


Country Sales Swing Up

wing perhaps to an increasing number of older record buyers, sales of country music nearly doubled in the last three years, according to figures compiled by the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA). Country recordings accounted for only 6.8% of dollar sales in 1989, but rocketed to 12.5% in 1991. Conversely, rock recordings dropped from 42.9% of 1989 sales to 36.3% last year. The fastest-growing format: children's records, which moved from 0.3% to 3.3% in three years.

The RIAA figures also revealed that 56.8% of last year's music consumers were 25 years or older, compared to 49.6% in 1989. Sales in record stores slipped from 71,7% to 64.4% during the three-year period, while sales in discount and department stores rose from 15.6% to 20.7%.

Prerecorded Music Profile





organization; promises editorial freedom TV evangelist and former Republican presidential hopeful Pat Robertson won a bankruptcy court auction of United Press International, bidding \$6 million

for the wire service network, and other assets. "Business goes on as usual," UPI Managing Editor Bob Kieckhefer told R&R late Tuesday (5/12) after lawyers for UPI and its creditors committee accepted the bid from Robertson's U.S. Media Corp. U.S. Bankruptcy Judge Francis Conrad planned a hearing the next day to certify the agreement.

Robertson is to provide \$150,000 on May 19 and another \$150,000 on May 26 to keep cashstrapped UPI operating. Under terms of the agreement, Robertson will forfeit that \$300,000 if he backs out of the deal by a June 30 deadline or lowers his bid after taking a closer look at UPI's books.

Despite reports from UPI management that many firms had sought information, only four bids were submitted and Robertson's was the only one seeking to buy all of UPI. The other bidders offered only \$12,000 to \$125,000 for various pieces of the company. UPI's

Group W Seeks Common Claus KFWB VP/GM manages **KTWV: Chlowitz exits**

KFWB/Los Angeles VP/GM Chris Claus has been given additional duties as VP/GM of neighboring sister Group W NAC outlet KTWV (The Wave). He succeeds veteran radio executive Allan Chlowitz, who leaves the station.

Claus told R&R, "Westinghouse Broadcasting simply decided to consolidate the two stations. It's our goal to put KFWB & KTWV under one roof as quickly as possible. We're beginning that process now.

"At the same time, Group W felt it was appropriate to create one GM position for the two stations. We've made a similar consolidation in Boston: [N/T] WBZ Radio and WBZ-TV are now under the direction of one GM. The Wave's been successful with its unique format, and we have no other plans to [change] the station.

Regarding Chlowitz, Claus remarked, "The company has good feelings about what he accomplished. I know he'll land somewhere appropriate.'

Claus said the company is exploring the possibility of moving the Wave from its Sunset Blvd. CLAUS/See Page 30 creditors, owed approximately \$60 million, would receive about 10 cents on the dollar from Robertson's bid.

Although he didn't spell out specific plans for the company, Robertson listed the radio network and international reporting among its most desirable assets. He called the domestic newspaper operation UPI's weakest link, but didn't say whether he intended to shut it down. "I don't interfere in the editorial policies of our stations," Robertson told reporters outside the court hearing iri Rutland, VT.

UPI Exec. VP Steve Geimann said he had no idea what Robertson had in mind for the company: "UPI has had no discussions with Robertson or any of his people.

NABOB Asks FCC To Dump Rules New regs called 'unfair, unfounded

The FCC's new radio ownership limits should be abandoned because they're unfair, unfounded, and improperly eliminated one of the Commission's minority ownership policies, according to the National Association of Black-Owned Broadcasters (NABOB).

In a petition urging the FCC to reject the new limits, which are scheduled to take effect August 1, NABOB contends the agency has offered no evidence to support its claim that relaxing the national and local ownership limits will help the troubled radio business

"The Commission is attempting to put 'the cart before the horse,' NABOB claimed. "First, it proposes to radically change its local and national ownership rules, and then it will find out if there is any record which could justify such action." In fact, the petition states, the rules will actually hurt most small broadcasters, many of whom are minorities, by allowing wellheeled groups to snap up the most desirable small properties. That would, in turn, make it more difficult for other small broadcasters to NABOB/See Page 30

FCC Set To Approve Hoax Rule

The FCC is expected to approve a plan this week to fine broadcast stations for airing hoaxes that result in public harm.

According to sources, the pending rule will allow the Commission to levy monetary penalties against stations that knowingly air false reports of "crimes or catastrophes." In order for the Commission to take action, the bogus broadcast must actually result in "substantial public harm" – harm that could have been "reasonably foreseen" by the licensee.

A licensee will be held responsible for such a broadcast even if it was made without management's knowledge. The commissioners will vote on the proposal at Thursday's (5/14) monthly public meeting. Levy Amounts Unknown

Under the proposed rule, "public harm" is defined as destruction of property, endangerment of the public health and safety, or diversion of law enforcement officials from their duties. The Commission has not yet addressed the issue of how much stations would be fined. One senior staffer suggested the levies will probably be similar to those imposed for indecency: currently a \$12,500 base fine that can be adjusted up or down as circumstances warrant.

The new hoax rule was prompted by a spate of headline-grabbing episodes during the past year, including KROQ/Los Angeles's admission that it fabricated an on-air murder confession and KSHE/St. Louis's broadcast of a phony nuclear attack warning.

The FCC currently deals with such incidents by applying its "War of the Worlds" policy, which bars fake newscasts or other "scare announcements" that divert public safety officials from their duties. Violation of that policy is punishable by one of two sanctions: license revocation or letter of reprimand. (KSHE was fined \$25,000 for violation of a separate rule prohibiting the broadcast of fake distress calls.)

According to Commission sources, Chairman Al Sikes has been the driving force behind the new rule.

Former KRLD GM Opposes CF Media Deals

Former KRLD/Dallas VP/GM Michael Ewing has asked the FCC to probe Robert F.X. Sillerman's finances and deny his \$100 million in station trades to create CF Media.

Ewing wants the Commission to investigate whether CF Media correctly certified in its applications that it had financing in place to acquire the eight stations, since letters of intent filed with the FCC refer to "obtaining adequate financing." The petition also calls for Sillerman to identify his non-attributable money sources "who will be providing virtually all of the funds to finance the acquisitions." Finally, Ewing charges that Sillerman's history of station trading has been to treat broadcast stations like "grain futures" with no regard for serving the public interest.

"It's obviously not true," Sillerman told **R&R** when asked if he had submitted a false financial certification. Sillerman termed the petition "completely groundless" and said he was "very disappointed that a former employee would do this."

Ewing painted a picture of Sillerman squeezing pennies out of KRLD while billing the station for posh living. He also noted:
The station "refused to make a competitive bid" and lost the Dallas Cowboys radio rights after

17 years.
KRLD missed an opportunity to pick up the Texas Rangers "because of a bad credit reputation and Sillerman not 'checking out' " with the team's owners.

• He had "no promotion/advertising budget... trying to compete in a market where major stations spend \$1 million+ a year" and that equipment was "in constant need of repair."

• He questioned a \$50,000 payment to Sillerman for expenses and noted that on one four-day visit to Dallas Sillerman charged \$7500 in hotel and food bills to the station.

'Spurious Attempt'

In CF Media's formal reply, the company charged that Ewing's petition was "a spurious attempt at personal vindication for Mr. Ewing's termination as General Manager of KRLD." It called for the FCC to reject the "obstructionist and baseless petition" and said Ewing didn't even have standing to file since KRLD isn't one of the stations involved.

Under the proposed deals, KRLD owner Command Communications would sell KJQY/San Diego and KODA/Houston to CF Media. Six other stations would be acquired from two other Sillerman-related companies, Capstar Communications and Force II Inc.

Although CF Media's financial structure is not unusual for large Wall Street radio deals, there appears to be growing concern at the FCC about proposed sales that don't close. One recent example was Force II's collapsed deal to buy three stations from Edens Broadcasting. "Maybe it's time to take another look at our certification procedures," suggested one high-ranking FCC insider.

In a formal declaration, Sillerman stated he had sufficient commitments from institutional lenders when the CF Media deals were filed, and that none of the financial sources will have "any right of active participation" in station operations.

Iorida broadcasting tycoon Lowell "Bud" Paxson has agreed to buy 63% majority control of publicly traded radio programmer **TM Century Inc.** as a prelude to listing his rapidly expanding **Paxson Broadcasting** chain on public financial markets.

TM supplies programming and services to 5700 radio stations worldwide. CEO David Scott said deal terms were not disclosed, pending a formal SEC filing later this week. Glenn Serafin of Communications Equity Associates brokered the transaction on behalf of Paxson. TM common stock, which is traded on NASDAQ, closed Tuesday at \$1.25 per share.

"TM Century's business is so closely related to the radio industry that it offers a unique platform from which to [build] a company that owns and operates radio stations and also provides programming and a full range of audio products and services nationwide," Paxson commented in a prepared statement. He added that Scott and other officers will continue in their positions at TM's Dallas headquarters.

Since TM stock is already traded on the NASDAQ stock market, the maneuver allows Paxson to "go public" immediately and bypass expensive SEC registration. Paxson is no stranger to the benefits of a public market — he made millions after founding **Home Shopping Network** and turning it into one of the hottest stocks on Wall Street. Paxson recently left HSN and returned to radio. He's purchased several Florida stations, including **WROO/Jacksonville**, **WINZ & WZTA/Miami**, **WWNZ & WZTU/Orlando**, and **WHNZ & WHPT/Tampa.** A deal to acquire **WNZS/Jacksonville** is pending FCC approval.

Jacor Woes Continue

acor Communications CEO Terry Jacobs is warning shareholders that his company's economic storm has not ended, and heavier weather could loom ahead.

Jacor owes \$115.7 million in senior debt and a subordinated debt of \$22 million. The company's new annual report states that "substantially all of the company's debt is immediately callable or contractually due within the next year."

If the company can't restructure, "it would likely be required to sell additional operating assets or be subject to the foreclosure rights of its existing creditors." The company recently suspended interest payments on its senior debt and retained **Salomon Brothers** to develop a refinancing plan.

Sillerman To Rescue Big Apple AM?

anhattan tycoon **Robert F.X. Sillerman** has told the *New York Post* he may rescue **WNEW (AM)**/ **New York** and thwart a possible sale to Religious broadcaster **Salem Communications**.

Sillerman, whose financial qualifications are being challenged in an FCC proceeding (see adjacent story), owns half of the 50kw AM. He said he might buy the remaining half from co-owner **Westwood One** to preserve the station's low-rated Nostalgia format. "I think the problem isn't with the music, but that the station has been mismanaged," Sillerman insisted. WWI Chairman **Norm Pattiz** declined comment.

In other market action this week:

• A federal judge in Ohio has appointed **Paul Robinson** of **Broadcast Trustee Management Inc.** as receiver of five stations owned by wellknown broadcasters **Theodore Baum, Richard Rakovan**, and **Herbert Roberts.** The stations include WLMX-AM & FM/Rossville, GA; WOMP-AM & FM/Bellaire, OH; and WMFX/St. Andrews, SC. The receivership follows litigation brought by **Central Bank & Trust** over defaulted loans.

• First Union National Bank has foreclosed on S.E. Broadcasting, licensee of WHBS/Eatonville (Orlando), FL, and an Orlando judge has appointed Miami radio broker Julio Rumbaut & Associates as receiver of the 5kw AM station. Rumbaut also has agreed to lease the station for six months from the bank for a monthly time brokerage fee of \$5000.

• Comko Ltd.'s WQQW/Waterbury, CT has gone dark after its principal owners, Richard Barbieri Sr. and John Corpaci, pleaded guilty to federal crimes involving public corruption and real estate scams. Burritt Bank is searching for buyers.

• According to FCC filings, Kalil & Co. will receive \$160,000 for brokering the \$3.75 million sale of EZ Communications' WOKV & WKQL/ Jacksonville, FL to Phalen & Associates.

• San Francisco-based Media Venture Partners broker Elliot Evers has been appointed receiver of KTCJ & KTCZ/Minneapolis and KAHI & KHYL/Sacramento. The FDIC has obtained a \$21.36 million judgment against the licensee, the Parker Companies, and a sale is pending to Art Kern's and Alan Beck's National Radio Partners L.P.

NABOB Members Attack FCC Rules Changes

frican-American station owners lashed out at the FCC's new ownership limits at the National Association of Black Owned Broadcasters' spring meeting at Hilton Head Island, SC (5/7-9). Despite their opposition, NABOB members also discussed how to make use of the relaxed rules to expand their own operations.

KPRS-AM & FM/Kansas City President Mike Carter charged that allowing group owners to own more stations and have multiple stations in a single market will block minorities from buying their first station and make it difficult for existing minority owners to compete. "Are blacks out of radio after my generation? It's the end of Black radio as far as I'm concerned," Carter said.

NABOB Exec. Director/General Counsel James Winston said the rules changes were the actions of an "out-of-control" FCC. Immediately after the meeting, he petitioned the Commission to reconsider its actions. (See related story, Page 1.)


Defending his agency's actions, FCC Mass Media Bureau Deputy Chief Roderick Porter said that owning several stations in a major market wouldn't necessarily give one group control of that market. "But you'd have control of the money," Inner City Broadcasting VP/Corporate Counsel Lois Wright shot back.


'Buy Or Be Bought'

Despite their attacks on the FCC's actions, some NABOB members are exploring ways to use the rules changes and stay competitive in their markets. WWW2/Summerville (Charleston), SC President/ GM Cliff Fletcher said he'd already locked up a popular format to keep it from going to a competitor. "All I need now is a facility to put it on and a bank to lend me the money."

Broker Gary Stevens warned, "We're almost at the point where it's a buy or be bought situation." He took issue with claims that minorities will be cut off from financing under the new rules, insisting that "banks are going to look favorably on deals that make sense."

In an attempt to turn the rules changes to their own advantage, WDKX/Rochester President/GM Andrew Langston suggested that NABOB members team up on a group deal to take to Wall Street. "We should be talking about \$500 million. That would get attention."

TERMS: The buyer has agreed to pay \$12 million in cash to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp., in its capacity as receiver for the New Bank of New England, to acquire its position as a \$21.36 million judgment creditor of the seller. The buyer also has agreed to purchase the creditor's position of several subordinated debt holders for \$750,000 in cash. The buyer agrees to pay \$75,000 to the seller's Minneapolis subsidiary for payment of a like amount of its accounts payable. In addition, the buyer will pay the seller an additional \$1.2 million in cash. 

remiere Radio Networks (NASDAQ: PRNI) reported a '92 first quarter net income of \$206,500 (10 cents per share), compared to a \$33,100 loss (two cents) during the same period last year. Revenues were \$2 million versus \$1.4 million in first quarter '91



syndicated programming, the operation of radio stations and related businesses, the expansion of Premiere Marketing Promotions, and capital expenditures

eritage Media (AMEX: HTG) disclosed a first quarter net loss of \$7.2 million (88 cents a share), versus a net loss of \$5.7 million (65 cents) in '91. Revenues were \$52.4 million, up from \$51.4 million last year.

The company reported radio station revenues of \$3.6 million in the first quarter of this year, compared to \$3.1 million a year ago. The radio division's first quarter operating cash flow improved 34% to \$540,000 this year. Heritage owns 10 stations in five markets.

nfinity Broadcasting (NASDAQ: INFTA) posted a net oss of \$22.8 million (\$1.67 a share) in the first quarter, compared to a \$14.8 million loss (\$3.60) last year on revenues of \$26.6 million, up slightly from \$25.4 million in 1991. The company absorbed an extraordinary charge of \$8.3 million in the first quarter in order to redeem 14.25% bonds.

Infinity owns 19 stations in 12 markets, including WFAN/New York, which is excluded from the current results.

iacom Inc. (AMEX: VIA and VIAB) reported net earnings of \$7.1 million (six cents a share) in the first quarter, compared to a \$3.7 million loss (three cents) last year. First quarter revenues rose from \$407.2 million last year to \$430.6 million.





Showing workers how to do something isn't enough - instead, motivate them to "learn by doing." Your confidence in them will strengthen their company loyalty, job performance, and personal morale

Beware: Don't create an intimidating environment. Once you give workers the necessary tools to succeed, step back and judge results not how they were achieved.

Inspiring

Beyond fact and rationale, this method of teaching adds purpose to an employee's hard work. Supervisors need to express the company's hopes and dreams, then guide workers toward those goals.

If workers share the organization's aspirations, they'll strive for excellence. They'll also feel rewarded once their hard work finally comes to fruition.

Encouraging 'Ownership'

Performance excels when employees equate the company's growth with their own. Once workers realize their decisions affect the organization and themselves, they're more likely to feel an integral part of the company.

Managers can promote this sense of "ownership" by taking the following four steps

- · Forming small problemsolving teams
- Encouraging suggestions from all workers
- · Leaving room for employees to work their own way
- Rewarding accomplishments, not compliance.

Money Doesn't Buy Loyalty

oney doesn't buy happiness, and it doesn't buy employee loyalty, either. According to Rittman, OH-based management consultant Roger Herman, a pay hike might keep an unhappy employee from quitting, but it won't make this person lose those negative feelings about the iob.

Instead of offering a raise, find out what's troubling the dissatisfied employee, then try to remedy the problem. Workers who are motivated only by their paychecks eventually will leave no matter how much you're paying them. Meanwhile, their negative attitudes may taint office morale.

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
How To Reprimand Today's **Employees More Effectively**

hen you're forced to reprimand errant employees, the first thing to remember is never to let them see you smile. Smiling indicates approval, and that's not what you want to project. Here are four more tips to make your disciplinary actions more effec-

- · Reprimand a worker as quickly as possible after the infraction occurs.
- · Be specific when pointing out problems; explain exactly how someone fell short of expectations.
- · Make sure the reprimanded worker understands that you're criticizing one particular action - not his or her work in general.
- · Once the reprimand is given, don't dwell on the problem; try getting back to work instead.





The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reports that American households spent an average of \$2485 in the at-home food category a 5.3% increase from 1988.

Meanwhile, spending on foods away from home averaged \$1811

per household - up 1.7% from '88. All told, food and beverage outlays accounted for 16% of consumer spending in 1990.

Meat & Potatoes

Flesh products devoured the lion's share of food shoppers' dollars in '90 (the last year for which figures are available), with the average household spending some \$668 on meat, poultry, fish, and eggs.

running with a full head of steam. According to NYC-based Shanken Communications, 1990 U.S. beer sales reached \$34 billion - up 2.8% from the previous year - the best showing since 1980.

Brewed In The U.S.A.

Incidentally, sales of American beers increased at a higher rate than imports (2.8% to 1.4%) for the first time ever.

Meanwhile, exports of American beers also rose 28%, paced by a 73% surge in Japan. Back in the U.S.A., Anheuser-Busch still taps the largest share of market, accounting for 45.8% of all sales.

Draft Coming On

Beers with "draft" or "dry" on their labels are the hot trend right now. After only one year on the market. "Bud Dry Draft" and "Busch Light Draft" are among America's Top 15 brands.

As the popularity of "original" beers go into a tailspin - sales of Budweiser, Miller, Coors, Old Style, and Strohs all decreased in light beers and premium 1990 beers continue to prosper. By the end of the decade, they are expected to account for at least two out of every three beers sold.

Fruits and vegetables finished in second place (\$408), followed by cereal and bakery items (\$368), and dairy products (\$295). American households spent an additional average of \$84 on combinations (canned, frozen, and prepared meals) selected from these main categories.



Covering 209 markets, the study compiles time-spent-with-media data from Simmons, Nielsen, the Audit Bureau Of Circulation, and Arbitron.

Incidentally, Miami/Ft. Lauderdale; Odessa/Midland, TX; and Providence are the top three radio markets in terms of time spent listening.



U.S. Celebrates Tax Freedom Day

inco de Mayo may be a Mexican holiday, but this year. May 5 was a time for Americans to rejoice as well. According to the NYC-based Roper Organization, May 5 marked 1992's Tax Freedom Day – the day on which the average U.S. citizen has earned enough money to satisfy all of his tax obligations for the entire vear

The Bad News

This year, roughly 35% of the average worker's salary - or \$6000 for every man, woman, and child in the country – will go toward paying taxes. In comparison, 1929's Tax Freedom Day fell on February 9 and accounted for just 11% of the average citizen's earnings.

Taxes are growing fastest at the state and local levels. In the last three years, 31 states have raised their taxes.

The Good News

Meanwhile, the percentage of audited federal income tax returns has been steadily dropping, from 2.3% in 1975 to just 0.8% in 1990. However, the more you make,

the more reason you have to worry individuals earning \$100,000 or more are almost 10 times likelier to go one-on-one with the IRS than those who make \$25,000 or less.

JUICE MONEY 'New Age' Drink Sales Rebound

uice sparklers, gourmet sodas, and flavor-essence waters (aka "new age" drinks) are making a commercial rebound, according to the NYC-based Packaged Facts research firm.

After coming on strong in '87 (with a effervescent 83% growth increase), the product category stalled in 1990, its growth rate stunted at 8%

However, perhaps owing to consumers' increased health concerns and appreciation for "natural" ingredients, sales surged 13% during recession-plagued 1991 and are expected to remain at that level for the next four years.

DC AM Mayhem

Cook inlet CHR WPGC/DC pulled toprated morning host Robin Breedon off the air Monday (5/11) after she turned down the station's "final" contract offer. Breedon's current contract - which reportedly pays her a base salary of \$185,000 - expires Friday (5/14)

According to a press release issued by 'PGC VP/GM Ben Hill, Breedon rejected a new deal that would have paid her an average base of \$195,000 (plus bonuses of up to an additional \$355,000) over two years.

However, Breedon's lawyer Leslie Fein fired off a press release of his own, claiming Breedon would have to be No. 1 for eight consecutive books before she'd earn the money mentioned in Hill's release. Even then, according to Fein, Breedon would still make less than other DC morning personalities with lower ratings.

QUESTIONS WITH... Gordon Hastings New President, Katz Radio Group

Group (R&R 4/3). Prior to his return, he had exited the rep business in 1986 to buy a small market station group in upstate New York. Shortly after beginning his new post, Hastings was interviewed by R&R Assistant Editor Jack Messmer.

: Did your experience as an owner change your attitudes about this business?

A : I have acquired a great understanding of what owner/operators are going through. Our business has changed dramatically: economics, radio property valuations, and relationships with lending institutions. The competitive environment has also changed from a regulatory standpoint. To top it all off we've been in the teeth of a tough economic recession during the last two years.

: In the last few months, the rep business has been hurt even more than local radio by the advertising slump. How will you help Katz overcome that?

A: KRG is extremely well-organized to maximize its effectiveness for existing clients. The situation we're facing now is that we're selling more units than we have ever sold, and we're moving more units than we have ever sold through KRG. Unfortunately, the cost per points in the major markets – and really across [all] marketplaces – have been pushed downward by economic conditions in the country and within the business.

Even though KRG's total share of [national spot] dollars is up two points for the first quarter, total sales across our group of companies are down three percent. I don't think there's anything wrong with the machinery, the effectiveness of the sales organization, or the way it's structured. The major thing that's going to turn around the national spot radio business is obvious. We have to create through a turnaround in the economy, combined with an allout effort - more pressure against radio's inventory.


: How do you create that pressure?

Q

A : n try : It's time for the indusbasically now comprised of KRG, Interep, and CBS Radio Spot Sales - to step up to a higher level of selling and collaborate in a unified effort to bring more national radio dollars into the marketplace. To that end, I've had preliminary conversations with Interep [Chairman] Ralph Guild. I'm scheduled to meet with CBS Radio [President] Nancy Widmann in order to see how the three of us can work together to target some 25-30 major nonusers of radio. We need to combine our very best marketing/ management people and resources, and literally divvy up these major accounts by building teams that cross over the three firms. Then we can educate them about radio: selling it, getting an order, and executing campaigns.


A : You're correct, although I'm not exactly sure what the relationships have been in the past. I would like to look upon this as a new beginning and a higher order of opportunity for the industry. Of course we have self-serving interests, because a share of every new dollar we bring into radio is going to filter through the Katz Radio Group and, most importantly, to our represented stations. But remember, the underlying benefit is that the more pressure on inventory, the greater the value of the inventory. So we can help reverse this serious downward pressure on rating point costs.

: What's been the reaction from the other rep firms?


A : The reaction from Interep's Guild and [President] Les Goldberg has been very positive. I have the highest respect for Interep's Radio 2000 concept. They've taken a great initiative. CBS Radio Spot Sales has always been an organization that's had the ability and resources to make calls above and beyond answering the "bell of avails." I greatly respect both organizations and, needless to say, I have the greatest of all respect for KRG and its marketing organization.

: You have a new business development team at Katz, and you mentioned Radio 2000. Have those efforts paid off yet?

: I can only speak for the Katz Radio Group directly and its enormously successful campaign for Bacardi Breezers. I also can refer to a very successful sale we just made with Best Western Motels. These are two recent examples that roll into the millions of dollars. It's interesting that the Bacardi campaign was a cross-media campaign. There may be an even greater opportunity down the road to present major advertisers with plans [multimedia] advertising for and promotion. But my immediate goal is to have Interep, Katz, and CBS pool their resources and take a giant step forward to sell this enormously successful results-oriented medium called radio.




A : The dollar goal is something that has to evolve. It cannot be established until we come to a meeting of the minds on exactly who the target list should be. It's going to be a combination of bringing advertisers back to radio and selling new advertisers on radio. I would hope the attitude of this group would be one order at a time, one success at a time.



: It can have an enormous impact, because it undoubtedly is going to cause movement of the players on that great rep chessboard. I know the Katz Radio Group is postured economically and organizationally to respond to our clients' changing needs.

We have no inside information as to which of our groups may be buyers and which may be sellers. We can only speculate on that. Once those chessboard moves have been made, our business plan is in place to

Under the new ownership rules, a single licensee could own up to 30 AM and 30 FM stations nationwide (up from the current 12-12 limit) and as many as six stations in a single market (R&R 3/20).

NABOB also argues that the Commission's decision not to include minority ownership incentives in the new rules constitutes a violation of a 1987 act of Congress. which ordered the FCC to retain all of its minority ownership policies. Under the current rules, a broadcaster is permitted to own up to 14 stations per service as long as the additional properties are controlled by minority investors. That provision is not included in the new rules.

In a final jab at the Commission, NABOB accuses the agency of 'pursuing a political agenda" and failing to "rationally consider the issues" in its decision to revamp the ownership rules. As a result, the group says the new rules bear "an insidious odor of unfair dealing.



"An Evening With The Allman Brothers Band – First Set" is the first of two such projects – and the first official Allmans live set since 1971's classic "Live At Fillmore East."

Recorded in Boston and NYC, the nine-song Epic disc spans more than 72 minutes. Among the tunes are "End Of The Line," "Blue Sky," "Dreams," "Southbound," "Revival," "Get On With Your Life," and Blind Willie McTell's "Midnight Blues." An acoustic version of "Melissa" goes to radio June 2. The set hits the stores June 9.

Lobos Con 'Kiko'

The forthcoming Los Lobos record will be titled "Kiko." The band produced the Slash/WB set with Mitchell Froom. Among its 16 tracks are "Dream In Blue," "Short Side Of Nothing," "Kiko And The Lavender Moon," and "Riva's House," which goes to radio June 2. The album arrives May 26.

ELP Return

Emerson, Lake & Palmer return with "Black Moon," the trio's first Victory/PLG release. Producer Mark Mancina wrote the cut "Burning Bridges," and the band wrote everything else, save an adaptation of Prokofiev's "Romeo And Juliet." Other tunes include "Paper Blood," "Farewell To Arms," and "Footprints In The Snow." The title track goes to radio May 25. The LP will be in stores June 9.

Erasure Does Abba

Erasure's four-track EP of Abba covers – set for a June 1 UK release – will include "Voulez Vous," "Take A Chance On Me," "Lay All Your Love On Me," and "SOS" (ROL).

KLF Call It Quits?

The KLF reportedly have disbanded. According to ROL, Bill Drummond and Jimmy Cauty shuttered their firm, KLF Communications, and had all the KLF records deleted. A spokesman assured UK's Radio 1 that the duo will "definitely still be working together.... There's not musical differences, they're still friends, but they're packing it all in."

Troggs Tapes Coming To CD

The Troggs are making excerpts of the infamous outtakes known as the "Troggs Tapes" available on CD for the first time. ROL reports that 11 minutes of the salty latenight studio talk will be available with a limited number of copies of the next UK single from "Athens/ Andover," the album Reg Presley and company recorded in Georgia with R.E.M.

The vinyl seven-inch will be a "double A-side" ("Together" b/w "Crazy Annie"); the CD single will sport a third track, "Tuned Into Love." Rhino will release the full "Athens/Andover" disc stateside on June 23.



FROM THE MAILBAG

College Instructor Challenges His Peers

Rummaging through my bulging postal sack, I chanced upon three intriguing communiques.

For too long now, college radio has been considered a joke by many broadcast professionals. This impression is not unjustified; it has, in fact, been earned by many college radio programs.

My opinions of college radio have been formed after attending many "educational" broadcasting conferences and "professional" conferences. The latter have been the most valuable by far, to myself and to my students.

Whenever you have a group of broadcast educators together, the topics always focus on their inability to keep up with the industry owing to "tight" budgets, on their responsibility to teach the "theories" of broadcasting and leave the "button-pushing" stuff to be learned after entering the industry, and on how wonderful internships are for the students.

If the college radio program cannot keep up with the industry, it should no longer promote itself as providing a quality education to its students. -Jon Burlew

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99 These common topics of discussion are not valid philosophies of broadcast education; instead, they

are rationalizations for broadcast education programs that are not practical and are not producing a marketable product.

The whole problem began back in the dawning ages of broadcast education, when some twit decided that the purpose of college radio stations was to provide a programming alternative to their markets.

The No. 1 priority of college programs should be to fulfill the needs

of the broadcast industry and provide a product that is marketable to the industry upon graduation. Students are not receiving a quality education if all they are learning is broadcast law, broadcast ethics, or how to bring in satellite programming.

Broadcasting students should be trained on state-of-the-art equipment; they should be working on a broadcast facility; they should know how to operate a production room: they should be on the air several times a week, running a live show. Anything less than providing the students with the training and education they need to qualify for at least an entry-level position is cheating the student and the broadcast industry.

Budgets are tight and getting tighter. But new equipment pays for itself in increased enrollment and placement of students. If the program cannot keep up with the industry, it should no longer promote itself as providing a quality education to its students.

Klunk Job Letter Of The Week

ach time I reprint an incredibly inept job-seeker's cover letter (taking care to omit any information that might reveal the writer's identity), I think, "Well, that's it. We've seen and reprinted it all."

And then some head-shaking, tongue-clucking PD sends me a new one.

This week's letter was forwarded by Russ Shaler, OM at WKSW-FM/ Urbana, IL. It runs four singlespaced pages. Here are just a few brief excerpts. Would you hire someone with this guy's attitude?

After years of upper management abuse and neglect, the failing economy has now brought the station to further crisis, and more layoffs are coming . . .

I'm a non-smoker, so I do not endanger the health of my coworkers or shorten the life span of equipment .

I'm a vociferous anti-smoker but even I know enough not to go out of my way to antagonize a prospective employer who might be saddled with that filthy habit!

Programming Philosophy And View Of Country Radio: Thanks to a combination of fear, ignorance, conformity, and faulty logic on the part of programmers, and political intrique on the part of record labels and trade magazines, the format is sterile and repetitious. Highly researched, hit-style radio is incompatible with the culture that genuine country music creates

The Country format is also plagued by a glut of personr el with CHR. hard rock. and vcungerskewed AC backgrounds who haven't gotten used to the fact that they are now in a different culture

Good luck getting a job from the former CHR/AC/Rock PD who's reviewing your package!

Outside Programming Consultants: I strongly prefer not to work with them. They waste valuable station financial resources that are best used elsewhere. Furthermore. I have yet to find one that knows as much about the format as I do .

Russ received this letter several months ago. But if you're looking for a jock, I have a hunch this guy might still be available

Signing Away Your Rights

The person who sent this next letter in wishes to remain anonymous, but the issue is so broad in its application, he might be any air personality.

There's something I've just come across on standard job application forms sent to me by two respectable medium market radio stations. The last paragraph says I am applying for "at will" employment and "at will" only ... that the employment can be terminated

with or without cause, with or without notice . . . and that no part of this agreement can be altered except by approval of the president of the corporation.

I had never run into this before, but it strikes me as the kind of arrangement one makes if one is taking a job with one's local burger joint and not if one is a broadcast professional.

In all likelihood. I would be dealing with the PD or GM. If we agree to a contract (oral or written) that requires notice or cause for dismissal but has not been approved by the president, then I really have no contract at all. Wouldn't I somehow have to get the station to agree that any agreement we arrive at would specifically void previous agreements?

This is a weasel clause if ever Γve heard of one. The station is asking you to give up all of your rights before they'll even let you

apply for a job. The good news: You don't have to accept the terms of this clause.

From a strictly legalistic viewpoint, I suspect that one could challenge the at will application clause on the grounds that a job application is not a contract. For a contract to be legally enforceable, it must be shown that each side gave consideration to the other; e.g., labor in exchange for money.

If the issue ever went to court, I suppose the station could try to convince a judge that simply accepting your tape and resume constitutes consideration - a lame suggestion that seems laughable on its face. (In reviewing tapes and resumes, the station is simply acting on its own need to locate new employees.)

Ironically, even if a station were successful in selling this flimsy legal construct, it probably would be tripped up by the fact that you didn't provide them with consideration (no labor, talent, expertise, etc. - except, of course, for the cassette they've recycled in the production room).

Realistically, however, you have no desire to end up in court. Thus, you have four clear choices:

· Send your tape and resume without enclosing the formal application form and, if the PD questions its absence, plead absentmindedness and move on to one of the following choices.

• Cross out, initial, and date the offending line in the agreement before returning it to the station.

 Sign the application agreement but, in the event you're offered a job, do not accept it until the agreement (whether oral or written) is approved in writing by the corporation president. (Presumably, the terms of your employment are less barbaric than those suggested in the employment application.)

• Sign the application agreement, accept the job offer, and take the PD's word for it when he says, "Oh, don't worry - the company would never try to hold you to that at will stuff," and return to your daily routine of believing every word spoken by politicians, junk bond salesmen, and disc jockeys discussing their salaries.

Everything else being equal, it's probably best to choose the third option. Statistically speaking, you're unlikely to get the job anyway, so why wage war over a clause that will probably have no effect on you? Wait until they actually propose marriage before you insist that the prenuptial agreement be supplanted by a more rational mutual understanding.

WKSE Wings To Buffalo's Top Spot

Emphasis on cume, females, and staff visibility knocks off Country rival

OM Mike Edwards has kept mainstream CHR WKSE/Buffalo near the top of the market consistently since Winter '91 (with some help from Alan Burns & Associates). He's finally achieved the Arbitron book he's been working toward . . . market dominance.

WKSE rose 8.4-9.8 in the Winter '91 book to edge out Country WYRK, which obligingly slid 10.8-9.6. Not only was WKSE tops in 12+ AQH this winter, it also dominated in:

- Cume
- Teens
- 18-34 Adults (second
- consecutive book) • 18-49 Adults
- 25-34 Women

Furthermore, WKSE ranked third among women 25-54 and sixth among 25-54s.

Management/Sales Support

Edwards, who joined WKSE in summer 1989 (coming from the PD post at WDCG (G105)/Durham-Raleigh), gave a lot of credit to the entire staff for the win, but he singled out management and sales for their support. "Having both departments in your corner is invaluable, as they've given us the goahead to win the 18-34 demos. At one time the CHR format and this station were pronounced dead by the previous management.

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If your GM supports the programming, it's much easier to focus on your goals, rather than worrying whether all of your hard work will go down the drain with a format change.

"Personally, I've never given up on CHR. It's been shaky at times, and we've had spurts of bad music, but if you have a GM like **Darrel Goodin**, who supports the programming — and the sales staff supports his position — it's much easier to focus on your goals, rather than worrying whether all of your hard work will go down the drain with a format change.

"We'd all love to have No. 1 25-54 numbers, but instead of browbeating ourselves into trying for something that may be unattainable, we've found other ways to make the bucks we need in the demos we're able to successfully deliver. As a result, the sales staff has been stable, which adds a lot of overall financial stability. In the first quar-

ter of '92, WKSE was the top-billing station in Buffalo – which is really unheard-of for a CHR these days."

Commenting on the local climate, Edwards explained, "While it has been tougher than normal, the economy really hasn't been as bad as in other parts of the Northeast, because Buffalo is on the Canadian border. Every weekend, charter buses transport Canadians from Toronto, Hamilton, and St. Catherines over here to shop. Prices are cheaper, and so are the taxes."

Sticking To The Target

Edwards reasoned that "Kiss 98.5, the No. 1 hit music station" (WKSE's sole identifier) "leans toward the dance/pop side because that's what the market — and more specifically, our target wants to hear. We've already got a great AOR in town, WGRF, which targets males and, to a much lesser degree, females.

"However, females are our only target. Right now, those females prefer music with a pop or dance edge. Street rap is not acceptable, but a record like Kris Kross's 'Jump' will get played at night. By the same token, the Def Leppard single, "Let's Get Rocked," isn't for us. The females aren't really that interested in rock & roll. Queen's 'Bohemian Rhapsody' is a major exception, due to the movie 'Wayne's World.""

But you can't make it on music alone. Many of the adult demos GMs crave come from the morning show. So when Rocky Allen left WKSE to join WPLJ/New York in late 1990, Edwards had to find a killer replacement. Predictably, the morning numbers deteriorated after Allen's departure. But Edwards found Sam Malone doing

wakeup service at then-CHR WSRZ/Sarasota, FL and signed him on in October 1990. WKSE has since made impressive gains in mornings.

Providing Compelling Reasons To Listen

KSE PD **Mike Edwards** seems to be bucking a few programming trends — and that seems to be paying off for the station.

He remarked, "A first-time listener would find our energy the most compelling thing about our station and our air personalities. Kiss is a highly produced station. Using only two dead segues an hour, the rest of the time we use jocks, jingles, and sweepers to really keep the flow.

"WKSE is a big success because we're cume-driven, not TSL-driven like many of our peers. Our goal is to get as many bodies as we can to tune in, and then the product takes over to generate the TSL. You should always be in a cume-building mode for our female core. We don't include men in the callouts, so we dominate among females in the market.

"We do a great deal of research, and we're doing real well even as others aren't — despite intensive research. In a market where there used to be several CHRs, we have no direct CHR competition anymore. But with one of the better AORs in the country here in **WGRF**, a strong Country outlet in **WYRK**, and a lot of other competitive radio in this city, the entire market is now our competition."

Building Mornings

"Sam is now No. 3 in mornings behind Country WYRK and AM Full-Service WBEN. In hiring him, we made it a point that he be very visible. So when he first arrived we'd throw him in a limo and send him to restaurants where women 18-34 dine. Malone would show up, introduce himself, and pay for their lunch. It cost about \$100 a week, but they'd tell all of their friends and co-workers about it, and the word spread like crazy.

"Then we developed 'Office Feud,' a contest where Sam pits two offices against each other at 8:45am. Each player has to name five things in a category in 10 seconds; the winner of three out of five rounds wins an office party at a club or restaurant, with Sam as the host. Each week Sam interacts with a minimum of 100 people on a personal basis and is seen by hundreds more at his appearances. It's good old-fashioned get-out-andmeet-people politicking for support.

"In addition to all of the bits and stuff, Sam is a genuinely quickwitted, real person who gets the music in and doesn't turn the show into a talk show. His 'Seeeyaaaaaaaaaa,' which you may have heard others use, was originally

his. People use it everywhere now.

Edwards also talked about the contributions of sidekick/news personality Maria Todd. "Maria and the Wease really round things out for Sam. Maria handles news twice an hour for two minutes at a time and adds a lot of the fun to the show

'We often throw the Wease into the van for a stunt. Recently, when [Democratic presidential candidate] Bill Clinton was in town to speak at a college, the Wease went out and tried to get Clinton to say 'Hi' to Sam Malone. All he ended up accomplishing was getting himself pinned up against the wall by the Secret Service. We heard it happen live on the air."

WKSE extends certain morning services into other dayparts, where needed. "We only do traffic reports in morning drive," explained Edwards. "The afternoon rush is kind of spread out." While a number of CHRs hardly even give the time anymore outside of morning drive, Edwards maintained, "It's important to give the time in afternoons as well; it's a good service. We also update the weather hourly, because it can change pretty rapidly. These are some basics I just don't hear on the radio anymore.

Mobilized Airstaff

"For the most part," continued Edwards, "our airstaff is pretty stable compared to many CHRs. Midday personality Liz Michaels has been in that slot less than a year, having come in from WZOK/ Rockford. Afternooner Mike McGowan is one of our mainstays: He's been here for seven years and

is an incredibly talented performer. About 18 months ago we moved overnighter Donnie Walker to nights, and weekender Ken Casey advanced to overnights. We value everyone's contributions in every shift.

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"The entire airstaff is mobilized on a constant basis. This city has a very active nightlife. It's a rowdy town. More than a handful of highly successful clubs want our jocks there, and we want to be there as well. Every Friday night, 'Club Kiss' - which rotates from club to club - hits the air at 11pm. We mix in some currents and club-only material 'til 3am; the clubs are open until 4am.

"Outside of mornings, we also push our people to be personalities

within the format. We ask for creativity - instead of word-for-word during the five to six liners breaks an hour that aren't locked into specific formatic elements. We're carrying 10 units an hour when sold-out, and at a minimum we run a 30-minute music sweep hourly. On hours where we have a lighter load, we'll double it to two 30-minute sweeps and the stopsets will shift slightly by a few minutes to accommodate.

Attack Yourself

Promotionally, WKSE didn't do TV until March, when it was targeted toward the spring book. Ed-wards added, "Aside from 'Club Kiss,' we did a snow-sculpting competition, covered almost all of the movie premieres and core artist concerts, and had Sam host a monthly 'Up Downtown' party at the convention center to bring people back downtown for shopping. We did nothing really out of the ordinary.

"Kiss 98.5 has been able to maintain top-of-mind awareness because of our overall visibility, which is boosted each year when we rejuvenate our bumper sticker campaign. In essence, we're always attacking ourselves - just as if someone is chasing us. It's better that we do it before they get a chance to do it to us.'

Los Angeles Changes in A Big Way

Results from Arbitron's first batch of winter books have three Bonneville AC programmers beaming.

It was inevitable: Though it stretched back to 1988, the No. 1 25-54 winning streak at Cox powerhouse KOST/Los Angeles had to snap eventually. The end came this winter when format foe KBIG (Big Mix 104) broke KOST's enviable record, even nabbing L.A.'s 35-64 crown in the process.

"KOST's still a formidable competitor and won't simply go away," noted KBIG VP/Programming **Rob Edwards**. "I give them lots of credit for their hard work over the years, but I give us credit, too. Many little things came together for us this winter."

Telemarketing, TV Key

Edwards explained, "We did an extensive winter telemarketing pro (ram. Our aggressive TV campaig,n really paid off, as well. A new TV spot had a long-term run through the winter book, which helped a lot."

While off-air strategies (TV, telemarketing) were instrumental to

KBIG's gains. the station employed no major on-air changes. "We've always had solid product acceptance," Edwards commented. "Once people find us, they like us. That's been the case the last three years. Now we have to keep these 'new' people."

Not surprisingly, women clearly hold the key to KBIG's ratings strength. "We're No. 1 with women 18+, 18-49, 25-54, 35-54, and 35-64," boasted Edwards. "In the winter book, our gains were in areas where KOST lost. We really pulled ahead [of KOST among 25-54s]. It also appears KOST didn't do well in Orange County."

Edwards candidly stated that KBIG and KOST are the market's two "major AC players." Concerning fellow AC KLIT, Edwards said, "KLIT's hung in for a long time. Frankly, I expected them to make a format change last year. In a market like this, though, the challenge is what format do you change to? KLIT may be questioning

where they may go, because all the niches in Los Angeles appear to be taken."

Around The Dial

The market's Oldies battle also heated up, with **KCBS-FM** increasing 0.2 from last winter (25-54) and **KRTH** advancing 0.7. Edwards, however, downplays the impact of these stations on KBIG. "Their audience is more male-oriented. I don't see our female-skewed listeners going to Oldies stations in big numbers."

KBIG and KOST had identical 25-54 morning drive shares: KBIG's Bill & Sylvia were up 0.2 from last winter, while KOST's Mark & Kim dipped 1.4. Posting a modest 0.2 gain from last winter, AOR KLOS holds a two-one 25-54 morning drive advantage over KBIG and KOST with its vaunted team of Mark & Brian. The always colorful Howard Stern notched the biggest 25-54 morning drive gain on Classic Rocker KLSX, more than doubling last winter's stats with a 2.7 jump. Edwards noted, "KLSX's gains weren't surprising, because the buzz has been that Stern's continuing to pick up audience."

Status Quo

Though he's obviously elated about the winter numbers, Edwards pointed out, "A station's already into another book when it gets information from the previous one. This business is much too volatile, so I don't like making predictions. We want to maintain the product level and will make no major changes — only refinements. Our marketing will still be aggressive."

Regarding KOST, Edwards predicted that if any changes are made, they'd be in marketing. "KOST has a high loyalty factor among its listeners, and a programmer doesn't want to make changes that will upset that audience. KOST could increase its marketing, but I don't think it will make any on-air changes."

KOST PD Jhani Kaye declined to comment on his station's winter book performance.

KOIT Survives Month Of 'Hell'

P placing second 25-54 and third 35-64, KOIT/San Francisco rebounded this winter from its recent ratings doldrums in convincing fashion. KOIT's move was the market's second-best winter-winter Arbitron 25-54 improvement, eclipsed only by Talk KNBR's 1.5 increase.

"Somewhere in every station's history, a PD gets the 'month from hell,' and we got ours last October." lamented KOIT VP/Programming **Suzy Mayzel**. "Up until then, we'd been very consistent. The trends and our research indicated everything was positive about the station. We didn't repackage KOIT in the winter, but we wanted to make it a bit fresher."

Production Elements Added

One of the things that made KOIT so distinctive when it bowed approximately six years ago was the lack of produced bells and whistles. But times have changed. Mayzel remarked, "We've added jingles to make the station more interesting. Also, we're doing a music-related contest — the Song of the Day. Hopefully, our presentation of it is done in a mature way, The station's become more interesting and captivating."

Los Angeles and New York notwithstanding, San Francisco's radio wars are possibly the country's most ferocious. Consequently, Mayzel maintains an eagle-eye on the music logs. "I'm constantly worried about burn. People can hear a song from everywhere. At any given time, eight or nine stations in the Bay Area are playing the same basic music.

"I'm a nut with music rotations. After my assistant's done working on the music, I circle anything I

think will be a problem. The computer can only do so much: I have to sing each hour's music in my head to make sure it will sound right. In a format like this, flow is everything."

Environmentally Sound

Among local format competitors are KIOI (K-101) and KABL. Mayzel asserted, "KABL seems to be trying to be a KOIT clone; they do what we do. K-101 is a goodsounding Bright AC with a new PD [Bill Stairs]. While KOIT's an 'environmental' station, K-101's more personality-oriented and fills different needs."

Mayzel is convinced that KOIT's strong numbers are the result of careful structuring. She revealed, "We have one-year and five-year plans. This station is focused and has real goals. It's been a real fun education for me to learn about business as well as about radio."

Dunphy Tracks Gotham's AC Musical Trends

Three days prior to the winter book's conclusion, **Bonneville**'s **WNSR** became **WMXV** ("Mix 105"). The station's last Arbitron 25-54 performance under the 'NSR banner was a good one — No. 3 25-54. Meanwhile, **Viacom** Lite AC WLTW was the market's 25-54 and 35-64 pacesetter.

"We've been hammering on this thing in various ways for six years," remarked WMXV VP/Programming Bob Dunphy. "Every tenth of a point in this market gets harder and harder to get. Our call letter and marketing changes needed to be made to stay ahead of the competition. In what we consider a big milestone, we beat [Gold] WCBS-FM for the first time [12+]. We're excited to be at our present level."

Dunphy has detected definite music adjustments at WLTW. "As we get more contemporary, *they* get more contemporary. WLTW no longer dabbles with **Tony Bennett** and **Frank Sinatra**. I was really surprised recently when I heard 'LTW play 'Wrapped Around Your Finger' by the **Police**."

Both Ends Burning

Park Communications' WPAT/ New York remains one of the country's last major B/EZs. Commenting on rumblings about a possible WPAT format evolution, Dunphy said, "If 'PAT decided to go Soft AC to become the market's true 'wimpy' station, it could have something. Our understanding, though, is [that Park Chairman] **Roy Park Sr.** is really 'into' the station. Consequently, it's pretty unlikely that there'll be any changes there within the next year."

In addition to challenges WMXV faces on the soft side (WLTW, WPAT), Dunphy also has to deal with competition from Scott Shannon-programmed WPLJ. "They've flatly said they're coming after Dunphy asserted. "'They us." haven't admitted it yet in public, but WPLJ's AC. The differences between us and them are reflected more in the programmers' personalities than in the stations' goals. WPLJ's presentation makes it sound more CHR than ours does."

Television Views

Perhaps the adult format approach at Cap Cities 'PLJ is best summarized by Shannon's current TV spot. "It's warm and fuzzy," commented Dunphy. "The message is that he's grown up and doesn't want to hear rap and hard rock. At the end of the spot, you see that he's talking to his daughter."

Bonneville's Image Works produced Mix 105's present TV spot, which debuted this past January. Dunphy commented enthusiastically, "This commercial will soon be available for syndication. It uses three painters and paint cans with artists' names on them. There are many neat, colorful, eye-catching effects throughout the spot. It sells the music, and we've tied other marketing to the TV commercial. We're giving away small radios in the shape of paint cans, and our direct-mail piece ties-in to the spot."

His eye fixed on the future, Dunphy pointed out, "Our mode of operation's always been to build our niche. We'll continue doing that, but we'll have to look out the rearview and side-view mirrors a little more. We need to make sure another station isn't changing the tides to prevent us from getting to where we want to go."

FORMAT NEWS ROUNDUP NARTSH Confab Looms

As if the city isn't plagued by enough hot air already, the nation's capital will play host next month to a bevy of radio talkers.

The National Association of Radio Talk Show Hosts (NARTSH) will convene its fourth annual convention at Washington's Mayflower Hotel from June 18-21. Conference planners hope to draw some 300 hosts, programmers, and managers. Last year's meeting in Seattle drew 200 registered participants.

Considering the location of the meet, NARTSH's tentative agenda is surprisingly light on political speakers. At presstime no member of Congress, the Bush administration, or FCC was scheduled to address the group. But that could change, according to NARTSH Executive Director Carol Nashe. She says the group has issued invitations to some political "big boys" and is still waiting to hear from them.

The confirmed speakers are drawn almost entirely from the ranks of television's "talking heads." They include ABC's Sam Donaldson, CNN commentator Linda Chavez, McLaughlin Group member Eleanor Clift, and columnist Jack Anderson, who serves as an advisor to NARTSH.

The professional sessions include programs entitled "Winning Together," "Do-It-Yourself Talk Radio," and "Programming A Talk Radio Station." Scheduled panelists include WOR/New York VP/ GM Bob Bruno, WHDH/Boston GM Dan Griffith, WMAL/Washington President/GM Tom Bresnahan, Daynet President Michael Castello, and WWDB/Philadelphia PD David Rimmer.



How has New Rock **KROQ**/ **Los Angeles** cashed in on Talk programming? The secret will be revealed at our Friday (6/12) format session.

Despite the flap over the American Petroleum Institute's underwriting of last year's NARTSH meeting (and the subsequent Alaskan junket it sponsored for NARTSH leaders), the oil lobby will once again sponsor a portion of the convention.

Convention registration runs \$265 for NARTSH members, \$355 for non-members, and \$225 for spouses. Call Carol Nashe for details: (617) 956-3320.

Use It Or Lose It

The NARTSH convention could also mark the end of Talk radio's special relationship with Compuserve, the on-line computer service. Jim Cameron, the former radio newshound who operates Compuserve's Journalism Forum (JFORUM), says he will drop the forum's Talk Exchange section if usage doesn't pick up in the next month. "There are other journalism groups out there waiting to make better use of that electronic real estate," says Cameron. "If there isn't some increased utilization by the end of the NARTSH convention, it [Talk Exchange] will be abandoned."

NEWS/TALK

Cameron created the Talk Exchange in 1990 to serve as an "electronic crossroads" for the N/T format; a place where hosts, producers and programmers could share news and ideas. Unfortunately, that concept – which has proven popular with journalists – has never caught on with talk professionals. Days, even weeks, can pass without a message being posted in the Talk Exchange.

Ironically, notes Cameron, several talkers, including Rush Limbaugh and WWRC/Washington's Bob Madigan, are frequent users of JFORUM and other Compuserve offerings.

Whether or not the Talk Exchange survives - and it would be a shame to let this potentially valuable resource wither - Compuserve will remain an extremely useful tool for talk hosts. In addition to a bevy of on-line news and research services (including the AP wires, magazine, and newspaper databases) Compuserve offers an electronic mail system that makes it quick and easy for hosts to communicate with listeners. What's more, he observes, the boards generate an overwhelming curiosity in drivers. "People will tune in when the light's on just to see if you are lying."

The news light is activated by a subcarrier signal from the studio. According to Hobbs, the boards were somewhat more expensive than regular outdoor ads. The additional costs include an electronic "black bcx" (about \$400-\$500 per sign) and the charge for 'round the clock electricity

WFLA's campaign began in mid-March and will run until June 1, after which Hobbs plans to lease the black boxes to other stations — outside the market, of course

tions, UHF outlets, and cable systems, plans to air radio talk shows in the overnight slot. While details have not been finalized, network President Ted Kavanau says talkers chosen for the show will FedEx videotapes of their shows to Channel America for broadcast the following night.

Channel America could pose yet another problem for the long-delayed Talk TV Network, which plans to create an all-Talk cable television service featuring such well-known radio talents as Bruce Williams and Jim Bohannon.

WRKS: Livin' Large In The Big Apple

Reclaims market crown from AC WLTW with a 5.2-5.5 move

The Winter '92 Arbitron ratings contain mixed signals for the UC format. Over the next few weeks, I'll look at various markets where the format really flexed its muscles.

Kicking off the ratings-related series is the first half of a two-part profile of the New York City market. The spotlight is on WRKS, which reclaimed the number one crown from AC WLTW with a 12+ 5.2-5.5 boost.

Consistent Strides

"We like to say we've moved back to number one because we've been on top for six of the last eight books," says WRKS VP/GM Charles Warfield. "That's something. we're very proud of; consistency is something we all strive for in this business.

"I think a major portion of [our success] started in 1989-90 when Vinny Brown took over as PD. The station and parent company Summit Communications believed there were more listeners who were not being measured in relation to Urban Contemporary radio.

"We had to address a number of factors, including why more people weren't listening to UC radio. It was because some things had turned listeners off. The stations were not playing the right music and were not servicing the community properly.

"Another factor: The ratings services were not providing the service we were paying for which was to properly measure the audience within the metropolitan area. And that was when there was Arbitron and Birch. We subscribed to both services but felt they [left] a lot to be desired in their measurement efforts, particularly in regards to UC radio.

"They were not delivering the appropriate number of diaries that was representative of our audi-

ence: The black population within the metropolitan area was inconsistent in terms of delivery. They might deliver a 100% index for one book and then an 88% index for the next book. The advertising community is generally less than receptive to those fluctuations — they are not going to let you explain them. This became an obstacle in regards to getting the proper recognition from the advertising community."

Battle Not Over

"We've worked at improving the radio station in terms of servicing the community," continues Warfield. "We've also worked with Arbitron to make them understand why they aren't providing the service we're paying for. You have to work at these things; it's not about getting up on a soapbox, name-calling and finger-pointing. It's about working together to address what some of the concerns are from your point of view."

Does he feel Arbitron is now doing a better job? "We feel they're doing better but will still be watching very closely because our concern is consistency. We want to feel we can expect a consistent delivery of the appropriate audience bal-



ance from book to book. There has been some improvement, and we certainly want to give them credit for that. But we don't believe our battle is over."

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Turning to the subject of sales, Warfield comments, "In many cases the advertising community has responded to the success of this radio station. The continued strong performance over the last two years [never lower than number



three] — has helped overcome a lot of obstacles. There are still some perceptual problems to overcome, but that's the job we have and [must] face in this format. We have a sales staff with a passion for selling Urban Contemporary radio. Our job is to inform and educate the advertising community about the vitality of our audience and the opportunities out there.

"We're number one 18-34. As a full-service UC station, we feel we serve the audience from birth to death. So if we defined a target, it would be 18-49. But our broader target is the entire black population of New York City. We have something to offer every segment within our community. We went up a full share this book. It clearly indicates our staff has been able to impress a broader element of the community.

"When you look at our numbers and all the stories written about WRKS and its audience, what you see is that WRKS is the number one radio station in New York City and one of the most listened to radio stations in the country - that's overall, not just in the Urban format. We want people to know that. We're competing against every radio station in this market for advertising. And we feel there should be no reservations about working with this station. We are representative of the listening audience that exists in New York City. And we compete that way.

News Commitment

With this being an election year, I asked Warfield to discuss his station's role in the community. "It's important for our listeners to be involved in the process and understand it — whether it's a presidential or a local election. We always look for ways to present a better picture of the world and the city to our audience. Two years ago we implemented 'Open Line': Every Sunday morning we open up the phone lines, and listeners let us know their views about things that affect their lives every day.

"We also have a major commitment to news with a three-person news department that includes Joe Bragg, Bob Slade, and Ann Tripp. These people are an integral part of our commitment to provide information and insight to our audience."

When asked about the success of WRKS's morning team cf Jeff Foxx and Ken Webb, Warfield says. "We realized mornings was an area we needed to improve. We've worked very hard on that. The combination of Foxx and Webb plus our news team has helped the show become one of the top morning programs in the country. It's ranked fourth in the market. Two of the stations that beat us are News [WCBS and WINS]." The other is [WXRK] with Howard Stern, who plays no music. Rounding out the airstaff are Chris Welch, middays; Carol Ford, afternoons; Windy Williams, nights; Evonne Mobley, late-nights; and Bobby Gales, overnights.

Summing up the future, Warfield says, "I've been in the industry almost 15 years. Believe me, we don't feel like we have it made. This is a ratings period we're very proud of, but's there's still a lot more that can be done. There's still growth potential, and that's what we'll continue to strive for."

Life During Wartime

How KLOS dealt with the Los Angeles riots

While most of us watched the recent L.A. riots from the comfort of our living rooms, KLOS staffers weren't as fortunate. Situated on the west end of the hardest-hit area, the station found itself directly in the path of the looters and arsonists.

"It started getting real crazy Thursday afternoon [4/30] when they torched the Fedco building. which is just two blocks from the station." recalls PD Ken Anthony. 'It was a very scary situation. Eventually there were six or seven buildings on fire within a threeblock area, including a furniture store adjacent to our building. Some of the flames were threatening our new construction site, and our engineers ended up trying to hose down the furniture store. At that point we became concerned with the safety of all the employees, and most everyone was sent home.

"A lot of us were scared to drive. There were cars all over the place, people running up and down the street, and billows of smoke all around. I didn't really want to leave, but I figured I'd better get out before it got dark. I left at 3:30pm and just bolted for the freeway. There was no way I was going to stop, because I had heard reports of people being stopped and pulled out of their cars."

Security Guards Hired

The close proximity of the fires prompted the station to hire a handful of heavily armed security guards. "It was pretty wild," Anthony says, "because there were moments when security guards were running through our building saying, 'We need to lock this door

... We need some chains here." Although the rampaging arsonists and looters met with little if any police resistance, Anthony's confident the security detail would have provided the necessary deterrent had the building been threatened. Luckily, he and his coworkers never had to find out if that was the case.

"They were burning and looting stores. What would they want with a radio station? Now, if this was a wartime situation, it might have been a different story. But they didn't care about us."

Aside from frightening the staff, the riot also forced some rescheduling. Anthony extended shifts, gave evening rocker Cindy Scull the night off, and had weekender Frank Sontag host an overnight talk show, which proved cathartic.

"The phones just went nuts," Anthony says. "All 13 lines were lit up during the entire show. Everyone wanted to talk about what was going on."

The same held true the next morning. Instead of the usual frivolity, Mark & Brian, News Director 66

Chuck Moshontz, and helicopter traffic reporter Skylord provided news and information.

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
Things quieted down over the weekend, but Anthony played it safe, rearranging shifts so that none of the women personalities were scheduled after dark.

Praises Staff

"The jocks did a terrific job, and I'm proud of all of them," Anthony says. "They were very courageous coming into work — especially on Thursday, and Friday. [Morning show producer] Nicole Sandler said it best when she told me, "There are news reporters out in the middle of things, bringing the story to everybody. This is our job as journalists and broadcasters. We're going to go on the air and do our job."

"What we did was try to be the young adult rock 'n' roll-oriented listener's News/Talk station. The guys at [sister Talk outlet] KABC filled us in on what was going on, and we passed that info along to the listeners. We also ran a lot of stuff directly from our KABC feed, including the President's speech, Rodney King's statement, and the various press conferences with [California Governor] Pete Wilson and [L.A. Mayor] Tom Bradley. And we patched into the Arsenio Hall/Jesse Jackson/Magic Johnson broadcast on [KPWR] Power 106 for about an hour Friday night.'

As you can imagine, the tense situation directly affected the station's music mix. "First of all, we played Tom Petty's 'Peace In L.A.' every couple of hours after we got it. It was very therapeutic, and the response was overwhelming. We had a block party weekend scheduled, but obviously I cancelled that and went to just a regular format,

with a lot of songs added and dropped based on whether they were appropriate or not. We also dropped all promotional mentions and liners. We didn't want to be talking about that kind of stuff with all the craziness going on."

Asked what advice he'd give other programmers about preparing for a similar situation, Anthony says, "I don't know that you can prepare for something like this. All you can really do is listen to the audience and respond to their needs. If you don't respond you're telling your audience you don't really care about what's going on."

'Twilight Zone'

Longtime KLOS afternoon driver Geno Michellini was on the air when the not-guilty verdicts came in. "One of the stringers from across the hall at KABC

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handed me the newscopy. I was on mike when I said, 'You're kidding me. This is not a joke?' Within the hour things started breaking loose. By the time I came in the following day it was a war zone down here.

"I remember watching the TV monitor and seeing the Fedco building down the street burning. Then they panned and I saw the furniture store next door on fire. They machine gunned the gas station across the street and tried to

torch it, but they couldn't get the pumps working. It was scary as hell. My nerves were frayed, and after several hours on the air I could tell my voice was showing it."

Michellini coped with the situation as best he could by providing information and altering the music mix to fit the mood. "I tried to soothe rather than antagonize, playing a lot of John Lennon and U2. And of course there were no comedy bits. I couldn't keep things positive, but I tried to keep things sincere.

"I figured I wouldn't have much of a listening audience at all, but it surprised me how many people were listening. I opened up the phones, and the response was incredible. I'd think people would be listening to the News stations, but maybe you get inundated by it and don't want anymore."

Michellini likened the experience to being in the "Twilight Zone," explaining, "I didn't feel immediately threatened, but it was like being in the eye of the hurricane. It was all going around me. It was very eerie, especially since I was virtually the only person in the building."

'Mr. Mellow'

Ironically, late-night rocker Joe Benson — who had to drive through the chaos to relieve Michellini had received a bird's-eye view of the riot the previous day. "Wednesday was our anniversary, and one of my wife's clients offered us a helicopter ride. We were up in the air when the verdict was announced. About 10 minutes before we were about to land the riot started.

"For the next hour and a half we were 500-700 feet above the whole thing, freaking out. Just as we

were splitting there was gunfire coming up toward the helicopters. It was insane.

"When I went in that night I was quite afraid of what I might run into, because I had seen what was going on, and the station was on the edge of the zone. There wasn't a lot of action that night, but by Thursday things were out of control. Nevertheless, since I'd already driven in the night before, I wasn't as nervous as I might have been.

"Geno was sounding a little nervous near the end of his shift, so I

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felt my job was to be just as calm as possible. Once I got in there it was like being on the air for an earthquake or a tornado. Basically I was just trying to be Mr. Mellow and relate what was going on while playing whatever music seemed appropriate. The playlist was just there as a reference.

"Leaving that night was kind of scary, because even though the station was semi-secure, who knew what could happen out on the street? I do a lot of racing, and that came into play. I don't think anyone could have caught me unless they had a very large caliber gun of some sort. I was in and out in a hurry."

Benson sums up the experience: "It was like being inside a bad movie waiting for Chuck Bronson to show up."

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





KWNR Upsets KFMS...

One of the winter's most stunning ratings upsets occurred in Las Vegas, where 20-month-old KWNR beat longtime market leader KFMS in 12+, 18-34, and 25-54 all for the first time. KWNR scored historical high-water marks in those demos. ranking second, fifth, and first, respectively.

Even more amazing than the win is the margin of victory in each cell .9. 2.9, and 3.9 shares. respectively, KWNR's 3.9-8.3 12+ surge was eclipsed by its incredible 3.8-10.2 25-54 leap.

Clouding KWNR's achievement, however. is Arbitron-related activity. which caused the ratings service to flag KWNR on page 5B for "Breach of Diary Security." Both sides of the dispute appear below.

Explaining The Win

Joyous over KWNR's accomplishment, KWNR VP/GM Mike Ginsberg says, "In 20 months, to come from zero to punch out a heritage station says a lot about what happened here." And what did happen

According to Ginsberg. "We put on a superior musical product better flow and better selection. We were more active in the public sector. One jock doesn't show up with a banner and we call it an event; we have lots of folks participating in remotes, etc. KWNR is cleaner, our clutter minimal. Our load is eight units an hour. And low [PD] Gary Moss did a great job."

Offering his thoughts on the ratings jumps, Moss says. "KWNR is an easier station to listen to. Our research has showed us neck and neck with KFMS: the numbers are just catching up with what we're doing." He also adds a few "reasons" of his own for the win, noting, "We did a lot of things better than KFMS." Moss identifies those things as:

More attention to detail.

• The "differences in presentation – what's done between the records [since] most successful Country stations are playing the same music. We focus more on that than KFMS.

• Stable staff. KWNR has made one staff change since the format switch, KFMS has made at least six

Great morning show

• "We more closely reflect Las Vegas and its lifestyle. This is a unique city.

Ginsberg also says KFMS made some mistakes on which KWNR was able to capitalize. "They were complacent; they didn't react to us fast enough. And by the time they chose to react. we already owned what they wanted to save.

Ginsberg adds that the real ratings story is KWNR's posting dominant numbers while being outgunned. "KFMS outspent us 10:1 on TV and billboards. If we had the ad budget they did, we'd have done a number on them quicker than we did.'

...While KFMS Is Upset With KWNR's ARB Ploy

Are KWNR/Las Vegas's exceptional Winter '92 numbers a product of programming, or were they inflated as a result of KWNR's search for diarykeepers? And just what was KWNR VP/GM Mike Ginsberg up to when he commissioned a local advertising agency to run the ad appearing on this page?

Arbitron Flags KWNR

Here's what's known for sure: UPS Advertising ran the pictured ad in the Sunday (2/16) and Friday (2/28) editions of the Las Vegas Review Journal newspaper. (It received 14 responses that were followed up by phone calls from an independent Arizona-based research company.)

Las Vegas stations notified Arbitron, which conducted an extensive investigation that resulted in its flagging the Winter '92 book on page 5B with a "Breach Of Diary Security" announcement. It stated, "KWNR-FM funded an independent study of Arbitron placement, followed by the full text of the UPS advertisement, with the following final paragraph:

'This advertisement had the potential for the identity of current diarykeepers to be made known to a station and thereby the anonymity of their survey participation to have been breached. In light of this, Arbitron took steps to ensure that the integrity of our sample had not been compromised. Arbitron is obligated to alert users of this report to any such activities which have been conducted in this market.'

KFMS Cries Foul

KFMS/Las Vegas GM Doug Shane feels the ads and subsequent follow-up were directly related to KWNR's ratings surge. "The ads

99 ran two weeks into the book's second phase and two days into its third phase," says Shane. "KWNR's cume for the first phase – 7000 – was about normal. But the second phase cume climbed to 10,800 and phase three was 10,200. Either our transmitter was off, or they got incredibly good in just eight weeks.

"It ran light TV targeted to country TV specials, had no major onair contesting, and no telemarketing that I'm aware of."

Arbitron's response - both in the book itself and its in-person explanation - hasn't exactly made Shane a happy GM. "Arbitron said it spent a lot of time interviewing those who responded to the ads. Its conclusion was that the information wasn't tainted, and KWNR's actions didn't affect the book."

KWNR's Side

KWNR VP/GM Mike Ginsberg explains his actons and the ad this way: "KWNR took a huge [ratings] hit last fall - we lost over three 25-54 shares. They didn't go to KFMS, which was also down and that puzzled us, particularly because other indicators seemed to be showing we were growing according to plan.

"Nobody [from Arbitron] could tell me why the numbers disappeared, and I figured it was due to a poor sample. I noticed the fall book had a lot of buffering in the last phase. I also learned Las Vegas – where 68% of the phones are unlisted, meaning people aren't inclined to participate - has the worst response rate in the nation. Then it hit me: What if Arbitron had to get response rates up and what if it put diaries back into households that had participated before? In that scenario, heritage stations would do well while growth stations would suffer. That's what happened last fall.

Next, I wondered how to prove my theory without distorting the ratings. That's where the idea for the ad came from - the KWNR calls are nowhere in the ad. I gave the names of the 14 who responded to the ad - plus another 19 names of people who had taken part in ratings surveys we found through our music research - to an independent research firm. Of the 33. three said they had been surveyed more than once. To me, that's an incredibly high percentage of people who have been resurveyed. If my small sample turned up that many, I was afraid Arbitron had a much bigger problem. I feared that if Arbitron was not moving the diaries around, radio stations could identify and target those people. No one wants that; it must be a random sample. And the more random, the better.

"I took my data to Arbitron, not the press. I presented the 33 names so it could conduct its investigation. If there's a sample problem, we both need it fixed. Arbitron is my business partner. We both want the most accurate information possible." Ginsberg says Arbitron has not yet reached a conclusion regarding repeat diary placement.

Another of Ginsberg's complaints with Arbitron placement is that while Las Vegas has grown by 37% in the last 10 years, the number of diaries placed has actually dropped by 8%

Both Unhappy Over Flag

Neither Shane nor Ginsberg is happy with Arbitron's flag in the book. Shane believes the wording should have been stronger; he still feels the huge swing is somehow attributed to contact with diarykeepers. He's also upset with Arbitron's response to an agency inquiry with regards to the flag. An Arbitron rep told the agency it was 'no big deal, it didn't affect the book." Says Shane, "Arbitron has no business making those kinds of comments to our clients.

Ginsberg, who says, "What's the problem looking for past diarykeepers?", feels KWNR shouldn't have been flagged. "If we were guilty of distorting ratings, KWNR wouldn't have been in the book at all '

This nasty business is far from over, as Ginsberg's final comment indicates: "I don't want KFMS to dodge the real story with a sidelight about Arbitron. The fact is we successfully annihilated them."

As with all radio wars, time will tell the ultimate story. I'll keep you posted.






"Being the first artist on a new label with Irving Azoff at the helm and James Stroud heading up the Nashville arm, I decided I'd probably get the attention for what I was trying to accomplish.

Songs

· Robbins co-wrote all 10 of the tunes on his Giant debut, "Man With A Plan." set for a June 16 release. Eight songs were written with Billy Hill buddies Sherrill and DiPiero; one of the tunes, "I Am Just A Rebel," was the title track of the Billy Hill album. "I always wanted that song to be a single and never got the chance with Billy Hill. So I figure now's my chance.

· Though an accomplished songwriter, Robbins admits he feels most comfortable on stage. "Once you've gotten used to living 23 hours for that one hour on stage once that's in your blood - it's hard not to keep on wanting that."
