Tennessee River Conservation Opportunity Area



The Tennessee River Conservation Opportunity Area

encompasses portions of the Tennessee River, Buffalo River, and Duck River, which provide important aquatic and terrestrial habitat in the river channels, floodplains, and surrounding uplands. In this COA, the Tennessee River is impounded by Kentucky Dam and is an important recreation area for boating, wildlife viewing, recreational fishing, commercial fishing, and hunting. The section of the Tennessee River in this COA below Wheeler Dam is perhaps the best example of "big river" habitat remaining in Tennessee and is home to rare species of mussels and fishes that are state or federally listed as threatened or endangered. Other important species such as the Pygmy Rattlesnake can be found in terrestrial habitats along the river. The primary land uses in the adjacent floodplains are agriculture and forestry.

The Tennessee River COA also includes extensive upland hardwood forests and pockets of limestone glade and barrens habitats. Public lands, including Land Between the Lakes, are distributed throughout the river corridor, providing important habitat conservation, recreation, and public education benefits.

TWRA will consider future land acquisitions in this COA for watershed protection, critical habitat protection, habitat restoration, streambank stabilization, planting of bottomland hardwoods, and buffer strip plantings along the river. The goal of land management projects is to establish or protect wide forested buffer zones along the rivers and promote the use of best management practices (BMPs) for farming, forestry, and construction projects.



Partnerships

TWRA will develop and foster partnerships with the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation, Tennessee Department of Forestry, the Tennessee Valley Authority, the US Fish & Wildlife Service, The Nature Conservancy, Wolf River Conservancy, Tennessee Ornithological Society, Natural Resources Conservation Service, Farm Bureau, Tennessee Department of Agriculture Forestry Division, Ducks Unlimited, Cooperative Extensions, citizen scientists, universities, various other institutions, and local governments.
