Patient Information

Your patch test result indicates that you have a contact allergy to abietic acid. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is abietic acid found?

Abietic acid is an irritant in resin and pine wood. It is found in lacquers, varnishes, and soaps.

How can you avoid contact with abietic acid?
