Godey's Lady's Book:

- Most widely circulated women's magazine in U.S.
- Encouraged motherhood as a religious value
 - Images depicted the four virtues
 - Stressed fashion to make women attractive to husbands



Godey's proclaimed

- "The perfection of womanhood... is the wife and mother, the center of the family, that magnet that draws man to the domestic altar, that makes him a civilized being, a social Christian."
- "The wife is truly the light of the home."

Post-Industrial Family:

- Middle class family did not need to be self-sufficient
 - -Men producing goods and services
 - -Wives and children stayed home




Piety:

 - -Body






Submissiveness:

Truisms about Women



 - -For men to escape the immoral world of business and industry







