In Truce, a War of Words

Lebanese head home as Israel, Hezbollah each claim victory

BEIRUT, LEBANON | Tens of thousands of Lebanese jammed bomb-cratered roads Monday as they returned to still-smoldering scenes of destruction after a tenuous cease-fire ended 34 days of vicious combat between Israel and Hezbollah.

Lines of cars — some loaded with mattresses and luggage - snaked slowly around huge holes in the roads and ruined bridges. Hezbollah fighters hugged each other and celebratory gunfire and fireworks erupted in Beirut when the Islamic militant group's leader, Sheik Hassan Nasrallah, claimed a "strategic, historic victory."

Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert also claimed success, saying the offensive eliminated the "state within a state" run by Hezbollah and restored Lebanon's sovereignty in the south.

In northern Israel, residents emerged from bomb shelters, hopeful that the barrage of nearly 4,000 Hezbollah rockets that had rained down on towns and villages since July 12 had ended — for now. Stores shuttered for weeks reopened and some people returned to the beaches in Haifa, which suffered most from guerrilla attacks.

President Bush said Monday that Hezbollah guerrillas suffered a defeat at the hands of Israel and he blamed the guerrilla group for the devastation. "There's going to be a new power in the south of Lebanon," he said.

The conflict left nearly 950 people dead - 791 in Lebanon and 155 on the Israeli side, according to official counts. (AP)

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
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

Report Cites Misconduct By Military Recruiters

Military recruiters have increasingly resorted to overly aggressive tactics and even criminal activity to attract young troops to the battle-field, congressional investigators say. According to service data provided to the Government Accountability Office, substantiated cases of wrong-doing jumped by more than a third, from about 400 cases in 2004 to almost 630 in 2005. (AP)

Nagin's Halt of Dumping Could Delay City Cleanup

Mayor Ray Nagin on Monday ordered waste haulers to stop depositing debris in a controversial landfill opened after Hurricane Katrina, a move state regulators said could delay the battered city's cleanup by more than a year. Bush: Israel Defeated Hezbollah

President says militants to blame for deaths of Lebanese civilians

WASHINGTON | President Bush said Monday that Israel defeated Hezbollah's guerrillas in the monthlong Mideast war and that the Islamic militants were to blame for the deaths of hundreds of Lebanese civilians.

Bush admonished Iran and Syria for backing Hezbollah, which captured two Israeli soldiers on July 12 igniting the conflict. Both sides claimed victory Monday, hours after a U.N.-brokered cease-fire took effect, while Bush said Israel prevailed.

"Hezbollah attacked Israel. Hezbollah started the crisis, and Hezbollah suffered a defeat in this crisis," the president said at the State Department after a day of meetings with his top defense, diplomatic and national security advisers.

The United States backed Israel in the war, and Bush made clear he was determined to help the Israelis in the post-fighting struggle of words about who wound up on top.

The president portrayed the war, which killed about 790 Lebanese and 155 Israelis, as part of a broader

struggle between freedom and terrorism. He said one can only imagine how much more dangerous such a conflict would be if Iran possessed nuclear weapons.

Bush said Hezbollah lost, though Israel didn't knock out the guerrillas.

Bush said a United Nations-brokered cease-fire was an important step toward ending the violence, yet he acknowledged that the truce was fragile.

"We certainly hope the ceasefire holds, because it is step one of making sure that Lebanon's democracy is strengthened," Bush said. DEB RIECHMANN (AP)

Judge Won't Stop Sale of Oil and Gas

NEW ORLEANS | A federal judge Monday dealt Gov. Kathleen Blanco a defeat in her campaign to force the government to give Louisiana a bigger share of the royalties from offshore oil and gas drilling.

U.S. District Judge Kurt D. Engelhardt turned down Blanco's request to block Wednesday's sale of federal natural gas and oil leases in the western Gulf of Mexico.

Blanco has threatened to block such sales until the state is given more royalties to help it recover from Hurricane Katrina. She filed a lawsuit claiming the federal government has not done enough to protect Louisiana's wetlands from damage from drilling.

The state now receives less than 2 percent of royalties from oil and gas produced in the Gulf. (AP)

WTC Workers' Benefits to Rise

NEW YORK | Gov. George Pataki signed legislation Monday to greatly expand benefits for workers who have died or become sick from toiling in the smoke and dust that hung over the ruins of the World Trade

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

Baby Girl Born in Wreck

Fla. woman delivers child after crashing car on way to hospital

PAHOKEE, FLA. | A pregnant woman in labor, driving herself to the hospital, crashed her car and gave birth while trapped in the mangled, partially submerged vehicle, authorities said.

Kenyetta Biggs spent more than an hour in the car Sunday morning before she — and her newborn daughter — were rescued and taken to a hospital, authorities said. Her father said she had not told the family she was pregnant.

Biggs, 21, suffered a broken leg, but she and the baby she named Myracle were reported to be doing well.

Palm Beach County sheriff's Deputy Stephen Maxwell noticed a person's head poking out through some tall grass along a canal bank. The deputy stopped and found Biggs trying to get out of her partially submerged car. She told him her baby was inside.

Police said she had been driving to a hospital and a strong contraction caused her to lose control of the car shortly after 5 a.m. (AP)

Katrina Victims Eyed in Crime Jump

Houston police say New Orleans gangs to blame for homicides

HOUSTON | A recent paper trial led Louisiana bounty hunter James Martin to Texas. Again.

It marked the seventh time since Katrina that Martin, who pursues bail jumpers, has followed a trail starting in New Orleans to Texas. Katrina sent a lot of bad guys to Texas, as Houston is finding out.

Houston took in 150,000 evacuees — the most of any U.S. city — after Katrina struck on Aug. 29. Houston police believe the evacuees are partly responsible for a nearly 17.5 percent increase in homicides so far this year over the same period in 2005.

About 21 percent of Houston's 232 homicides through July 25 involved an evacuee as either a suspect or a victim, according to police, who attribute much of the bloodshed to fighting among rival New Orleans gang members.

"New Orleans allowed a lot of these guys to stay on the street for whatever reason or be picked up and released after 60 days," said Capt. Dale Brown, who oversees Houston's homicide division. "Texas law, I don't want to say it's tougher, but we take these offenses very seriously."

Judge Robert Eckels, chief executive of Harris County, which includes Houston, said Katrina evacuees arrested in Houston have cost the county's criminal justice system more than \$18 million. In June, Texas Gov. Rick Perry sent \$19.5 million to Houston to help pay for additional officers and overtime to police the city after Katrina.

The police and the Harris County sheriff's department said they have no figures on how many Katrina evacuees have been arrested.

Houston police said misdemeanor and felony arrests overall actually dropped last fall from the same period a year earlier.

But the sheriff's department reported a 41 percent increase in felony arrests in November from the year before.

Katrina evacuees received fair warning when they arrived in Houston. Days after the storm, Mayor Bill White went on television, flanked by Houston police, and welcomed Katrina's bedraggled survivors with a stern warning that a jail cell was waiting for anyone who crossed the line.

Hoover Center Reopens After Explosives Scare


BOULDER CITY, NEV. | The Hoover Dam visitor center reopened Monday while authorities continued investigating the weekend discovery of an explosive blasting cap in a construction tunnel.

Bob Walsh, spokesman for the federal Bureau of Reclamation, which operates the dam, said a fire department bomb squad was called about 1 p.m. Sunday after the blasting cap was found.

"Nobody hurt, nobody panicked," Walsh said. The visitor center was closed as a precaution, and authorities said there was no indication of terrorism.

Officials removed the explosive from the tunnel in a canyon wall and detonated it away from the dam.

The Bureau of Reclamation estimates that close to 1 million visitors a year tour the dam on the Colorado River, 30 miles (50 kilometers) southeast of Las Vegas, and millions more drive across it. (AP)

Army Recalling 300 Troops to Iraq

Pentagon: Extended Alaska unit had just returned home to U.S.

WASHINGTON | About 300 Alaskabased soldiers sent home from Iraq just before their unit's deployment was extended last month must now go back, the Army said Monday, setting up a wrenching departure for troops and families who thought their service there was finished.

The soldiers — all from the 172nd Stryker Brigade — are among the 380 troops who had gotten home to Fort Wainwright when Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld ordered the unit to serve four more months. The remaining 80 will not have to return to Iraq.

Army officials have sent a team of personnel and pay experts to Alaska to help sort out all of the soldiers' vacations, school enrollments and other plans torn apart by the decision to return them to Iraq. The unit is now being stationed in Baghdad.

Lt. Col. Wayne Shanks, a service

spokesman, said the Army fully realizes the hardships triggered by the move and is "bending over backward to accommodate" the families.

The bulk of the 172nd Brigade was still in Iraq when Rumsfeld

extended its deployment as part of a plan to quell the escalating violence in Baghdad. Overall, the brigade has about 3,900 troops.

Another 300 soldiers from the unit had left Iraq and gotten to

Kuwait, and were about to board flights home when they were called back.

Before Monday's announcement, the troops who had already returned home to Alaska had been told that decisions on their fates would be made on a case-by-case basis.

Army officials said they don't recall another time during the three-year-long Iraq war when the Pentagon so quickly recalled soldiers who had served a year on the battle-front and gotten home.

Other units have had their deployments extended anywhere from a week or two to a few months.

The 300 soldiers recalled from Alaska on Monday got to spend between three and five weeks at home, and will head back to Iraq in the next two weeks. Most of the brigade is expected to leave Iraq by the end of the year, although Army spokesman Paul Boyce said Monday there are no assurances the unit's stay will not be extended again. A second extension, however, would be very rare. Lolita C. Baldor (AP)

White House: Lesser Bird Flu Found in U.S.

WASHINGTON | Scientists have discovered possible bird flu in two wild swans on the shore of Lake Erie — but it does not appear to be the much-feared Asian strain that has ravaged poultry and killed at least 138 people elsewhere in the world

It will take up to two weeks to confirm whether the seemingly healthy wild mute swans in Michigan really harbored the H5N1 virus.

On Monday, the Agriculture Department declared that initial testing had ruled out the so-called highly pathogenic version of H5N1 — but that they could have a relatively harmless, low-grade H5N1 strain instead.

That's the suspicion, making Monday's announcement almost a practice run for the day the more worrisome Asian strain actually arrives. Were the highly pathogenic H5N1 to be found in any wild birds here, that could trigger additional security steps. (AP)

Cuban TV Airs New Video of Castro Talking With Chavez

Cuban state television on Monday aired the first video of Fidel Castro since he stepped down as president to recover from surgery, showing the Cuban leader joking with both his brother and Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez. Castro appeared tired and pale, yet alert in the videotaped encounter, speaking quietly but clearly enjoying himself as he chatted with Chavez, his close friend and political ally. Acting President Raul Castro was also present for the encounter on Sunday, his brother's 80th birthday. (AP)

Fighting Among Government Forces, Tamils Kills Dozens

Fighting between the government and Tamil insurgents and a suicide bombing killed dozens Monday, including youths at what the rebels said was a school and the government insisted was an insurgent base. The clashes and the blast in Colombo appeared to dash hopes for a quick end to fighting that has worsened over the past month, undermining an already shaky cease-fire. (AP)

A bus plunged over a cliff after its brakes failed and unsuccessfully trying to exit off an emergency ramp early Monday, killing 23 people and injuring more than 50, police said. (AP)

Lebanese Return to Scenes of Ruin

Weeks of fierce battles leave destructive aftermath for villagers

MARWAHEEN, LEBANON | Villagers began returning home Monday after Israel's 34-day onslaught that cut a jagged swath through southern Lebanon, leaving behind scenes of near-total destruction. In many border villages, gunmen emerged from collapsed buildings and hugged one another.

In Kafra, about six miles north of the frontier, two Hezbollah soldiers in fatigues and carrying rifles stood beneath a tree watching cars creep past bomb craters. The ceasefire was only hours old when residents in beat-up cars and pickup trucks, children packed into the back, came bouncing along the ruined roads.

Smoke still rose from several of the buildings in Kafra. Entire streets lay in ruin. Bombs had smashed storefronts and apartment buildings alike all along the southern border.

The Israeli force had gotten as far as high ground at Beit Yahoun, nine miles north of the frontier after punching past Hezbollah defenses at Bint Jbail in several days of some of the heaviest fighting in the war.

Bint Jbail was a deserted wasteland of smashed homes. Intermittent fighting had continued until shortly before the cease-fire took effect Monday. The road into the town from Tibnin, also hard hit, was littered with unexploded artillery shells and spent rockets.

One of the hardest-hit villages in the south was Aita al-Shaab, the scene of one of the fiercest battles. Nothing seemed undamaged.

Palestinian Gunmen Abduct Fox News Crew

GAZA CITY, GAZA STRIP | Masked Palestinian gunmen ambushed a car carrying a Fox News crew in Gaza City on Monday and kidnapped two of the journalists inside, according to witnesses and Fox.

We can confirm that two of our people were taken against their will in Gaza," Fox News said in a statement

A Fox employee in Gaza, who declined to give his name because he was not authorized to release information about the incident, said the two kidnapped people were reporter Steve Centanni, a U.S. citizen, and cameraman Olaf Wiig, who was from New Zealand.

The men were parked near the headquarters of the Palestinian security services when two trucks filled with masked gunmen pulled up and boxed them in, according to the employee.

Major militant groups in Gaza denied having any connection to the incident, and there was no immediate word of any demands made.

Security officials put police on alert and set up roadblocks to find the journalists, said Interior Ministry spokesman Khaled Abu Hilal. (AP)

Sharon's Health Said to Be Worse

JERUSALEM | Former Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, who has been in a coma for more than seven months, suffered a further deterioration in his health Monday, according to the hospital where he is being treated.

A new brain scan showed a worsening in his brain function, his urine output has decreased significantly and a chest scan showed that he had a new infection in his lungs, said Anat Doley, spokeswoman for the Chaim Sheba Medical Center.

Dolev wouldn't say whether Sharon's life was in danger, but said that doctors were treating him with broad-spectrum antibiotics and steroids.

Sharon, 78, has been in a coma since suffering a massive stroke Jan. 4. He underwent several extensive brain surgeries to stop cerebral hemorrhaging, in addition to other, more minor procedures. (AP)

Taking a New Tact In the AIDS Fight

Gates ready to focus efforts on drugs to prevent HIV infection

TORONTO | The double Bills of the global fight against AIDS — Microsoft founder Gates and former President Clinton — opened an international conference on the deadly disease Monday by challenging governments to confront the virus and help end the stigma plaguing women.

In a roundtable discussion, the two said they have devoted so much time to AIDS, which has claimed more than 25 million lives, because they believe the disease is one of the greatest heartaches of their generation.

More than 24,000 researchers, activists and health workers from 132 countries are attending the five-day summit. This year marks the 25th anniversary of the first

reported cases of human immunodeficiency virus, or HIV. Since the beginning of the pandemic, nearly 65 million people have been infected with HIV globally.

Gates noted that between 2003 and 2005, the number of people in low- and middle-income countries on antiretroviral drugs increased by 450,000 each year. Yet over the same period, the number of people who became infected with HIV averaged more than 4 million a year

He said the development of a vaccine and drugs to prevent HIV infection, such as microbicides that would empower women in developing countries, were now his priorities.

"If we had a tool for women to use, like microbicides, I think that would change the course of this disease and we would finally start to have years where you would see less infection," Gates said. (AP)

Koizumi Visits Disputed War Shrine

TOKYO | Japanese Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi prayed at the Yasukuni war shrine Tuesday to mark Tokyo's World War II surrender, defying strident protests by China and South Korea but cheering his conservative followers.

It was Koizumi's sixth visit to the shrine since taking office in 2001, but his first on the highly symbolic Aug. 15 anniversary of Japan's 1945 defeat. He is the first prime minister to make such a visit since 1985.

The shrine visits have been a lightening rod for critics who accuse Japan of failing to properly atone for its military invasions in the 1930s and '40s. The shrine honors convicted war criminals among Japan's 2.5 million war dead. (AP)

Britain Lowers Terror Threat Level

Air passengers will be allowed to bring more items as carryons

LONDON | Britain lowered its terrorist threat level a notch Monday, a relief for weary travelers who have endured days of chaos at the nation's main airports since security forces foiled an alleged plot to blow passenger planes out of the sky.

Attention, meanwhile, began turning to the role a radical Pakistani charity might have played in financing the terror scheme, allegedly with money that was meant to go to earthquake relief.

Additionally, a court in London granted the government more time to interrogate the last of 23 people it is holding in connection with the plot.

The decision to drop the terror threat level to "severe" — where it was before the alleged jetliner scheme was thwarted — means passengers will be allowed a single, briefcase-sized bag aboard aircraft, and books, laptop computers and digital music players will also be permitted again.

The British Airports Association said it was searching only half of the passengers at Heathrow airport, greatly speeding up the flow.

Home Secretary John Reid cautioned that the easing of security measures and the lowering of the terror threat level did not mean that Britain was out of danger.

"I want to stress ... that the change in the threat level does not mean that the threat has gone away," he said at an early morning news conference. (AP)

Iraqis, U.S. at Odds Over String Of Deadly Blasts

BAGHDAD, IRAQ | A deadly series of explosions in a Shiite neighborhood of Baghdad triggered a new battle Monday — between the U.S. military and the Iraqis over what caused the blasts.

A U.S. military spokesman blamed the Sunday evening explosions in Zafraniyah on a gas line explosion that he said triggered secondary blasts and devastated the working-class district.

But Iraqi police and Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki said the neighborhood was hit by car bombs and a rocket barrage.

U.S. teams went to Zafraniyah and found "no evidence" of anything other than a "significant gas explosion," U.S. military spokesman Maj. Gen. William Caldwell said. (AP)

PepsiCo Names **New Female CEO**

Nooyi will rank No. 2 among women execs in the Fortune 500

NEW YORK | The exclusive club of women running the nation's largest public companies grew by one

PepsiCo Inc., maker of Pepsi, Gatorade and Frito-Lay snacks, named Indra K. Noovi as chief executive officer, making her No. 2 among female CEOs at firms in the Fortune 500, which are ranked in size by revenue. She takes over Oct 1

Nooyi — who was born in India and earned an undergraduate degree and a master's degree there – has been called "a true internationalist." She started her career in India, including a post at Johnson & Johnson, and later moved on to jobs at the Boston Consulting Group and Motorola Inc. She also earned a master's degree in public and private management from Yale University.

Nooyi, 50, replaces Steven Reinemund and boosts the ranks of women at the top of large companies to 11. Reinemund said in a statement that he is retiring to spend more time with his family.

Patricia Woertz at agricultural processor Archer Daniels Midland Co. ranks first among female CEOs of Fortune 500 companies, where ADM is positioned 56th. PepsiCo, the world's second-largest soft-

> drink company after Coca-Cola Co., is 61st.

"I'm very excited and at the same time very humbled," Nooyi told analysts during a conference

call on Monday.

The announcement of Noovi's promotion comes while PepsiCo faces allegations that beverages being sold in her home country contain high levels of pesticides. Within the past week, at least five Indian states have banned the sale of Pepsi and Coca-Cola products at schools and government offices.

PepsiCo and Coca-Cola have maintained that their drinks are safe. Between them, the two companies account for nearly 80 percent of India's \$2 billion-plus softdrinks market. Vinnee tong (AP)

HSN Testing Unprecedented Shop-by-Remote Service

The Home Shopping Network is offering another way for shoppers to buy their goods: using their remote control pad to buy such merchandise as clothing and jewelry on TV. It is the first service of its kind being offered in the U.S. The new shopby-remote interactive TV service quietly began testing in Hawaii at the beginning of the year, while service in parts of the New York market started being tested a few months ago. Fairfax Victims to Get Criminal Info

System expanded to release information about offenders' status

FAIRFAX, VA. | A program designed to help crime victims know when their perpetrators are released from state prisons is expanding to include city and regional jails.

The program, Victim Information and Notification Everyday, or VINE, gathers data on prisoner transfers, bond hearings and releases. Computer technology scans prison rolls and transmits a snapshot of the population to a database every 15 minutes, Gov. Timothy Kaine said Monday.

"Each institution agrees to have a record of who's there, available every two hours," said Kaine, adding that the system will take about two years to expand to 73 city and regional jails.

Victims will be able to call a toll-free number to find out whether an offender is in jail or register by phone to be notified when an offender is released or transferred, or escapes, officials said. Kaine said victims also can receive e-mails.

About 24,000 people have signed up since 2000, when, Kaine said, the program was implemented on a limited basis in state prisons. Before

then, Kaine said, victims had to go a lengthy route that involved contacting several jails and prisons — often ending up with old information or none at all.

A \$1.25 million federal grant will help expand the program, said John Jones, executive director of the

Virginia Sheriff's Association, which is organizing the expansion.

The grant will cover the entire phase-in. The system will cost the state about \$600,000 a year thereafter.

"It's going be helpful, because victims will have access to realtime information when the person who committed a crime against them is released," Jones said. "They may need to take action to protect themselves."

The initiative was announced at the Fairfax County jail complex. (AP)

Beltway Briefly Shut Down Following Truck Sludge Spill

The inner loop of the Capital Beltway at the Wilson Bridge reopened Monday after crews finished cleaning up sludge from an overturned truck. State Highway Administration spokesman Chuck Gischlar said all three lanes were reopened about 5:45 p.m., three hours after the truck spilled debris along the road. The spill snarled southbound traffic during the afternoon rush. County fire department spokesman Mark Brady said the truck driver received injuries that were not life-threatening. (AP)

Poll: D.C. Council Chair Vote May Split Along Racial Lines

When voters choose the next D.C. Council chairman, the decision may come down to a sharp racial divide. Three-term representative Kathy Patterson, of predominantly white Ward 3, is running against first-term representative Vincent Gray, of predominantly black Northeast and Southeast neighborhoods in Ward 7. A Washington Post poll finds Patterson, who is white, is favored by most white residents, and Gray, who is black, is favored by most black residents. (AP)

Ex-Md. Gov. Gives Perez His Support

ANNAPOLIS, MD. | Former Gov. Harry Hughes endorsed Tom Perez for attorney general on Monday, saying Perez would do the best job of the three Democratic candidates to improve water quality in the Chesapeake Bay and protect the environment.

"It's getting more difficult all the time to protect this great body of

water behind us, the Chesapeake Bay," Hughes said on the Annapolis City Dock.

Hughes is considered a leading environmentalist. While governor, he helped form the Chesapeake Bay partnership among Maryland, Virginia, Pennsylvania, the District of Columbia and the federal government. (AP)

Signals of a New Era

As technology grows, so must the town on HBO's 'Deadwood'


SHINY NEW TOYS | "We're in the presence of the new," the menacingly eloquent Al Swearengen of "Deadwood" says. He is talking about the interloper George Hearst, but he might as well be referring to just about everything around him.

From its first episode, the "Deadwood" universe has been obsessed with the new — the bumpiness of innovation and its uneasy relationship with old ways. In short, it mimics America, land of neverending novelty.

Now, as David Milch's HBO series winds toward its unsettling end this month, it seems that the show is largely about the rise of an overwhelming media society.

A.W. Merrick, the editor of the Deadwood Pioneer, is portrayed by Jeffrey Jones as an insider's outsider, grappling with the notion that there are quicker, sexier ways to obtain information than his extremely local newspaper. Far more in step is someone like Charlie Utter (Dayton Callie), whose shipping business is riding the wave of the future.

Swearengen (Ian McShane), meanwhile, watches from the balcony of his Gem Saloon as new tele-

graph-related contraptions rise. "Messages from invisible sources," he spits. This theme became more pronounced with the arrival of fresh

stagecoaches, each containing a new metaphor for the outside world.

On one coach arrives a "velocipede," a precursor to the bicycle the debut of modern consumer invention in Deadwood. Its owner, barkeeper Tom Nuttall, rides it to initial success until a follow-up ride plays a role in the death of Sheriff Seth Bullock's young stepson.

On another coach arrives Jack Langrishe (Brian Cox), an actor in a troupe from back East that wants to establish a theater in town. "The place," Langrishe deadpans, "is yearning for elevation."

Each of these is an expression of the fears that mass communication produced in Deadwood in the 1870s and, not coincidentally, is producing in America in the 2000s.

"The introduction of a new communication technology disrupting established communications networks ... presages what we see today with digital media, wireless networks and the Internet," Shawn McIntosh writes in the upcoming book "Reading Deadwood: A Western to Swear By."

Can it be coincidence that the ultimate force of evil in "Deadwood" is Hearst, patriarch of a clan synonymous with what many consider the birth of Information Age tyranny?

Best of all, ballads like "I Came Here to Live" and "Words Get in the Way," with their moral dilemmas and sensitive portrayals of love, prove that Adkins can offer depth and variety beyond novelty dance hits.

Adkins has the nation's attention now: he should use it to show how broad his talent can be, rather than act like he's little more than a swaggering party animal. MICHAEL MCCALL (AP)

Coping With the End

A man faces finality in Francois Ozon's film 'Time to Leave'

LAST DAYS | Filmmaker François Ozon has largely focused on stories about women, from the psychological drama "Under the Sand" to the all-star musical whodunit "Eight Women" to the erotic thriller "Swimming Pool."

With "Time to Leave," the 38vear-old French auteur delivers a heartfelt drama as told from a man's perspective.

The film stars Melvil Poupaud as Romain, a successful and attractive gay photographer who is diagnosed with terminal cancer. With

only a few months to live, Romain copes with the prognosis by pushing away those closest to him. He confides his secret only to this bohemian grandmother (Jeanne Moreau), with whom he shares a special bond. On the way to visit her, Romain meets a waitress who makes a startling proposition, which eventually helps him come to terms with his fate.

What made you decide to tackle this subject matter?

It came out of my experience on 'Under the Sand" ... which was about coping with the death of someone vou love. At the time, I said to myself, it will be interesting to make a film in a certain way about

my own death, to imagine if it is possible to accept when you're young and know you're going to die.

Did it take long to write?

Actually, I wrote it very quickly because I did some medical tests

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and during the waiting I was so afraid, like anybody who has ever waited for their results.

Was it a deliberate decision to make Romain's terminal illness cancer rather than AIDS?

Yes It also was a way for me to lose this cliche between AIDS and gay people. I wanted to say you could be gay and die of something else.

Is Romain's shaving his head a symbolic act?

It originally wasn't in the script, but I realized to express the will to be naked, to lose all the superficial things of life like losing one's hair, that could be a strong image. It's like shedding your skin.

Do you consider the film cathartic?

I think so. For me, all my films are a kind of therapy. It's a way to speak about things that you're afraid to speak of in real life. ANGELA DAWSON (ENTERTAINMENT NEWS WIRE)

Reality bites back for staffers on strike against 'Top Model'

STRIFE | A dozen striking TV workers are demanding their bosses face

The "America's Next Top Model" employees contend that their tasks on the series should be classified as writing and earn them the union pay and benefits they're not getting.

The strike against "Top Model," which airs now on UPN, is also the latest and most aggressive move in the Writers Guild of America, West's two-year effort to unionize reality TV.

Sara Sluke and Kai Bowe, who have been picketing since walking out more than two weeks ago, say their challenge is to avoid casting doubt on reality TV's legitimacy.

The striking staffers — whose job titles are show producer or associate

Bowe and Slike claim that makes them eligible for WGA representation and benefits.



Portis Out for the Rest of Preseason

Gibbs hopes star back will be ready for next month's season opener

REDSKINS | Washington running back Clinton Portis is out for the remainder of the preseason and his status for the Redskins' opener was uncertain Monday, one day after he partially dislocated his shoulder in an exhibition game.

Portis flew to Alabama for another MRI and further examination on the right shoulder, which he injured while tackling receiver Keiwan Ratliff following an interception in the first quarter of Sunday night's 19-3 loss to the Cincinnati Bengals.

Coach Joe Gibbs said Portis' shoulder was sore and that the back, who ran for a club-record 1,516 yards last season, would begin rehabilitation once the soreness has abated. The coach essentially ruled out the possibility of Portis playing again in the preseason and instead focused on the Sept. 11 game against Minnesota.

"We would hope that he would be ready for the opener," Gibbs said.

Gibbs also defended the use of Portis and his starters against the

"He's a complete player, obviously a guy we feel comfortable with," coach Brian Billick said.

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


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

No Place Like Home, but D.C. Will Do

Soriano, a Dominican native, has adjusted to new life in Washington

NATIONALS | The hot summer days at RFK make the Washington Nationals' star outfielder Alfonso Soriano and his fellow Dominican teammates feel like they are back home.

As has become the trend with most major league clubs, the Dominican Republic is the most well-represented foreign nation on the Nationals' roster this year. Soriano, along with infield-

ers Bernie Castro and Cristian Guzman, outfielders Tony Blanco and Jose Guillen, and pitchers Ramon Ortiz, Felix Rodriguez and Pedro Astacio all hail from the tiny Caribbean nation.


Without a large Dominican cultural base to rely on, Soriano and his teammates look to their friends and family to provide the comforts of their home island.

"I've got something real special," Ortiz said. "I've got my wife cooking great food and everything I want. Rice, beans and chicken in salsa, it's the best." For Soriano, the lack of a large Dominican population in D.C. doesn't make a difference, either.

"It's different than New York, but I like it here the same. It's great. There are no [Dominican] restaurants, but there don't need to be any. I find Dominican culture within my own house. We cook and live among ourselves, and that's all I need."

As the Nationals look to re-sign Soriano in the coming months, at least they won't have to worry about him being unhappy living in Washington.

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

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

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

Pluto's status is in jeopardy as scientists meet to define planets

Our solar system is suffering an identity crisis.

For decades, it has consisted of nine planets, even as scientists debated whether Pluto really belonged. Then the recent discovery of an object larger and farther away than Pluto threatened to throw this slice of the cosmos into chaos.

Should this newly found icy rock known as "2003 UB313" become the 10th planet? Should Pluto be demoted? And what exactly is a planet, anyway?

Ancient cultures regularly revised their answer to the last question and present-day scientists aren't much better off: There still is no universal definition of "planet."

That all could soon change, and with it science textbooks around this planet.

At a 12-day conference beginning Monday, scientists will conduct a galactic census of sorts. Among the possibilities at the meeting of the International Astronomical Union in the Czech Republic capital of Prague:

subtract Pluto or christen one more planet, and possibly dozens more.

"It's time we have a definition," said Alan Stern, who heads the Colorado-based space science division of the Southwest Research Institute of San Antonio.

The debate intensified last summer when astronomer Michael Brown of the California Institute of Technology announced the discovery of a celestial object larger than Pluto. Like Pluto, it is a member of the Kuiper Belt, a mysterious disc-shaped zone beyond Neptune containing thousands of comets and planetary objects. (Brown nicknamed his find "Xena" after the TV warrior princess; pending a formal name, it remains 2003 UB313.)


The Hubble Space Telescope measured the bright, rocky object at about 1,490 miles in diameter, roughly 70 miles longer than Pluto. At 9 billion miles from the sun, it is the farthest known object in the solar system. The discovery stoked the planet debate that had been simmering since Pluto was spotted in 1930.

Some argue that if Pluto kept its crown, Xena should be the 10th planet by default — it is, after all, bigger. Purists maintain that there are only eight traditional planets, and insist Pluto and Xena are poseurs.

Still others suggest a compromise that would divide planets into categories based on composition, similar to the way stars and galaxies are classified. Jupiter could be labeled a "gas giant planet," while Pluto and Xena could be "ice dwarf planets."

"Pluto is not worthy of being called just a plain planet," said Alan Boss, an astrophysicist at the Carnegie Institution in Washington, D.C. "But it's perfectly fine as an ice dwarf planet or a historical planet." Despite the lack of scientific consensus on what makes a planet, the current nine — and Xena — share common traits: They orbit the sun. Gravity is responsible for their round shape. And they were not formed by the same process that created stars.

Brown, Xena's discoverer, admits to being "agnostic" about what the international conference decides. He said he could live with eight planets, but is against sticking with the status quo and would feel a little guilty if Xena gained planethood because of the controversy surrounding Pluto.

"If UB313 is declared to be the 10th planet, I will always feel like it was a little bit of a fraud," Brown said. Alicia Chang (AP)

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

Cambodia turns the sites of atrocities into tourist attractions

Call it crass, macabre or educational, but Pol Pot's shabby grave and a towering stack of his victims' skulls are drawing a growing number of visitors to Cambodia's genocide trail.

These and other relics of the Khmer Rouge reign of terror are the grim counterpoint to Angkor Wat, Cambodia's world-famous ancient temple. Some decry it as "dark tourism" and "a Khmer Rouge theme park," while officials and private entrepreneurs argue that it will reap tourist dollars for an impoverished nation.

The latest station on the circuit is Anlong Veng, the final stronghold of the Khmer Rouge and its leader, Pol Pot, who turned the country into a vast slave labor camp in which as many as 2 million of their fellow Cambodians perished from Cambodia is

known to the world for two things -Angkor Wat and the 'killing fields."

disease, starvation and relentless executions in the mid-1970s.

"Cambodia is known to the world for two things - Angkor Wat and the 'killing fields.' Some believe one came from God and the other from hell." says Youk Chhang, a leading researcher of Khmer Rouge atrocities.

This scruffy town in northwest Cambodia once housed one of the 20th century's largest assemblages of mass killers. Now, following up on a government order to preserve Khmer Rouge sites, officials are planning to restore nearly 40 houses of former Khmer Rouge leaders and build a museum where the guides are ex-soldiers of the ultra-commu-

nist movement. Bulldozers are laying the foundations for a South Koreanbuilt resort with swimming pool. And just down the road, a casino and massive market will cater to visitors from neighboring Thailand.

Chhang, who heads The Documentation Center of Cambodia, is concerned that sites such as Anlong Veng will lose their raw, powerful authenticity. "We don't want them turned into Disneylands," he says.

A private Japanese enterprise, JC Royal Co., last year won the concession to develop Choeung Ek, the vast killing ground, into a more touristfriendly place, while the World Bank is completing a wide, paved road to speed tourist buses to the site.

Tuol Sleng and Choeung Ek are on the itineraries of almost every tour company and are expected to be visited by many of the 1.6 million foreign tourists expected in Cambodia this year.

Roberto Rossano, a 22-year-old Londoner, said he knew little about the Khmer Rouge nightmare until he visited Choeung Ek. "When somebody tells you one or two million were killed, it's just a number, but when I came and saw just a fraction of what they did — these skulls — it absolutely shocks you," he said.

Ta Mok, a brutal military commander, lived here until his death last month. Although he was to have stood trial for atrocities, he was a hero in Anlong Veng, and people point out his humanitarian legacy — schools, clinics, a dam, a sawmill that provided free wood to the poor.


The commander, dubbed "the Butcher," was seen off by hundreds of mourners and chanting Buddhist monks, and his ashes were placed in a tomb in a temple — the newest addition to Cambodia's genocide trail. DENIS D. GRAY (AP)



Security Checks

MIKE BROOKS, independent security consultant and former member of the FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force, was online Monday at washingtonpost.com to discuss heightened travel security.

I am confused — is the ban on all liquids or carryon items in general? I've seen news footage of people not being allowed to carry on even a purse. What does this have to do with liquids/gels?

You can still have carryons here in the U.S. You can check liquids and gels in your checked luggage and have them sent to your city of arrival but you will not be permitted liquids and gels except for the small doses of liquid medication, the low blood-sugar treatments and baby food, and now solid lipstick.

If this sort of threat has been known prior to this latest headline, why is it that the U.S. has to scramble to get procedures in place? Shouldn't all types of scenarios be examined so implementation of new securi-

ty procedures and protocol go more smoothly?

Procedures and technology are intelligence- and scenario-driven, especially in the aviation industry. The last time we saw liquids as a threat was the mid-'90s. Since then, we really have not seen liquids as a major threat to any transportation sector. They have been working on technology to detect liquid explosives, but nothing is on the market as of yet.

Although passengers are screened very closely, people who work at airports go in and out of controlled areas unchecked. What is being done to prevent an airport worker from committing an attack?

Here in the U.S., I've always thought that this was one of the vulnerabilities that I've always addressed. Airport workers go through a thorough background check and fingerprint check for certain serious felonies and certain misdemeanor offenses, but if they have never been arrested before and have not been the target of any investigations, they will pass the background check. It's an issue that the TSA needs to reevaluate.

Don't Let Me Hear Your Body Talk, Please!

My friend is constantly talking negatively about her weight. She is significantly thinner than I am, so this gets old, and I wonder about her motives. She has always fished for compliments. I want to know how I can stop this. - VERY ANNOYED IN DC

The in-the-moment response: "I'm not sure how you want me to respond when you berate yourself, but it's hard for me to hear." The spewing lava response: "Are you aware of how your comments are coming across? You may be trying to put yourself down, but you're putting me down in the process." The contemplative, helpful friend response: "Hey, can we talk? You've been speaking so



negatively about yourself. It makes me uncomfortable, but more importantly, it worries me that you feel that

way." It's your choice which hat to wear, but you can figure out which one is best for the friendship.

My stepsister has her father wrapped around her little finger, which didn't used to bother me, but lately my mother (who I've had a good relationship with) has become entangled in her web of lies. She's dropped out of college but gets full financial support from them, and her only job (I believe) is dealing drugs. My stepsister and I have fought in the past, so I doubt my mother would hear me out without thinking it has to do with our history. But I am so tired of her taking advantage of them. - NO NAME PLEASE

Like a person facing a fridge of cheesecake samples, you must prioritize and decide what you really want most. MOST CALCULATORS help brains atrophy. But the Sharp EL-T100B Brain Exerciser (\$13), inspired by the research also behind the Nintendo DS game "Brain Age," makes you do the number crunching. The idea is that brains can be kept healthy in part through regular exercise, just like muscles.

The Sharp performs simple math drills - addition and subtraction of numbers less than 20, and multiplication of singledigit numbers. It lacks competitive thrills: You won't find out how you compare with others, or even see what you missed. And brains need exercise besides math (like reading, doing crosswords). But long-lost math skills, such as the times-nine multiplication table, came crawling back. With several more days of practice, calculating 15 minus 8 without mental fingercounting may even be achieved. And even if that doesn't stave off dementia 50 years hence, it'll help when the restaurant bill arrives. HOLLY J. MORRIS (EXPRESS)


Stop! Or My Bag Will Glow!

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Push It Good

I try to do push-ups every day, but no matter how consistent I've been, I don't feel stronger and I can't do any more.
What's wrong?

It could be any number of things from poor diet to overtraining, but assuming those are not the issue, take a look at how you do your push-ups. Instead of working toward an increase in quantity, focus your efforts on the quality of your push-up.

Analyze your position in the mirror. Your hands should be spaced just outside the shoulders and in line with your chest. Your body should be straight from your feet to your head, with a slight curve to your lower back creating a neutral spine. If you cannot do a push-up in this position, start on your knees and hold the pushup position. Pinch your shoulder blades together and then separate them. This will activate the rhomboids and mid-trapezius, which will teach your body how to have control over your upper back musculature. Once you've mastered that, do a push-up on your knees. Then progress to a push-up on your feet with a straight body. This exercise involves an exact position to be effective, and once vou've become a push-up pro vour strength will improve.

30-Minute Body

How fast can you get an all-around workout?

A perky voice broke into the music to shout, "Change stations!" and 47-year-old Leslie Jackson grabbed a pair of dumbbells to start pumping her biceps.

After all, she had to make her remaining 24 minutes at Silver Spring's Contours Express count. "I've got to get in and out quickly," she panted. And by keeping her heart racing while leaping between machines, she figures she's packing a lot into the half an hour she can devote to exercise. "I'll tell you this: When I don't come, I can feel the difference," she said.

According to official guidelines, though, it's not enough. The food pyr-

amid unveiled last year said adults should engage in at least 60 minutes of moderate-to-vigorous physical activity every day to maintain a healthy weight — and add an extra 30 if they want to shed pounds. But many fitness professionals are lashing out at that notion in the form of circuit-training gyms, quickie classes at health clubs and a flood of DVDs promising results in the time it takes to nuke a Lean Cuisine meal.

The most ubiquitous speedy sweat evangelist is Curves, the all-female gym franchise that has lured many women who would have otherwise avoided the gym altogether. Their tricks: a quick, 30-minute circuit and nonthreatening hydraulic exercise machines that don't require the user to deal with weights. "The harder and faster you push, the harder they are to push," explained spokeswoman Barbara Frusher.

It's a perfect introduction to strength training, noted Gregory Florez, CEO of FitAdvisor.com. "The only downside is that it doesn't promote progress," he said. "Unless someone shakes you up, you're destined to do the same workout forever." That's why Contours Express and other competitors stock traditional weight machines, so people who are plateauing can make sure they're kicking it up a notch.

To make the most of a squeezed schedule, Florez advocates a work-

out comprised entirely of compound movements, like squats with overthe-shoulder presses and other exercises working two muscle groups simultaneously, done at a fast pace to produce a cardio effect.

Fast-forwarding can work with other exercises, too. Steven McClure, who teaches Pilates Express at downtown's Fitness First, jumps right into a brisk litany of core strengthening exercises. "In a classical session,

you do one move right after another. It's not a slow, gentle thing," said McClure.

Fitness First offers a ton of similar "express" classes to appeal to the time-crunched crowd. They may not pack the wallop of an hour of exercise, but regular visits will likely have an impact, especially if it means people can actually go. Kimberly Spreen, the National Group Fitness Director for Life Time Fitness and the host of the DVD, "10 Minute Solution: Fitness Ball Workouts," predicts all health clubs are going to start focusing more on fusion workouts that provide "all the bang you can get" in the shortest possible time.


As for her DVD, she said that while 10 minutes of exercise a day isn't enough to stay healthy, someone who uses free time wisely can get a benefit. If done at the same intensity, three 10-minute sessions have the same effect as one continuous half-hour. "Every bit helps. Park further away, take the stairs and try to strategically place activity throughout your day," she said. Maybe you'll get to 90 minutes without even realizing it. VICKY HALLETT (EXPRESS)

Accessing Bollywood

Learn the moves behind the hottest Indian dance techniques

You're at a club, ready to bust a move. But then, in the middle of a hip-hop song, the DJ tosses in some bhangra beats, and you don't know how to dance authentically. You could use some help from the Rhythmaya School of Dance.

WHAT IT IS: Founded in 2005, Rhythmaya encompasses a professional dance troupe, kiddie instruction and adult classes. The grown-up sessions, lessons in either Bollywood or bhangra styles, are drawing a crew of all ages and ethnicities that wants to sample the latest dance crazes.

MOVES: The two forms of dance are very different. Bollywood fuses classical Indian dance with hip-hop, salsa, jazz and more; bhangra evolved from a Punjabi folk dance into a super high-energy style popular at dance clubs. Bollywood steps are complex — hand movements, head turns and expressions are all as critical as what the feet are

up to (and make sure your body is always artfully tilted to the side). In bhangra, it's not the moves that are tricky, but the speed and repetition. Try jumping in and out of a circle

while repeatedly clapping and throwing your arm over your head for a few minutes and you'll get the idea.

LINGO: The teachers usually describe the steps rather than name them, and they try

to use terms that dancers will be familiar with, like "jazz hands." But with Bollywood, the hand positions are called mudras, and some of them have names that are useful to know. "Katakamukha" is kind of like making a bunny shadow puppet; "alapadma" requires you to face your palm up with your fingers pointing in a circle so it resembles a lotus blossom.

WORKOUT: An hour of dance class is usually a respectable way to burn some calories, but with all the stopping and blocking of choreography, it's no 5K run. The Bollywood class

follows that model. Bhangra, on the other hand, can kick students' butts. "Every single muscle in your body is tensed in every step," explained teacher Mili Mittal. "I'm always incredibly sore the next day," agreed Sonja Uwimana, 25, who's taken both classes since June. Your shoulders are always bouncing up and down in bhangra, so prepare to feel the burn there.

CROWD: If you haven't heard of Shahrukh Khan, don't worry. No background is necessary, and even South Asians in the classes often have never had any instruction. It's mostly ladies (and a few guys) who are just curious about the style. There's a quick camaraderie among the students, especially when the teacher recommends everyone practice their bhangra moves in a 10-minute-long freestyle session.

GARB: Loose, flowing garments are best for moving. Most of the class goes barefoot, but if you have sensitive tootsies, sneakers will do. VICKY HALLETT (EXPRESS)

- → Don't give unsolicited advice. It may be obvious to you that doing bench presses with the barbell clenched in your teeth is a bad idea. But if someone's doing it, he has his reasons. Leave it to the trainer on duty to correct bad form.
- → Don't try to strike up a conversation with someone who's lifting. Put yourself in this scenario: you're struggling through your 15th overhead press with 235.7 pounds on the bar, and some twerp asks

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Maybe Harry Potter Needs Some Sex Ed

■ If you go outside in the rain and wait to open your umbrella, you'll get wet. Perhaps that's how we can explain proper condom use to British teens. In a survey of 1,400 U.K. teens, two-thirds reported using condoms during their last sexual encounter — but six percent put on the condom after penetration and another six percent carried on with penetration after removing the condom. Teens with close relationships with their mums were most likely to use their prophylactics correctly.



That's the Joint, That's the Jam

■ Don't bother weighing your treatment options for tennis elbow. No matter whether you go for physical therapy or simply don a brace to deal with the condition that strikes between 1 and 3 percent of the population each year, the cost and results will be the same, according to a study performed by researchers at the Academic Medical Center in Amsterdam.

Cool It With All the Applesauce Already!

■ Who doesn't like a chubby baby? Researchers in Massachusetts, who found that 6 percent of babies 6 months and younger are overweight. (That's up from 3 percent in 1980.) Doctors are concerned because early weight gain can indicate a predilection for continued weight problems and a host of other medical concerns. One possible cause: moms who overeat during pregnancy.

The Mattress

Hotels have been working with mattress manufacturers to create the most comfortable sleep surface possible. Their beds feature more coils and cushioning than even high-end store models. And they're for sale. We tried five: the W Mattress, Westin's Heavenly Bed, Sheraton's Sweet Sleeper, the Four Seasons Signature Mattress and the Four Points Four Comfort Bed.

BEST IN CLASS: Thanks to a nearperfect balance of support and padding, the Four Comfort Bed (\$1,300, starwoodhotels.com) provides the ultimate slumber surface. The specially designed Sealy mattress sits atop a foundation made of heavy-gauge, high-carbon steel, which does a better job of absorbing weight and movement than a traditional box spring.

The Sheets

If you shop for sheets, you'll come across the term "thread count." This is marketing jargon for the number of threads woven into 1 square inch, the idea being that the higher the count, the softer the sheet. But pay attention to the fabric too. The rule: Go with natural fibers, such as



cotton, and avoid synthetics, which are less absorbent.

BEST IN CLASS: Make your bed with Garnet Hill Signature flannel sheets (\$135 for king size, garnethill.com). So soft! And while warm, they weren't oppressively so.

The Blanket

Our mission: Crawl under a variety of fabrics filled with a range of insulations and discover which comforter is king.

BEST IN CLASS: For that just-outof-the-womb feeling, you can't beat the Isotonic Indulgence down-alternative comforter (\$180, bedbathandbeyond.com). It's filled with hypoallergenic synFor safe sleep, get a pillow that keeps your neck aligned with your spine.

thetic-down fibers, which kept us warm but not baking the way goose down can.

The Pillow

For sound, safe sleep, you need a pillow that will keep your neck aligned

with your spine.

BEST IN CLASS: Lay your noggin on the Select Comfort's Grid-Zone pillow (\$90, www.select comfort.com). The egg-crate surface conformed perfectly to our tester's head and neck, dramatically reducing how much he tossed and turned. If you sleep on your back, though, the Grid-Zone might be too thick. Try the TempurPedic Classic (\$100, tempurpedic.com); it's a bit thinner but still supportive.

The Sleeping Pill

Popping a supermarket sleeping pill is a lot like whacking your head with a mallet: Both strategies will send you into la-la land, but it won't be a restful trip. Talk to your doctor about a pharmaceutical fix.

BEST IN CLASS: Ask your M.D. about Lunesta, a sleep drug that was approved by the FDA in late 2004. Unlike its chemical cousins Sonata and Ambien, which tend to lose their potency toward morning, Lunesta is effective throughout the sleep cycle — without disrupting the critical deep stages. It put our guinea pig to sleep in record time, kept him there for eight hours, and left him feeling wide-eyed and alert the next day. 

Do your feet have high arches? Do you trip often and easily? Is it difficult to manipulate small objects, such as buttons or doorknobs? Have you ever cut or burned your hands or feet without noticing? You may have **CHARCOT-MARIE-TOOTH SYNDROME**, an inherited neurological disorder. The nerves governing the hands, arms, legs and feet of CMT patients gradually degenerate, causing muscle weakness and the loss of sensory perception. There's no cure, but physical therapy, braces and well-fitting shoes can help manage symptoms. So can a good pedicurist — because some CMT folks lack feeling in their toes, they shouldn't cut their own nails.

See Spot Run

Are there any overthe-counter products for blemishes that actually work?

If there were, would we need dermatologists? Actually, it depends on what type of spots you sport. Bethesda-based dermatologist David Green says there are two kinds of acne — non-inflamed, like whiteheads and blackheads, and inflamed, like the kind you wake up with and think, "Mount St. Zit is ready to explode on my chin!"

Green said for non-inflamed acne, look for products with salicylic acid; for inflamed, go for benzoyl peroxide. Brand doesn't matter.

Fort Washington dermatologist Robyn James says the new acne kits like those from L'oreal, and Neutrogena contain the same strength medication you'd receive if you got a chemical peel from an aesthetician. But for people with more severe acne, "because these are fairly new, the verdict is still out." Look for something that says dermatologist-tested, hypoallergenic and non-comedogenic.

Banish Bad Hair Days

Keep your locks looking lovely by avoiding these common blunders

You crunch, blow and curl it to make it look great, but all that handling could be sending your hair down the drain — literally.

Mistake: Overhandling

Giving your hair 100 strokes, teasing, or vigorous shampooing will eventually fray the cuticle, the outer layer of the hair shaft that protects the fragile inner filaments.

→ HAIR HELPER: Use the tips of your fingers to gently cleanse your scalp — no need to scrub. Dirt, oil and debris will float away as the lather passes over your hair. After you condition but before you rinse, detangle your hair in the shower with a wide-tooth comb. When hair is dry, brush just enough to style it.

Mistake: Overheating

When exposed to high heat, the cells of the hair's cuticle separate and break off, exposing the delicate filaments within. Hair loses its smoothness and luster, too, when the cuticle is damaged.



→ HAIR HELPER: Never blow-dry sopping-wet hair; it can't take the heat. After rinsing, squeeze hair gently with a towel. When blow-drying, direct medium heat airflow down the hair shaft in the direction that the cuticle's cells are layered; blowing hair in all directions adds to frizziness. African-American

women should not use curling or flat irons more than once a week, cautions Susan C. Taylor, MD.

Mistake: Overprocessing

Most dyes, perms and relaxing agents aren't dangerous unless left on too long or used too often.

→ HAIR HELPER: Don't perm more

frequently than every 120 days, and never perm and color on the same day — a few weeks in between is best. For African-American women, relaxers and other chemical processes may contribute to a kind of permanent hair loss called central centrifugal cicatricial alopecia (CCCA), although genetics also may be involved. Women with CCCA can either relax or color, but not both.

Mistake: Oversqueezing

The pressure of a rubber band around a ponytail can wear away the protective cuticle.

→ HAIR HELPER: Use only hairprotecting bands, such as Goody StayPut Hair Elastics (\$5; drugstores). If braids feel tight as they're being styled, ask the stylist to start over. Likewise, extensions and weaves shouldn't leave your scalp feeling tight, give you a headache, or cause inflammation. Clip-in extensions are best. ment is over, bags are gone, eyes look brighter and you can rush to work ready to face the day. One warning: Bring makeup and reserve a few minutes to re-prep.


EXPRESS FACIAL: There's a little bit of paradise on Pennsylvania

scrubbed but won't look irritated, and you're encouraged to steal a little more time in the steam room or sauna.


