SELICHOT

The Hebrew month of Elul is a special period of time for reflection and preparation. It is intended as an opportunity for us to be ready for the awesome and powerful days of the YAMIM NORAIM - from Rosh Hashanah to Yom Kippur. The Shofar is the instrument by which we are to be awakened to the spiritual world and to change within ourselves. That is why, centuries ago, the Rabbis declared that the Shofar should be blown during Elul. Each Friday evening during September (corresponding to Elul) the Shofar will be heard in the Sanctuary. Join us as we prepare!

BETWEEN US . . .

Question: What do you call a person who can't read Hebrew and, instead, reads those transliterations?

Answer: A transliterate!

"Rabbi, I'd love to be able to read Hebrew, but I just don't have the time to study for a whole year."

"You know, I'd come to Temple more often but I can't follow the Hebrew. I really wish I knew how to read."

The above is why we are offering a Hebrew Marathon. No more excuses, no lazy reasons, no more transliterations. In one day, you can learn to read Hebrew.

But why is it so important? Because Hebrew acts as a very significant key to who and what we are as Jews. It is our language: the language of the Jewish spirit and soul. Without it something is missing.

As a Rabbi, I want to know that the congregation I serve is made up of Jews who are more than simply Jews. I want to know that the Jews in this congregation are Jews of conviction, Jews who care, and Jews who are Judaically literate. In our times, we should be nothing less!

SELICHOT SEPTEMBER 23, 1989

Traditionally, the period of reflection and repentance connected with the High Holiday season actually begins before Rosh Hashanah. According to Jewish tradition, this preliminary period (called Selichot) begins after the Havdalah service which comes at the end of the Sabbath immediately prior to Rosh Hashanah. A special nearmidnight observance is held. It is a very profound and moving worship experience.

Our observance of Selichot will begin at 8:30 on Saturday evening, September 23. At that time, we will be showing a few media pieces designed to help us prepare for the High Holidays. These short films deal with the themes of the YAMIM NORAIM.

Please join us for what promises to be a moving and educational experience, including the films and discussion, the gathering of friends, Havdalah, and Selichot services.

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK . . .

Although my school days are over and I am paying taxes from January to December, I still function on an academic calendar. When I was a child, the year began in September and ended in June with a nice long vacation in the summer. Somehow in the last few years the long vacation in the summer has been eclipsed by High Holiday choir rehearsals and now presidential responsibilities. In spite of this, the feeling that life begins anew in September still prevails.

For those of you who have not had the experience of enjoying a service in our newly air conditioned Sanctuary, September will offer you a new life experience. The air conditioning was completed in mid-June in time for a couple of the Friday evening services and the Shabbat morning B'nai Mitzvah services.

During the summer our Friday evening services used to be held in the social hall. This year we held these services in the Sanctuary, experimenting with various arrangements, always checking the air conditioning. This was followed by a thorough analysis to get a comprehensive picture of the effectiveness of the system. I think that all of you will be pleased.

The aesthetic beauty of the Sanctuary has not been affected. The visual impact on the room is virtually zero. I can honestly say that if you didn't know that such a major undertaking had been done, you would never become aware of it upon entering the main Sanctuary.

The comfort level of the room, which was another of the higher priority items dealt with by the air conditioning project, is extraordinarily satisfactory. It keeps us cool and dry. The acid test, of course, will be on the High Holidays when there will be two services back to back. Rest assured that you will be cool and contented.

The other major change this September, bringing new life to our congregation, is the Day Care Center. During the summer, the old library has been transformed into a Day Care Center. The committee has been busy hiring personnel and outfitting the facility. For those of you in need of child care with a Jewish flavor, call the Temple (545-6484) for information.

The pre-High Holy Day season is upon us as well in September. The Hebrew month of Elul is preparing us for the Days of Awe. I wish you all a year filled with new life, joy, contentment and, above all, good health.

If your seat reservation has not arrived by September 20, please call the Temple office (545-6484). Please note that all seats in the Sanctuary and social hall are reserved. No one may occupy any vacant seats unless the Seating Committee is advised of their availability prior to the start of services. Remember, please, that tickets will be required at afternoon Yom Kippur, Yizkor, and Ne'elah services. Ushers will check tickets.

A High Holy Day program will be planned by the Youth Group for children over six years of age. Arrangements may also be made for babysitting of younger children during morning services on both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. If you want your children to participate, please call the Temple office (545-6484) by September 15 to make a reservation.

Ushers are needed for all High Holy Day services. If you can assist at one or more of the services, please call Fred Greenstein at 249-6456 or the Temple office (545-6484).

The congregation provides large print editions of the High Holy Days prayer book to those wishing to use them. Ask an usher to provide you with one. Special audio equipment for the hearing impaired is available for use in the Sanctuary. Please call the Temple office to reserve a head set.

Because of physical impairments, some members of the congregation may not be able to attend High Holy Day services. If you or a member of your family is unable to worship with us at the Temple, cassette recordings of our High Holy Day services will be available. Please call the Temple office to obtain the tapes.

Our Temple used to have such an appeal made by the president of the congregation from the Bimah on Yom Kippur. Many congregations still do this.

Our Board of Trustees, in an effort to keep the sanctity of the worship uninterrupted by such an appeal, decided to have our appeal done by phone. Each member of the congregation is personally contacted by an officer or board member and asked to make a pledge. The phonothon occurs over a period of three or four days just prior to Rosh Hashanah and is then followed up by calls a few weeks later to those people who could not be reached the first time around. Pledge cards are sent to those who desire.

This year our phonothon will be done the same way. Please be expecting a call and be ready to help us meet our goal of 100% participation.

SUPPORT HOUSING FOR THE HOMELESS: JEWISH NEW YEAR CARDS FOR CONGRESS

The Religious Action Center in Washington, D.C., has created unique Jewish New Year cards intended to be sent to members of Congress to urge support for housing for the homeless. A set of three cards (one for each senator and one for our respresentative) is available to congregants free of charge at the Temple office.

The text of the cards reads:

"Dear Senator,

At this time of the Jewish New Year, I wanted to send a card to a homeless family, but they have no home and thus no address. Therefore, I am sending it to you with my prayer that next year every American will have a decent and affordable place to live. Then will our New Year be full of rejoicing. During this holy season I ask what the homeless ask for themselves: HOUSING NOW!"

These cards are part of the Jewish community's participation in HOUSING NOW, which includes several days of activities during the High Holy Days, including a massive march in Washington, D.C., urging that decent and affordable housing be made available for all Americans. All congregants are urged to send copies of these cards to their elected officials.

ANNUAL HIGH HOLY DAY APPEAL FOR ISRAEL BONDS TO BE HELD AT KOL NIDRE SERVICES

Our congregation is proud to be taking part once again in the annual High Holy Day Appeal for Israel Bonds.

Israel has made remarkable progress in the past year, and nowhere is this more evident than in Jerusalem, which has been reborn in spirit and substance since 1967.

Let us do our part by providing maximum loan funds for Israel's continued growth during our congregation's High Holy Day bond effort.

MAZON

MAZON: A Jewish Response to Hunger, offers American Jews a means through which they may add a rich dimension of community service to their private celebrations. Through MAZON, we voluntarily add 3% to the cost of our celebrations—a Bar or Bat Mitzvah, a wedding, a birthday, or anniversary, any joyous occasion—as an offering to help defeat the scourge of hunger here at home and around the world.

MAZON is one of American Jewry's principal means for participating in the twin effort to feed the hungry and to put an end to the causes of hunger. In cities, large and small, across the country, through synagogues and organizations or on their own, thousands of Jews have become part of the MAZON effort by sharing 3% of the cost of their simchas as well as contributing on the occasions of Yom Kippur and Passover.

Three percent: to a cost of \$3,000, add \$90; to \$8,000, add \$240; to \$20,000, add \$600.

To a child suffering from malnutrition, add life.

Think how meaningful it can be for us to know that a portion of our celebration is set aside to include those in need—and that our joy is thereby increased.

Think how meaningful it can be for all of us to know that our good times are also times of good. And above all, think how meaningful it is to bring food to those who have none.

The Christ Church of New Brunswick has an ongoing soup kitchen to help feed the poor and homeless of our area. Most of the staff for the kitchen comes from the church, but they would appreciate our help on the second and third Sundays of each month.

Our help will allow their members to observe their Sabbath as both a holy day and a family day. Here's your chance to do a Mitzvah in church!

ADULT B'NAI MITZVAH
