General information

The Czech Republic (Czechia) is a landlocked country located in Central Europe bordered by Germany, Poland, Slovakia and Austria. The country is divided into thirteen regions, plus the capital city and region of Prague.


Useful facts

The **Czech economy** is based on industry and manufacturing, especially the automotive sector. Car production alone makes up almost 18% of all exports and hundreds of thousands of people across the country work in the industry.

The official language is Czech. It is a Slavic language that is mutually intelligible with Slovak, and roughly intelligible with Polish.

While approximately 86% of our neighbours **believe in God**, only 29% Czechs say the same thing. Czechs support legal abortions (84%) and same-sex marriage (65%).

In the Czech Republic, Christmas is associated with many superstitions that usually relate to the life, love and destiny that awaits us in the year to come. According to one Czech custom, one is supposed to fast all day to see the "golden piglet" in the evening.

A traditional Czech meal usually consists of two or more courses, starting with soup, followed by the main course.

Typical Czech cuisine is very meat- and dumpling-oriented. One of the most popular dishes is beef sirloin in cream sauce (svíčková na smetaně).

The climate of the Czech Republic varies from season to season.

During summer, temperatures can rise up to 35 °C. Winters (December–March) can be either mild or harsh with temperatures below 0 °C. Do not forget to bring a warm coat!

TRANSPORTATION IN HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

Hradec Králové has an extensive cycling network and the best way to get around the city is on **bikes** and **scooters**. The cycling network is about **80 km** long. If you don't want to buy a bike, you can use the **Nextbike** service.

If you sign up for a Nextbike account with your university e-mail address, you will get **CZK 160** as credit!



All trolley and electric bus timetables are available at the **Public Transport Company of Hradec Králové** website. Alternatively, you can also use the IDOS mobile app. dpmhk.cz/en



Main Railway Station and Public Transport Terminal

When you first got to Hradec Králové, you probably arrived at the Main Railway Station. It's good to know that the Public Transport Terminal (Terminál HD) lies less than 300 metres north from the Station. The terminal is divided into red and blue sections. If you need to travel around town, go to the Red Bay. From there you can get a bus to the "Palachovy koleje" Halls of Residence and even UHK. If you'd like to take a bus out of town, go to the Blue Bay.

City card

Use your City Card as either a time ticket or an electronic wallet. You can also use it as an **ID card** at the **Research Library**, the **Flošna swimming pool**, the **wellness centre**, at the **City Spa** and at the **Hradec Králové City Library**.

Get your City Card from the **HK Infocentre** (Eliščino nábř. 626), the **Public Transport Terminal** (Nádražní street) or the **Public Transport Company** (Pouchovská 153).


SPORTS IN HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

HANDY INFORMATION & BASIC VOCABULARY

Academic year

At UHK, the academic year has two semesters – the winter semester (September–February)and the summer semester (February–June). Lessons cover a **13 week period**.

Courses

Czech students take obligatory, semi-obligatory and voluntary courses. Your study plan is different and tailor-made just for you. Please remember to submit your preferences to the International Office in time!

Lectures

With some courses, a guarantor (associate professor or professor) may give non-obligatory lectures. You need to attend these lectures if you want to pass the course.

Seminars

Apart from lectures, you may also need to attend seminars. These are more practical and are designed to further the knowledge you gain at lectures. They are also **obligatory**, so make sure you show up!

Credits

UHK uses the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). You gain credits for successfully passing a course.

Pre-exams

You must meet certain criteria to be allowed to sit the final course test. You may be required to write an essay or give a presentation, for example.

Exams

Exams can be written, oral or practical. Depending on how you do in your exam, you'll get a/n A, B, C, D, E or F. If you get an F, you fail the course. Please keep in mind that you can try no more than **3 times** to pass an exam.

IS/STAG is an information system designed to electronically manage your **ST**udy **AG**enda at UHK. It facilitates a wide range of functions from the admissions procedure to the award of a degree. You can use it to **manage your study programmes**, **courses**, **study plans** and **student mobility**, or to **enroll in courses**, **apply for exams**, **write assessments**, to record Bachelor's and Master's dissertations, **set timetables**, and do much more.

Logging into STAG

Switch to English in the right corner

The system is available at **stag.uhk.cz** – sign in with your login details. Your username is the first 5 letters of your surname and 2 letters from your given name + 1 digit (e.g. surnana1).

UHK STUDENT CARD

One of the things that you definitely cannot live without at UHK is your **UHK Student Card.** It comes in the form of an ID chip card. Let's call it an ID Card.

Your ID Card gives you access to a wide range of services. Use it to print and copy things, borrow books, establish your identity, and access UHK buildings and lockers.

Get your ID Card at the **UHK Service Centre** in the Common Education Facility (Building A). The ID Card alone costs CZK 200, but if you throw in an ISIC card as well, you can get the two at CZK 350 in total.

UHK SERVICE CENTER

LOGGING INTO THE UNIVERSITY NETWORK AND WI-FI CONNECTION

You'll get your login details at the orientation lecture or sooner.

The Wi-Fi network at UHK is connected to the international **Eduroam** (name of the wi-fi) project, which is covered by the **CESNET** Association.

You need to insert the entire UHK email and password sent to you by the coordinator in the email.



Setting up client devices

Automatic configuration for mobile phones can be carried out using the Eduroam CAT (Configuration Assistant Tool).

PHOTOCOPYING AND PRINTING

There are several self-service **photocopiers** at UHK. You can also scan documents and **send them to your e-mail**. You need a valid **ID Card with enough credit** to use these services.

To print something from a university PC, simply send your documents to the **YSoft SafeQ na forkys3.uhk.cz** printer. Then sign in to any printer at UHK with your ID Card and it will start printing. If you need any help, please contact the Service Center where you can also **add credit to your ID Card**.

TOPPING UP YOUR ID CARD



You can top up credit on your ID card at top-up points. The minimum amount of credit is CZK 20 and the maximum amount is CZK 1,500. Prices for photocopying and printing can be found in the Service Center's current price list.

Any unused balance on your card is non-refundable!

Some other medical facilities that you can go to are the University Hospital Hradec Králové (Sokolská 581) - this is where the Department of Emergency Medicine is (go there only in very serious cases) and the Health Centre III (tř. E. Beneše 1549/34).

The hospital staff speaks English.

If there are no vacancies, alternative accommodation will be provided.

ACCOMMODATION IN HK

If you want to stay at the dorms, **don't leave things until the last minute and plan ahead. You really need to apply before you get to Hradec!** Vacancies are usually first offered to international students.

University Halls of Residence

The Palachovy Halls of Residence (referred to as "Palachárny") are a huge complex with 7 entrances and can house up to 869 students. Typical flats have 2 - 3 bedrooms, a kitchen, a toilet and a bathroom. Kitchens are fitted with a fridge, a freezer and an electric cooker. You can use the washing machines and dryers located in the basement of Entrance E for a small fee.

The dorms also have a piano and table tennis.

The following services are also offered:

- Bedding rental (included in the residence fee)
- Rental of a set of dishes (only a whole set can be borrowed) service charged according to the price list
- Iron rental service charged according to the price list
- Gym
- Study room and social room

Students must follow the **UHK Halls of Residence Rules**. They are published on the UHK website and hung on the walls of the halls of residence at the reception desk and at every entrance.

Before moving in, each student must pay a refundable deposit of CZK 2,000.

Please take special note that the accommodation period ends sooner than the semester (end of the examination period). So it may happen that you will need to look for alternative accommodation.







If everyone at the dorms makes 2 cups of tea with one liter of hot water per day, we will needlessly pay 300,000 CZK for electricity consumption per year. Heat only the water you need, switch of unnecessary lights, turn off electronic devices that are not in use.

Sorting recycled waste

In the Czech Republic 3 out of 4 citizens sort and recycle their waste. You can also help to preserve a healthy environment by learning how to properly sort waste. The rules differ from country to country but also from city to city! Here's how it works in Hradec.





For clean paper of all sorts.

Sklo = glass

There are two types – clear and the rest (green, brown mostly).

Plast = plastic

PET bottles, clean plastic packaging and also TetraPak (e.g., milk box).



Sometimes there are also these gray containers that are used for metal (empty drink cans, broken but clean kitchen utencils and food cans).

Kov = metal



CODE OF ETHICS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

UHK wants a safe environment for students and employees, which is why it amended the <u>Code of Ethics of the University of Hradec Králové</u> at the end of 2021. This Code of Ethics forms university ethical principles that apply to all students and employees of UHK.

The complaint to investigate a violation of the Code can be made by submitting it via e-mail <u>etickakomise@uhk.cz</u> or physically in paper form to the UHK registry office. In the case of filing a complaint through the UHK registry office, it is necessary to state on the envelope the following: "UHK Ethics Committee – do not open."

The Ethics Committee handles all complaints regarding violations of the Code. <u>The Rules of procedure of the Ethics Committee UHK</u> define further details and requirements for filing a complaint.

UHK condemns all forms of violence and, in the context of sexually motivated violence, recommends using the instructions in the <u>following video</u>.
