**All candidates must:**

1. Have a high school transcript on file with the Records Office prior to graduation.
2. Earn a minimum 2.0 grade-point average at the time of graduation.
3. Complete an Application for Graduation via your MyTriton portal.

It is recommended that you see a counselor prior to completing the graduation application to ensure that all program requirements are met. You may also verify your requirements by clicking on **Program Evaluation** in the **Academic Planning** section of the **MyTriton** portal.

## ENROLLMENT STEPS

### 1. Complete an Application for Admission

- You should receive an acceptance packet within 7-10 days.

### 2. Submit Your High School Transcripts or GED Scores

All new degree-seeking students or those planning to take a course that requires college-level math or English must adhere to the course placement process. Course placement can be satisfied by using past work or through placement testing.

New first-year students may be exempt from the placement test by demonstrating college-level proficiency through qualifying SAT, ACT, GED scores or high school GPA. Please refer to Triton College's Placement Measure for more information.

### 3. Meet with an Academic Advisor

## PLACEMENT TESTING

Triton College expects all students to either possess at the time of admission or acquire through appropriate developmental coursework, the basic reading, writing and mathematical skills that are necessary for success in the course or program of study chosen by the student.

Therefore, Triton College requires all entering students wishing to enroll in credit classes, to take institutional placement tests or provide formal documentation of basic learning skills. See advisor for exceptions.

Students scoring in the developmental range on the English placement test must enroll in appropriate college reading and/or writing courses prior to the completion of 12 academic credit hours. **New students must complete testing or submit documentation to be exempt prior to attending orientation or registration.**

Students with previously earned college credit may be waived from placement tests if they personally bring in a college transcript or grade report showing successful completion of a college-level English composition/rhetoric course or mathematics course with a "C" or better. **New transfer students** need to bring a transcript or grade report to their orientation program. **Returning students** should bring appropriate documentation with them at the time of registration. 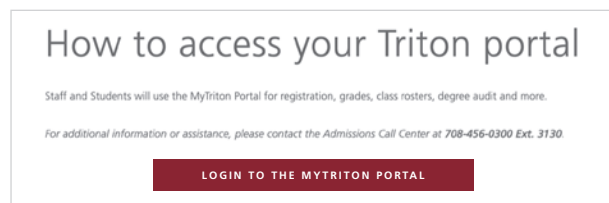

## ACCESSING YOUR STUDENT PORTAL

- Go to [triton.edu/MyTriton](http://triton.edu/MyTriton).
- Click the "Login to the MyTriton Portal" button.



- Your username is your first + last name followed by "@triton.edu"  
**Example:** johndoe@triton.edu

- Your password is the first letter of your first name + the first three letters of your last name + your six-digit birth date in a month/day/year format.  
**Example:** John Doe was born on July 1, 1990, so his password is jdoe070190.

### ONCE YOU HAVE SUCCESSFULLY LOGGED ON:

- Change your password at the top of the page by clicking on your name and selecting the option "Change Password."
- Do not forget to log off when done and close all tabs. Logging off of the portal is important, especially when using a public computer.

### TO LOG OFF OF THE PORTAL:

Click the arrow displayed next to your name then select "Sign Out" option and click. A new page will load, indicating that the user must close (quit) the browser to complete the sign out. Be absolutely sure to exit the browser to ensure that you are logged out of the portal.

# Tuition

The tuition rate is based on your permanent residence. To be considered a resident of District 504 a student\*:

- Must have occupied and/or owned a dwelling for 30 days immediately prior to the start of the classes.
- Must provide two forms of verification in the student's name: Illinois driver's license, auto registration, property tax statement, voter registration, utility or phone bill, lease or purchase agreement, library card or other appropriate documentation.

A change from out-of-district to in-district during the semester becomes effective no earlier than the following semester.

Students are required to report a change of address to the Welcome Center.

## CAREER/Joint Agreements

The Comprehensive Agreement Regarding the Expansion of Educational Resources (CAREER) allows out-of-district students to earn an Associate of Applied Science degree or certificate at in-district tuition rates if the program is not offered at the community college in their district. Interested students should obtain approval to enroll in a specified program of study from their local community college.

## Work in the District?

If you live outside Triton's district, but work full time (approx. 35 hours per week) for an approved in-district company, you may be eligible for in-district tuition. Interested students must first apply for a joint agreement, when applicable. If a joint agreement is not available, the company representative must sign the Company Contract Training Form (available in our Records Office) verifying the student's employment.

## Reduced Tuition for Older Adults

Residents of the Triton College district who are 60 years of age or older may register for credit classes at a reduced rate. The reduced tuition rate is \$6 per semester hour.

Additionally, senior citizens are entitled to a waiver of registration fee (\$2 per credit hour). Proof of age is required.

### PAY by Nelnet Tuition Payment Plan

To help you meet the expenses at Triton College, we offer a convenient monthly budget plan for students with a tuition balance of at least \$250. Nelnet gives you two options for making monthly payments.

You may make payments by either automatic bank payments or by charging payments to your Discover Card, MasterCard or American Express. Because Nelnet is not a loan program, there is no debt incurred, no credit search, and no interest or finance charges assessed on the unpaid balance. Nelnet charges a \$25 per semester nonrefundable fee to enroll and participate in its program. Students who opt to use the credit card option also will incur a credit card convenience fee.

You are responsible for paying tuition for all classes for which you have registered. **You should not assume that you have automatically been dropped from classes if you don't pay for them by the due date.** Be sure to drop any class you do not wish to take.

If you register, fail to attend and fail to officially withdraw from classes, you are still responsible for the tuition. Students who receive grades but do not pay will be subject to collection fees when the account is turned over to the college's collection agency.

## How Nelnet Tuition Payment Plan Works

You must enroll online. Go to [triton.edu/MyTriton](http://triton.edu/MyTriton) for instructions on how to log on to the student portal. Once you log in, select Enroll and Manage My Payment Plan from the Financial Information pull-down menu. After you submit your online agreement, a confirmation email will be sent to verify your agreement.

### You may budget your tuition and fees one of two ways:

- A. Automatic Bank Payment (ACH)** – ACH payments are those payments you have authorized Nelnet to process directly with your financial institution. It is simply a bank-to-bank transfer of funds that you have preapproved for your tuition at Triton College. Payment can be made from either your checking or savings account. Payments are processed on the fifth of each month and will continue until the balance due to the college is paid in full.
- B. Credit Card Option** – If you elect to use this option, monthly payments along with a convenience fee will be charged to the Discover Card, MasterCard or American Express as designated at the time of origination. The convenience fee is in addition to the Nelnet nonrefundable enrollment fee. Payments will be charged on the fifth of each month until the balance is paid in full.

### Completing the Nelnet Agreement

When you enroll online be sure to have the following information:

- Your student ID number.
- The name and address of the person responsible for making the payments.
- Account information for the responsible person.
  1. If paying by automatic bank payments, you will need bank name, telephone number, account number and the bank routing number. Most of this information is located on your check.
  2. If paying by credit card, you will need the credit card number and expiration date.

### Nelnet Pending Aid Payment Plan

Nelnet Pending Aid Payment Plan is available for eligible students applying for financial aid. An eligible student is one that has an expected family contribution (EFC) of \$5,500 or less (based on their FAFSA on file in the Financial Aid Office). The \$25 Nelnet processing fee is deferred until the plan is activated. If the student's financial aid award covers all institutional charges, the plan is canceled with no penalty. If the student has an incomplete file, or a balance due after the financial aid award has been applied to their account, the student can choose to pay the balance due in a one-time payment and the plan will be canceled with no penalty, or the plan will activate and the \$25 Nelnet processing fee will be charged to the student along with the first of the monthly installments.

## STUDENT PHOTO ID CARD

A student identification card may be required to access various services on campus. An ID is required for admittance into the Educational Technology Resource Center, to check out materials in the Library and for discounted admittance to student events. You may obtain your ID at the Welcome Center in the Student Center. Two forms of identification are required: your current class schedule and a picture ID. There is no charge for the initial ID, however, there is a \$5 replacement charge if lost.

## REFUND POLICY

A student who registers, fails to attend class, and fails to officially withdraw from the class, is still responsible for all tuition and fees. A student who receives grades for a class, but does not pay, will be subjected to collection fees when the unpaid balance is turned over to a collection agency.

A student who officially withdraws from any class may be refunded to a percentage of the course tuition depending on when withdrawal is made (see the following table). The registration, late registration, proficiency test and special examination fees are not refundable. The auxiliary and student services fees are refundable only when official withdrawal occurs before the start of the semester.

### REFUND

A student is entitled to a 100% refund when official withdrawal is made no later than the first 5.5% of the class calendar days. A 50% refund will be granted within the first 5.6-8% of the class calendar days. Withdrawals after the 100% refund period will result in a grade of "W".

Students should refer to their current class schedule in the MyTriton portal for specific withdrawal dates for each term.

All requests for exceptions to this policy must be made in writing on a General Petition form and submitted to the Welcome Center in the Student Center within one calendar year of the semester in dispute. For more information, you may obtain a guide to refund petitioning at the Welcome Center.

### Tuition Refunds/Credit Vouchers for Students Called to Active Military Service

Any active student who is required to withdraw from classes during his/her regular semester or summer term due to active military obligations will be entitled to a full refund of tuition or credit voucher (unless paid by a state/federal agency) upon evidence and notification to the college within the semester or term of withdrawal.

If you do not make payment arrangements within the specified timelines, you **may** be dropped from your selected classes. The College will send an email notifying you of the need to re-enroll. If you decide not to attend, please be reminded that. **If you decide not to attend, please be reminded that you are responsible for managing your enrollment and must drop courses for which you have registered.**

### The following **PAYMENT OPTIONS** are available to students:

- **Payments in full** may be made by cash, money order, check or credit card (MasterCard, Visa, or American Express) at the Cashier's Office (Student Center, Room B-130). You may also pay online through your MyTriton portal.
- **Proof of third party payment** means that a third party is providing payment on your behalf (e.g., a company for which you work). Eligible persons should contact the Cashier's Office (Room B-130) prior to registering for classes..
- **Nelnet Payment Plan** allows you to have interest-free monthly installments automatically deducted from your bank account or credit card. Program eligibility requires a minimum balance due of \$250 and payment terms are based on the date of registration. A valid bank account or credit card is needed to set up the payment plan. There is a \$25 processing fee. For more information, please contact the Cashier's Office at Ext. 3649. You may apply for the Nelnet plan online through the MyTriton portal..

- Faculty and students are linked via computer over the internet.

### Fees

Students enrolled in "E" noncredit/vocational courses (i.e. PSY E01) are assessed fees totaling \$16 per Adult Education Credit hour (AEC). This includes the Registration, Auxiliary, Technology, and Student Services fee.

Students enrolled in "C" noncredit/personal enrichment courses (i.e. PED C01) are assessed a \$7 registration fee per course. Students registering for multiple "C" courses are eligible for a refund of any registration fee balance over \$7 and should contact the Continuing Education main office.

The registration fee is waived for in-district senior citizens age 60 years and older. In the event a student cancels a course, the Registration fee will not be refunded.

### Extension Centers

Meeting dates for classes held at extension centers generally follow the schedules and/or school calendar of that center. When a center is closed because of local scheduling, severe weather or some other condition that makes holding class impossible, that class meeting will be canceled and rescheduling arrangements will be made at the next class meeting.

### Refund Policy

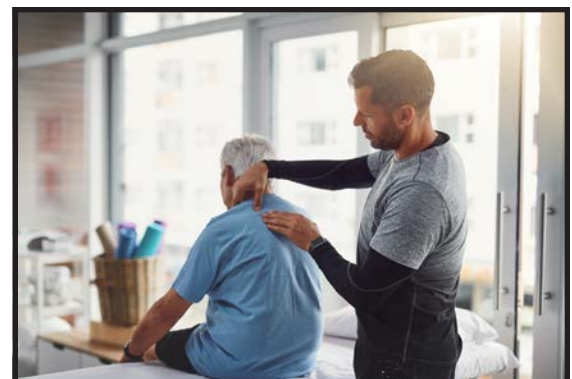

## Pharmacy Technician Program



Pharmacy technicians work under the supervision of licensed pharmacists to perform technical duties in the systematic operation of the pharmacy – providing health care services and medications to patients. This 75-hour course will introduce students to various settings in pharmacy practice, including the community, hospital, managed care, mail order and long-term care. Information on qualifying for the pharmacy certification examination will be provided. Technicians may perform many of the same duties as pharmacists. However, all of a technician's work must be checked by a pharmacist before medicine can be dispensed to a patient.

### Career Outlook

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), employment of pharmacy technicians is projected to grow 20 percent from 2012 to 2022, faster than the average for all occupations. Several factors will lead to increased demand for prescription medications. Depending on the position, the technician may also manage third-party billing, answer telephones, direct customers to items or to the pharmacist for medication consultation, receive written prescriptions, clean and sterilize dispensing bottles and instruments, answer questions regarding non-drug products and operate a cash register.

### Educational Requirements

High school diploma or equivalent. Since pharmacy technicians interact daily with co-workers, patients and health care professionals, good communication and interpersonal skills are essential. It is recommended that students take the math placement exam to ensure their ability to do basic college math.

## Triton College is an easy drive . . .

### From the South

Travel north on the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) and exit onto the Eisenhower Expressway (I-290), heading east toward downtown Chicago. Exit the Eisenhower at First Avenue and turn left (north). Travel to North Avenue, turn left and drive west to the next stoplight, which is Fifth Avenue. Turn right and drive north on Fifth Avenue to the next stoplight. Main campus will be on your left.

### From the East

Travel west on North Avenue to Fifth Avenue (one block west of First Avenue). Turn right and drive north on Fifth Avenue to the next stoplight. Main campus will be on your left.

### From the West

Travel east on North Avenue to Fifth Avenue (just past the Winston Plaza Shopping Center). Turn left and drive north on Fifth Avenue to the next stoplight. Main campus will be on your left.

### From the North

Take the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) south to the Irving Park Road exit (Illinois 19) and head east to River Road. Turn right (south) on River Road. Stay to the right at Fifth Avenue to reach the main campus (second stoplight).

**PLEASE NOTE:** There is NO exit from the Tri-State Tollway (I-294) at North Avenue.

## Triton College is easy to get to by train or bus . . .

### From the South

Take the Douglas train to the end of the line. Exit at the Cicero-Berwyn stop and take the 322 bus west to Cermak and First Avenues. Then take the 331 bus north to the Triton campus.

### From the East

Take the Congress train to the end of the line. Exit at the Des Plaines stop and take the 17, 303 or 310 bus west to Madison and Fifth Avenues. Then take the 331 bus north to the Triton campus.

### OR

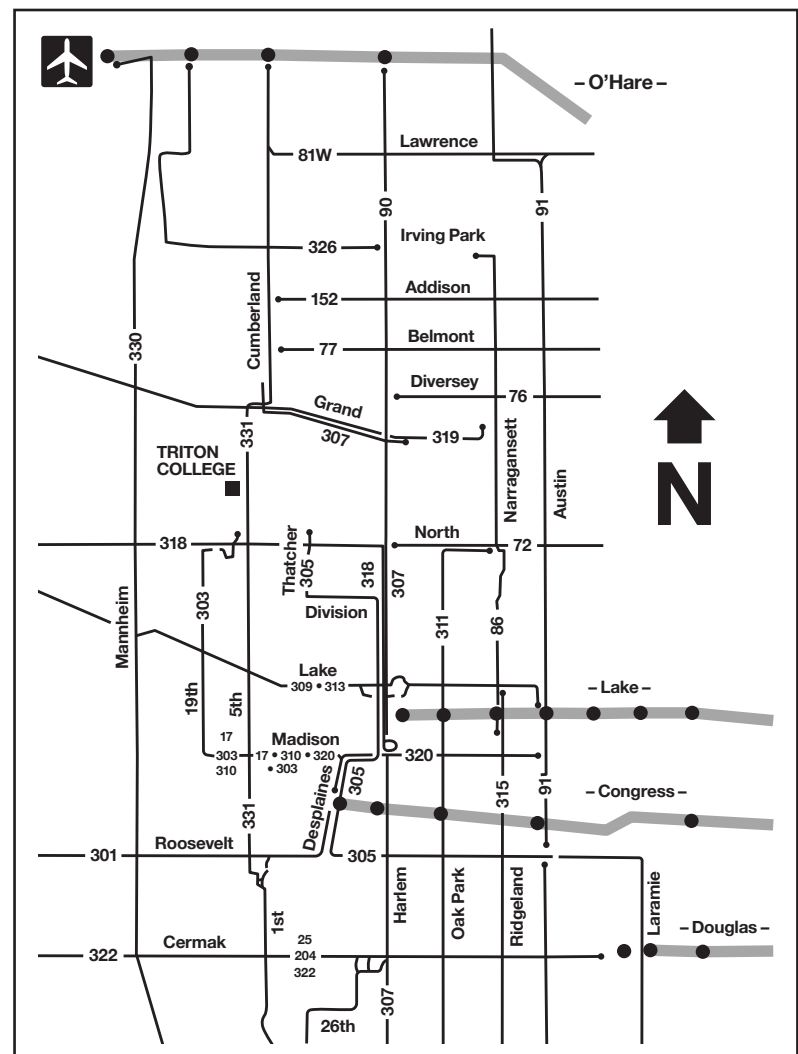
Take the Lake Street train to the Austin or Harlem exits. Take the 309 or 313 bus west to Lake Street and Fifth Avenue. Then take the 331 bus north to the Triton campus. 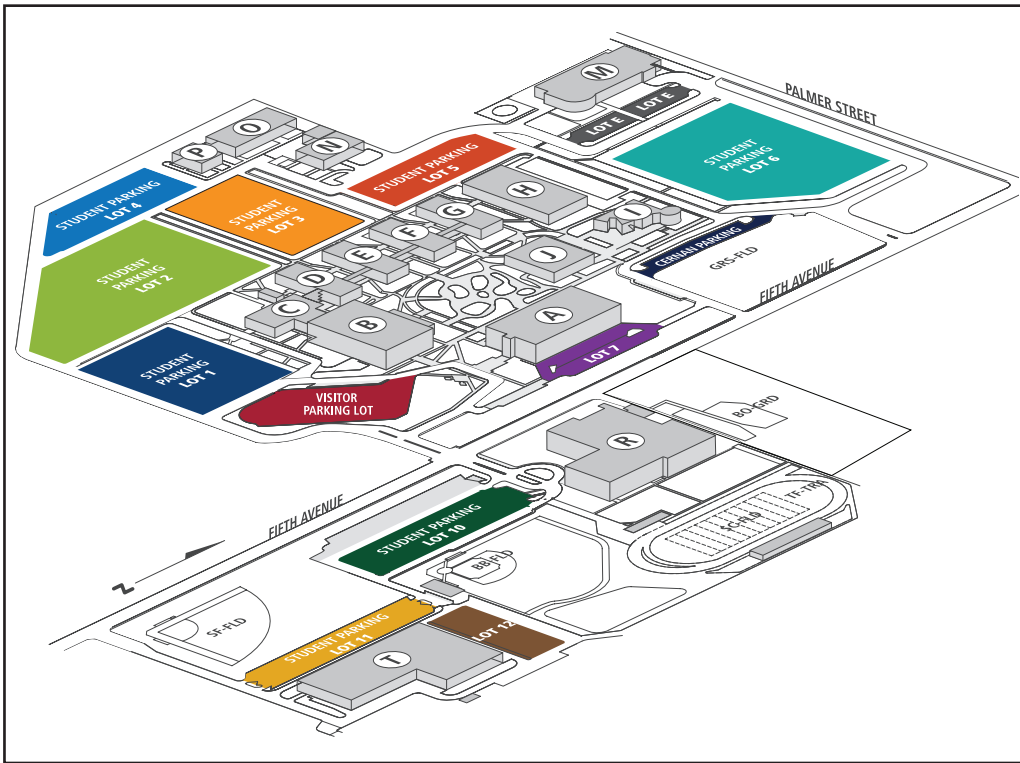
### From the North and Northwest

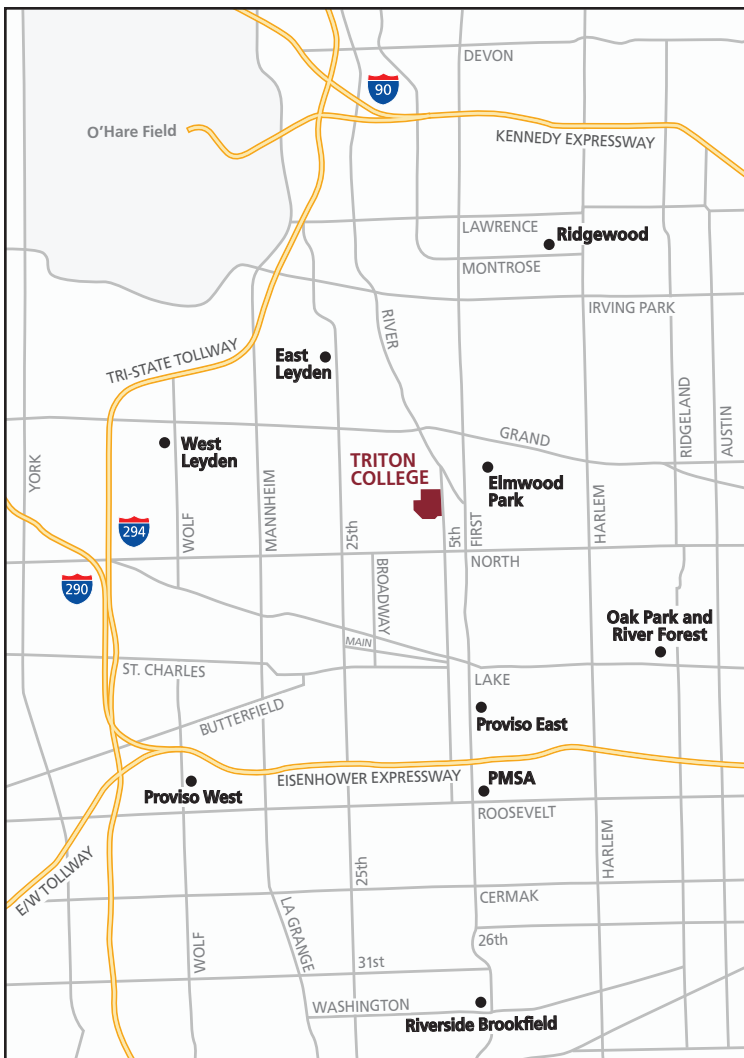
