




# Nature in the city: the triple zone approach

When developing new combinations and product concepts, Verver Export takes account of the 'triple zone approach' for nature in the city. Account is thereby taken of the distinctive characteristics of the urban environment when using bulbs, annuals and perennials for public planting.

Let's list them for you again:



Taking account of the nature of a particular zone when designing and managing plantings results in variation in the planting and reinforces the identity of the various parts of the urban area. A useful assessment can be made by differentiating between three aspects: aesthetic quality, ecological quality and the usage value of the planting.


At Verver Export we are keen to help you think around this theme so that the right plant/concept ends up in the right place!

In the transitional zone the environment for plants and animals is usually intact, including the original soil. There is only scattered development. The transitional zone can be very species-rich; it forms the boundary region and the contact zone between the city and the surrounding landscape. For this zone, Verver Export recommends more **natural planting** with bulbs for naturalising and perennial planting planted mechanically in verges.



# **Verver Export** introduction

A flower bulb can be officially named after assessing whether the cultivar is unique in its appearance and/or its characteristics. Depending on the bulb type, registration takes place centrally somewhere in the world.

On Saturday 29 September 2018, Verver Export christened a Dahlia from breeder Peter Koomen (Anna Paulowna, NL) 'Princess Erika'. Princess Erika is a French singer and actress of Cameroonian descent. She is best known for her reggae songs "Trop de bla-bla" or "Faut qu'j'travaille".



# From seed to tuber

As with other flowers and plants, the breeder makes a conscious decision to cross two cultivars with each other. The species are crossed in the summer, and breeders make sure that no spontaneous, natural crossing can occur. The seeds are harvested in the autumn and sown in early spring. From these seeds, a beautiful plant with a tuber grows in one season. The flowers are evaluated and, if approved, the tubers are harvested.





The tubers are placed in a moist, warm place early in the spring. The tuber quickly forms many new growth shoots. These are cut off to become the cuttings for the new season. After producing shoots and hardening,



they are placed in the ground in May/ June and go on to grow from cuttings to large tubers in one season. In November, the tubers are harvested and delivered to Verver Export.







# A long history!



Anemone coronaria is a plant from the ranunculus family

(Ranunculaceae). The plant is native to the Mediterranean region. In its area of origin, it is an herbaceous perennial that grows to a height of 20-40 cm (and sometimes up to 60 cm). It has a rosette of a few leaves at its base. Each leaf is divided in three and deeply lobed. The flowers grow on a single stem with a whorl of small leaves just below the flower. The flower is 3-8 cm wide and has five to eight red, white,

pink, purple or blue petal-like sepals. The red anemone is most common on the Batha (Morocco), the purple ones in Galilee (Israel) and Esdralon (Israel) and the white ones in the hills of Tiberias (Israel). The colour is probably determined by the type of soil.

After flowering in the dry summer, it goes dormant, and the tuber can shrivel up until it looks like a rock-hard, wrinkly piece of wood. As soon as there is water again, it absorbs it like

a sponge and becomes three times its size. It then starts to grow and flower again.

The Anemone coronaria has been a popular cut flower since time immemorial; this colourful flower has been mentioned since ancient times.



# Connection & variation increases biodiversity

Connection and variation are two central themes in nature-inclusive building, design and layout of residential areas. Varied inner city green spaces that are connected to the countryside or other green hotspots around the city have greater biodiversity.

### **Variation brings balance**

Ribbon-shaped parks and hedges and tree-lined avenue can connect the various parks, rural areas and public gardens. These connections can be specially constructed, but existing elements such as waterways with natural banks, railway embankments, dikes and widened verges can also be used. Animals are not the only ones to use these connections, they also have added value for residents.

### From rough grass to verges with flowering grass

A strip of flowering grass added to a section of grass provides a useful feeding area for bees. All kinds of other insects and small vertebrates also benefit from the flowery, slightly wilder strips. A different mowing method used for the flowery strip also reduces mortality among the fauna when mowing. The flowery strip creates a colourful display from early spring to late summer.

### Useful green space

Hedges, shrubs and other perennials provide greenery all year round as well as food and shelter for birds and bats. These green elements are reflected in every plan and can easily be used to make the street, district, neighbourhood or city nature inclusive. They are also a good base for connecting green spaces.

### 🚺 Idyll

A variety of communal facilities can be created in and around houses or buildings, such as the Idyll: a flower-filled meadow for bees, butterflies and people. Idyll is a flower meadow designed for bees and butterflies (and people). These are larger areas from 0.5-2 hectares, sown with local and native plant species that are beneficial for bees and butterflies. Idylls are usually freely accessible.

### **Variation minimises problems**

A lack of variation can upset the balance of the landscape. This gives some species the chance to thrive while others do not. This is often accompanied by problems from wasps and oak processionary caterpillars. The more variation in verges, neighbourhoods, parks and nature reserves, the more resilience there is.

The plants for the Summer Trams are supplied by various producers in Heerhugowaard, the Netherlands. The wooden transport racks are assembled, the plants are sorted by Tram and placed in trays and then placed by order on the shelves. All orders are loaded on Sundays or Mondays, so they can be delivered as quickly as possible.

The order picking takes place in the greenhouses of **Tips** Verver Export, so that the plants remain in the dark for only a short time during transport. The plants should be watered immediately after arrival - we do - First place the pots in the desired places and then not water them too much before the transport to avoid Botrytis.

### Notes on planting

- 1. With our Summer Trams you can easily achieve a beautiful summer bloom.
- 2. The ready-to-plant Trams are delivered driven in
- 3. Your individual planting plan is included in the delivery.


# Clean and healthy cities for Europe

The Green Cities Accord is an initiative of the European Commission to mobilise European mayors who are committed to safeguarding the natural environment. It aims to improve the quality of life for all Europeans and accelerate the implementation of relevant EU environmental legislation at local level.

By joining the accord, cities commit to step up their efforts in five areas by 2030:

- 1. Air: significantly improve air quality by moving towards compliance with the WHO air quality guidelines and ending exceedances of EU air quality standards as soon as possible.
- **2. Water:** making significant progress to improve the quality of water bodies and increase efficiency of water use.
- 3. Nature and biodiversity: make significant progress in conserving and enhancing urban biodiversity, including by increasing the size and quality of urban green areas, and halting the loss and regeneration of urban ecosystems.
- 4. Circular economy and waste: make progress towards the circular economy by significantly improving municipal waste management, significantly reducing waste generation and landfill, and substantially increasing reuse, repair and recycling.
- Noise pollution: significantly reduce noise pollution in cities and move closer to WHO recommended levels.

The Green Cities Agreement will also ensure coherence with other EU initiatives and support the implementation of the European Green Deal and the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

- Extending the flowering period of plantings


