HOW JULIAN GOT IT'S NAME

Mike Julian was one of a number of prospectors who found gold in the streams surrounding town. When a mining district was founded, Julian was elected its recorder.

In 1870, Mike's cousin Drue Bailey plotted a townsite and named it "Julian City," in honor of his cousin. Bailey said it was a better-sounding name, and Mike was the handsomest man in camp and a favorite of the ladies.

Mike Julian was a respected individual and became a trustee of the first school district in the township. In 1871, he married Margaret Skidmore and was elected to be the San Diego County Assessor

Because commuting in those days was

not an option, the couple moved to San Diego and never lived in his namesake town again.

In 1892, they moved north to Long Beach to build and operate three hotels — the lowa Villa Hotel, the Julian Hotel and the Colonial Hotel.

Julian died in 1905, and he was survived by his sons Will, Ray and Ed.

OUR AFRICAN AMERICAN PIONEERS

African American pioneers and their stories have enriched Julian's history.

A.E. (FRED) COLEMAN

Late in 1869, Fred Coleman paused at a little creek to let his horse drink, when a glitter of gold in the stream caught his eye.

Raising livestock in Julian since the early 1860s, Coleman, a 41-year-old native of Kentucky, had worked in the gold fields of Northern California and knew what he saw. Wasting no time, he started panning with a skillet he had in his pack. It didn't take long before word spread, and that little creek was soon crawling with dozens of gold-pan-wielding and sluice-box-shaking fanatics. Fred Coleman was the first, and the creek that started off the Julian boom was named for him. The Coleman Mining District was formed, with Fred being the duly elected recorder.

AMERICA NEWTON

One of Julian's most colorful characters was a former slave who arrived in 1872 from Independence, Mo. Assisted by Mr.

and Mrs. James Cole and family, she filed an 80-acre homestead two miles west of Julian, where Cole built her a comfortable cabin and a two-wheeled cart, and gave her a fat, sleek roan horse to pull the cart. Newton did laundry for Julian residents and the miners using old-time washboard and tubs, and she turned out excellent work. Her irons were all heated over a grill in her fireplace.

JULIAN'S APPLE HISTORY

While Julian's first claim to fame was gold mining, the agricultural benefits of the area were soon recognized, and the planting of apples and pears began.

In the mid-1870s, James Madison and Thomas Brady went to Central California and brought back fruit trees to plant.
Other early apple pioneers were Isaac Bush, David Talley, Henry Morris, L.N. Bailey, Chester Gunn and James Duffy.

There are dozens of varieties of apples grown in Julian, including some antique cultivars that can only be found in 80-plus-year-old orchards, such as Bellflowers, Greenins, Baldwins, Bush's Seedlings and Duchess of Oldenburg. The most common varieties are red delicious, golden delicious, Jonathan, Gravenstein, Rome beauty and Winesap.

In 1889, the San Diego County District Fair was formed, with the first fair held set to be held in 1890. Julian apples and other produce, such as pears, were entered into that fair and brought home 88 first- and second-place awards. Wyatt Earp was the judge.

Local apples won first-place recognition in the 1893 World's Fair of Chicago, the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair, and the San Francisco State Fair of 1914, gaining national attention.

In 1907, Julian apples won the Wilder Medal, named for Marshall P. Wilder, which was the highest award given apples in competition with fruit from all over the United States and Canada.

In 1909, a local committee was formed to celebrate the Wilder Medal win and to interest outsiders in Julian's future

On Oct. 9, 1909, the first Apple Days celebration was held.

Currently, Julian's apple season changes based on the whims of Mother Nature. While apples may ripen as early as August, apple pies are available year-round from a number of local bakeries and restaurants.

During the annual harvest season, be sure to visit the Julian Town Hall Visitor Center for up-to-date information about apple-picking opportunities.

RESPONSIBLE TOURISM

Julian is a small town. It is not incorporated, and there is no "local government."

Julian is under the jurisdiction of County of San Diego. As such, the amenities in town are provided by volunteers.

Julian Chamber of Commerce provides 25 trashcans around town and has hired folks to empty them daily. Public restrooms are also provided by the Chamber, which is thankful to San Diego County Supervisor Joel Anderson, who allocated grant monies to help provide these amenities to visitors.

In order to help keep this community a place people love to visit again and again:

- Please don't litter Visitors are here to experience the fresh mountain air and beautiful scenery. So is everyone else, including those who live and work here. Please put litter in its place.
- Please treat the public restrooms with care. Maintaining public restrooms is the Chamber's most costly service. Vandalism and theft are a constant struggle. Please help keep these restrooms in service by respecting them.
- · Please park only in designated areas. The roads are narrow in the backcountry. Those who park where they don't belong may hinder emergency services.
- · Bring refillable water bottles. There is not a sophisticated recycling program here, so everyone's help is appreciated.
- · Respect private property. Guests are asked

to be responsible and respect local homes, farms and orchards.

- · Share the road. Most ways into Julian are by two-lane roads, and it may be tempting to pass on a double-yellow line. Please be respectful of other drivers and pass only when permitted by law and use turnouts if there are several vehicles behind you. As an added caution, please watch for motorcycles.
- Check road conditions. Snow and ice. are common during the winter months. Be prepared with chains, if required. For road updates, visit Caltrans Quickmap at quickmap.dot.ca.gov.
- · Respect the wildlife. Visitors are likely to see deer, turkeys, foxes and racoons, to name a few. Mountain lions and coyotes also call the Julian area home. Please don't approach, feed or harass any wildlife you are lucky enough to happen upon.
- · Please don't pick the flowers. Imagine the disappointment of traveling to Julian to see the wildflowers, daffodils and lilacs, only to find there are none. Did you know that every year, hundreds of daffodil bulbs are planted locally by volunteers. Please be respectful of those efforts and refrain from going onto private property to "just pick one." It's unfair and robs others of the opportunity to enjoy them.

It's easy to exhibit courtesy and care when visiting the Julian area. The community is very grateful when folks choose to visit. Join with residents in helping to keep the town safe and enjoyable for all who live here and visit.

HIKING IN JULIAN

So many Julian hiking trails have been featured in blogs and publications that the secret is out! Local trails give visitors a great reason to return again and again to experience all the natural beauty this area has to offer.

CUYAMACA RANCHO STATE PARK

(760) 765-0755

Located south of Julian on Highway 79. Hiking trails and day use are open at the Green Valley and Paso Picacho campgrounds, located 15.8 miles and 11 miles from Julian, respectively. Trail maps and information are available at a kiosk, open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily. There is a fee to park.

AZALEA GLEN LOOP TRAIL

A moderate 4-mile loop with gain in elevation of 550 feet is partially shaded in summer and sheltered in winter. Walk along one of the few seasonal streams in this park. Trailhead and parking are at the Paso Picacho campground parking lot.

CONEJO SPRING TRAIL

This is a moderately strenuous, sometimes steep, 3.5 miles to the summit. The gain in elevation is 1,650 feet, with a rugged ascent over the north shoulder of Cuyamaca Peak. Trail becomes a streambed after heavy rain or snowmelt. It connects to a paved road leading to summit, with a descent to the campground by a paved fire road. Trailhead and parking are at Paso Picacho campground.

STONEWALL PEAK TRAIL

Enjoy a moderate 2.0-mile hike each way with a steady gain in elevation of 900 feet that is suitable for energetic youngsters. There is a well-graded trail to the summit of Stonewall Peak, with the last section on an exposed ridge, but with steps and a handrail. Great views from the peak. Trailhead and parking are across from the entrance to Paso Picacho campground at the picnic area.

JUAQUAPIN TRAIL

A moderate 3-mile scenic loop ascends via East Side Trail and Juaquapin Trail, with a steepish return by Dyar Spring Trail. With a gain in elevation of 400 feet, the well-graded trail goes through oaks and open meadows and by a flowing stream, with viewing possibilities for wildflowers and deer. Trailhead and parking are at the turnoff for the Park Museum.

GREEN VALLEY FALLS TRAIL

An easy 1.5-mile roundtrip trail is suitable for children. The way to a pretty but seasonal waterfall is well-marked, and is best in spring and early summer. Trailhead and parking are located at the picnic area parking lot at Green Valley campground.

CHAMBERS PARK, LAKE CUYAMACA PARKS & RECREATION DISTRICT

(760) 765-0515

This easy 3.5-mile roundtrip family-friendly walk enters at the Chambers Park sign and continues across the dike to the tall pines on Fletcher Island. Picnic tables surround the lake. Leashed dogs are welcome. There is a fee for parking.

VOLCAN MOUNTAIN

(760) 765-4098

Take Main Street north, which becomes Farmers Road. Turn right at the four-way intersection, then take the next left. Volcan Mountain Preserve is on the right. There are no rangers and no fees. The 3-mile roundtrip trail to mid-summit leads from the gateway to a ridge overlooking Julian. Leashed dogs are permitted.

SANTA YSABEL OPEN SPACE PRESERVE

(760) 765-4098

Open from 8 a.m. to sunset, weather permitting, the 11 miles of multi-use trails are accessible on Farmers Road, 1 mile north of the Volcan Mountain trailhead. Julian Chamber of Commerce has a trail map for this area in the Julian Town Hall office. Leashed dogs are permitted.

More hiking information is available inside the visitor center in Julian Town Hall, 2129 Main St., at the corner of Washington and Main streets.



AREA PARKS AND RECREATION


