Maxine Brown, Al Hibbler, Albert King, Jimmy McCracklin, Curtis Mayfield, Sam Moore, the Five Keys, the Spaniels and songwriter/ legendary producer Doc **Pomus** received Pioneer Awards, while Ray Charles was awarded the coveted Legend Award. Posthumous awards Congressman went to George "Mickey" Leland and his Chief of Staff Patrice Johnson. Not on the invitation list were high school buddies Luther Campbell and Vanilla Ice, who nevertheless crashed the party.

Anthem Rocks

Arista is reporting that Whitney Houston's version of "The Star Spangled Banner" is the fastest-selling single in the history of the label. Said one enthused label exec: "It's sweeping the country. They're even singing

it before sporting events. It's bigger than the lambada!!!" Said Arista Sr. VP of Promotion Rick Bisceglia: "Golly, what a catchy tune. Are you sure I've never heard it before?"

Top 40 programmers, whose playlists have been increasingly restrictive to **rock** records, are suddenly faced with a plethora of projects that are packing both a **soles** base and strong **MTV** support. Programmers will be hard-pressed to look away from some pretty impressive facts.

Def American/Reprise's the Black Crowes have a Top 10 album and massive MTV support without a hit single. The just-released "She Talks To Angels" is causing a buzz at Top 40, but will still be an uphill battle for Rich Fitzgerald and his team. The band has already had two semi-successful Top 40 efforts and is looking for the big breakthrough this time around.

EMI's Queensryche is another sales monster that has MTV's request lines ringing off the hook. We seem to see this video every time we switch on the channel and radio is already feeling those crossover requests and big sales. Will those numbers and video exposure earn them a place alongside the dance beats?

Meanwhile, Post Modern giant **Divinyls** (Virgin) is starting off by rolling in Top 40 alphabet soup, but even the strongest initial radio buzz must be hammered

It's five years to the week that Brian Ross' segments hit the NBC airwaves and all independent promotion companies hit the unemployment lines. In the half decade that passed — a period that saw a huge amount of civil and criminal litigation — all companies, with the exception of two, have resumed using indies on a direct basis. Those two labels now hire indies through an outside project coordinator. Five years ago, the average cost of independent promotion for a record was in the \$150-200 thousand range. Today, the figures are closer to \$40-50 thousand with close to half that cost recoupable from the artist. While a number of indies across the country are doing brisk business, the four main players today are Jeff Mc-Clusky & Assoc. out of Chicago, L.A.'s Platinum Music, Boston's Jerry Brenner Group and Buffalo's R.P.M.. Indie promotion is back, but nowhere on the scale it was before Brian.... Despite printed rumors to the contrary, tonguewaggers are saying that a deal that would see Arista Founder and Ruler Clive Davis remain with BMG is more likely to happen than not.....





AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH TIM DUBOIS BY HOLLY GLEASON



Mintz's Master

When Clive Davis decided to make the commitment to country music, he knew he needed somebody that looked at things as creatively as he did. Establishing a new label is never easy — and it was going to take excellent music, solid marketing, a great team and just enough innovation and expertise to pull it off.

Of course, Arista Nashville label czar Tim DuBois never intended to be a "record company guy." A songwriter who'd written hits for Alabama ("Close Enough To Perfect") and Jerry Reed ("She Got The Goldmine (I Got The Shaft)"), in addition to co-writing Vince Gill's Grammy-winning hit "When I Call Your Name," the appointment of the former accounting professor made sense on a lot of levels.

Before joining forces with Arista Nashville, he'd been integral in putting together Restless Heart's success, both as their producer and part of their management team — and his understanding of the complete artist development process was invaluable when it came time to tool up. Plus, DuBois understands finding ways to get the creative side to meet the bottom line.

Eighteen months ago, Arista Nashville didn't have a phone number. Today they've seen Alan Jackson, their first artist, go gold and continue selling, while other new acts like Pam Tillis, Rob Crosby and Diamond Rio appear to be continuing the flow. And don't forget about the yeoman job DuBois and company are doing with re-igniting Exile and taking on left-of-center propositions like Asleep at the Wheel and slide guitarist Lee Roy Parnell.

With all that cooking, it's a wonder DuBois has time to hang out with the real power behind the throne, that way-bitchin' black lab Nimitz. No wonder HITS' Neobilly Goddess Holly Gleason spends so much time around the office panting with her tongue out.

Is Arista's status as a newcomer in Nashville an advantage or a disadvantage?

Both. The advantage is that we don't have a history, so in the beginning, people didn't expect anything from us. We didn't have a history to consult to make our decisions about what was possible — so in that case, being brand-new was a help.

The disadvantage is, when you come in, the other labels have so much momentum going for them. We entered at a time when the charts were really opening up to new talent — which was to our benefit — but still, the other labels had their machines in place. They had solid promotion staffs, as well as marketing plans, programs and personnel

We started a little over 18 months ago with nothing... not even a phone number. So we had a little catching up to do. We had to staff up to put the foundation in place. Still, I think the advantages outweigh the disadvantages.

How long did it take Arista Nashville's image to evolve?

The parent company already had an image as a winner and as a label that put a lot of emphasis on the music. I explain it as a few well-chosen shots with a lot of muscle behind it. What we tried to do was bring that philosophy to the

country market.

We moved slowly, signed sparingly and preached our point-of-view to country radio and retail as we went. I actually spent a lot of time out in the field, talking to radio and telling them, "We're different. I'm here to show you we're different. We're here to be the small label with the very selective roster that leads with the music." That's what's referred to as "The Gospel According To Tim" — and I work very hard to preach that to people. Especially at the beginning.

How long did it take to convince them you were for real?

As evidenced by our first year's success ratio at radio, the response back has been especially gratifying. They welcomed our small roster of brand-new artists with open arms across the board. I think we've put out 15 or 16 singles to this point in time, and there's only four of those that we haven't been able to take Top 30, which is a pretty amazing ratio. It's a real tribute to Allen Butler and our promotion staff.

What do you look for in signing an act?

Several things. In the end, the decision is the sum of those things and my gut feeling. Most importantly, I look for a source of material that excites me. I look at the songs first. There are a great many writer/artists on our roster and the ones that

aren't have a writer/producer involved, so that there'll be a continuing source of great songs.

Second, I look for something that makes the act unique — a vocal style, a voice, something that stands out. Also — and I wish it wasn't this way, but in the '90s, it is — you have to consider the visual image. Today, it can't be ignored or downplayed. The artistic/creative person inside me hates that it's this way and I can't say it's as important as the music, but it is incredibly important.

I won't sign an act I haven't seen live. I think there's a chemistry you

have eight artists who sold like Alan. Because of the way we do business, I have to have a higher success ratio than average, so I need to find acts that I really believe have the potential to do more than just recoup. I don't sign an act unless I think they've got the ability to really pop out there and do big numbers.

How does a new label with new artists manage to go gold?
We had a lot of help with Alan
Jackson. Two pieces of machinery

were in place — we were able to draw from the best that our New York office had to offer in the way

can see when an act plays live that sometimes doesn't translate to tape - and I want my act to have the ability to connect with an audience. Given the diversity of acts like Alan Jackson, who's a traditional country singer; Lee Roy Parnell, who plays great slide guitar; Asleep At The Wheel, who're keeping Western swing alive; Michelle Wright, who seems to be country's answer to Melissa Etheridge; and Pam Tillis and Rob Crosby, who are classic singer/songwriters — do any of the same rules apply?

[Laughing.] There's definitely no formula. I'm not trying to sign eight Alan Jacksons, though I'd love to

of creative services and publicity. That's one great thing about Arista. They've never treated Nashville like an ugly stepchild — we always get the best of every department in New York. Though these people aren't necessarily used to dealing with country music, they are used to dealing with hits and with stars. Plus, I had some experienced people in Allen Butler and Phran Schwartz [since-departed Director of Marketing].

The other part of the puzzle was that we fit into a distribution company which has had tremendous success at retail with country product in BMG. They've marketed RCA's product so effectively through the

years. They obviously knew how to sell Alan Jackson, because they'd come through less than twelve months before selling Clint Black. Those are two new acts that both broke very big in the beginning. What does Clive think of country music?

He's genuinely excited about what's going on in Nashville. He and I talk on a regular basis about what's going on with the acts down here. He's also probably the only person in the world who could've talked me into doing this, because I'd never thought about working for a record company. But, the challenge he presented to me — and the opportunity — is something I couldn't resist.

The thing I love best about him is that he's a music person, a song person and comes from a writing background like myself, and that's the level we connected on. We disagree sometimes - and he's great because he allows me to disagree. But we more often agree. Plus, he's given us a tremendous amount of freedom down here - yet when we need him, he's always there for us. What is it that excites him most? Songs. To him, a great song is a great song. So, when I played Clive "Here In The Real World," he got just as excited about it as he would a new song for Dionne Warwick. How do you resolve your background as a songwriter/producer and an accounting professor? I describe myself as a recovering CPA. I started out in accounting because I thought I wanted to be an attorney and I'd always had a knack for math. And when you get

right down to it, music is math. It's a very mathematical kind of thing. I've always loved music and writing — it's just that accounting and

business came very naturally to me,

too. I do have a unique background, but it's very comfortable and the two have always somehow balanced each other. When I was an accountant, I always thought about the bottom line. And even in my years as an accounting professor, I was always involved in music.

Writing is what pulled me to Nashville, but teaching accounting at Vanderbilt is what fed me until I was able to develop the skills to go out and succeed as a writer. Still, I wouldn't trade my business background for anything. I think it helps me tremendously.

Writing is still the most creatively satisfying thing for me. Unfortunately in this position, I don't have time to write. It's an all-consuming kind of job, so finding a great song now takes the place of the buzz that writing used to give me. I'm blessed to work with some very fine writers, and the writing community here in general. I still have an open-door policy for writers to come in and play me their stuff on guitar.

How did it feel to have cowritten the Country Single of the Year?

Very good for many, many reasons. Vince [Gill] and I are good friends. We struggled through some tough years together when I was one of his managers and we couldn't get arrested. So, to finally see him receive the acclaim he's deserved for so long - and to finally have a record that broke through like that - was very gratifying. There are many personal reasons that record's very special to me. It was my fifth #1 record — but that one means more to me than all the others added together. It was a real special song and I'm glad about what it did

for Vince's career.

Why does a creative guy get into management?

In my particular case, it was strictly happenstance. I had no intentions of getting involved in the management side. The Restless Heart project was a mission. All I really

creating really well-made records that don't sound like they're trying to be from L.A. We've got some great producers, players and engineers in this town and we're letting country music's roots show through by demonstrating they can be exciting in a way that really

intended to do in the beginning was help get them started as an outlet for some material I was writing and to help get me started as a producer. As it turned out, because their first management situation turned sour, I became a manager by default. Fortunately, my business background helped me muddle along until I found some other people. But I learned a lot from it. Consequently, I have a great deal of respect for managers because it's the hardest job there is. And I think it helps me from the label side because, with Restless Heart in the beginning, I did everything from simple road management stuff, riding the bus with the guys, right through negotiating record deals so I do have a different perspective as a result. So when I deal with a manager or a developing artist having been there with Restless Heart, Vince Gill and Foster & Lloyd — it helps me understand in a different way

What do you think about the current return to traditional roots country?

I think it's good. It's the end of what [head of Warner Bros. Nashville] Jim Ed Norman calls "sloppy pop records" and instead we're makes sense.


The new people coming into this town are bringing a rock sensibility with them. I didn't grow up listening to country music — I was listening to rock. And a good portion of the players in this town didn't come up playing country, but other forms of music. When they get here and are affected by Nashville, and bring their other roots with them, the music begins to evolve. So we're past the point of trying to make records that sound like another format; we're just making the music that comes through us.

Anything else you'd like to talk about?

My staff. I have the most incredible staff in the world. I've got 14 or 15 people now and they believe. We're here and able to pull off what we do because we truly believe that we're different, that we can do it differently and that we can be a different kind of record company — from John in the mailroom right on up through me, everybody makes a difference and they know it. So the kind of dedication we get from our people and the commitment to what we do has been incredible. M

Feelies, "Time For A Witness" (Coyote/A&M): Mere language is insufficient when describing the influence of the Feelies and the brilliance of their second A&M effort. The first single, "Sooner Or Later" highlights the internal and external battle of guitars, drums and demons, as Glenn Mercer's lyrics

highlight an intense spirituality, sung as though he and Bill Million were singing for their lives. A Feelies song is like a James Joyce story, slowly building and gaining momentum until the final epiphany. The Feelies are the best band in life.

Beat Happening, "Dreamy" (Sub Pop/K-Tel): The next best band in life (see above review) is Beat Happening, a trio that combines the musical sophistication of the Shaggs with the basso profundo of Johnny Cash. Calvin, Bret and Heather infuse the spirit of "punk rock" into simple sing-songs that are



confrontational in their minimalism and presumed innocence. "Me Untamed," "I've Lost You" and "Red Head Walking" are among the highlights on "Dreamy." Let's just see if this doesn't change your life.



John Wesley Harding, "The Name Above The Title" (Sire/Reprise): John Wesley Harding's charisma is so magnificent that this follow-up was greeted with major anticipation. Produced by Andy Paley (Brian Wilson, Jonathan Richman) and featuring two of Elvis' Attractions, J.W. Harding's latest is a

veritable cornucopia of unparallelled songwriting, covering a spectrum of musical styles, from the driving "The World.." to the poignancy of "The Movie Of Your Life." Maybe if we're lucky, we'll be allowed a bit part.

The Posies, "Suddenly Mary" EP (DGC): Finally, an opportunity to hear one of the highlights of the Posies live set, their frenetic and incredible version of the Big Star classic "Feel," in the privacy of your own life. Also included on this CD-5 is another non-LP song, "Spite & Malice," written and produced



by the Posies. Oh yeah, and "Suddenly Mary," a fine song from the Posies debut, and a hit if there ever was one. Apparently, there exists a mysterious tape of the Posies playing the *entire* Big Star "#1 Record." Hmm. And what about Chris Bell's "I Am The Cosmos?" Hmm. Still, the surprise treat of the week.



I think that Top 40 radio goes in cycles. It's almost like we're going through the same period that we went through in the early '80s, when most of the radio stations were very rockleaning. You heard Tommy Tutone and Rush all the time on the radio, but you never heard the other side of the coin. I think that Top 40 has kind of boxed itself in by not playing all the hits. People come to Top 40 radio to hear a variety

and excitement, and I don't think that's ever going to change. When the Joe Lunchbuckets, our bread and butter, come to a Top 40 station, they want to hear the hits. That's the bottom line. How do you think Top 40 has been handling the Gulf Crisis?

Any Top 40 station that tries to ignore the fact that we are at war, especially given the mood of the country, is making a serious mistake. At B95, we have the NBC one-minute report on

promotions go?

It has affected the moming show, which I do. I was playing a lot of inhouse songs and songs I had acquired about Saddam Hussein, and I stopped playing them. of all the hits — that's certainly my philosophy. When people tune into a station that's programmed for a certain sound vs. all the hits, I feel they turn the dial. That's where the erosion starts — the target listener isn't satisfied.

What do you think can be done to repair the damage?

What's eventually going to happen is a programmer like Mike Joseph will come along just when people start sounding the death bell for Top 40 radio and put a station on the air that goes to the top. People are going to say, "Hey, this is new" — when in fact it's not. It's just the old cycle coming around again. Back to basics. People come to Top 40 radio to hear music


every hour, and in the morning, we do news twice an hour. At the beginning, we carried the full load. We ran the NBC continuous coverage for the full hour and we carried the President's speech. Whenever the President speaks pertaining to the war, we will carry it. Some things are more important than playing Bart Simpson records. Everyone is interested in this, and a great many people have their loved ones at stake here. We haven't been at war in quite some time, and under

Sassy. Fresh. Deliciously candid. Incisively witty. Fiercely independent. RCA's K.T. Oslin, who once quipped, "The labels didn't want to sign me because I was too old — and they thought I was ten years younger!," has no problem calling it or writing it like she sees it. Hailing from Texas, but a product of New York City's world of theater, Oslin has served as a lightning rod for the emotions of middle-aged women everywhere with anthems like "80s Ladies," "Do Ya" and "Come Monday." Though not country in the hardcore, traditional sense, Oslin has the ability to tap into the Neobilly aesthetic on songs like "Cornell Crawford," in addition to writing quiet, more reflective numbers like "New Way Home" and "Still Feel The Same" from her recent "Love In A Small Town" LP. To Oslin, being country has more to do with the honesty and emotional directness of your approach than it does the twang in your guitar and with the success the Grammy award-winning songwriter's enjoying, it's obvious she knows what she's doing. That is until she sat down in a room with HITS' Neobilly Namedropper "Wholly" Holly Gleason for a little Q&A on the QT.



Your momentum at country radio slowed with the last album, but "Come Monday"s #1 success changed that. Did you decide to court radio this time?

No, I don't want to appease radio, because that would be a mistake. Not to slam them, but you have to do what's right for the songs. You have to write what you write and sing what you sing. Hopefully, when you put that down on tape, it's something radio can relate to. Can you actually romance radio? Sure, you can give them neat little three-minute songs that have nothing controversial in them, so no one gets offended. I guess you can make them all upbeat and uptempo, so they're perfect for driving to and from work.

"This Woman" was a good album, but it wasn't so obvious musically. And "80s Ladies" wasn't exactly Saturday night at the Opry, either. Do you feel you experienced backlash from your initial success? I came on so hard and so fast that no one had a chance to find anything wrong with me. There was no chance to really pick me apart. When we took the time to do the second album, there was that opportunity.

You're also very outspoken. That may have been a bit disconcerting — not only was your music stretching boundaries, but you weren't a cookie-cutter girl singer.

[Laughing.] I don't know if that affected me. I believe you should play your own game. I am disappointed that I was naive enough to think being a strong woman was an attribute. I was wrong to believe that on a desert island, you'd want a smart, strong, no-bullshit woman.

Do you follow any songwriting rules?

They don't come from the same place.

Well, where did "Cornell Crawford" come from?

I saw the phrase, "I ain't ever gonna love nobody but Cornell Crawford," written on a bathroom wall in South



Carolina. I remember thinking, "If that's not a country title, I don't know what one is." And I immediately pictured the couple. I could see them, and I hoped that they'd live together forever. I couldn't see how they wouldn't. It was the first song I ever wrote. Then writing came easily to you? I don't know. I did it, but it was hard being successful with it in New York. It was almost like, why don't I be a shepherd in Manhattan? It'd be just as easy.

Given the breadth of the material you write, one has to wonder if you ever feel limited by being labelled a "country" artist. nusic was largely from rural areas. Now there are no more isolated rural areas — we're all pretty much the same. And I get irked when people say country has to be three-chord changes and a lot of twang. That's missing the point completely. Country's about well-written songs as much as anything.

Do you think video can play a role in changing that perception or in hastening artist development? It works more for new acts — it's

It works more for new acts — it's invaluable for that. I came out with a video for "80 Ladies" and it catapulted me wide-open over two months. It was amazing. All I can

I don't think of myself as limited by that. I think I'm a songwriter. If some of the songs aren't obviously country — well to me, it's just a different kind of country music. I have experience and training in other things that may set me apart and I try to bring those things to my music.

Do you think the tag "country" is still misunderstood by the mainstream?

I think there's a certain amount of embarrassment to it. People who aren't informed are still operating on a stereotype from 40 years ago. do is make good videos, though they'll never have the impact of when people're seeing you for the first time. I like working with [video director] Jack [Cole]. He's a madman — very creative and willing to try things.

Well, "Come Monday" is certainly left-field, spoofing "The Bride of Frankenstein."

They were a wonderful couple and they're together in the end. They made it work, which is more than we can say for most of us. If Frankie and the Bride got together, though, maybe there's still hope.

KNOCK, KNOCK: "Suffice to say, I like Jim Morrison much more than I like Val Kilmer," Doors biographer Danny Sugerman told me about the star of the Oliver Stone biopic. "I don't think Val Kilmer has the human wattage that Jim had. He doesn't have the IQ quotient, nor the sheer heart and force. But Oliver Stone took him and got him closer to Jim Morrison than I thought anyone could ever come. If I had seen this movie instead of the Doors in concert when I was 12 years old, would it have changed my life? I don't think so. But it's as close as you're gonna get and I wouldn't hesitate to recommend it to anyone."

WHERE HAVE ALL THE PEACE SONGS GONE?: Talking of
