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ACQUIRES PARK CITY STATIONS Katz Agency Forms Broadcast Group

The Katz Agency rep firm is forming a wholly-owned subsidiary, the Katz Broadcasting Group. The nucleus of the new group will be the four Park City Communications stations, WEZN-FM/Bridgeport, WAAF & WFTQ/Worcester, and WZZK-FM/Birmingham, which Katz has agreed in principle to purchase. Further, Katz has also announced plans to acquire KWEN-FM/Tulsa.

Park City President Dick Ferguson, who will become President of the Katz Broadcasting Group, said, "The opportunity to become part of the Katz organization is an exciting one for all of us at Park City Communications. Katz's financial strength and its commitment to the broadcast industry positions the station group for future growth."

James Greenwald, Katz President and CEO, commented, "This is a logical extension of the Katz Agency's continuing involvement in the broadcasting industry. Our investment in a strong management team and excellent properties indicates Katz's commitment to what we believe is a prosperous future ahead for broadcast stations.

Kenn Donnellon, Vice President/ Corporate Communications for Katz, echoed Greenwald, saying, "We have been looking for an opportunity to become owners of broadcast properties for a couple of years now. We had hoped to purchase WSIX-AM-FM/Nashville last year, but that fell through because the Cox/GE merger was not completed. Merging a broadcast group like Park City with strong young management is exactly the situation we have been looking



GM MCSORLEY JOINS KYUU

KQFM Switches From AOR To Oldies Format

Golden West's KQFM/Portland has changed formats to Oldies after three years as an AOR station. The new format (which debuted March 8) was described by GWB VP/FM Group Victor Ives as similar to the Oldies format devised at the company's WTWR/Detroit, but leaning closer to "pure gold." KQFM GM Jack McSorley announced he would be leaving the station April 1 to join KYUU/San Francisco as General Sales Manager.

Ives, who before his recent promotion to FM Group VP (R&R 2-20) was VP/GM at WTWR, explained to R&R, "We made a decision to drop our head-to-head confrontation with KGON. Although we were doing moderately well with the format, Jack McSorley and I, after surveying the market, decided to go after a more attractive demographic. There seems to be a somewhat diminishing interest in the 18-24 male, upon whom most of the AOR format relies. There are stations here playing oldies as part of their mixes, but we decided to go after the franchise."

Ives told R&R that PD Bob Brooks would stay on. Brooks said that about seven staffers had exited, including MD Cynde Slater. McSorley told R&R, "It wasn't a programming decision; it was a financial one. The problem was that in putting a quality product on the air, our overhead was going up disproportionately to our overall income. We finally found that if we did win the AOR battle in Portland, it would be a hollow victory." Commenting on his new position, McSorley said, "I enjoyed my 3½ years in Portland. It was a lot of hard work and I learned a lot about broadcasting. I worked with KSFO/San Francisco in sales for five years, and I consider this move going home."

REMAINS GROUP W VP

Faherty Resigns As WIND GM

Michael Faherty has resigned his position as General Manager of Group W's WIND/Chicago, but will continue as Radio Group VP in Chicago over the next several months while pursuing other interests, involving a greater concentration on broadcast operations. David Graves has been named acting GM for the Talk station; when a successor to Faherty is named, Graves will resume his position as Radio Group Director of Programming & Promotion based in New York.

Radio Group Sr. VP S. William Scott explained, "For some time, Mike Faherty has had as one of his personal goals a desire for greater involvement in the operation of broadcast properties. He has advised me of his interest in more actively pursuing this goal, and has resigned. We appreciate the many contributions Mike has made to WIND for the past year and a half."

Scott continued, "I am pleased to appoint Dave Graves Acting General Manager of the station. He is well acquainted with the staff and the format of the station, since he had served as WIND's Program Manager." Graves held that position in 1978-79, following a term as Program Manager at Group W's KDKA/Pittsburgh and several positions at the company's WBZ/Boston.

Harry O Named WZAK PD sn

Harry O has been appointed Program Director at WZAK/Cleveland in the wake of the station's recent switch from foreign language programming to TM's Jack Patterson-consulted "Alpha One" format (3-2). The former Program Director at KMJM/St. Louis and morning air personality at KMJQ/Houston will assume his PD responsibilities Monday (3-16). In addition to its new format, WZAK will have a new identity as well, henceforth being known as "93-FM."

Breakefield Exits WASH GM Position

Susan Breakefield resigned her post as General Manager at WASH/Washington, DC to pursue a new career in the investment business. A 12-year veteran of the station, the last four as GM, Breakefield told R&R, "I wanted something where I'd have an opportunity to be my own person. I passed my broker's exams last November and I'll be joining an investment company called Linsco, where I'll be specializing in tax shelters.

"One of the things I was very clear about," Breakefield continued, "was that I didn't want to work for any other radio station because I think WASH is the best radio station in the world. I also didn't want to work for any other broadcast company because I really think Metromedia is one of the finest broadcast companies in the world. I decided that because I didn't want to do either of those things; it was time for me, in terms of maturity and growth, to move into a new field." No replacement for Breakefield has yet been named.

Charter Sets KITT Purchase Agreement

Charter Broadcasting has reached an agreement to purchase KITT-FM/San Diego, subject to FCC approval. Last summer Charter Media, the shortlived communications company formed by Charter Co. and Karl Eller, signed an agreement in principle to buy KITT (R&R 7-18), and when Eller and Charter dissolved their partnership, Charter Broadcasting retained the option to purchase the station.

Charter Broadcasting President John Bayliss stated in announcing the agreement, "It has been our intention for some time to acquire an FM companion station in the San Diego market. We consider San Diego to be one of the most dynamic and attractive broadcasting markets in the country." Charter presently owns KCBQ/San Diego in addition to five other major market stations.

Sherman Becomes Motown Sr. VP

Dick Sherman has officially been appointed to the position of Senior Vice President/Marketing & Distribution for Motown Records. Sherman was most recently Sr. VP/Sales & Marketing for Boardwalk, following several years as a Casablanca VP. Motown President Jay

Lasker, in making the announcement Tuesday (3-10), stated, "I take great pride in our ability to per-



pride in our ability to persuade Dick Sherman to join us. I know that he will be relieving me personally of a lot of extraordinary pressures in the sales area. I don't think I could have found a better sales and marketing man for Motown than Dick Sherman."



FIELD OFFICES MAY BE FORCED TO CLOSE

Lee Paints Grim **Budget Picture**

Appearing before a House Appropriations Subcommittee Tuesday (3-10), Acting FCC Chairman Bob Lee sketched a grim scenario of processing delays, service cutbacks, and office closings under the Reagan plan to cut the FCC's budget \$4.8 million and its staff by 169 slots.

After the hearing, Broadcast Bureau Chief Dick Shiben told R&R, "If I got a feeling at all, it was that they probably agree with the Reagan cuts."

Despite an expected 29% increase in new FM and major change applications, Chairman Lee said the cuts will "increase delays in our authorization of service program."

He said the Commission would be forced to close field offices in Beaumont, Savannah, Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, Washington, Little

Rock, and St. Louis (R&R 2-27). Plans to open new offices in Phoenix, Des Moines, Salt Lake City, Tulsa, Nashville, Greensboro, Spokane, and Albuquerque would be cancelled.

The Acting Chairman also testified his agency will have to cut down its participation in international conferences, as well as double the 30 days it now takes to approve new or modified electronic equipment for the marketplace.

POSSIBLE RECORD INDUSTRY IMPACT

Copyright Tribunal Called Unnecessary

Clarence James, Chairman of the Copyright Royalty Tribunal, told a Congressional subcommittee last week he thinks the tribunal should be abolished. The CRT supervises licensing for cable, jukeboxes, and noncommercial broadcasting, plus mechanical royalties on records and tapes.

'The tribunal is not required or needed and is clearly unnecessary to determine reasonable terms and rates of royalty payments," James said in testimony before the House Subcommittee on Courts, Civil Liberties and the Administration of Justice.

James went on record supporting a proposal by copyright owners that royalties not be set by the government, but instead be based on a fixed percentage of the suggested retail list price of phonograph records.

"If the price of records goes up or down, the royalty due and payable will also go up or down. Thus by appropriate action of the Congress, another function of the Copyright Royalty Tribunal can be eliminated," James testified.

Stressing that he spoke only for himself and not for the entire tribunal, James unloaded a blistering attack on long delays in the payment of royalties under the current system. "Payments should be made at least within the year after they are paid, not four or five years," said James, who predicted that unless changes are made, the government will soon be holding well over \$100 million in royal-

Thurmond Revives Record Price-Fixing Issue

Senator Strom Thurmond (R-SC) has requested Justice Department files on "alleged price-fixing activities" among top record industry executives, hoping to reopen a JD investigation which was rumored to have been squelched by the Carter administration last year.



Jones Urges Fairness **Doctrine Repeal**

Saying she trusts the press to "generally act responsibly," FCC Commissioner Anne Jones called for repeal of the Fairness Doctrine late last week.

Appearing before the American Newspaper Publishers Association (ANPA) (3-5), Jones said repeal "may encourage broadcasters to deal with controversial topics. by removing their vulnerability to expensive, time-consuming attacks when they do so."

A major force behind Fairness Doctrine repeal, Jones believes, will be the blurring of the line between broadcast and print journalism with the coming of electronic teletext and videotext in the home. Were these new systems to be classified as broadcast news, Jones told ANPA, newspapers would be subject to the Fairness Doctrine "and I don't know if they could live with that.'

BROADCASTERS MAY STILL HAVE TO PAY

"Cost Of Regulation" **Fees Studied By Senate**

The staff of the Senate Commerce Committee is drafting legislation that would order broadcasters to pay fees to cover the FCC's regulation costs. "There should be some way to help offset some of the cost of regulation," Communications Counsel Riley Temple told R&R. "And it's also revenue-producing.

According to Temple, each segment of the communications industry would probably be asked to carry its own weight. For instance, the bill might require radio stations to pay fees adding up to the total spent by the FCC in administering radio regulations.

The staff has asked the FCC to supply data on the cost of regulations and to make recommendations on the size of any fees stations might be charged.

Sources indicated the proposed fees would be considerably smaller

than "user fees" considered in the

last Congress. **QUELLO CHANGES POSITION**

Temple stressed to R&R that cost of regulation legislation is by no means a certainty. "We're just studying the matter now," he explained.

The staff hopes to have the necessary data in hand by the end of this week, with a bill introduced "as soon as possible after that" if there is support for the idea among **Communications** Subcommittee members

If proposed, the fee scheme will be included in legislation now being drafted to grant Congress the authority to reauthorize the FCC and its functions every three years.

Foes Seek FCC Reversal On 9 kHz

Opponents of 9 kHz reduced spacing picked up a key ally last week when FCC Commissioner Jim Quello told state broadcast association executives he now opposes reduced spacing. When the FCC approved the scheme in 1979, Quello had been a lukewarm supporter.

Reduced spacing was the focus of the state executives' NAB-sponsored meeting in Washington, where a strategy was mapped for attempting to turn the FCC around before May 31, with the help of Quello and possible new members, such as communications attorney Mark Fowler, who may become the new FCC Chairman.

The state officers spent part of the week on Capitol Hill, lobbying against any Region 2 treaty that might contain a 9 kHz shift.

Interference Study Demanded

Broadcasters and engineers clashed with FCC officials over the issue of a 9 kHz interference study at last week's meeting of the Joint Industry-Government Advisory Committee on AM Broadcasting. Agency officials called the study unnecessary, but NAB General Counsel Erwin Krasnow later submitted a formal request: "It would be irresponsible for the Commission to reach a final decision on 9 kHz without having the benefit of studies showing the impact on listeners."

WDVR/Philadelphia President Jerry Lee agreed, telling R&R, "I firmly believe the mood of the country is such that the Senate would not ratify a treaty without first finding out what the impact was on the American public.

Cuban Crisis: Interference Imperils American AM Stations

Washington Report

Faced with the potential of massive AM interference from Cuba that could virtually force the U.S. to accept 9 kHz reduced spacing, a delegation of FCC and State Department officials will go to Havana April 6 and 7 to discuss existing and future interference problems.

The Americans want to discuss Cuba's current interference in violation of international agreements, as well as the impact of Cuba's proposal to the International Frequency Registration Board for 188 stations, some with power as high as 500 kw, on virtually every one of the existing 107 AM frequencies.

Meanwhile, a working group of the Joint Industry-Government Advisory Committee on AM Broadcasting last week released a study showing that the proposed Cuban inventory of stations, if approved by the Region 2 Conference beginning in November, would require massive power increases by some American stations to offset nighttime interference. Some stations would have to boost power into the hundreds of kilowatts (see table).

9 kHz Could Be Forced On U.S.

"I don't see how we can satisfy these incompatibilities with Cuba based on 10 kHz," State Department official Bill Jahn told R&R. Jahn, who is in the Office of International Communication, said even if Cuba gets a fraction of its proposed stations, U.S. stations would suffer severe problems. "I think really to protect all U.S. stations it is going to force us into some type of 9 kHz plan. That's just kind of a gut feeling," Jahn told R&R. It's deemed likely that if Cuban interference becomes a long-term problem, the U.S. would have to convert to 9 kHz reduced spacing to find new frequencies for stations affected by the Cubans. These displaced stations would then become the top priority candidates for the new frequencies opened up by 9 kHz. Jahn indicated the U.S. would try to resolve differences with Cuba during the April meetings, as well as at the Panel of Experts (POE) meeting that opens April 21 in Geneva to make comparative studies of 10 kHz and 9 kHz, with both a maximum of 4 or 9 kHz shift.

"Clearly Cuba cannot implement this inventory. They don't have the resources. I think what they've done is positioned themselves for bargaining," said Jahn.

While Canada has sent a protest note to Cuba, Jahn told R&R, "I think you're right to say it's basically going to fall on our shoulders. I think what we want to do is force it into a multilateral forum." According to Jahn, some of the smaller nations in Region 2 have not even studied the Cuban inventory and are still unaware of the dangers it poses to their own stations.

The FCC has completed computer runs totalling thousands of pages detailing the impact of Cuba's proposal on every affected U.S. station. With the help of the Advisory Committee, the data is now being analyzed and will be presented to Cuban officials to show them the havoc their plans would wreak on American broadcasting.

Cuban Interference Already Widespread

Besides discussing potential problems, the U.S. delegation wants to discuss interference already being caused by the Cubans. The FCC is asking the Advisory Committee, the NAB, and state broadcaster associations to help document specific cases of interference be used as ammunition for the American team at the April 6-7 sessions.

In nearby Florida, interference is already "severe," according to Matthew Liebowitz, counsel for the South Florida Radio Association (SFRA). He says WKAT and WINZ/Miami have already been granted special relief by the FCC, which is now considering another request from WQBA/Miami, a Spanish-language station. Liebowitz alleges the Cubans are deliberately jamming WQBA because "it is not in concert with the Cuban government's policies." On behalf of SFRA, Liebowitz has asked the FCC and State Department for an expedited procedure, reducing to 30 days the time it takes a station to get special FCC relief, such as a power increase to offset interference which violates the North American Regional Broadcasting Agreement (NARBA). NARBA is the treaty under which Cuba officially protects American stations, but FCC and State Department officials agree Cuba is flagrantly violating the treaty, which it plans to renounce on November 3, 1981.

The Florida Association of Broadcasters (FAB) estimates 88 of its member stations will suffer new interference under Cuba's proposed inventory, and has arranged a March 27 strategy session in Tampa for broadcasters and engineers from several states.

"The Cubans are trying to get Radio Havana down into Central America," FAB Executive VP Ken Small told R&R, "but they're not using directional antennas."

As bad as existing interference is, Small predicted "the roof will cave in" when Cuba withdraws from NARBA in November. However, Chief Wilson La Follette of the FCC's Technical and International Division said Cuba may already be creating all the interference it plans after officially withdrawing from NARBA. La Follette told R&R there is "some question as to whether or not there are any new dangers. The indications we have are that they're already starting to do this."

Not Just A Florida Problem

Representatives of both Florida broadcast groups stressed that Cuban interference is not strictly a Florida problem. The SFRA's Liebowitz told R&R, "There are stations in Cincinnati where, if the DJ pauses too long, you hear Spanish. In Washington you hear Radio Moscow via Radio Havana on 600 on your dial."

FAB's Ken Small agreed and said broadcasters from Georgia, Alabama, Louisiana, and South Carolina have been invited to the March 27 conference on Cuban interference

The Consequences Of Cuban Interference

The following table was released late last week by a working group of the Joint **Industry-Government** Advisory Committee on AM Broadcasting to supply several examples of what would happen to AM radio stations at various frequencies at night if Cuba is allowed to follow through with its plans to establish numerous highpower radio outlets which would interfere with existing American stations. With 10% interference from a Cuban station, the damage would be severe – stations' efficiency of coverage could be reduced to the equivalent of 1% of their current power in

some cases, and to restore coverage of their present service areas, some stations would have to increase their present power up to 180 times.

The table lists stations at certain frequencies and details the estimated effective reduction in nighttime power 10% Cuban interference would cause, and the power required to restore normal coverage of the station's present service area. The first column lists frequency, and the second shows the proposed power of the nondirectional Cuban station allocated for that frequency. The next two columns list call letters/city and nighttime power in watts.

The fifth column presents a figure representing the power a station would effectively be reduced to by 10% interference. For example, 5000-watt WTAR/ Norfolk would be reduced to the equivalent of a 532watt station at night. And the sixth column's figure shows how many watts it would take to maintain the present nighttime coverage area under 10% interference. 5000-watt WREC/Memphis would require 333,000 watts to match its pre-interference coverage, for instance.

U.S. Imports More Home, Fewer Car Radios

Recently-released statistics from the **Electronics Industries Association**'s Consumer Electronics Group show that the number of auto radios imported to the U.S. dropped 23.4 percent to 3.4 million units in 1980, down from 4.4 million in 1979. Customs values of auto radios slid 28.2 percent in 1980. However, the number of home radios imported by Americans rose three percent to 29.8 million, up from 28.9 million in the year-previous. Customs values for home radios declined 1.1 percent.

U.S. exports of home radios slipped 13 percent from 686,940 in 1979 to 594,246 in 1980 as customs values dipped 20.5 percent. Exports of auto radios gained slightly (0.7 percent) to 509,771 units, up from 506,365 units in 1979, while customs values increased 20.9 percent.

Dashboard TV's Making Inroads

Television may invade radio's last bastion, the automobile, by the mid-Eighties. The Glenview, IL-based **Zenith Radio Corp.**, working in conjunction with Detroit, has already developed cathode-ray tubes (CRT's), which would be linked to TV-like screens in the auto's dashboard.

While engine control computer systems are currently in use in Detroit's newest models, once connected to dashboard CRT's, drivers would have, in effect, their own personal computer terminals at the wheel. These new CRT's would provide color information such as travel speed, fuel levels, and time of day. By pushing a button, the screen could convert to a "trip computer," displaying fuel economy data, the number of miles to an empty gasoline tank, elapsed time, and map location.

The screens could also show the results of automatic checklists performed by the computer under the car's hood, advising the driver to add oll, tune the engine, or restore proper tire pressure. Adding a programmable calendar, the CRT might remlnd drivers of important dates. Other features, such as an engine tachometer, could be included as well with no loss of dashboard space.

Nevertheless, the cost of the CRT's (between \$65-\$85, as opposed to \$30 for the conventional instrument cluster) may limit their inclusion to optionladen luxury models for the time being.


TraveLodge Sets 3 New Radio Spots



Blair '80 Net Declines, Despite Record Revenues

John Blair & Co. reported that 1980 net earnings for the broadcaster/ rep firm declined four percent to \$11.6 million, down from \$12.2 million in 1979, while year-end revenues rose 12 percent to a record \$220.6 million, up from 1979's \$197.3 million. The decrease, according to Blair President Jack Fritz, was primarily attributable to the firm's owned stations division.

Fourth quarter net earnings swelled 25 percent to \$4.1 million, up from \$3.3 million in the analogous period of 1979, with Blair's fourth quarter revenues increasing five percent to \$58.8 million, up from \$55.8 million in the fourth quarter of 1979.





Aberrations "Flipped Out" This Spring

In my February 20th column on Arbitron's plans for speedier report delivery, I touched on the highlights of their thinking. However, the company is planning to take other steps, besides the use of ascription rather than callbacks, to expedite the production process. One of those additional steps deals with "flips" or call letter aberrations. New, computerized steps will be enacted for this sweep, and they may be of interest to stations that regularly have their calls aberrated in the diary.

search

Current Procedures

In the past and up through the Winter '81 sweep there have been two ways of handling aberrated sets of calls when they show up in the Arbitron diaries. The first, and most frequent, is that the "flips" (which derive their name from Arbitron's attempt to "flip" the misperceived set of calls to a legal set in the relevant market) are handled automatically in the computer's county file. So, if a station has previously asked for and been granted the credit of WPUL to be flipped to WLUP, and the WPUL aberration crops up in metro Chicago diaries, the computer would automatically

credit WLUP with any entries that the respondent recorded for WPUL.

This computer handling of aberrations is the quickest way of dealing with such problem entries, and as long as the county file is updated regularly by Arbitron, all is well. Of course, if the Arbitron staff doesn't cull the file regularly, and keep up with call letter changes in the markets, things can get problematical.

An example of how even the computer can have a hand in creating problems came to light in Chicago back when WJJD-FM changed calls to WJEZ. Prior to that, entries to WJEZ had been automatically flipped to a non-commercial station in the market, WBEZ. The call letter change was not caught in the update, and when entries to WJEZ came up in the diaries they were given automatically to WBEZ. This came to light when a post-survey diary review was performed and it was found that 44 diaries had their WJEZ entries awarded to WBEZ.

I'm sure that the Arbitron staff is aware of this potential problem and is on the alert for it, but it's important to keep in mind that computer handling doesn't necessarily mean that an entry was handled correctly.

Manual Decisions

Besides the computer flipping, other aberrations that are not in the county file are manually flipped after a review by someone in the Radio Department. I can tell you that this job is a tedious and mind-blowing task, ranking right up there with walking on hot coals as a desirable activity. Although stations would request laundry lists of aberrations that could be granted and entered into the computer, there were always thousands of creative souls out in radioland who would think of new and diverse ways to record a set of call letters. It was to these thousands of entries that staffers in the Radio Department were dedicated, trying to figure out what local station, if any, should get credit for the misperceived set of calls.

The manual flip review involves examination of several criteria before a crediting decision is made. The Arbitron staff must look at what other calls in the market might be confused with each other; stations on another band (AM-FM) that could be a confusing factor; signal reach of various stations, including clear channel properties and so on. Eventually, many of the manually-reviewed aberrations are credited to a station. When that station performs the post-survey diary review it can see what manual flips were received and request those aberrations be entered into the county file for future computer handling.

New Procedures

According to Arbitron spokespersons **Connie Anthes** and **Lynn Turner**, the computer will play an even more important role in handling flips, effective with this spring sweep. Evidently many of the checks performed manually before will now be made by a computer, a thorough 10-step process. The good news, though, is that not only does this save time in production but the possibility of manual review still lingers.



What does it cost for a "full-market" mechanical a reader recently wanted to know?

A full-market mechanical, a mechanical print-out that shows every diary used to process the relevant market report, can be priced two ways. If a station orders a station mechanical, the additional sort for the market is only \$100, a real buy. Ordered separately, the full-market printout will cost approximately between \$400-\$700, depending on the size of your market.

Although the full-market mechanical contains a lode of information, it cannot be removed from the Arbitron sales office (or the Laurel office, if you prefer).

Advisory Council Orientation Set

REPROTENT REPORT OF THE REPORT OF

Most members of the Arbitron Radio Advisory Council will gather in Maryland for an update on what is happening at Arbitron. According to Council Chairman Tom Hoyt one of the major goals of the session, scheduled for two days, will be to acquaint the six new Council members with the status of Arbitron's methodology and production techniques.

Facility Form Contact Revised

Arbitron's Manager/Communications Connie Anthes called this week to revise information given R&R recently on the person stations should contact when they have updates for their facility forms. Ms. Anthes stated that Mr. Lynn Turner should be the person to whom updates should be addressed, not Ms. Zelda Ross as previously reported. Turner can be reached at the Laurel office of Arbitron, (301) 982-4600. Mailing address is the Arbitron Building, Laurel, MD 20810. Turner is Arbitron Radio's Manager of Policies and Procedures.

Without manual Arbitron review possibilities, aberrations could come up that might not be reviewed for credit. The listening involved would go to "unidentified." However, Anthes told **R&R** that "although there is a very slim possibility of it happening, manual review of any aberrations that make it through the computer checking procedures will still be available." Someone in the Radio Department will essentially be a backup to the automatic handling the computer will offer. This is good news, especially for stations in markets where the respondents are frequently confusing stations.


How Many Show Up

According to information supplied by Turner, approximately 15-20% of the manual aberrations sent in by stations showed up in the subsequent survey in the market. According to the Arbitron personnel, all of these would have been handled through the new computerized checking process.

This brings up the question of whether or not stations should submit possible aberrations for the spring or other surveys. Anthes stated that "stations don't have to request" aberrations any more, since the computer will — with human backup be handling almost all possibilities. However, if your station is especially sensitive about certain aberrations being credited to you, it wouldn't hurt to drop a line or give a call to Turner's office. Documentation is always important whenever you are dealing with procedures at Arbitron that could affect your ratings, and thus your livelihood. For your information, Turner's number is noted in the Week In Review section elsewhere on this page.

Here's hoping that Arbitron's computer makes benign decisions on your station's behalf — and that all your aberrations flip your way this spring!





One of the great people in the broadcast biz is making a change in a couple of months. Jack Brown, who's completing 3½ decades of government service, is retiring as Director of Radio Programming for American Forces Radio and Television Service. And what a success story he has!

AFRTS provides $82\frac{1}{2}$ hours of *TV* programming to 349 overseas outlets per week, and the *radio* nurgle involves 80 hours of AM programming and 10 hours of FM every week to some 493 stations around the world (and a lot of other places, too!).


Jack will be heading up the Don Martin School in Hollywood as President; he began working after hours there in 1968 as a part-time instructor. Incidentally, the radio school has produced such names as Don Imus, the Real Don Steele, Bob Eubanks, and Tom Kennedy. It was founded back in 1937.

Young tyke Jack Brown started in radio as a child actor in the New York area, and he still loves radio and TV acting. He's done a number of national TV commercials, including Coca-Cola, Crisco, Diet Delight, and Olympia Beer. So this very talented man is retiring from the highest civilian level in AFRTS after starting in the humblest position in one of its smallest and most remote outposts (a Horatio Alger story quite unlike that of Radio & Records' Earl C. All of our best wishes go out to this warm and intelligent gentleman, for whom I worked in the late 60's and early 70's. I'll never forget when AFN in Germany flew me into Frankfurt for a big celebration, and thousands of people met me at the airport with banners proclaiming "Ach, Schweinhundt!"

It was the *nicest* thing any group had ever said to me.

Incidentally, Jack's favorite flavor is green, he eats 157.8 pounds of Hostess Twinkies per year, he becomes excited looking at Jeff Gelb's large collection of erotic butter churns, and has a tattoo of Claude Hall on his sternum.



CBS Wins Going Away Again

Even without "Dallas" (preempted for a double dose of "Dukes Of Hazzard" last week), **CBS** continues its drive toward total TV domination. In the **Nielsen** ratings for the week ending March 8, CBS came up with a 19.6 average rating, **ABC** finished a distant second at 17.3, and **NBC** brought up the rear with 15.8. The ageless "M*A*S*H" was the top program of the week as CBS took six of the first seven slots, with good performances from "60 Minutes," "Alice," and both episodes of the "Dukes" (the edition in the regular time slot was third for the week; the one in "Dallas" 's spot fell slightly to 10th). CBS also benefitted from the nation's seemingly inexhaustible appetite for awards shows, as the "People's Choice Awards" finished 13th.

In the February Nielsen sweeps stakes, CBS won by a wide margin again, amassing a 20.6 average rating for the month compared to ABC's 18.9 and NBC's 16.9. Top show for the crucial sweeps period? What else — "Dallas," with a 31.8 average rating for the month. Last week's Top 20:

Presidential Noses A Foot Too Large

Mostly we live by "hard" news, but interesting sidetracks come along and we whip up Consumer reports or send out Investigative reporters until the phase passes, then back to the hard stuff again.

I'm off on a sidetrack lately, calling people around the country and the world, asking them to explain otherwise littleknown facts about their individual fields of experience. The chief ranger at Mount Rushmore told me the sculptor carved those sixty-foot-tall faces from the granite mountain with noses a foot too big, so hundreds of years of erosion would finish his job to exact proportion. A pencil company spokesman explained that each of us has a tiny bit of volcano around the house, because ground-up volcanic pumice is a vital part of every pencil eraser. A NOAA Satellite Services representative told me how satellites look at offshore currents so ships plying the East Coast can maneuver to catch the equivalent of an aircraft's tailwind.

For several years I have been compiling the Calendar section below this column, gathering bits of information in several big homemade volumes, and within the past couple of months that non-hard-news sideline has developed into a syndicated radio program. To go with the short facts I need good audio, and it comes from whatever experts or eyewitnesses I can chase down on a telephone. It has turned into fun, and it's a challenge of the first order. In gathering information about the only American ever convicted of cannibalism, I stumbled across the only eating establishment named for him, the Alfred Packer Grill at the University of Colorado, where the Packer Snacker and Manslaughter Stew are among the menu items. In chasing down material on the first man to reach the North Pole I learned it wasn't the famous explorer Peary, but his black assistant Matthew Henson who actually arrived at the top of the world first. A drug company source explained the first medical operation using ether as a painkiller, and revealed that until then ether had been a party drug for years.

You never can tell what you're going to stumble across when going after hard news or this sidetrack variety, and the unpredictability is what intrigues me. Calling a Jesse James museum in Missouri, I learned there's an alternate explanation of the infamous outlaw's death documented in several print sources. They claim he wasn't shot to death by a gang member for the reward money, but that a stand-in was killed and the real Jesse James snuck down to South America to cool off. Who knows whether it's true? But true or not, it's an interesting story, and the documentation is something that cannot just be laughed off.

Tracing the history of the legendary Pony Express, an archivist at Wells-Fargo said back then a regular letter cost a dime while the ponies charged up to five dollars, then explained why the Express went broke despite charging so much. This sideline is an offshoot of oral history, spoken by experts and eyewitnesses. There are *local* applications you might consider exploring, because there are always people around town who can explain why your village is as it is . . . the reasons

for the way things are today. It might make an interesting recess from the school of hard news, and sometimes you learn memorable stuff by jumping away from the usual grind. Any broadcaster interested in running my short daily programs is urged to admire the great restraint with which I've

Any broadcaster interested in running my short daily programs is urged to admire the great restraint with which I've refrained from hyping the name of my syndicator, who has made my program "Daybook" fabulously successful in a very short time. My prime purpose in writing of this non-hard-news approach is to cause you to consider assigning some reporting talent to not only how things are, but how they got that way in your own town.



SCRAMBLING FOR TENTHS OF POINTS

Los Angeles: A Six-Way Battle

Travelling over 3000 miles across the country is an amazing experience that I would recommend to anyone with a bit of time to invest. The changes in scenery are breathtaking, and the knowledge gained from listening to radio in different regions of the country is highly valuable.

Driving into the L.A. market, I soon discovered how complex programming here is due to the size of the market, the huge population, and the socioeconomic mix. For that reason, most programmers tend to specialize their programming (see L.A. Market Facts). One well known programmer, John Rook, PD of KFI, doesn't believe in that theory.

AM Survivors


John has been PD at KFI for over four years now and understands the complications of programming in a market with over 70 signals pounding in between AM and FM. "My demographic target is the same as it has been for over 20 years... I go for anyone who will turn on the radio." John backs up his "McDonald's/ Sears" philosophy of radio by adding, "Mass appeal radio is not dead. I program the hits, anywhere from Kenny Rogers to the B-52's."

KFI is a very personality-oriented station with a huge 50kw signal. Mornings are anchored by Lohman & Barkley, who have been in that slot for 13 years. Tim & Ev Kelly, a husband and wife team, do middays; Jack Armstrong and the Gorilla drive KFI home, Big Ron O'Brien works 6 to 10pm, Mark Taylor does 10pm to 2am, and Byron & Tanaka team up from 2am to 6am.

Why a team for all night? "We prepare ourselves for the future. I hope Lohman & Barkley never leave, but if they do we have options with Byron & Tanaka, or with Tim & Ev," Rook responded. The personalities at KFI do a lot of personal appearances on their own, but the station organizes very few of these events, as John believes this gives personalities more prep time for their shows.

Using TV, billboards and buscards, KFI is quite visible. "KFI In The Sky," anchored by reporter Bruce Wayne helping motorists make their way through the tangle of L.A. freeways, has been a big cume builder, John feels.

As far as large-scale contests go, "I don't believe in hyping the audience," said John. "We cume over a million every book. The audience won't buy the hype for long." KFI does give away tickets and albums though, "because it says what we are, a music station," John concluded.

The other "AM Survivor" in the CHR battle is KRLA, which takes a different approach to the market. PD Jack Roth describes his station as "basically an adult station in the daytime that gets on the streets and focuses on teens at night." In the Fall '80 book it worked, as KRLA became number one teens 7pm to 12mid with a 12.6 share.



KRLA is on the streets, actually all over cars, having distributed over 900,000 bumper stickers and giving out \$100 bills when the "KRLA Hit Man" spots listeners who are tuning in to the station. Another successful promotion has been "Name That Hit," where a piece of an oldie is played and a caller tries to identify it for \$100. If these contests seem like old standbys, they are. Jack said, "KRLA is a very nostalgiaoriented station without the synthesizer and slick window dressing that most L.A. stations have gone in for."

Musically the station is pre-programmed by MD Rick Stancato, who doesn't use colors and codes, but according to Jack, "uses his guts and ears for a good blend of music. Our jocks don't talk a whole lot; we try and keep the station as a 'musical oasis' on AM."

The format was conceived by KRLA Sr. VP Art Laboe of "Oldies But Goodies" LP fame. Art has been in L.A. since the 50's and the station is well flavored with oldies. One of the more popular day-to-day promotions is KRLA's on-the-street oldie dedications. A listener is taped and then the song and dedication are played back later. In a market as big as L.A., KRLA is trying to give the impression it's everywhere.



Part Three

From 100 to 102: All The FM CHR You'll Ever Need

There are four FM stations with a variety of CHR formats packed together on the FM dial from 100 to 102. To simplify things, we'll look at them in order of dial position.

KIQQ has been the largest ratings gainer in CHR over the past three books, and is now a P1 Reporter (see Parallel Realignments, Page 22). Programmed by Paula Matthews and administered by GM George Wilson (of Bartell fame), the station has spent very little money and has relied heavily on the active listener to spread the word about what is happening at 100-FM.

Paula has been PD for a little over a year now, and was previously MD at KTLK/Denver. "We try and do a few things very well, so we do not go overboard on promotions. Music has been responsible for our ratings growth, and our niche in the market is exposing new records selectively, but early," she explained.

Describing KIQQ, Paula says, "This is a classic CHR station where the jocks can have fun and talk up records." The station keeps a high music profile and doesn't do much news or traffic information. This coming ARB will find KIQQ experimenting with TV advertising for the first time in what Paula described as "an overcrowded medium."

Next up the dial is KRTH (K-EARTH 101), which has been a very stable and successful FM station for a number of years since **Bob Hamilton** took over the PD reins a little over four years ago. Bob is also National Music Director for **RKO Radio**.

KRTH is about 50% oldies and 50% current, having evolved to this format over the last several years from an all-oldies approach. It's aimed at the 25-34 adult with a secondary target of 25-49. Hamilton makes good use of TV and billboards to spread the word about his station, and also has an active morning team, London & Engle-

man, formerly of KULF/Houston, doing appearances and TV cameos

John London & Ron Engleman have been at KRTH for about 11/2 years and have a growing following. They have created a star of their own with Gippy Dinklewad, the "World's Biggest Coward," and have T-shirts and a fan club started for him. Another running feature of their show is "Catalina Island," a spoof on "Fantasy Island," as well as the "New Leave It To Beaver Show." Some of you may not realize it, but KRTH is totally

automated with the exception of morning drive. This presents no problems for contests, though, as Hamilton has the system set up for live-assist. One very successful promotion just completed was "The Birthday Game," in which listeners send in cards with their birthdays. If selected, they automatically win \$250, and if they call in within the time limit, they win an additional \$250

Hamilton described the station as "comfortable and easy to listen to." Recently KRTH had a "Grammy Weekend" where past Grammy-winning music was played and Grammy-winning albums were given away. Another regular weekend feature is a "60's Weekend" featuring a lot of those oldies you just don't hear anymore. This is the kind of programming that helps KRTH maintain its own identity on a crowded FM band.

More CHR To Come

With so many CHR stations in L.A., each has maintained its own "feel for the market" and is a direct reflection of each programmer's interpretation of what the market needs. This really applies to KUTE-102, with its blend of Urban & CHR music. It's pro-

one can become a reporter; with a one-day turn-around of information, it's difficult to increase the number of reporting stations above the current 231.

Unless we hear from you otherwise, we will hold your CHR application form along with any material like airchecks and ratings until the next review after the Spring Quarterly Measurements are back in.

The main criterion for inclusion as a CHR reporter is ratings dominance in your market. In cases where a market has more than one CHR reporter, those stations can remain in the parallels as long as the ratings show that each is a major force within the marketplace.

Remember, even if your station did not become a reporter this time around, your input regarding changes at the station, photos, and promotions are eagerly accepted

grammed by Bill Stevens, who has been at the station for seven years and has been PD at other times during the past two years. Bill has carefully researched the music for the 18-34 market.

KUTE has not been an active promoter "because we have gone through several format changes. We are now fine-tuning our product and will be using TV heav-



ily and other outdoor mediums to let the L.A. market know about us," Bill remarked. Up until now, albums and T-shirts have been the mainstay of promotional efforts, but look for this station to get real active

KUTE is staffed by a lot of familiar people from the market, including Brian Roberts, formerly of KDAY; Stevens in middays; Charlie Fox, formerly of KHJ, at night; and "Humble Harv" Miller in afternoons. Bill is very optimistic about KUTE, summing up his efforts as "having a clear-cut direction with a void in the market to fill."

The last CHR profile in L.A. goes to KIIS-FM at 102.7. See what I mean about being crowded? According to PD Mike Wagner, "KIIS-FM has a brand new spirit." Mike is a five-year veteran of the station and feels that the appointment of L. David Moorhead, who becomes Operations Manager and in-house consultant, will help launch the "new spirit."

Mike foresees no change in direction or format, but said "KIIS-FM will make a major effort to become the CHR leader in the market." It's backed up by a first venture into TV, using Chuck Blore's "Chimps" spots as a part of cume-building. With KIIS-FM at the top of the dial for CHR's, I

Our thrust is towards doing things 'on the street' that people will remember."

Just recently, KIIS-FM hosted Yarbrough & Peoples at the Roxy and brought in a packed house, and the station is looking to do more soon. Another on-the-street feature is the "KIIS-FM Energy Express," comprised of lovely ladies who go out to clubs and public events and "strut their stuff" in station outfits.

As you can see, programming CHR in L.A. is no easy task. Each of these stations sound unique, have their own ideas of how to achieve success, and are all determined to win. With many of these CHR stations just now getting into TV for the first time for this upcoming Quarterly Measurement, it will be an interesting situation to watch and to examine what impact, if any, their promotional campaigns have had on their ratings.

AOR Triple Threat: The Brothers Sinton

Sinton, Sinton and Sutton - sounds like a team of lawyers. Actually, Sinton, Sinton and Sutton (born Sinton) are all successful broadcasters involved in various aspects of AOR radio. This week I spoke with Steve Sutton (30), Carey Bruce Sinton (28), and Jon Sinton (26) about their respective radio careers, and how the three got started in radio.

Steve Sutton: Ex-Radio Pirate

Steve Sutton said, "It always seemed natural we'd get into radio." Carey Bruce Sinton remarked, "The Jewish tradition historically in America is tied in with show business." And indeed, as the three Sinton brothers grew up in Lincoln, Nebraska, they were surrounded by talent: their mother hosted a radio public service program and their father,



Steve Sutton then a car dealer, hosted a local channel's midafternoon movie.

"We grew up listening to KFOR in Omaha," Jon Sinton recalled. "I'll never forget sharing bedrooms with Steve and Carey. After the lights went out, we had transistor radios and flashlights in our beds, listening to 'Night Train.' "

Steve was the first of the three to get into radio, in an unusual fashion: "I was 18, going to Ohio State. I met a kid at a party who'd put together a bootleg station in Cincinnati and wanted to do the same at Ohio State. Roy was the kind of guy who would eventually build a machine that would enable him to rule the earth; Roy is in an institution in New York now. But there we were in 1969 with 17-watt WSIN, authorized by absolutely no one. But we showed up in a Pulse, someone got pissed and filed on us, and we were shut down five weeks later."

Later that year, Steve got his first commercial radio job at WSPO, which was programming progressive rock at night. "This was the year of the student riots," he mentioned. "When troops moved into Ohio State we were on the air relating troop movements, and one of the jocks told everyone to get guns and shoot policemen. We were all fired summarily over the phone the next day."

From there it was on to early Cleveland prog. rocker WNCR; "I did 6-12pm six nights a week for \$130," Steve recalled. "Most of the staff ended up walking off six months later; we were fighting with management because they would run 14-15 minutes of spots per hour. The term of the day was 'the station was pigging on the community'; what we really wanted was more control at the radio station. I regret the whole episode now."

There followed airshifts and MD gigs at WCOL-FM/Columbus, WMMS/Cleveland, and five years at WEBN/Cincinnati. Steve moved to KZEW/Dallas and shortly thereafter crossed the street to KTXQ (then KFWD) and his first PD

He left KTXQ and spent eight months in what he calls "the real world" working for his father's hardware store. He called the experience invaluable for broadening his perspective. "To us, radio is the real world. But it's fantasyland to 98% of everybody out there. We live and operate in Disneyland."


Steve rejoined radio when he was named PD

at WYSP/Philadelphia. "The station went on the sales block twenty minutes after I got there," he said. "You haven't lived till you come to the fourth largest city in the country to program a station with no promotional budget, up against Jeff Pollack (then PD at WMMR), who's sharp enough to begin with."

He left that job last fall, and is about to enter a new phase of his career, as General Sales Manager at a Western AOR currently undergoing a change in ownership. Why the change from programming to sales? "When I'm a GM someday," he stated, "I want to be a well-rounded one GM's who come from the sales department tend to think that programming is all voodoo. PD's tend to think that sales-oriented GM's have three motivations: greed, avarice and greed. I've worked for a number of good GM's, and they all had well-rounded backgrounds that included programming. Those guys are unstoppable and I want to be one of those guys."

Carey Bruce Sinton: The Urge To Program Younger brother Carey

said he remembered watching brother Steve playing disc jockey at the pirate station, and decided to give it a try. His first radio experience was at WCOL-FM, followed by several years at a West Coast music conservatory, and then his first PD job at KXFM/ Santa Maria.



shift/production gig at Carey Bruce Sinton KAZY/Denver and then emigrated to WLUP/ Chicago for an airshift. "But I had the urge to get back into programming," he recalled, "and when I met the owners of KIDO-KIDQ/Boise, I knew they were offering me the sort of job I couldn't turn down." Carey is now PD of both stations; KIDO is Country and KIDQ Superstars AOR, which means he often speaks with his brother Jon, a Superstars consultant. "We talk almost every day," he said, "with Steve joining in as well. We have a real good sense of give-and-take. We don't argue; we present our opinions to each other. Generally we think along the same lines."

Jon Sinton: Superstars Lifer

Youngest brother Jon Sinton began his radio career at WIOT/Toledo. He was attending college at the time, and remembered, "To get through college, a four-hour-aday job that still allowed me to go to school fulltime made a lot of sense." He honed his radio skills at WIOT and was named PD there in 1975, the same year the station pacted as a Superstars affiliate



He moved to KDKB/Phoenix as PD in 1978 and joined Burkhart/Abrams in 1979. He consults stations in nonmusical areas, and acts as the organization's liaison to client network "The Source.'

Jon's radio career has come a long way in a relatively short period of time. What's next? He responded, "I hope and expect to stay right here. It's the job situation I always dreamed of in that, to a great degree, I'm my own boss. At the same time I work under the umbrella of some of the smartest people in the business.

'This is such a forward-thinking company," he continued. "It will go so many places in allied industries as well as in radio and records. Truthfully, I hope to be here the rest of my life."


Strangely, the three brothers have never worked together at a radio station. Carey commented, "It's because most corporations are nervous about the appearance of nepotism; most companies don't want two brothers working for them, let alone three. So you can't work with them and you don't want to work against them. Every time one of us was interested in moving to a new market, we'd have to rule out any place one of our brothers was working.'

The future may be another story. All three Sintons voiced their common wish to purchase and run a radio station together sometime in the future. In the meantime, Steve, Carey, and Jon continue their successful careers in radio. Why radio? Steve summed up their thoughts when he quipped, "We always figured it beats working. And I always said it's the most fun I ever had with my clothes on.'





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PROGRAMMING VET REFLECTS ON LONG CAREER

WXCL's Lee Ranson Changes Format — From Radio To TV

Few radio veterans spend the majority of their careers at one station and fewer still their entire careers in the same market. However, that's exactly what Lee Ranson, PD of WXCL/Peoria, IL, has done during his two decades-plus in radio. Now Lee has decided to make a major career change - no, not to a larger market, but to the ABC-affiliated TV station serving the Peoria area.

This week's column is devoted to a man who has certainly made a name for himself in the Peoria market but who may not be as well-known in other parts of the country. Not a flashy programmer who sends out weekly press releases, Lee's brand of success stems from his natural low-keyed style. Following, Lee reflects on his lengthy career and his plans for the future, as well as offering some worthwhile advice to those just entering the field.

R&R: Lee, you've been in the business a long time. Could you give us some background on yourself?

LR: Peoria is my hometown. I went to college at the University of Denver and worked at the campus radio station there, but I got my first full-time job back here at WIRL in 1960. Since November of 1966 I've worked at WXCL on the 9am-12noon show, and have been both Music and Program Director since 1971. Also, for the past nine years, I've been the weekend weatherman at WRAU-TV

R&R: Why didn't you ever feel the desire to move on to another market and why make a major career change at this point in your life?

LR: As you might expect, I've had quite a few different offers over the years. However, I just felt that I would rather be a big fish in a small town than a small

fish in a big town. I know my market well, and what works here might not work somewhere else. I felt this was the place for me.

Just about a year ago we had a change in ownership, and the new owners and I have had a few minor differences of opinion basically between their programming philosophy and mine. I really didn't want to move since one of my boys will be going to Bradley University in Peoria in the fall and the other is in a very good school system. Since I had been doing TV weather at Channel 19 for so long and am very well-known in the market, I felt that this would be a good opportunity for me to go over there. I'm going to be Director of Special Projects, which will include some country tie-in interviews as well as other outside activities with entertainment people in general, so I'm not getting out of the Country radio business completely even though it's going to be based in TV. I'll also be doing some selling, which is the prime reason that I'm excited about going over there, because, as everyone knows, in this business the money is in selling.

R&R: What has been your radio philosophy over the years . . . the reason both you and WXCL have done so well?

LR: My philosophy has been a very simple thing: don't do anything to offend anybody with anything at any time. Sometimes it's difficult, especially with music trends going a little bit overboard with either sexual or drinking references, but as long as you don't play things that are real raunchy (either noisewise or lyricwise), you're going to be in good shape. I think the reason this station has become so successful over the years is that it's a comfortable radio station to listen Lee Ranson Then . . .



And Now

to . . . there's nothing on the air that's going to turn anybody off or make them tune out.

R&R: What do you think you'll miss most when you leave?

LR: What I'll miss probably more than anything is talking to the stars and the record promotion people with whom I've had a tremendous relationship. The glory, glamour, and excitement of radio has gone out, but I still enjoy the music so much that I know I'm going to miss opening up the mail and seeing all the new songs and playing them on the air.

An Exciting Memory

R&R: Are there any memorable moments in your long radio career you'd like to share with us?

LR: One highlight that I can recall offhand was back in 1972 shortly after I took over the music. I happened to watch an episode of "Night Gallery" on TV in which a new Jerry Wallace tune was played on a jukebox. I recognized Jerry's voice right away, so I went through his latest album and there it was. I played the song as background during the part of my TV weather show where we ran down all the temperatures, and the phones rang off the hook for about an hour following the newscast. The next night the same thing happened, so Monday morning I played it on my radio show and the listeners went completely bonkers over it. I called MCA and told them about the response, and they ultimately released "If You Leave Me Tonight, I'll Cry" as a single. It became one of the biggest hits Jerry ever had, and a few years later he asked me to do the liner notes on his "Coming Home To You" album. That was kind of exciting.

R&R: Your ratings have been fairly consistent over the years, usually in the double-figure range. How important do you think ratings are for a smaller market?

LR: We'll usually go along for three or four books in a row and have great ratings and then take a big drop and then bounce back next book. It's kind of a leveling factor. Locally this doesn't hurt at all . . . the local business knows that our radio station gets results for them so they're not going to pay any attention at all. The only problem is that it does affect national business since Peoria is a pretty good test market for a lot of national accounts. I think ever since Nixon said "Would it play in Peoria?" it's kind of stuck in everybody's mind!!

R&R: Where do you think Country radio will go in the future, especially with all the current emphasis on anything country?

LR: I think it's really nice to bring country out of the closet. Some people until the last year or two were afraid to admit that they listened to country music and now, of course, it's the "in" thing to do. However, I think that stations have to be very careful in not aiming at those few people. They can't forget their basic aud-

ience that's kept them in business for years. You can sprinkle a few of the "Urban Cowboy" songs in with your traditional, but I think that a Country station that doesn't play the basic country hits is not a Country station.

Advice For The Beginner

R&R: What advantages (or disadvantages) would you say radio has to offer a young person over other types of careers?

LR: I think radio offers a pretty stable career in the small and medium markets. As long as you perform and do the kind of job that your boss wants, you're going to be able to maintain a pretty good living. However, the security is diminished somewhat in the larger markets. Country radio is the best place, in my opinion, for someone to start out since at most Country stations you can still be a personality, something you don't find too much with rock and roll radio these days.

Probably the best piece of advice I could give a newcomer is don't back down from your own principles.

If you feel that what you're doing is right, pursue it. Try to make other people believe in your way of doing things; and if they don't, look elsewhere. Otherwise, you'll end up becoming a "yes" man. Radio can be a financially as well as a spiritually rewarding career because of the people you're involved with.

R&R: Anything you'd like to say to your many friends in the industry before embarking on your new career?

LR: We've had about four or five country shows come into Peoria every year, so we've presented everybody from Johnny Cash to Larry Gatlin to Slim Whitman, and I'd like to say to those people that I have never in the 15 years that I've been doing those shows met a person in the "star" category I didn't like. They are all really nice people and it's been such a pleasure to have worked with them over the years. You might mention that I'm working on some future plans involving these people that I'll be announcing at a later date. 





A POSITIVE VIEW Should P/A's Skew Younger Musically?

P/A

Conversations about where CHR leaves off and P/A begins have become high on the topic list among programmers in recent times. Here at R&R we go through all sorts of checklists and criterion levels to make sure a station's musical fare is listed in the proper section of the paper. But still the aforementioned question goes, for the most part, unanswered. Last week we had a chance to talk with industry veteran **Bob** Paiva, now the Program Director of WCMB and WSFM in Harrisburg, PA. Paiva's view of what Pop/ Adult radio is, musically, and, more importantly, where it is going in the future made for some thought-provoking ideas.

R&R: You've said that some stations have become too conservative musically to get the adults. Please explain.

Paiva: I think that some of the stations that started out to characterize themselves as "adult" created a view of a lot of pop music as "non-adult." That view, in my opinion, is much too conservative when you look at the total spectrum of pop music being offered. To get into it a little further, I'm talking about the 25 to 30-year-old who visits a disco occasionally, who grew up with rock 'n' roll, someone who has an album collection with a great deal of rock material and is not, just because he turned 25 or 30, content to all of a sudden listen to Anne Murray and Glen Campbell records. We are attempting to appeal to an upwardlymobile white collar adult who still wants to maintain a contemporary outlook and not be what we called an MOR listener.

R&R: Of course, if you're too young with music, you could find yourself maxing out at a demo as low as 35 or 36...

Paiva: I think you're taking a narrower scope and putting limitations on the audience's ability to accept the music. For instance, in adults 25-49, doing what I'm doing, WSFM is just about a clear winner with a 5.8;

the other stations in town are scaled down from there. The only station that beats me is a very conservative MOR which has 42% of its listenership over 50 years old. R&R: Do you have air personalities that magnetize

the adults? Can they relate to someone over 35? Paiva: That's the trick of it. I created a format

in 1973 at WLEE in Richmond – we nicknamed it "MOR" and it stood for Middle of the Rock. R&R: What was the essence of the format?

Paiva: To examine very closely the 50,000-watter

in town, WRVA (a P/A station), and extract from it all of the service elements which it did so well for the adult audience. Then to take those elements and fit them into a contemporary music format by doing them in a contemporary manner. Rather than taking an MOR station and contemporizing the music as many do, we took a pop music station and put the proper services in. Basicnot cost you a great deal of promotion money, needs to be evolutionary, because as you pointed out, the audience will not stand for trauma. So, keeping the music basically the way it was and making the services and general approach more adult, we effectively reduced the trauma.

R&R: But the question remains, are you **Pop/Adult** or some form of full-service **CHR**?

Paiva: Let me put it this way. People have a tendency to think about Pop/Adult or Adult Contemporary in the same terms that we used to think about MOR and to think of it only in terms of the music.

R&R: I see what you're getting at, but let me ask you, how hard musically can you get? Will you pull out and play "Satisfaction" by the **Rolling Stones**?

Paiva: At this point in our transition, I'm not playing that or similar records, but I do play some softer

ally that's what we've done here at WSFM.

R&R: It seems to be working quite nicely in 1981 in Harrisburg as it did in 1973 in Richmond. Why?

Paiva: There are enormous similarities between Harrisburg today and Richmond then. It is a state capital. The state government complex employs a large percentage of the people so that they are doing the same kinds of jobs and are in the same income structure. The city is even divided by a river that flows down the middle ala Richmond. Those and other situations led me to believe that my concept would work here. Also when I came here in September, there was literally no AOR station, so that people who were contemporary music-oriented were already disposed to listening to us because we had been the only pop-type music station available.

R&R: So when you hit town, you applied your aforementioned philosophy of subliminal image alteration?

Paiva: Yes. It seemed imprudent to change the existing image musically to a more conservative approach, and it seemed, in turn, more prudent to take the existing "Rock 99" imagery and make it more adult. R&R: Many stations have changed or altered their

images only to cause trauma with the audience

Paiva: Well, this was done only after studying the audience's connection with us and vice versa. The way I like to put it is that all change, to be successful, and

Rolling Stones. In general I'm trying to play old records that are in harmony with the current music. The hardness or softness of the current list will determine how I will surround those with my gold. As you know, the current records, with a very few exceptions, are very soft, so I will not inject into the system records that are inconsistent with the currents.

R&R: The idea is balance. You obviously hope to maintain the higher end demographically while courting and capturing the younger element . . .

Paiva: We scored extremely well 25-49, and we are going to try to stay on that track, but we're going to have a more contemporary view of that 35-49 year-old audience than they've been given credit for in the past. If we don't give them the correct services and we give them a lot of new music, there's no reason why an adult would listen to us. We may eliminate records by Frank Sinatra, but we are still going to play "New York, New York"; that was a smash.

R&R: P/A and CHR have grown so close that it's really almost six of one and a half dozen of the other . . .

Paiva: For sure. If you maintain a narrow view of the audience and realize that you must define the services offered in harmony with the music played, you will come up with the transition of what was classically AM Top 40 into, at least in our case, an FM Pop/Adult, full-service, but contemporary radio station.

This week marks the final R&R column from Bill Speed. Bill submitted his resignation at R&R last week in order to pursue personal goals and new projects, some of which he discusses below. One project Bill plans will be a new publication for Black radio, an idea close to his heart for some time and a cause in which he believes strongly. All of us wish Bill success as he begins his new endeavor. R&R will be hiring a new Black Radio Editor in a few weeks; in the interim, our music information will continue to be presented.

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When this section debuted on July 28, 1978, it was the first link in what was to become a solid network of people, stations, and a universal spirit of unity. We have collectively attempted to bring Black radio to a position of respect within the entire radio community. Over the years I've been here, we've had a lot going for us – several conscientious FCC Commissioners and many other important officials of that organization, a few key record execs, and some programmers who weren't afraid of change!

We've had a chance to be close to some historical events, such as radio deregulation, and increased minority opportunities to enter the broadcasting arena. But most importantly, we have and are continuing to bring Black radio to the forefront of the radio community, with not only respect but acceptance as a solid, viable format with something to offer to the current evolution of radio. Progress has been made, but don't kid yourselves and believe it's going to be much easier now with certain newfound freedoms; now the fight to achieve all goals is more important than ever.

As for me, I must follow my heart and continue to work for the growth, development, and institutionalization of the Black radio format in new and challenging ways.

Now with the format dealing with innovations such as talk/information blocs, differential survey techniques, and the after-effects of deregulation, I am currently working with a team of people to develop a universal kit which will work as a schematic for the major advertising agencies to use Black radio better for effective campaigns, which in the long run will bring a better type of advertiser for Black radio and, ultimately, black people. We must continue to grow and achieve these immediate goals, for these goals will feed the flame, and we'll be able to go even further.

Let's reflect for a moment at what has happened in the last three years. When I started, there were just two stations who weren't using numbers; now over 70% of the format uses rotational systems without numbers. There are many more black record executives with significant clout, and a few successful black-owned record companies. We watched as the tax certificate distress sale policy developed, and within a two-year span there was more than a 100% increase in black or minority-owned stations. We've seen the birth of the Black Music Association, the Black Radio Advisory Council, the United Concert Promoters Assoc. There are now at least 10 cities with an ethnic-oriented radio station that holds the top position for music stations. For the first time, a black is represented on the Arbitron Advisory Council. As you can see, there is much growth and much work to be done to insure that growth flourishes, and to insure the natural evolution of the format.

I will continue to work and be involved in whatever it takes to insure a secure future for Black radio. I wish my successor all the luck in the world. It's been a lot of fun, and it has been a very rewarding experience in satisfying my thirst for a better radio community as a whole. Thank you for reading and contributing and reflecting with me on the things we have collectively fought to change, and thank you for all your support. But this is not the end, it's the beginning. We all continue in our responsibility to the communities we serve. Here's to a bright future.
