze one that isn't a quarter mile, they tend to raise an eyebrow."

McCrocklin is also consigning a handful of the 40 2-year-olds in training that are being sold as part of the dispersal from the late Bob Lothenbach, who are just galloping through the stretch.

"I don't think it will be looked upon with skepticism or negatively," McCrocklin said of the strategy to not ask the horses for any serious effort. "Mr, Lothenbach built and ran a high-class stable. The estate requested that none of the horses breeze, so we are just honoring their wishes, but I don't think it will negatively impact the horses or the way they sell."

The final under-tack preview is set for Saturday morning beginning at 8 a.m. The March Sale begins Tuesday, Mar. 12 and runs for three days, with bidding beginning each day at 11 a.m. ET. For more, visit www.obssales.com.

FIFTY MONTHS AND TWENTY RACES LATER, ECLIPSE CHAMPION STORM THE COURT LOOKING TO GET BACK TO WINNER'S

CIRCLE by Bill Finley

Even though he won the 2019 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, no one was ready to declare that **Storm the Court** (Court Vision) was a star in the making. After all, he was 45-1 that day at Santa Anita and the field for that year's Juvenile was one of the weakest in the history of the race. But nobody could have predicted what was to become for that year's 2-year-old male champion, an epic losing streak that has lasted now for more than four years and 20 races.

Storm the Court will be out to put an end to the futility Saturday at Gulfstream Park in the Silks Run S., but he is 20-1 in the morning line for a race that brought together a surprisingly deep field. Expectations are that the Silks Run will be the 21st straight loss for the now 7-year-old horse.

"The race came up super tough," said his trainer Bill Morey. Storm the Court won his debut on Aug. 10, 2019, for trainer Peter Eurton. He lost his rider in his next start, the GI Del Mar Futurity, and then was third in the GI American Pharoah S. Ridden by Flavien Prat, he won the Juvenile in a game effort in which he outfought Anneau d'Or (Medaglia d'Oro). Since then absolutely nothing has gone right.

"A lot of it has to do with fact he matured a lot earlier than most horses do," Eurton said. "In the Breeders' Cup he was in the right place at the right time. The rest of the horses caught up to him."

Storm the Court's 3-year-old campaign coincided with the pandemic, which pushed the GI Kentucky Derby back to Sept. 5. He lost all five of his starts leading up to the Derby, but ran creditably when third in the GIII Ohio Derby and second in the GIII La Jolla H. In the Derby, he finished sixth, beaten nine lengths. That was sixth straight loss, and it would only get worse.

Being that the horse was an Eclipse Award champion and a Grade I winner, the owners looked into turning him into a stallion, but the response from the breeding farms was lukewarm at best.

"There was some talk about turning him into a stallion back when he was four," Eurton said. "But it didn't happen. His pedigree, it's just not there."

His five-year-old season ended with a 12 3/4-length drubbing in the GIII Tokyo City S. That would be his last start for Eurton.

"The owners thought the horse would be better off back East and would have more opportunities there," Eurton said.

He was sent to Tom Amoss and made two starts for him, the last of which resulted in a 23-length loss in an allowance race at Churchill in September. **Cont. p10**

The ownership group then decided to make another change and sent the horse to Morey. The new trainer hasn't gotten him to the winner's circle in three tries, but at least Storm the Court has been competitive. He's had three starts for the new outfit, all of them in allowance sprints on the grass. He finished third at Horseshoe Indianapolis and then second in consecutive races at Tampa Bay Downs.

"I had some other horses for the ownership group and they called me and asked what I doing for the winter," Morey said. "When I told them I'd be racing at Turfway and Tampa, they thought Tampa might be a good place to get him reinvigorated and back on his game. That was the idea. It just seemed like the horse was obviously stale with what he was doing so we decided to try something drastically different. So far, it has worked to some extent. We haven't gotten to the winner's circle yet, but we seem to have him going pretty good. We're training him to be a sprinter rather than continuing to train him to be a router. I have trained him to sprint. I am assuming that the trainers who had him before me were all training him for routes."

Morey is optimistic he can break the losing streak, but understands that it probably won't happen Saturday. Storm the Court is running against horses who are considerably faster than him on the Beyer scale, including Big Invasion (Declaration of War), who was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint.

"In this game you take chances," Morey said. "There wasn't an allowance at five furlongs on the grass at Tampa for the foreseeable future. An on-the board-performance in a race as tough as this would almost feel like we had broken the losing streak. This looks like a tough spot. Maybe we'll get lucky and hit the board or maybe win. If not, hopefully we'll get him into the winner's circle the next time." At Santa Anita, Eurton will be watching. He hasn't had the horse for a year and a half, but will always have the memories of his win in the Breeders' Cup.

"I would love to see him win a race. One hundred percent," he said. "There will always be a soft spot in my heart for this horse."

SOUTH AFRICAN HEAVY HITTERS ARRIVE IN NEW YORK WITH BC GOAL

A plane carrying 11 South African Thoroughbreds, among them current Equus Horse of the Year **Princess Calla (SAf)** (Flower Alley) and Breeders' Cup qualifier **Beach Bomb (SAf)** (Lancaster Bomber), touched down at New York's JFK Airport on Thursday, the *Sporting Post* reported. November's Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships at Del Mar are on the radar for several of the new arrivals, who will now spend two months in quarantine.

The first direct export flight from South Africa since 2003, the plan was chartered after champion owner/breederGaynor Rupert of Drakenstein Stud, her racing manager Kevin Sommerville, Robin Bruss of Northfields Bloodstock, Team Valor International's Barry Irwin, CTB Forwarding Pty., Ltd's Gerard Connolly and Mersant International New York joined forces to facilitate the trip. Originating in Johannesburg, the plane made a refueling stop in Barbados prior to touching down in the Empire State.

Rupert's homebred MG1SW Beach Bomb, already successful in the G1 Cartier Paddock S., a "Win And You're In" for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, anchors the Drakenstein quintet. Grade 3 winner **Golden Hostess (SAf)** (Gold Standard {SAf), also MG1SP, as well as GSW & G1SP **Distant Winter (SAf)** (What A Winter {SAf}), **Hunting Trip (SAf)** (Trippi) and GSP **Coldhardstare (SAf)** (What A Winter {SAf}) complete the fivesome.

Irwin, who experienced great success with South African exports previously and had chartered the final flight in 2003 with Bruss, sent a trio--Equus Champion 3-Year-Old Filly **Bless My Stars (SAf)** (Gimmethegreenlight {Aus}) who is also bound for the Filly & Mare Turf; GSW & G1SP Feather Boa (SAf) (Flower Alley); and former smart juvenile Eqyptian Mau (SAf) (Fire Away), a Grade 3 winner and Grade 1-placed at two.

Irwin told *Sporting Post*, "It has been meaningful to get this over the line since it is 20 years+ since the last time Robin and I did it. I hope that the results are just as successful. It would have been nice if the enterprise received a bit more support from key players. But as the old saying goes, TISAB !This is South Africa, baby!"

Other owners were encouraged by the group to participate, with trainer Sean Tarry and owner Mario Ferreira sending the aforementioned five-time Grade 1 winner Princess Calla. She has a pair of Breeders' Cup options--either the GI Filly & Mare Sprint or the GI Mile versus males.

Tarry said on his website, "There is a lot of planning still to do. It wasn't a last minute decision, but I don't think there is a firm plan. She certainly has the option to race still. She took her run on Saturday very well [third in the G1 Wilgerbosdrift H F Oppenheimer Horse Chestnut S.] and she's sound. In terms of breeding I am sure the world will be her oyster."

Hollywood Syndicate's 2023 Equus Champion Sprinter and MG1SW Isivunguvungu (SAf) (What A Winter {SAf}) was also on board. The 5-year-old gelding will target the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. Completing the 11 visitors is Ridgemont Stud's MG1SW Make It Snappy (SAf) (Dynasty {SAf}), heroine of the G1 Cape Fillies Guineas and G1 Paddock S.

Breeders Cup's Josh Christian told the publication, "We are thrilled that the South African horses have arrived in New York on their way to the Breeders Cup World Championships! None of this would be possible without the help and support of Gaynor Rupert, Barry Irwin, Kevin Sommerville, Robin Bruss and Gerard Connolly. We are looking forward to seeing them at Del Mar in November and having the best from South Africa, Asia, Europe and the America's will make the Breeders Cup a true world championship."

Northfields Bloodstock's Robin Bruss, "The USA export route allows South African horses to compete almost up to flight date as Horse of the Year Princess Calla did on Saturday and was in New York four days later. The difference lies between the EU stance of pre-travel quarantine and USA's post arrival quarantine. South Africa is the eighth largest racing country in the world and established great success in the first decade of the 2000s winning Gr.1 races on four continents. Exports have been severely constrained for the past 10 years whilst waiting for difficulties in the pre-travel quarantine system to be resolved. We are the sleeper in world racing, and we want to be back on the stage, win lose or draw. I pay tribute to Gaynor Rupert and Barry Irwin for their willingness to go the extra mile and make things happen and give thanks to the supporters of this venture including Breeders Cup, Ltd."

FLORIDA LEGISLATURE APPROVES EXTENSION OF RACING AND BREEDING FUNDS

A tax package that will extend racing and breeding incentives in the state of the Florida, was approved Friday by Florida Legislature. HB 7073, which was initially enacted in 2023, continues to provide state funding for HISA along with \$20m in purses and/facility improvements split between Gulfstream Park and Tampa Bay Downs. It also gives \$5m to the FTBOA for use as racing and breeding promotions and an additional \$2.5m for Florida-bred racing incentives. In total, HB 7073 gives a boost of over \$32.5m to the Florida racing and breeding industries.

"Once again, the legislative sponsors of last year's breeding and racing development program stepped up in a big way," said FTBOA president George Isaacs. "I'd like to personally thank Marion County's Representative Stan McClain [R-Ocala] and Senator Blaise Ingoglia [R-Spring Hill] for continuing their support of this program. We have also enjoyed support from the state's legislative and industry leaders, including Representative Lawrence McClure [R-Dover]."

HB 7073 now goes to the desk of Florida Governor Ron DeSantis for further action.




