

CHANRAGNE AND SPARLING

Wine has been made in this North Eastern region of France since Roman times, but the advent of the effervescence with which Champagne is synonymous was a relatively recent one and occurred in the mid 1600's.

Quite who first came up with the idea of a second fermentation in bottle (the source of the bubbles) is unclear.

It definitely wasn't that famous monk Dom Perignon (although he made enormous contributions in other areas) and there's even a contentious theory concerning an Englishman called Dr Christopher Merrett who is said to have mastered the process some 30 years before the French announced the invention.

Of course we'll never know for sure but the unique expression of Champagne and the ingenuity behind it live on to this day and that's something we can all drink to!



One of the key aspects of Dom Pérignon's recognizability is their iconic, shield-shaped champagne bottle label, which has been in use since the first modern vintage of the champagne was produced in 1921.



Since 1743 when it was founded, Moët & Chandon has been passing down unequalled wine-making savour-faire and an innovative and pioneering spirit from generation to generation.

Claude Moët, it's founder, was the first person to embody these values when he made his Champagne the most sought-after in Europe. With his grandson, Jean Remy Moët, a pioneering and visionary mind, Moët & Chandon became a major international champagne brand. This saga quickly transformed the family House into a worldwide symbol of success.

The House of Laurent-Perrier was founded in 1812 by André Michel Pierlot and took the name Vve Laurent-Perrier when Mathilde Emilie Perrier, the widow of Eugène Laurent, combined the two family names after she decided to expand the business.

Eugénie Hortense Laurent, her daughter, inherited the House in 1925 and sold it to Marie-Louise Lanson de Nonancourt in 1939.



In 1939, Marie-Louise de Nonancourt, widow and mother of four children, mindful of their future, acquired the Domaine Laurent-Perrier.

During WWII, Marie-Louise Lanson de Nonancourt ran the business while two of her sons, Maurice and Bernard, joined the French Resistance.

In 1945, Bernard de
Nonancourt began an exacting
apprenticeship, learning
every aspect of wine-making
from vine to cellar, before
his appointment in October
1948 as Chairman and Chief
Executive. At that point,
the House was employing
around 20 people and shipping
80,000 bottles a year.



The story began with Athanase de Villermont, the youngest son of a noble family with a brilliant destiny. A great soldier who shone during the American War of Independence, he inherited an extensive estate from his family in the Aÿ area.


He immediately foresaw the extraordinary potential of the wines of Champagne, but as an aristocrat he was forbidden to become involved in trade. He then met Joseph Bollinger, a widely travelled German who had left his country of birth to learn about the Champagne wine trade, and Paul Renaudin, a local man who was fascinated by the world of wine.

The firm of Renaudin-Bollinger & Cie was founded on 6th February 1829. Joseph took care of sales and Paul of the cellar. Athanase had founded a champagne House that was to endure through the centuries.

ARGENTINA

Argentina has a rich vain of wine making heritage, one which is prolific and now well respected from initial humble beginnings. There was certainly once a period of isolation but wines produced today are of greater interest and display superb quality.


Vines were planted as early as the 15th century by Spanish Conquistadors, but it was really the arrival of the Italian, Spanish and French settlers who introduced their own indigenous varietals and wine making style that things started to thrive.

The two great wine growing regions are the provinces of Mendoza and San Juan in the North West of the country, where vast vineyards grow at an altitude of some 2,500 ft in the direct presence of the Andes foothills.

In recent years, restless producers have pushed the wine frontier westward, high, and South and East, seeking the cold of southern latitudes or the influence of the ocean.

From the high vineyards in the North, through the aridity of Cuyo and the plains of Patagonia, to the new projects on the edge of the Atlantic, Argentine wines offer an endless range of flavours that reflect the identity of each region.

Driven principally by the mighty, meat-friendly Malbec. Bonarda is the second most widely planted red and makes a much lighter, more frivolous red.





In terms of wine world wine time line history Argentine wines are still at an experimental stage. This is a distinctly cooler climate, cool but dry, in the rain shadow of the Andes. There are lovely mountains replete with condors.

There is snow, and lakes, rivers, wonderful trees and much green vegetation, even in winter. This area is very promising but the problem is that few people want to work in such a remote place.



Organic Vineyard Malbec

VALLE DE UCO, ARGENTINA

AUSTRALIA

With a land mass of more than 7.5 million sq km, you could fit England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland into Australia 30 times over, and still have a bit left over. It's not surprising therefore that climates and topography are considerable varied.

Quickly becoming a haven for finding high quality wines which have words such as 'refined' and 'sophisticated' now added to their wines tasting notes there are exciting times ahead. It really has been a stunning turnaround Australia is now the 4th largest exporter of wine in the world, and one who is looked upon with merit and accolades. When the world cried out for the Aussies to produce delicious fruit forward exceedingly good value wines, they responded with a "no wuckers mate".

There are now 60 designated Australian wine regions ranging across every state. However the best Australian wines tend to grow in the cooler Southern territories New South Wales, Victoria, McLaren Vale and the Barossa Valley.

Wineries down South create some fine Australian wine that you simply have to taste to believe and prove beyond a shadow of a doubt that their wines have quality and diversity in abundance that are here to be enjoyed.





South Australia (SA) is the heavyweight wine state, producing most of the country's wine and boasting some of the it's oldest vines. The dry, hot climate ripens grapes fully, making bold, dense and concentrated wines.

The Barossa Valley has a rich viticultural history with patches of bush-trained vines, many more than 100 years old. It is first and foremost a red wine region. Shiraz is king but Cabernet sauvignon, grenache and mourvèdre play an important part, too.

Smokin's Barrels

Smokin' Barrels

Smokin' Barrels is a range of generously flavoured single vineyard wines from a site nestled in the Angaston foothills of the Barossa Valley. The vineyard is was planted throughout the 1990s and purchased by viticulturist, Warwick Murray and Winemaker, Kym Teusner in 2008 to supply this project.

Coarse sand over deep red clay being the perfect soil for these rich and distinct wines. Sustainable management practices are at the forefront of running this vineyard with self seeding native grasses populating the mid rows and runoff water captured from the roofs and car parks of a nearby industrial precinct used for irrigation. Honest and affordable, these are wines that are certain to impress at the price.

Aromas of ripe honey dew melons, peaches and nectarine. Medium weighted, creamy stone fruit flavours held in check with textural fresh citrus acidity

Mr Goose Rosé*

A densely coloured Shiraz with youthful violet hues. Complex oak characters of coffee, vanilla and caramel complement the full fruit flavours and create a rich, long and satisfying finish.

CHILE

Chile is located on the Western Coast of South America, but it's topography creates something akin to a pseudo-island, isolating its vineyards from the elements.

Bordered by the cool Pacific Ocean to the West and the snow-capped Andes to the East, by the Atacama Desert to the North, and the far reaches of Patagonia to the South, Chile is naturally protected on all sides.

As a result of this protection, phylloxera, the vineyard pest that decimated most of the world's vineyards in the 1800s, never touched Chilean vines. In fact, Chile is the only major wineproducing country free of phylloxera.

The country is thus home to some of the world's oldest vines, many of which are ungrafted, or planted on their own root-stocks, to this day.

As a grapevine grows older, the grapes it produces become more concentrated and nuanced, making these pre-phylloxera vines such an asset to Chilean winemakers.

Chile's wine industry is founded on diversity, which is why an overview of Chile's climate, grapes, and regions barely skims the surface of what this exciting country has to offer.

This narrow strip of land can produce festive sparklers, crisp and refreshing whites, and bold, world-class reds, plus every style in between.





Chile became first known for it's cheap cabernets and merlots made from high yields in the fertile, warm, flat, flood-irrigated Central Valley. However, Chile is no longer a cheap country to buy from.

In the last couple of decades Chile has begun to plant vineyards not just by matching variety and climate, which it has done very well up to now, but by mapping and analysing soils before planting.



ENGLAND

English wine (not to be confused with British wine, which is made from imported grape concentrate) is getting rather serious these days.

Most notable is our Sparkling Wine which consistently tops the medal table in blind tastings, so much so that the Champenoise have invested in vineyards on the South Coast, recognising that they share much of the geology


and climate of their homeland. Whilst vineyards are found across the whole of England, the climate of the South and South East makes it a particularly popular region for growing vines, especially in Hampshire, Sussex and Kent.

There are also some characterful white wines, especially those made using the Bacchus variety, as well as delightful rosés and even the occasional red.

A rainy 2019 harvest period has put no dampener on the mood for English Wine, especially after the growing and ripening season had been largely successful, though not as universally bountiful, warm and exuberant as in 2018.

Volumes are good and the early undercurrent seems to be of quiet confidence.





English wine producers as a whole continue to make major improvements to their wines, but it is the producers of premium sparkling wines which have received the most accolades in recent years, blazing a trail for the industry as a whole to be given the serious attention it deserves.





REGIONS

Alsace

Alsace sits on the France's north eastern frontier with Germany and Switzerland. The Vosges mountains in the west provide shelter from the extremes of the central European climate whilst the slopes orientate the vines towards the ripening sun. Alsace's specialties are; Riesling, Gewürztraminer, Muscat, Pinot Gris, Pinot Blanc and Pinot Noir.

Rhone

The Rhone is best known for its full-bodied reds, based on Grenache and Syrah, with truly 'fine wines' from Cote Rotie and Hermitage in the north to brooding Chateauneuf du Pape's in the south, along with peppery Cotes du Rhone's, peachy whites and bombastic rosés.

Provence

The picturesque southern French region of Provence on the Côte d'Azur is famous for it's rosé wines, sunshine and glamour.Bordered by the Mediterranean, it is home to towns and cities such as Bandol, Cassis and Marseille. The primary grapes used for the production of rosé and red wines are Mourvèdre, Syrah, Grenache, Cinsault, Carignan and Cabernet Sauvignon.

There are different soil types throughout the region: In the Northwest there are rocky hogbacks sculpted by erosion. In the east there is crystalline rock near the sea.

Loire

The Loire Valley stretches 250 miles from Nantes on the Atlantic coast to Sancerre and Pouilly-Fume in the east. White varieties reign supreme here; with bone dry Melon de Bourgogne (Muscadet), intense Chenin Blanc (Vouvray) and of course minerally Sauvignon Blanc in a style that's appreciably more complex and nuanced than some of the more 'tropical' versions found in the New World.

Beaujolais

Beaujolais sits below the mighty Burgundy region, and whilst it can't compete with the ethereal Pinot Noir's of its northerly neighbour Beaujolais is unsurpassed as a source of vibrant, fruity reds for pure drinking pleasure made from Gamay.

Burgundy

Whilst Burgundy inspires a somewhat obsessive devotion amongst its most hardcore followers, it's certainly undeniable that no other region in the world confers so much diversity and complexity on just two grape varieties; Chardonnay and Pinot Noir, Burgundy exemplifies 'terroir', the concept that a wine's characteristics are determined by the topography, geology and microclimate of a particular vineyard. The resulting wines are rarely cheap (!) but are unmatched for their captivating flavours and resolute sense of place.

Bordeaux

Bordeaux is the largest wine producing region in France and arguably the most important and influential wine region in the world. Although 75 million cases are produced each year (approximately 1.5% of total global production) only 3% of that comes from the Grandes Chateaux like Lafite, Mouton-Rothschild and Latour with which the region has become synonymous. Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Cabernet Franc are the bedrock varieties here, but aromatic whites and sensuous dessert wines based on Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon are also not to be missed.







Chianti is that part of Tuscany that is bordered to the north by the suburbs of Florence, to the east by the Chianti Mountains, to the south by the city of Siena and to the west by the valleys of the Pesa and Elsa rivers. The first notarial document in which the name Chianti appeared in reference to the wine produced in the zone dates to 1398.

HSTORY!

France has always shared a special relationship with wine not just driven by matters of the heart, palate and social culture but also influenced by its geography, climate and soil. Winemaking in France seeks to create wine that reflect the characteristics of its terroir and the flavour of it's grapes.


Vineyards have a special connection to the French and they represent the culture and culinary traditions of its people, as wine is a perfect accompaniment to their cuisine and way of life.


The wine regions in France experience a wide variation in climate, soil and traditions. Additionally, the difference in orientation of the vineyards, hills, slopes and prevailing winds play an important factor in the micro-climate of the vineyards therefore producing wines of different types and quality across different regions and appellations.

LOUIS JADOT

Often labelled as the "Land of fine art and living" Burgundy is one of the most famous and influential wine growing regions in the world.

The first vines were introduced by the Romans, and later the industrious Cistercian monks developed the techniques and knowledge required for much larger scale production.

As the monks began to explore the region of the Saône valley, they came

across the stream of "Vouge" near the town of Nuits
Saint Georges, it was here that they built the Clos de
Vougeot and began planting vines of the south-east facing slopes of the Côte de Nuits.

The monks knew the climate and soil were exactly what was required to grow grapes, all the ingredients where there to begin the incredible adventure of Burgundy red, white and rosé wines. History has proved that they were right.

NEW ZEALAND

Wine-making is still fairly new to New Zealand. Yet after only a couple decades, Kiwi winemakers are already producing wines that are consistently hitting the mark and gaining accolades from international experts.

Most of New Zealand's wine regions have a maritime climate. The long, thin shape of the country means that vineyards are never more than 75 miles (120km) from the coast, and most are in fact far closer than this (with the exception of the semicontinental Central Otago region).

Demand for the best New Zealand wines continues to be high, there are now a variety of wines made in New Zealand. Marlborough's Sauvignon Blanc took off in a big way in the 1980s and 1990s, producing a style of wine that was praised for it's forwardness and it's herbaceous, sweaty character which has developed into a must have on a wine list.

Although now Pinot Noir is also proving itself well suited to New Zealand's terroir and has made itself at home in Martinborough, Marlborough and most famously in Central Otago, where the wines can be described as dense with exceptional strong flavours of dark fruit.

At this time we need to be grateful as the wineries on the whole are small, so there is a limited volume for export.

This being the case you will find that the quest for quality is excellent and keeps getting better year on year.





Still a baby when compared with other regions, New Zealand has quickly earned a reputation for top-quality wine. New Zealand has taken the Sauvignon blanc grape variety and put it's own brilliantly zesty stamp on it, creating a wine style that the rest of the world now attempts to copy. The majority tend to be unoaked, combining delicious tropical fruit flavours with lively, fresh-tasting acidity and a directness that makes them especially satisfying.

Fach vine gets special attention as the team make every effort to produce the best wine possible with each and every vintage.

THE MARLBOURGH MAN

A name synonymous with wine, as one of the first independent wineries to be established in Marlborough in 1990, Allan Scott Family Winemakers have madea name for themselves in this highly competitive industry.

Allan has nearly 40 years in the wine business, which makes him one of the most experienced people in Marlborough when it comes to growing, making and marketing wine. When Allan and his wife Catherine decided to settle here in 1973, (Cathy isa fifth generation Marlburian) Allan took a job with Montana working in their new vineyards.

In 1980 he was head-hunted by Corbans to oversee the establishment of their Marlborough vineyards. He soon became their Senior Viticultural Manager, which not only gave him responsibility for the company's entire national grape intake, but led him to become part of the wine-making team.

All this stood him in good stead for the family's foray into wine-making. Back then, there weren't any boutique wineries to speak of in Marlborough.

In 1975 Allan and Catherine purchased a block of land and got into contract growing. Then, when the first independent winemakers started to emerge in Marlborough,
Allan and Catherine were in a position to become a part of this new era in New Zealand's wine industry.

In 1990, they launched Allan Scott
Wines. Allan remembers it well.
"We were one of a small number
who made up the first wave of the
independents." The Allan Scott
winery has seen some changes since
then. Over the 25 years since its
inception, the winery has evolved
to keep ahead of the changing
demands from the market.

Allan has been instrumental in the development of many of the region's vineyards along with localised vineyard husbandry techniques.

Today Allan takesgreat pride in his key role as Director of the company managing production and sales aspects along with the co-ordination of all facets of the business.

Scott Base. Our Place.

The Scott family, owners of Allan Scott Camily Winemakers, have long had an affinity with Central Otago. The Scott Base Vineyard was established in 1994 and is situated in the heart of Central Otago on terraces overlooking the town of Cromwell and Lake Dunstan.

Viticulture

Scott Base is a terraced vineyard with sandy, silty, loam soil, and sustainably managed. The vines are spur pruned and the laterals removed to encourage the vine to concentrate on fruit production. The Pinot Noir Reserve grapes come off the vines at the bottom of the terrace.

Vinification

Each batch of grapes was hand-picked in the cool of themorning, pressed, and the juice settled at cool temperatures. This was then 25% whole bunch fermented asing wild yeasts. When the alcoholic Termentation is near completion the wine is allowed to go through a full malolactic Termentation and then a further maturation in barrels.

Allan Scott Marlborough Rosé

This elegant salmon pink
Rosé immediately presents
luscious Strawberries and
Cream on the nose. Those bright
berries, meet with stone fruit
on the palate with a dry,
medium-dry finish.

Allan Scott Sauvignon Blanc

Fresh, zesty, juicy and full, this fruit driven new world style wine will excite the senses without the racy overload. Tropical fruit with a fresh herbaceous character balanced with zesty passionfruit and a dry finish.

Scott Base Pinot Noir

Aromas of berry fruit and black cherries, with wild thyme and nutty oak over layers of savoury spice. It is a medium-bodied wine that is rich and luscious, with supple tannins, balanced acidity, and a long finish.

Allan Scott Chardonnay

Aromas of butterscotch and pecan crumbleover white flesh nectarines and the freshness of a Pineapple Fruju down by the Wairau River in the summertime. Add in the smokey overtones and a creaminess that layers over the lingering Pineapple backed up by the heirloom Grapefruit fresh from the backyard.



PORTUGAL

Portugal has undergone something of a wine revolution in the past couple of decades, updating it's wine-making technologies, styles and attitudes. With this archetypal 'Old World' country its hard to argue that Portugal is better known for port rather than wines.

Wine-making in Portugal can be dated back to around the 5th Century BC. It was the Romans who actively promoted the practice of viticulture, producing wines in Portugal and then transporting them back to Rome to be enjoyed by many a senator.

These days we are excited to see a change and a movement begin to emerge as now Portugal begins to attract a great deal of attention for a new wave of rich, ripe, wines.

The Douro Valley was once the Mecca for port, but know become an El Dorado for red wines: savour a quality wine with body and structure...

Portugal's temperate, predominantly maritime climate has a great deal to offer ambitious vignerons.

The country's portfolio of terroirs is not as broad as that of, say, France or Italy, but there is significant variation none the less between its mountains, river valleys, sandy littoral plains and limestonerich coastal hills. In all with a diverse climate and a new focus on wine-making techniques, we're are excited to see what Portuguese wines will be landing on our these shores.





Although wrapped in many doubts and myths, it is thought the vineyard was cultivated by the first time in the valleys of Tejo and Sado, around 2000 years BC, by the Tartessian. Today, Portugal combines a creative attitude with the immense variety of terroirs, grape varieties and blends.

Like it's neighbour Spain, Portugal has been undergoing something of a quiet revolution over the last twenty years or so. A reluctance to follow trends and plant international grapes is now paying dividends and the new breed of full-blooded, fruit-filled wines are more than able to compete on the world stage.







OLD CLEM Old Clem comes from Pope Clement I and is known as the Patron Saint of Metalworkers and Blacksmiths. Traditionally celebrated on the 23 November as a welcome festival between Halloween and Christmas. "Old Clem's Night" started * St Clement Farm literallywith a bang and showers of sparks. During the ritual there was the MERLOT "Firing of the Anvil", where the Blacksmith would pack gunpowder into a small hole in an Anvil, then strike it soundly with a hammer, causing a small explosion. The Anvil firing was also a test of the Anvil's durability: weak Anvils would break under pressure, and had then to be re-forged.

OLD CLEM Chenin Chardonnay Viognier

The wine has as tricking, pale lime colour. The nose has pronounced tropical aromas of guava, passion fruit and melon with an interesting floral, pot pouri twist.

But what of the others? The wines you might pass by without considering?

There's more to Spain than Rioja - much more as it's exciting times with a new generation of daring, young winemakers who are challenging convention, rejuvenating ancient vineyards and pioneering long-forgotten regions and certain methods.

The result is an ever-growing collection of wine styles and flavours that are more and more delicious, individual a nd extraordinary then the often-anarchic labels that adorn them.

Look out for peachy Verdejo's that could pass as a 1er Cru Chablis or spice-laden Garnacha's that wouldn't be out of place in a serious Rhone line-up and you'll see why we're so excited!

Be bold and brave and try something that isn't just a safe bet and you might just find that jewel that you are looking for.








La Rioja is probably most famous of all Spanish wine producing areas now comprises some 600 wineries. It's creation is largely due to the French, who came here in the late 19th century to escape phylloxera.

They revolutionised its wine-making and two of the most prestigious bodegas, Murrieta and Riscal, made Marchioneses in recognition of their achievements. Prior to this friendly invasion, the region had primarily been a producer of white wines.

Bodegas D. Mateos

The year is 1886, and a young couple decide to plant a small vineyard in the foothills of Mount Yerga. Little did they know the importance this decision would have for the following generations 138 years later. That simple vineyard has grown to 100 hectares helping Bodegas D. Mateos design emotions through it's wines and leave it's unique mark.

A winery with so much history that every night it's walls whisper the stories of grandmothers telling bedtime stories to their grandchildren: a refuge from the disturbing afternoons among relations, with the spirit of grandmother Guillermina, making sure her legacy is not lost.

Reserva

Brilliant ruby-red colour, High cloak and light brick red tones. Very complex aromas of ageing over a persistent background of liquorice, compoted black fruit (prunes and dried figs) and low brush. Complex spices, powder and mineral aromas at the end. Structured and a smooth wine.

Tempranillo

Wide and intense wine, with a wide fleshy texture. Slightly sweetness at the end with hints of liquorice and black fruits such as plums, blackberries and cranberries.

Crianza

A marked acidity that gets a well-balanced wine. Prunes after-taste and aromas of ageing, toasted bread and vanilla, with a sweet, mineral and tasty end.

Blance

Fresh, with predominance of citrus notes and stone fruits, causing a very pleasant acidity-sweetness sensation. Long end caused by some very elegant bitter notes.

Rosé

Fruit flavours of strawberry, raspberry and currant Perfect balance between sweetness and acidity, with a slightly bitter end salted fishes, different rices, mixed and grilled vegetables.



It is however California that certainly flourishes. With over 1,200 wineries in the state, it's hardly surprising to hear that this region produces 90% of the wine coming out of the USA every single year.

The north coast region is without doubt the most famous region.
Here you'll find Napa Valley and Sonoma County. A wide variety of grapes are grown here, but if you're looking for a top class Pinot Noir or striking Zinfandel, this is where you'll find it.
The diversity of the region produces a wide range of varieties, from the cooler climate of Lodi to the very hot central valley.

Washington is quickly emerging as a hotbed of excellence when it comes to Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay and Riesling. With the continental climate of East Washington, it's quickly becoming one of the most important regions for wine-making, make sure to take a look.





California has been stereotyped as a producer of big, blockbuster-style reds and ripe, oaky whites, and while these wines do exist, elegance and subtlety also play their part, helped by the cool Pacific winds and fog that blow in from the west, with a cooling effect on vineyards as far as 50 miles inland. The most appetising styles come from these cooler regions.

One intrepid Scotsman in Fife is also having a crack but, perhaps not surprisingly, weather has so far hampered his efforts.

Using more Carignan than other vintages, giving it a more aromatic and fragrant nose. Ripe red forest fruit with Strawberries, Cherries and ripe plums and light sand, finest leather, oiled wooden planks.

1. CONTRACTS

All orders are accepted subject to these conditions to the exclusion of all other terms and conditions (including any terms or conditions which the Buyer purports to apply under any purchase order, confirmation of order, specification or other document). No order shall be binding unless confirmed by us on our Acknowledgement of Order form which shall set out the quantity of the goods to be delivered under our contract with you. It is deemed that all Retention to Title clauses (No. 10) have been agreed expressly prior to the issue of the Acknowledgement of Order Form.

2. QUOTATIONS

All quotations are subject to withdrawal or amendment by us at any time prior to actual receipt by us of an order for goods referred to therein. Clerical errors are subject to correction.

3. PRICES

(i) The price(s) are given in good faith and are those ruling at this date. All prices are subject to market fluctuations and revision and actual price(s) to be paid by the Buyer shall be the Sellers price ruling at date of dispatch. (ii) Where an order is received for a quantity less than quoted for or where delivery is required in instalments smaller than those specified in the quotation, prices will be subject to an increase.

- (iii) Unless otherwise agreed or shown, the price(s) excludes delivery.
- (iiii) All prices may be subject to budget increases by time of publication.

4 INSTALMENTS

Unless goods are ordered for delivery by instalments, each instalment shall be deemed to be a separate contract unless otherwise agreed in writing.

5. DELIVERY

Unless otherwise agreed in writing, delivery of the goods shall take place at the Buyer's place of business. Any dates specified by us for delivery of the goods are intended to be an estimate and time or delivery shall not be made of the essence. Any liability for non-delivery of the goods shall be limited to replacing the goods within a reasonable time or issuing a credit note at the pro rata contract rate against any invoice raised for such goods.

6. QUALITY

If we deliver to the Buyer a quantity of goods of up to 10% more or less than the quantity ordered, the Buyer shall not be entitled to object to or reject the goods or any of them by reason of the surplus or shortfall and shall pay for such goods at the pro rata contract rate.

7. PAYMENT

Subject to satisfactory references being given, payment to be made within 30 days of the date of collection or delivery; otherwise payment to be made against proforma invoice.

- (i) No discounts or other deductions will be allowed unless otherwise agreed on an order.
- (ii) If payment is not so made the Seller may without prejudice to any other of its rights under these conditions charge interest on the amount of the price then outstanding at a rate of 3% per annum above the Base Rate of Clydesdale Bank PLC accruing on a daily basis until payment is made, whether before or after any judgment.
- (iii) If payment is not so made by the due date the Seller shall be entitled to suspend deliveries, collections and by notice in writing to the Buyer to cancel all future orders but without prejudice to any rights which have been accrued to the seller prior to such notice.

8. CLAIMS

No liability is accepted for any claims for short delivery or damage unless notified to us within 3 clear days of the delivery and in the event of wet damage the documents must be endorsed accordingly.

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

All warranties, conditions and other terms implied by statute or common law (save for the conditions implied by section 12 of the Sale of Goods Act 1979) are, to the fullest extent permitted by law, excluded from the contract. The Seller shall not be liable to the Buyer for loss of profit, loss of business, or

depletion of goodwill in each case whether direct, indirect or consequential, or any claims for consequential compensation whatsoever (howsoever caused) which arise out of or in connection with the contract. Nothing in these conditions excludes or limits the liability of the Seller for death or personal injury caused by the Seller's negligence. Subject to the foregoing the Seller's total liability in contract, tort (including negligence or breach of statutory duty), misrepresentation, restitution or otherwise, arising in connection with the performance or contemplated performance of the contract shall be limited to the contract price.

10. RETENTION OF TITLE

The Seller and Buyer expressly agree that until the Seller has been paid in full for the goods comprised in this or any other contract between them: the goods comprised in this contract remain the property of the Seller (although the risk therein passes to the Buyer when the goods are delivered to the Buyer) until such time as the Buyer shall have paid to the Seller the agreed price together with the full price of any other goods the subject of any other contract with the Seller.

- (i) Legal title to the goods shall not pass to the Buyer unless the Seller has been paid in full, and legal title shall not pass to the Buyer until all sums due to the Sellers account have been paid.

 (ii) The Seller may recover those goods at any time from the Buyer if in his possession, if the amount outstanding from the Buyer to the Seller in respect to goods supplied shall remain unpaid after the due date for payment
- in his possession, if the amount outstanding from the Buyer to the Seller in respect to goods supplied shall remain unpaid after the due date for payment has passed; and for that purpose the Seller, his servants and agents may for the purpose of recovery of its own goods enter upon all premises, land or building upon which he goods are stored or where they are reasonably thought to be stored to recover the same.
- (iii) The Buyer acknowledges that the Buyer is in possession of the goods solely as a bailee for the Seller until such time as the full prices there of are paid to the Seller together with the full price of any goods the subject of any other contract with the Seller.
- (iv) In the course of his business for the account of the Seller (but any warranties, conditions or representations) given or made by the Buyer to any third party shall not be binding on the Seller who shall be indemnified by the Buyer with respect there to and to pass good title to the goods to his customer being a bona fide purchase for value without notice of Seller's rights.
- (v) The Buyer has the rights to re-sell the goods in the course of his business for the account of the Seller (but any warranties, conditions or representations given or made by the Buyer to any third party shall not be binding on the Seller who shall be indemnified by the Buyer with respect there to) and to pass good title to the goods to his customers being bona fide purchase for value without notice of the Seller's rights;
- (vi) In the event of such re-sale the Buyer has fiduciary duty to the Seller to account to the Seller for the proceeds but may retain there from any excess of such proceeds over the amount outstanding under this or any other sale contract between them and the Seller has the additional right to recover the Buyer's price directly from the Buyer's customer to the extent unpaid; if the Seller avails himself of such rights the Seller will account to the Buyer for any such excess as aforesaid less any expenses incurred by the seller in respect of such recovery;
- (vii) Nothing in this condition shall confer any right upon the Buyer to return the goods sold here under or to refuse or delay payment therefore unless otherwise agreed.

11. FORCE MAJEURE

The Seller shall not be liable for failing to perform the contract whether in whole or in part if the failure is caused by any inability to secure labour, materials or supplies, act of God, riot or civil commotion, strike, lock-out, fire, flood, drought, act of government or any cause, whether or not similar in kind to all or any of the foregoing, outside the Seller's control and shall have the rights by notice in writing to the Buyer to rescind the contract or to elect to vary the contract as may in the Sellers opinion be necessary.

12. GOVERNING LAW

The contract and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with it or its subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputed or claims) shall be governed by and construed in accordance with English law, and the parties submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.



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
