## Firefighters extinguish brush blaze

Dry weather has been a persistent threat this year

BANDON — Wildland firefighters had their hands full battling a two-acre blaze near Bandon on Wednesday afternoon, May 8.

The fire broke out sometime around 2 p.m. on Winterberry Lane off Rosa Road across from Chandler Lane in Bandon. A plume of smoke was visible from town.

The Coos Forest Protective Association and Bandon Fire Department dispatched multiple engines, tanker trucks and at least two bulldozers to contain the blaze. CFPA Unit Forester Nils Storkeson said firefighters had the blaze mostly under control by 4:15 p.m.

The fire is one of several that have broken out on Coos County forest lands in the past month. Fire season has not yet been declared but the lack of rain this year may bring an early start, said CFPA prevention specialist John Flannigan.

"It is too late to burn most large machine-built piles," Flannigan said. "We have seen piles burned last fall rekindle this spring. Hand piles can be burned safely, but precautions must be followed. You have to clear above and around your pile, have water and tools immediately available and never leave a burn unattended. Picking the right day and time is also important. A foggy morning can turn into a hot or windy afternoon. Double checking that the pile is out is also prudent."

CFPA will come take a look and give advice at no charge on how to safely burn. Call the CFPA office at 541-267-3161. Tips on burning safely also can be found on CFPA's website, www.coosfpa.net.

## Crowds flock to new creamery

BANDON — An estimated 1,000 people walked through the doors of the new Face Rock Creamery on Wednesday, May 8, as months of planning, hard work and eager anticipation culminated in a festive grand opening and ribbon cutting.

"This is a 14-month project and we completed it in six months and 15 days," said Daniel Graham, construction supervisor and vice president. Graham listed and thanked all the local contractors who were hired for the project.

The Bandon Chamber of Commerce held a ribbon cutting and the creamery treated visitors to food outside the facility as well as cheese samples inside. People tasted fresh "squeaky" cheese curds in plain and spicy three pepper, Face Rock Monterey Jack,

In Your Face cheddar, spicy three-pepper cheddar, Vampire Slayer garlic cheddar, and, for a limited time, special Grand Opening cheddar. High-end cultured butter will be available soon.

Face Rock Creamery president Greg Drobot told the crowd he believes the facility is probably the best in the country.

"We tried to get the best facility to make the best cheese and I think we have one of the best cheese makers, if not the best, here," Drobot said. "Bandon cheese is going to be known as some of the best cheese in the world."

Drobot added that the creamery wouldn't be in Bandon without the support of many people

and the encouragement of the public.

"It was a lot of work — it's been over two years in the making and with a lot of ups and downs," he said.

Drobot used his own and private money to finance the \$2.2 million, 8,000 square-foot facility on land owned by the city of Bandon and leased to the creamery. The city

also paid to construct the public restrooms adjacent to the building.

Drobot said he was able to fund the venture because of loans from Craft3, the Port of Bandon Economic Development Fund, the Oregon Business Development

## Wildlife Service adopts final plan for refuges

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service adopted Final Comprehensive Conservation Plans for Bandon Marsh, Nestucca Bay and Siletz Bay National Wildlife Refuges. These plans provide goals, objectives and strategies for management of the three refuges over the next 15 years, according to a news release from USFWS.

The final CCPs emphasize expanded habitat management, restoration and monitoring along with increased public use opportunities. The CCPs were developed to provide reasonable, scientifically-grounded guidance for improving the refuges' wetlands, grasslands, riparian and upland forests and

## California troopers arrest Bandon shooting suspect

 The suspect in a May 2 shooting near Bandon has been arrested in California.

According to the Coos County Sheriff's Office, 27-year-old James Housego of Bandon was arrested by the California Highway Patrol on Wednesday morning near Yreka. Housego faces criminal charges in that state stemming from his arrest there.

In Oregon, Housego is suspected of shooting 34-year-old Joseph McNeil at a Bandon resi-

dence last week. Police say two other individuals also were terrorized at the residence, 50-year-old Don Chambers and 35-year-old Rodina Sorter.

Police found a vehicle belonging to Housego at a WalMart parking lot in the Salem area. Authorities said they believe Housego abandoned the vehicle there and fled south.

## Langlois Library awarded grant to save newspapers

The Langlois Public Library has been awarded a grant from the Curry County Cultural Coalition to preserve the content of some very fragile issues of a newspaper published in Denmark, Oregon, in 1884-1885.

The Southwest Oregon Recorder was published in Denmark beginning in 1884, but within a few years the paper moved to Bandon where it was renamed the Independent Recorder. Publication ceased in 1916. Very few copies of the

paper survive, and as far as we know none of the issues in the Langlois Library exist anywhere else.

Newspapers were the Internet of the nineteenth-century — they were usually the only way people had to get news and information. Up until the 1840s newspaper publishing was a relatively small market, because paper was an expensive commodity. Before the mid-1800s paper was made from cotton and linen fiber.

However, beginning in the 1840s wood pulp replaced cloth and the price of paper plummeted, meaning that newsprint could

be mass produced. This coincided with the westward expansion of the U.S., and hundreds of new publications appeared.

The drawback to wood pulp paper is that it is highly acidic and over time, especially if exposed to air or light, it breaks down. Our copies of the Southwest Oregon Recorder have deteriorated to the extent that they cannot be read as print.

That's where the Curry County Cultural Coalition comes in. Thanks to their generous support, we will work with the Oregon Digital Newspapers Program to digitize our collection; once

complete the project will allow patrons to access this interesting slice of north Curry County history online.

The Oregon Digital Newspaper Program was established in 2009 with grant funding from the Library Services and Technology Act, the Oregon Cultural Trust, the Oregon Newspaper Publishers Association and private donations. Additional grant support has been provided by the Library of Congress and the National Endowment for the Humanities' National Digital Newspaper Program.

### Fact vs. fiction at the port

As an incumbent candidate for the Port of Bandon Commission, I have tried to maintain the high ground and not engage the other candidates directly. I prefer to tell my story and let the voters decide. However the facts have been played fast and loose on several issues, on several occasions so I would like to clear the air with some verifiable information about the port and our activities

**Fact:** We have only owned the Old Blue Building (now green) for two and a half years. We acquired it in November 2010. We opened for business as the Old Town Marketplace June of 2012. We had it up and running in less than 18 months, providing a venue for 66 local vendors who are ecstatic with the opportunity.

**Fact:** The port acquiring the old fish plant and repurposing it as a marketplace for local producers is probably one of the biggest things to happen in the Bandon area in years. Dozens of vendor families are positively affected and it is now one of the top two positive cash flow sources for the port — and we have a new seafood market to boot.

**Fact:** According to a recent study, port activities generate about \$50 million in annual economic impact to the area.

**Fact:** The Port of Bandon has an existing business plan which was commissioned by the port in 2006 and is in the process of being updated and reformatted to comply with new state requirements.

**Fact:** I have served on many committees and commissions during the last 35 years. I have never served on a board more committed, ethical and thoughtful as the Port of Bandon Commission. Port manager Gina Dearth lives and breathes the port's business providing port and community leadership seven days a week. Gina Dearth has been the leading voice in the 5Ports Group that was formed years ago to band together the southern ports after the news of the potential defunding of small port dredging. Any claims of lack of leadership are unfounded.

**Fact:** The port is in weekly, and sometimes daily, contact with our national representatives' offices regarding the dredging issue. We will get this worked out. We will get dredged one way or another.

**Fact:** The port has clearly and repeatedly expressed its lack of interest in participating in the Bandon Marsh expansion proposal.

Fund and Coos Curry Douglas Development Corp.

"There was a lot of teamwork to get this together," he said.

Mayor Mary Schamehorn agreed.

"It was a great public-private partnership between Greg and the city's urban renewal agency," Schamehorn said. "I think it's going to be a big boost for Bandon."

Cheese production, which was once huge in Bandon, halted in 2000, a couple of years after the Tillamook County Creamery Association purchased the former factory. The building was demolished in 2002.

Two years ago, the city purchased the lot from Tillamook using urban renewal money with the idea they could attract a developer to build a new cheese factory.

After ground-breaking in August and construction beginning in October, Drobot announced he had hired Brad Sinko, son of former Bandon cheese

factory owner Joe Sinko, as head cheese maker for Face Rock Creamery. The younger Sinko began his cheese making career at his father's factory and made a name for himself at Beecher's Handmade Cheese in the Pike Place Market in Seattle. He has won major awards for his cheese, an accomplishment Drobot feels confident will continue at Face Rock.

Along with Face Rock reflects her drive to be an outstanding leader among her peers. She is in National Honor Society, the Talented and Gifted program, Kiwanis Key Club, Rotary Interact Club, Philosophy Club and is currently Spanish Club president. In addition, she has been able to balance her love for the sport of volleyball, basketball and softball.

Wednesday, people slowly filed into the building and tasted and purchased cheese and generous scoops of Umpqua Dairy ice cream. Drobot and Joe Sinko cheerfully served cones alongside employees while Brad Sinko and his crew were visible behind heavy glass making cheese curds. People came from all over the county for the opening.

"I stood in line for almost an hour," said Stephanie Kilmer of Coos Bay. "This is so exciting."

Kilmer grew up in Coos Bay and visited the former cheese factory on family outings.

"I think this is a remarkable step, especially considering the economy, to have something so positive," Kilmer added. "This will be huge for Bandon and for the area."

Others were equally excited.

"This is an extremely happy event for Bandon," said resident Sheila Levinsky.

"I think this is the best thing to happen in Bandon in 10 years," said Jeff Stitt of Bandon.

Julie Heron of Coos Bay also said she visited the former cheese factory.

"I remember when they used to put out a green flag saying they had fresh curds," she said. "I hope they do that again."

Ed Atkinson of Coos Bay said he came down for the opening because he is a lifelong friend of Joe Sinko.

Katy Downard of Bandon, who works at First American Title just past the creamery, said they've gotten inquiries for years from people asking what happened to the cheese factory. Now they can direct them to the new one.

"We're so glad it's back," she said.

other habitats for the long-term conservation of migratory birds, anadromous fish and native plants and animals.

"These plans represent years of effort among the service, state and other federal agencies, local communities and other stakeholders," Oregon Coast NWR Complex Project Leader Roy Lowe stated. "They build off of established partnerships working to conserve the exceptional natural resources along the Oregon coast."

Government agencies, conservation organizations, private citizens, local landowners and other stakeholders provided input for each CCP. The service evaluated written comments and public input on the draft plans in the fall of 2012 and revised the plans to include the new information received.

"The service is committed to the conservation of wildlife and their habitat and these plans provide the best balance in sustaining or improving the biological integrity, diversity and environmental health of the refuges," Lowe said in a statement. "It also provides the best possible balance of expanding popular recreational opportunities while limiting impacts to wildlife and their habitat."

The CCPs only focus on future management actions that will occur within refuge-managed lands. Bandon Marsh NWR is currently undergoing a refuge boundary expansion study. Since the refuge boundary expansion study is not within the scope of the Bandon Marsh CCP, the final CCP does not propose a boundary expansion. However, all substantive comments received during the draft CCP comment period regarding potential refuge boundary expansion will be addressed and incorporated into the Bandon Marsh Draft Land Protection Plan/Environmental Assessment, which will be presented to the public as soon as the required analyses are completed, according to Lowe.

Copies of the CCPs are available in the references section of the public libraries in Bandon, Coquille, Newport, Lincoln City, Pacific City and Tillamook. Printed or CD-ROM copies can be requested from the Refuge Office at 541-867-4550. Bandon's girls golf team had a strong start to the Class 4A-3A-2A-1A state tournament at Eagle Crest Resort before cooling off on the second day.

Still, the Tigers finished 10th out of 14 schools, an impressive showing for the first trip to state as a team in school history.

"We are so very proud of the girls," said Bandon coach Chris Schneider.

The Tigers had a team score of 423 on the first day, with strong efforts through the lineup. Nina Pelayo shot 96 and Liza Skeie shot 102, both posting great scores. Grace McMahon finished at 111, Alaina Russell at 114 and Michelle Whitney with 115.

Pelayo had another solid round Tuesday, shooting a 103. McMahon (109) and Russell (109) both improved their scores from the first day. But Skeie shot 121 and Whitney carded a 133.

"The course played 300 yards longer than yesterday, which affected each player," Schneider said.

All the Tigers are eligible to return next year.

Pelayo, Whitney and Russell are juniors, while Skeie is a sophomore and McMahon a freshman.

Reedsport's Monica Vaughn won the state title by a shot over defending champion Kaitlin Collom of Henley. The Braves finished two spots above Bandon in the team standings.

**Local lakes:** Anglers are still reporting good rainbow trout fishing out at Bradley Lake. Bank anglers are doing best in the morning and early evenings when the sun is off the water. Chartreuse power nuggets or night-crawlers fished off the lake bottom has been working well for anglers fishing from the boat launch pier.

Local anglers Bob Gates and Jon Vining have been having great success fishing Bradley Lake from their boat. They have been catching trout trolling a variety of lures and flies. Bob told me they have been fishing some larger baits like Rebel minnows and Rapalas which have been working well on the trophy-size trout.

Large mouth bass have moved into shallow water to spawn in most South Coast lakes. Lake temperatures have been aver-

aging 60 degrees. Bass typically start spawning when water temperatures are in the mid-60s. This is a great time of the year to hook a large bass in shallow water.

**Local rivers:** Spring Chinook fishing on the lower Rogue River continues to be slow. Flurries of salmon have been passing through the lower river and anglers anchored upriver have been catching a few.

Spring Chinook fishing has been slow on the mainstem of the Umpqua River as well. One angler dropped by to let us know he caught two Chinook near the low water bridge on the Umpqua recently. They also landed and released a 10-foot white sturgeon which took their anchovie.

Anglers are still reporting good shad fishing on the Umpqua River. One angler reported catching 30 shad and losing about that many near Elkton on Monday morning. No reports of shad on the Coos or Coquille rivers yet.

**Pacific Ocean and beaches:** Good ocean conditions had plenty of anglers launching boats from the Port of Bandon last Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Anglers had to work hard to catch their limit Thursday and Friday. Saturday was much better with anglers returning back to port early, and with a good grade of fish. Plenty of halibut from 30- to 60-pounds were taken from the Bandon

High Spot. Today starts the next 3-day round of spring halibut dates.

Plenty of anglers have been signing up for the May Surf Perch Derby. No big perch have been weighed in yet, but it's still early. Fishing near Bandon's South Jetty was good for one angler Friday. He reported catching 10 pink fin in a couple of hours. The better fishing has still been south of town near Cape Blanco.
