

Short Phrases

(Verbs)

I am eating bread.	Inknash <u>tkwátasha</u> saplíl.
He eats meat.	Pánk <u>itkwátaxa</u> nkwítnan.
This woman eats fish.	Íchi áyat <u>itkwátaxa</u> tkwínatnan.
We eat berries.	Namáknatash <u>átkwatxa</u> tmaanítnan.
They will eat now.	Pmák <u>patkwátata</u> íchi íkuk.
Will you eat?	Míshnam <u>tkwátata</u> ?
Why are you not eating?	Míshnam chāw <u>tkwátasha</u> ?
I am going now.	Áwnash <u>wínasha</u> íchi íkuk.
We will climb up.	Namáktash <u>panátita</u> . (future tense)
They are climbing down.	Pmák <u>paháyksha</u> . (present tense)
(You) go away.	(Ímk) Wíyat <u>wínak</u> .
He does not want to go.	<u>Iwyáat'kw'sha</u> wínatyaw.
This woman is going (far) away.	Íchi áyat (wíyat)* <u>iwínasha</u> .
Will you go away?	Míshnam wíyat <u>wínata</u> ? or Míshnam wíyat <u>wínasha</u> ?
You're not going (far) away.	Cháwnam wíyat <u>wínata</u> ?
I will stand up.	Inknash <u>tútita</u> .
I jump up.	Inknash <u>tkáchayksh</u> . ¹
We will all stand up.	Namákná <u>tútita</u> .
Let's all stand up in an orderly fashion.	Awna <u>awxanayksha</u> . (Shoulder to shoulder, straight line)

* Wiyat = Means going far away

1 = Spring to your feet
