Comments: In February 1995, the U. T. System was authorized to implement an enhanced Optional Retirement Program (ORP) which reduced the number of ORP companies to provide services from 88 to 10. In response to criticism from parties that were not selected at that time, the U. T. System agreed to reinitiate the process by developing and transmitting to interested ORP vendors a Request for Responses (RFR). Eighteen companies met the minimum criteria contained in the RFR. However, since Executive Committee Letter 95-26 was approved, Gabelli and Company, Inc., Rye, New York, has asked to be withdrawn from the approved list so ratification of that firm is not requested. Similarly, Security Benefit Life Insurance Company, Topeka, Kansas, approved via ECL 95-26 has notified the U. T. System of a drop in its financial rating to a point which is below the required minimum criterion for financial ratings so that ratification of that firm is also not requested. Therefore, only the 16 companies listed above have been authorized to provide ORP services to U. T. System eligible employees.

Proposed Allocation from PUF Bond Proceeds for Library Special Collection

Based upon a request dated August 30, 1995, from President Witt, an allocation of \$9,307.50 from the PUF Library Special Collection Reserve is recommended.

The University of Texas at Arlington has an opportunity to purchase the final portion of the papers of Henry Washington Benham focusing on the Mexican War and Civil War service of Mr. Benham. Earlier this year, the Special Collections Division of the U. T. Arlington Libraries acquired a major portion of the papers through a grant from the Summerlee Foundation of Dallas, a donation by Mr. Al Peters of Fort Worth, and a grant from the PUF Bond Proceeds for Library Special Collections Reserve. Mr. Wes O. Clark of Dallas, a U. T alumnus, is now willing to sell the final portion of the Benham papers to U. T. Arlington for the appraised value of \$18,615.00. Dr. Gerald D. Saxon, assistant director for Special Collections, has carefully examined the papers and has received a commitment from Mr. Marvin Applewhite, a U. T. Arlington alumnus, to donate one-half the appraised value of the papers, or \$9,307.50, provided the U. T. System matches that amount. The papers will enhance the U. T. Arlington Special Collections holdings both in the area of the Mexican War, where the current collection is second to none in the United States and in cartographic history, in which the University's collection is one of the finest west of the Mississippi River.

In June 1986, \$1 million was appropriated by the U. T. System Board of Regents for Special library collections. This amount was placed in reserve for institutional requests when unusual acquisition opportunities exist. The reserve now stands at \$58,399.
