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## OVER THE EDITOR'S DESK

In our last issue, we invited subscribers to submit the names of Tennessee counties in which they are particularly interested. Of course, not everyone responded to that suggestion, but it is interesting to see that of Tennessee's 95 extant counties, only 30 were not mentioned. The votes were fairly evenly distributed for the remaining 65 counties, with Smith County receiving the most, and Warren, Lincoln and Rutherford tying for second. It might be expected that the so-called "burned" counties would receive the most votes, but that's not the case. Although most counties have lost some records, these four have saved at least some of their probate and land records which date back to the earliest court house. Warren County suffered loss during the Civil War, and Rutherford court house was destroyed in 1822 by fire, but many 1804 books have survived.

This seems to indicate that our subscribers are still interested in material from all over the state, with special emphasis on Middle Tennessee. We are in the process of up-dating the cumulative Table of Contents for the Tennessee Genealogical Magazine, "Ansearchin'" News. This will indicate the material we have published from each county, beginning with our first volume in 1954. We will announce it when our new Table of Contents is ready, but our current Table of Contents is still available for \$1.00.

The Southern New Mexico Genealogical Society has an interesting new project. They will join with the Fort Seldon Park Rangers in commemorating the 100th anniversary of the abandonment of that fort in June of 1891. Fort Seldon, created in 1865, is located 15 miles north of Las Cruces. The group would like to compile a roster of the men who served at the post and to locate descendants of these soldiers so that family representatives may join in the festivities. PETITIONS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF TENNESSEE

11-2-1813 Petition of Daniel TREDWAY of Jefferson County for divorce from Rebecca EATON, his wife, whom he married Feb 1807. He enlisted in the service of the U.S. in 1809 and they lived for near 12 months in the camp but after the children began to increase in size & number they concluded it would be better for her to live on a plantation in Jefferson Co where he occasionally visited her and furnished his family with all the necessities of life. For a few months in 1812 he could not go to her but in that time he supported her with money in the sum of \$125. He accuses her of adultery with Benjamin DAVIS. Sworn to before Michael BRANNER, J.P. 16 Aug 1813.

Deposition of Joseph AUSTIN of Hawkins Co before Jackson SMITH, J.P., states he has been acquainted with Rebecca TREDWAY, wife of Daniel Tredway, for several years and "has been a nigh Neighbour ever sense she left your Petitioner in the Army - on the Return of your Petitioner in April last said deponant was present with them both - the said Rebecca Tredway Expressed herself in these words 'I do not love you...well enough to live with you'"; Austin has since found out that she is pregnant and believes it is "not your petitioners by Reason of his Absence for twelve months and upwards at New Orleans and other places in the Army." 23 Aug 1813.

A similar deposition is given by Rachel EATON, mother of Rebecca Tredway and a resident of Hawkins Co, where Rebecca is living. (6 pages)

12-2-1813 Petition of Ph. HOODENPYL, who plans to raise 1000 sheep on Cumberland Mountain and needs more land. He asks for a reduction in price or for a tax deferment..."for the Encouragement of Iron Works the Law allows 3000 acres of Barrenlands for fewell to manufacture the ore into Iron..." Hoodenpyl asks for similar consideration. Read in the Senate 12 Oct 1813; marked unreasonable. An additional wrapper is marked Robinson Co and was referred to the Direct Tax Committee. (5 pages)

13-2-1813 Petition of Rebecca WATSON "a widow-Woman in Very contracted circumstances that she lives on a publick road and Supports a helpless family by Selling her own produce and Could be much bettered by having leave to Sell Speutuous liquers Tax free." She requests that privilege without any license. Signed by Rebecca Watson and: 28 Sep 1813 Marked reasonable (2 pages)

He abandoned her in December 1810 "and took with him another woman with whom your petitioner is informed he lives in Rutherford Co...TN." Witness: John MALTSBERGER 7 Sep 1813; endorsed by justices of the peace of Greene Co: William JONES, Christopher KENBY, Cornelius HEURNDN. (2 pages)

16-2-1813 Petition of Elizabeth ORTTO for divorce from Frederick Ortto whom she married 2 Jul 1805; he abandoned her in Nov 1805; she is told he has taken another wife in a distant region and does not intend to return. Signed: Elisa Ortto. (1 page)

17-2-1813 Petitioners of Greene Co complain that "the Constables' fees is two Extravagant" and ask for a reduction. 2 Sep 1813. Signed by: (2 pages)

Justices present were: Joel LEWIS, George WHARTON, Cary FELTS, Elihu S HALL, Philip PIPKIN, Christopher STUMP, Benajah GRAY, Candour McFADDIN, Robert HEWETT, Thomas HICKMAN, and Joseph COLEMAN; signed Nathan EWING, Clerk. 19-2-1813 "The Petition of Capt. FISHER's Company the 42nd Ridgement of Wilson County Militia...who Labour under a great difficulty from the distance that we have to attend our Ridgmental Muster which is at least fourteen miles from our Company muster ground, and the Ridgmental Muster Ground of the 7th Ridgment is but eight miles from our company muster grounds...(with) a public road... and there is no direct road to the muster ground of the 42nd Ridgment. Therefore if you would attach us to the 7th Ridgment you would lay us under such Obligations as would not Soon be forgotten."

21-2-1813 "State of Tennessee, Bledsoe County To the Honourable, the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee now in Session Whereas, John MISER, Tobias LONG, W<sup>m</sup> BLEAVINS, Robert Long, John JULIAN and William HAIL were bound in a Regagnizance as Securities for the appearance of a certain Joseph PATE, against whom the State of Tennessee had instituted a prosecution

And whereas the said Pate failed to make his appearance and it became entirely impracticable for his securities to surrender him, and whereas also, the property of some of the Securities has been executed and sold which has amounted to the costs attendant on said prosecution etc...To the very great distress of said Securities - In consequence of all, which your honourable body that forfeiture incurred. And your petitioners will pray etc. John Miser Tobias Long

22-2-1813 The petition of Joseph Alexander MONTGOMERY, aged about nineteen, who has been unable to walk or stand "since the first of his recollection from childhood." He has been attended and supported by his father, who lives in Rutherford Co and is old and not a wealthy man. Joseph wants a means of income after the death of his parents, who are willing to give him "a small property" for a store. He asks for permission to sell goods and spiritous liquors without state or county tax. The request is endorsed by: 16 Sep 1813 (3 pages)

23-2-1813 Petition of William G EVANS, who is "incapable of Manuel labour...he has a helpless family of small children" and asks for "the passage of a law in his favour permitting him to peddle & Hawk through the different counties of West Tennessee without being subject to the tax..." 27 Sep 1813 Signed: Will G Evans. Marked reasonable. (2 pages)

24-2-1813 The petition of James G RAULSTON for himself and on behalf of the other heirs of George Raulston, decd, who owned two lots with "improvements", one in Knoxville & one in Grantsborough. ("*a town at the junction of Clinch and Powell's rivers in Campbell Co.*" - *Eastin MORRIS' Tennessee Gazetteer, 1834*). The personal property has been exhausted in rearing the minor children, "all except a printing press and materials for carrying on the printing business." James has learned to operate the press and asks permission to sell and convey the lots & improvements "in as free and ample a manner as though your petitioner had arrived at a mature age, for the purpose of raising funds to educate himself and the other heirs ...the necessity of a liberal education being especially necessary to insure success in the printing business..." No date given (1 page)

25-2-1813 Petition of citizens of Morgan Co to change the site of the county seat. (*Ed. notes: Although Morgan County was not formed until 1817, this document was placed in among the 1813 documents when it was filmed.*) The commissioners appointed to select a site chose land of Daniel S LAVENDER, Esq., and although a town has been laid out, there are no improvements except a log court house and a log jail. The land which lies east of this town is more fertile and populated, and a site eight or twelve miles eastward of the courthouse on the road called Pile's Turnpike would be more convenient. The petitioners ask permission to meet at the Indian Tavern to vote on the change to a site near William WALL or Jacob LEMMONS. Dated 18 Oct 1819 and the following names were added.

A second petition reads in part: "...an act was passed for the purpose of moving the county seat of Morgan from...Montgomery to Some place East of Emerie's River...The county court put in nomination a place unfit...which received more than two votes to one over Montgomery..." The petitioners state that the county is thinly settled, larger than usual, rough and mountainous, and the chosen site within one-half mile of the county line. They ask the assembly to establish the county seat at Col. Sam<sup>l</sup> SCOTT's. [Some of the names are repeats from the first list, but they are in a different hand and the spelling may vary.] Signers were: (7 pages)

OLD MUNGLE CEMETERY - Contributed by Vernon Roddy, 204 Andrews Ave.,  
Hartsville, TN 37074

This cemetery is located on the Middle Fork of Big Goose Creek, 4.7 miles NE of Hartsville, TN, approximately 1.3 miles SE of Pleasant Valley Methodist Church, 0.25 miles north of the Trousdale-Macon County line, on the east side of the Middle Fork of Goose Creek in Macon Co TN. Mr. Roddy copied the cemetery in 1974 but of the 60-75 possible graves only one stone was legible.

SALLIE WOODMORE

Born Jan. 17th 1822

Died Oct. 19th 1862,

aged 40 years, 9 months, 2 days

Sallie Mungle Woodmore was apparently the daughter of Isaac MUNGLE (c1787-1840/50) and his wife Nelly. Isaac Mungle was the son of Daniel and Abigail (McKINNEY) Mungle. Sallie married Thomas Woodmore (1821-1900) and their only son, Moses "Mosely", born 1851, was the individual who, along with his wife, had the old Woodmore Hotel at Lafayette, TN, the Macon County capital. According to Reanie Mungle RANKIN (Mrs. Carr), who lives near this cemetery, Mosely Woodmore and wife were both buried in the Mungle Cemetery but their remains were moved about 1950 to a cemetery at Lafayette. Soon after Sallie M. Woodmore's death, her widower Thomas, married again to Analizer FORGASON (1837-1913), daughter of Dixon and Hannah (TOWSON) Forgason, and he had more children. Also according to Reanie, her Mungle grandparents are buried there - Andrew "Andy" Mungle, born c1815 and Lucy (GRIFFIN) Mungle born c1836.

Daniel Mungle, the famous long hunter, veteran of the Battle of Point Pleasant and of the Revolutionary War, had a North Carolina preemption land grant on Middle Fork of Goose Creek in 1783, the earliest known grant in the vicinity. Daniel returned to Washington Co VA and a marriage is on record under date of 14 Sep 1786 between Daniel and Abigail McKinney. They settled on Middle Fork at least as early as July 1797. When Daniel Mungle died in 1803, he left a widow named Abigail and at least two minor children named Isaac and John. In December 1804, John was a lad of "about fourteen years of age" (Smith Co TN records). Daniel Mungle, long hunter, is possibly buried here or in a small plot just over the county line in present Trousdale county. Where Abigail is buried is unknown. It may be of interest to note that the long hunter spirit seems to be very much in evidence today in the Mungle men of this territory, as it is widely conceded that they are true hunters and trappers, among the best (I am thinking here, in particular, of Vige Mungle, his brother Oakley Mungle and Oakley's son Jerry.)

THE LAST DAYS OF COL. JOHN E. LITTLE - Contributed by J. Roy Smith, Jr.,  
5317-C Riverdale Rd., College Park, GA 30349

In 1972, Mr. Smith sent Mrs. Dan E. West a copy of the following letter concerning the 1828 death in Memphis of Georgian Col. John Everett LITTLE. Family tradition said he was murdered, and a large quantity of gold and land records disappeared at the time of his death. Records in Georgia Courthouses support the probability that the family tradition is correct.

"Greenoch, Arkansas Territory  
8th May 1830

"Mr. J.N. Bethune  
Columbus Georgia

"Dear Sir:

Yours of the 31st March is answered by the following information. A gentleman by the name of John E. Little, titled Col. Little by his acquaintances, died in the town of Memphis, Tennessee, 17 miles from this place, about the first of September or October 1828. I had but a short acquaintance with Col. Little - he arrived in this country from New Orleans the same summer he died. His residence previous to his death was in this county with a family by the name of Williams, a widow woman, the widow of John D. Williams, formerly of Georgia, who had a young man by the name of James Moore living with her and attending to her business.

"Col. Little resided there until both Mrs. Williams and James Moore died. Col. Little was left by Mr. Moore his executor and went to Memphis on some business and died very suddenly at a public house in Memphis. And Mr. John D. Williams, Jr., went to Memphis and recovered his saddle bags and all his papers. Mr. Williams has left this county and I cannot inform you where.

"I have heard Col. Little speak in his lifetime of his family being in Georgia and that he had been some years from them (*since late in 1825 or early in 1826 per knowledge of Roy Smith*) in the Spanish Country and in Louisiana.

"As to the situation of Col. Little's business I can give you. I (*torn; only?*) know of his having some (*torn*) or and some p(*apers?*) probably of value in the p(*ossession?*) of a Mr. Butler of Madis...(*also torn*) Tennessee. Mr. Butler (*torn*) written me several letters of inquiry relative to Col. Little's heirs.

(*signed*) William D. Ferguson"

The addressee of the letter, J.N. Bethune, is the brother-in-law to Mrs. John E. Little or possibly her nephew. John Everett Little married his cousin Mary Little in Wilkes County, Georgia, in 1813. He was a Captain in the War of 1812 and a Colonel during the Seminole Indian War in 1818. His family resided in Wilkes Co GA (later cut into Taliaferro) and he owned property in several counties. The Little family are from Martin County, North Carolina, prior to their removal to Georgia in the early 1790s. In the previous generations the family is found in Surrey Co VA.

Greenoch was found on one map located on the west side of the Mississippi River adjacent to Shelby County north of Memphis near Island #40.

This journal was written by the father of Mrs. Washington's grandmother, Mary Elizabeth Underwood STOUT (Mrs. E.K.). William C. UNDERWOOD, born 17 Oct 1834, married 25 Jul 1858 Margaret NEWPORT who was born 12 Dec 1838. Her father was a Primitive Baptist circuit riding preacher.

The first wife of Howell Cobb Brewer died 22 Apr 1834. Howell remarried 12 Sep 1834 to Mary COPE. She was ill for much of the time they were married and died on 16 Jun 1837. Howell married the third and last time 3 Sep 1838 to Mary Polly WOLFE. She was the daughter of George Wolfe and his wife Mary. Mary Polly also had a brother named George. The son of this George, William Alvis Wolfe, married Orpha Brewer, the daughter of Joab, Howell C. Brewer's first son. This made Mary Polly, Orpha's step-grandmother as well as Alvis' Aunt. Because of this, she was known to the family as "Aunt Granny." Mary Polly and Howell had five children:

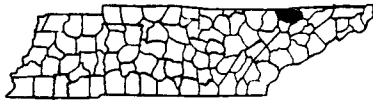

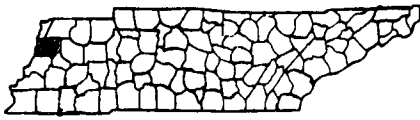

## ANCESTORS ARE WHERE YOU FIND THEM

MARSHALL CO MS CHANCERY COURT RECORDS, Holly Springs, MS - Benjamin MORGAN, deceased, died intestate. A lawsuit between John Morgan, administrator, and Ann T. Morgan on 4 Aug 1843 names the property remaining in Mississippi to be distributed as two negroes, Lucy and Harriet. The estate is otherwise settled. A petition was made to sell them. There are seven distributees with equal shares: Ann T. Morgan, Elizabeth F. PETTEY (Mrs. James W.) and John Morgan of Marshall Co MS; Benjamin Morgan of Rutherford Co TN; Harwood Morgan of Coffee Co TN; Mary Elizabeth Morgan, infant, of Davidson Co TN and Spencer Morgan of Spartanburg District, South Carolina.

MEMPHIS/SHELBY COUNTY, TENNESSEE ARCHIVES PROBATE RECORDS - Appearing in the estate papers of F.W. GARKEY, #968, 1869, is a transcript from the Record of Marriages in New York City dated 18 May 1869. It records the marriage of Paul LIST/SIST, age 25, of Ludlow/Sudlow St., a merchant born in Wurtemberg; his parents were Chas. Philip Christian List and Carolina EHRBACH. Paul married Anna GARKE, age 20, born in Prussia; her parents were Frederick William Garke and Wilhelmina RICHTER. Paul and Anna were married on 21 Jan 1866 by Dr. Charles SCHRAMM of 128 2nd Avenue, and their marriage was recorded 18 May 1869.

(Editor's note: These two examples of records, with a Tennessee connection and involving other states, demonstrate the importance of searching adjoining counties and states for data on one's own ancestors. Even the slightest clue of a sibling's marriage, or a lawsuit over an estate can verify members of a family.)

It is my will that the following negroes, my lawful slaves, be emancipated, viz. Peter and Sall, his wife, now at Lincoln County at my plantation on Mountain Creek, Big Peggy, niece of said Peter, and the said Big Peggy's living son, the only one she now has alive, Harry of a yellow complexion about ten years old, Pris and a small boy by the name of Ned...Granna Nancy, old Bet the mother of Marge and old Hannah...they are to be taken safely to the city of Philadelphia in Pennsylvania, only these and their children that come from them, viz. Peter Sal Peg Nancy Pris and Ned who is to be delivered up to some of the most respectable of the Quakers or Methodist Abletion or Emancipating Society with true copies of all the papers...a tomb be raised over the graves of my deceased parents and near relations..at the graveyard of Center Meeting House.

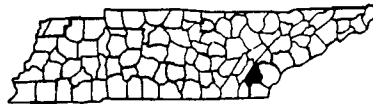

AMERICAN DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM GASTON AND MARY OLIVET LEMON by Max Perry. 1989. Softback, 8x10. 212 pp, indexed. Order from author, 2000 Harvard St., Midland, TX 79701. \$30.00

John "Jean" Gaston, born c1600 in France, a Huguenot refugee, settled in Scotland where he married and died. Three of his sons moved to Ireland. This is the story of the descendants of William Gaston and Mary Olivet Gaston who came to America before the Revolution and settled in South Carolina, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Massachusetts. Related names are: Boyd, Brice, Carter, Culp, Davis, Drennan, Hicklin, Kell, Kirkpatrick, McCain, McClure, Moffatt, Reid, Roach, Robinson, Rosborough, Simonton, Strong, Walker, Weir, Wilkerson, Young and many others.

ANDERSON COUNTY TENNESSEE CEMETERY RECORDS compiled by Mary S. Harris. 1989. Hardback, 8x10½. 446 pp, indexed. Order from compiler, Rt. 2, Box 192, Clinton, TN 37716. \$40.00

The compiler states that this manuscript contains 27,371 readings from cemetery markers in 310 cemeteries. TVA Quadrangle maps were used as the primary source for locating cemeteries, but Ms. Harris has found 43 which were not shown on the maps. Even with help, this was an enormous task, and she is to be commended for beginning and completing this venture, for she knew the work involved from her previous Marion County, Tennessee cemetery recordings. Mary S. Harris has not only recorded vital statistics, but she has included other important genealogical data, viz., mother/father, service record, children, husband/wife, marriage dates, etc.

KERSHNER KINFOLK - Volume 8, No. 1-4, W. E. Kershner, Editor. 1989. Softback, 8½x11. 82 pp, indexed. Order from William E Kershner Jr., 1449 Fox Run Dr., Charlotte, NC 28212-7125. \$14.00

This spiral-bound volume contains the 1989 quarterlies issued by the Kershner Family Association. Each of the four numbers is separately indexed. They contain Kershner family connections, current biographical data, books and publications available. One feature is a unique index which places all Kershners of the same given name together, regardless of the variation in surname spelling. Communications from family members in Langenselbold, Germany, are translated for the benefit of American kin.

TENNESSEE TIDBITS, 1778-1914, Volume III by Marjorie Hood Fischer and Ruth Blake Burns. 1989. Hardback, 6x9. 533 pp, indexed. Order from RAM Press, Dept A, 1239 Coventry Rd., Vista, CA 92084. \$37.50

This excellent Tennessee genealogical source contains abstracts from the earliest extant court minutes of Anderson, Bradley, Carroll, Decatur, Grainger, Johnson, Macon, Marion, Monroe, Rhea, Warren and Tipton counties. Names from all counties are alphabetically listed, and for each abstract the county and complete source is given. Contained are names, dates, relationships, adoptions, guardianships, paupers, divorce, bastardy bonds, delinquent tax lists, executors, dowers, and applications for pension for military service. The appendix gives a description of each source and a helpful list of legal and commonly used terms is included.

"OUR DAYS" VOL. I - :FAMILY HISTORIES: - RUSHING, MORRIS, BRADFORD, ESTES, DAY by Mrs. Merle Virginia Morris Hayes Day. 1988. Softback, spiral bound, 8½x11. 215 pp, mimeographed, not indexed. Order from compiler, 4705 Westerly Ct., Oceanside, CA 92056. \$24.95

In each of the five family sections of this book, one of the families listed in the title is traced. Mrs. Day has followed her ancestors from North Carolina through Tennessee, Arkansas, and Missouri using census and other available material. Copies of maps, documents, photographs, charts, and newspaper clippings are included. The Day section was researched by Reuben Reden Day, tracing this family from Ireland through Pennsylvania, Illinois and Iowa.

MARION COUNTY CONNECTIONS by Barbara Hiestand Moore. 1989. Acco looseleaf binder, 8½x11. 449 pp, indexed. Order from author, Rt. 12, Box 378, New Braunfels, TX 78132. \$32.50

The author has included numerous ancestral families from coast to coast and from border to border, including Virginia, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Illinois, Iowa, Tennessee and Texas. Surnames include Huff, Hays, Chance, Jenkins, Marshall, Basom, Boyer, Cooms, Emery, Jarratt, Pruett, Mims and Kimberling. Most pages are xeroxed copies of courthouse records, viz., marriages, wills, deeds, taxes, births and deaths; newspaper articles, viz., obituaries, birth

announcements, etc.; pedigree and family group sheets; pictures of families, gravestones, individuals, and brides and grooms; family resources available in archives and manuscripts.

JOHN YATES (1712-1779) AND HIS DESCENDANTS TO 1989 by Evelyn Yates Carpenter. 1989. Hardback, 8½x11. 424 pp, indexed. Order from author, P. O. Box 1356, Bowling Green, KY 42102-1356. \$45

Individuals named Yates were among the earliest pioneers in this country, as is indicated in the documented sources presented by this author. Using an understandable numbering system, Mrs. Carpenter takes her Yates ancestor and his descendants from Southside Virginia and Caswell Co. North Carolina, into Tennessee, Texas, Arkansas, Missouri and other states. Copies of deeds and other actual courthouse records, as well as maps and pictures are provided. Related families include Carr, Covington, Fisher, Freeman, Hendley, Henry, Johns(t)on, Jones, McNeely, Randolph, Swann and many more. The author states that she was born on "the land grants of James Yates, Sr. and Thomas Kilgore, Sr." in Robertson Co. Tennessee and family members continue to reside there.

GOING TO SALT LAKE CITY TO DO FAMILY HISTORY RESEARCH by J. Carlyle Parker. 1989. Soft back, 5x7. 84 pp, subject index. Order from Marietta Publishing Co., 2115 N. Denair Ave., Turlock, CA 95380. \$12.45

This "how-to" book is a valuable tool for anyone who intends to research in the Family History Library of the LDS Church facility in Salt Lake City. It has very detailed information on procedures within the library building and explains where all the holdings of the library are situated and how to use them. Also included are suggestions on dining and lodging in the city.

LETTERS FROM A SALT SACK, II compiled by Beth Davidson Syler. 1989. Soft back, 8½x11. 70 pp, indexed. Order from the compiler, Rt. 1, Box 586, Creal Springs, IL 62922. \$8.75 (\$6.75 for Morgan Co TN residents).

Although this book primarily concerns a Davidson family of North Carolina, Tennessee, Kentucky and Texas, it contains a large amount of documentary material from Morgan Co TN and the surrounding area. The unusual title resulted from hundreds of letters, legal documents, receipts etc., which were stored in an old salt sack found in the author's Morgan County home. Most of the letters have been transcribed, but many receipts, notes, newspaper clippings, and even a sheet of music have been photocopied without alteration. This is an interesting record of life between 1850 and 1900.

THE PREEMPTORS: MIDDLE TENNESSEE'S FIRST SETTLERS compiled by Irene M. Griffey. 1989. Soft back, 8½x11. 60 pp, spiral bound, indexed. Order from compiler, P. O. Box 454, Clarksville, TN 37041. \$10.00

Most of the original thirteen colonies promised to pay Revolutionary Soldiers with land grants, and North Carolina was no exception. A Military Reservation in Northern Middle Tennessee was reserved in 1782 for the grants, but there were already settlers along some of the waterways when it was surveyed by the Land Commissioners. The compiler has copied and identified the settlers entitled to preemption rights as found in the original record book kept for the Commissioners by David Shelby and preserved in the North Carolina Archives. There is also a list of men from Davidson and Sumner Counties who served in the militia against the Chicamauga Indians in 1787. This list is a good substitute for the 1790 census which is not extant. Tennessee researchers will find this an important genealogical source. This is Volume I of a Series of Early Tennessee Land Records proposed by the compiler.

ANDREWS SUPPLEMENT, 1986 by Ella Smith (Johns) Andrews. Soft back, 8½x11. 135 pp, spiral bound, indexed. Order from Mrs. Antonio Maglione, 776 Seven Hills Lane, St. Charles, MO 63303. \$10.00

The Families of John Andrews (1764-1842) George Andrews (1765-1842) Ephraim Andrews (1769-1834) With Allied Lines was published by Mrs. Andrews in 1984. This supplement adds information on a previously unknown line. The material contained in the supplement gives basic information on each individual member; birth, marriage, death, and parents if known. The same numbering system is followed as in the original volume which adds to the ease of finding a particular member of any of the Andrews or allied lines.

BIBLE RECORDS OF HENRY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, VOLUME I by Charles E. Sanders. 1988. Soft back, 8½x11. 95 pp, indexed. Order from Mrs. Jacqueline H. Claxton, P.O. Box 636, Paris, TN 38242. \$22.50

This collection of approximately 200 family Bible transcriptions is arranged alphabetically by the original owner's name. In several cases there are three or more families of the same surname. The present owner's name and address are given, and the contributors are scattered from Florida to California and Michigan to Texas and many points between. Several records came from Bibles in the collection of the W. G. Rhea Library in Paris, TN. Some of the most numerous references come from these Bibles: the 5 Bomar Bibles, the 3 Burnett Bibles, 5 French Bibles, 3 Smith Bibles, 3 Throgmorton Bibles, 3 Travis Bibles and 4 Walters Bibles.

SEVENTEENTH CENTURY COLONIAL ANCESTORS, SUPPLEMENT NUMBER ONE, 1975-1979 compiled by Mary Louise M. Hutton. 1981.

SEVENTEENTH CENTURY COLONIAL ANCESTORS, SUPPLEMENT NUMBER TWO, 1979-1988 compiled by Mrs. George L. Bott. 1988. Soft back, 6x9. 75 pp each. Order from Genealogical Publishing Co., 1001 N. Calvert St., Baltimore, MD 21202-3897. One book: \$9.25. Two books: \$17.75

In 1975 the National Society Colonial Dames Seventeenth Century published a list of the seventeenth century ancestors of its members. Both of these books are supplements to the original list. Supplement number one adds 2500 names of ancestors from whom descent was proved by the Society between 1975-1979. Shelby County, Tennessee was created after the Chickasaw purchase of 1819 and its first Court Minutes are dated 20 May 1820. Situated on the Mississippi River atop the fourth Chickasaw Bluff, the area had attracted settlers even before the county was formed. As adjoining counties were established, more and more families moved into the fertile and wooded new lands. Descendants of those early settlers have formed an organization which requires prospective members to document their descent from the pioneers who settled before 1870. This book is a collection of sketches written by each member about his or her ancestor. An 1823 map by the original surveyor, William Lawrence, decorates the end papers, and 99 half-tone pictures display portraiture of the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries. The full index includes place names as well as surnames, and lists 28 Revolutionary Soldiers.

## CIVIL WAR PRISON AUTOGRAPHS

The autographs are in a booklet which belonged to Gen. Joseph Brown HEISKELL of Memphis, TN. He was confined in the Federal prison at Camp Chase, Ohio from the late fall of 1864 until June 1865. Gen. Heiskell, born in Knoxville, TN, was a member of Jefferson DAVIS' Cabinet of the Confederacy. As a civilian he was arrested between Richmond and Knoxville, and kept in prison in Knoxville, Chattanooga, Nashville and St. Louis before he was sent to Camp Chase. After the war he moved to Memphis, TN. He served as Attorney General of Tennessee.

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A recent newspaper article has prompted frequent calls to our office from people who begin the conversation with that question. It seems that the answer might be of interest to many other people.

The Society is a non-profit organization formed in 1952 by local people who were interested in genealogical study and who wanted to collect and preserve genealogical records. Many books were purchased, used by the members and then donated to the Memphis Public Library, until the dream of housing our own collection became a reality in 1970.

The Society receives no government funds or grants, depending entirely on the income from the sales of its publications and projects - all manned by volunteers. A subscription to our quarterly, *The Tennessee Genealogical Magazine*, "ANSEARCHIN" NEWS, is currently \$15.00 and entitles one to:
