HEAD START/EARLY HEAD START

This past July, the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) conducted a monitoring review of the Yeled V'Yalda Early Childhood Center Head Start and Early Head Start programs. Areas reviewed



were Program Management and Quality Improvement, Education, Facilities, Family Engagement, Health Services, Fiscal Infrastructure and ERSEA. Reviewers connected with YVY Management via teleconference before the review and every day throughout. Additional reviewers also came in-person to inspect and observe the YVY sites and classrooms in action. The reviewers' satisfaction with the program could not be contained; one reviewer remarked, "I wish my grandchild could attend a class like this!" After an intense week of observations, interviews and audits, the review proceedings finally wrapped up. A Program Performance Summary Report was received by YVY the last week of July which detailed all findings of the review. It came as no surprise that YVY was found to run a stellar program; there were absolutely no areas of concern, non-compliance or deficiencies. In the report, the Office of Head Start thanked the governing board, policy council, parents and staff for their engagement in the review process.

Building on the outstanding success of its Early Head Start program for children Birth-2 in the Lakewood community, YVY has expanded its Lakewood regional program to include 128 Head Start slots for children ages 3-5. The expansion provides Head Start slots into which the program's Early Head Start children can transition after ageing out of the program.

The expansion has also enabled the program to open a third site in the Lakewood area, resulting in a network of convenient locations throughout the entire community.

Additionally, the program has developed a Regional Management Team consisting of Mr. Nathan

Salomon, who oversees partner and community relations and development, Ms. Daniella Dvash, who primarily oversees the Early Head Start component of the program, and Ms. Rochel Abelsky, who primarily oversees the Head Start component of the program.

YVY is proud to announce that due to the high demand for services in the Lakewood community, all of the available Early Head Start and new Head Start slots are fully enrolled.

Project REACH is Yeled V'Yalda's unique Home-Based Head Start for preschoolers with medical and developmental concerns. Much of the success of Project REACH lies in the efficiency of our workflow, services, and programs. For the last four years, Project REACH has utilized a customized task management program called Teamwork, in which all of our staff shares the same online platform. We are proud to have reached an unprecedented level of customization which unites our staff and allows us to keep up with tasks related to every aspect of the running of our program. This, in turn, results in better outcomes for the children and families we service.

One example of how Teamwork has been a valuable tool to bring positive improvements to Project REACH in the area of Literacy skills development. This summer we invested significant efforts into linking our children's literacy library to the Teamwork system. All of the books in our library have just been categorized and paired with the yearly curriculum. We catalogued each book to track the lending library in a segment of Teamwork. The Project REACH library is now able to efficiently service our current preschoolers. Thanks to the automated system, the books will now cycle back to our office, and be enjoyed by our children for many years to come.

Licensed Mental Health Consultants are assigned to each YVY site and are available to speak to parents on an as needed basis about any concerns the parent has about parenting such as setting routines at home, toilet training, or family issues. Parents can call their child's site and ask to leave the MHC a message to call them.

Short, pre-recorded teleconferences on a variety of parenting topics are available for parents to listen to at their convenience. A variety of informative parenting topics will be presented at various times of the year and the information will be shared with parents via the monthly flyers that are sent home with your child. Parents who listen to the teleconference can be entered into a raffle for an educational toy!

HEALTH SERVICES

Yeled's Health services department was busy over the summer preparing for the new year. Our nurses ensured that every classroom was safe and fully stocked with any medical or sanitary items needed. With the objective of keeping our sites healthy and safe for the children, every teacher was trained during orientation about what to do in the event of an emergency, allergies in the classroom, and proper infection control. The screening team is working tirelessly to screen each child's hearing and vision and parents are informed of their child's results in a timely manner. Additionally, the dental van has been making its way to each site, and should any issues be detected can potentially return to address those issues. We look forward to a wonderful year!

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






Fitness Center

Partnering to benefit our children is an integral part of our mission. Yeled staff is continuously working to expand our services to best meet the needs of our children and families.







TIPS FOR KEEPING KIDS SAFE ON SCHOOL BUSES (ON AND AROUND)

On the bus have your children

- · Buckle up, if seat belts are available
- · Keep the noise down loud noises could distract the driver
- · Stay in the seat
- · Keep all your body parts in the bus
- · Keep aisles clear of books and bags
- · Gather belongings together before reaching your stop
- \cdot Wait for the bus to stop completely before getting up from your seat

Around the bus

- Parents walk young kids to the bus stop, wait with them until it arrives and make sure the driver can see the kids.
- · Have kids stand at least three giant steps back from the curb as the bus approaches, let it come to a complete stop and board the bus one at a time.
- · If your child needs to cross the street, have your child take five giant steps in front of the bus, make eye contact with the bus driver and cross when the driver indicates it's safe. Teach kids to look left, right and left again before crossing the street.
- · Instruct younger kids to use handrails when boarding or exiting the bus. Watch for straps or drawstrings that could catch in the door. If your child drops something, they should tell the bus driver and make sure the bus driver is able to see them before they pick it up.
