UDC

- First edition (in French) published in 1905 around 10000 classes
- Full editions in the 1980s over 200.000
- Today standard version in English: 67.600
 - translations of the UDC exist in 39 languages
 - used in 125 countries
- Since 1992 the property of the UDC Consortium: not-for-profit organisation of publishers which sustains itself from membership fees and selling of UDC licenses



UDC AUTOMATION TIMELINE

- 1960s first use of UDC online
- 1980s BSI medium edition, 60.000 classes on magnetic tape
- 1993 UDC Master Reference File
- 2001 UDC on the Web
- 2007 UDC MRF 67600 classes migration to a new, improved editorial system



MASTER REFERENCE FILE

- updated annually
- designed for maintenance and publishing purposes
- up to 2007: text and ISO2709 exports
- from 2007: MySQL database, more exports
- MRF is not a tool for users!



UDC ONLINE PRODUCT

- the first general documentary classification made available on the Web in June 2001
 - Dewey, Library of Congress
 Classification were released shortly after
- six years of experience in supporting the service



UDC CHARACTERISTICS

- aspect or perspective classification (same phenomenon or concept may appear in many places in the schedule)
- designed to be used for both shelf arrangement and coordinated indexing and retrieval
- analytico-synthetic system
 - expressing a multifaceted nature of a single subject
 - combination of subjects



WHAT IS SPECIAL ABOUT UDC?

structure that allows

- scalable indexing: very broad →very specific
- establishing different kind of relationships between subjects
- independent use of facets of vocabulary
- extension of UDC with other indexing systems



WHAT IS SPECIAL ABOUT UDC?

- users can purchase UDC data in a file format
 - import in local indexing tools
 - creation of combined indexing tools
 - easier mapping to other vocabularies (local or and use of facets of vocabulary)



UDC USERS

- Information professionals: librarians, documentalists, indexers creating metadata to facilitate access to information
- What tools they have available until now?
 - printed editions of UDC
 - UDC CD ROM e.g. available in Czech, Spanish
 - Master Reference File



USE OF ENGLISH EDITIONS

 UDC schedules in English are used in 43 countries of the world

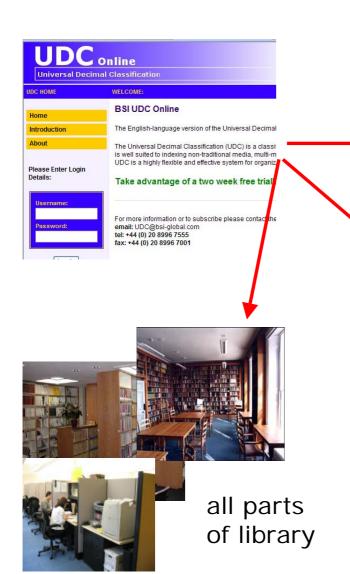




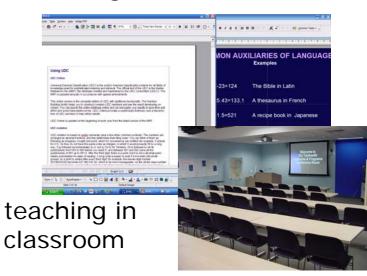
CLASSIFYING USING UDC

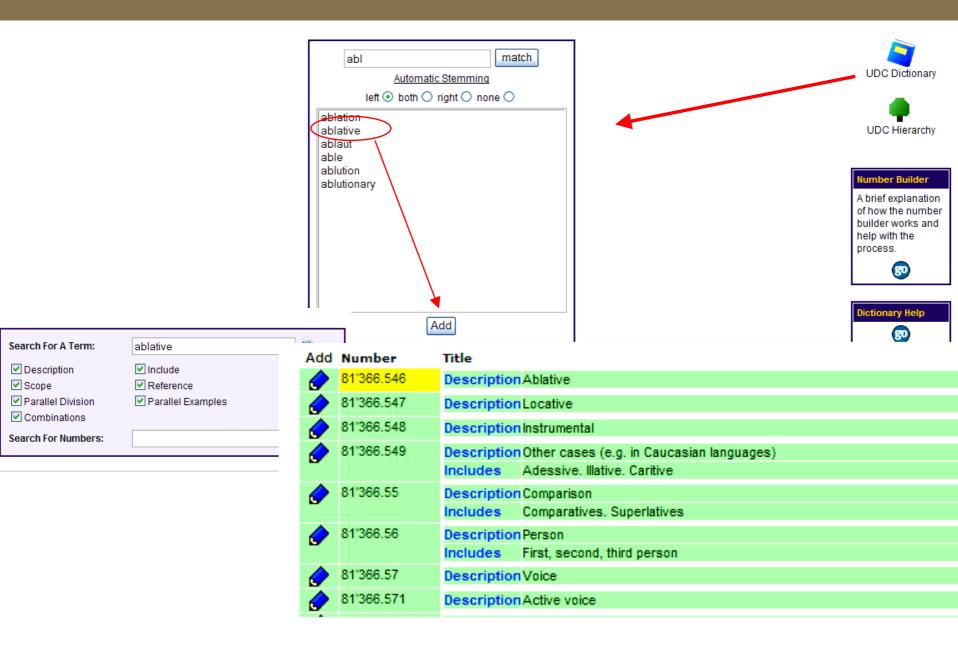

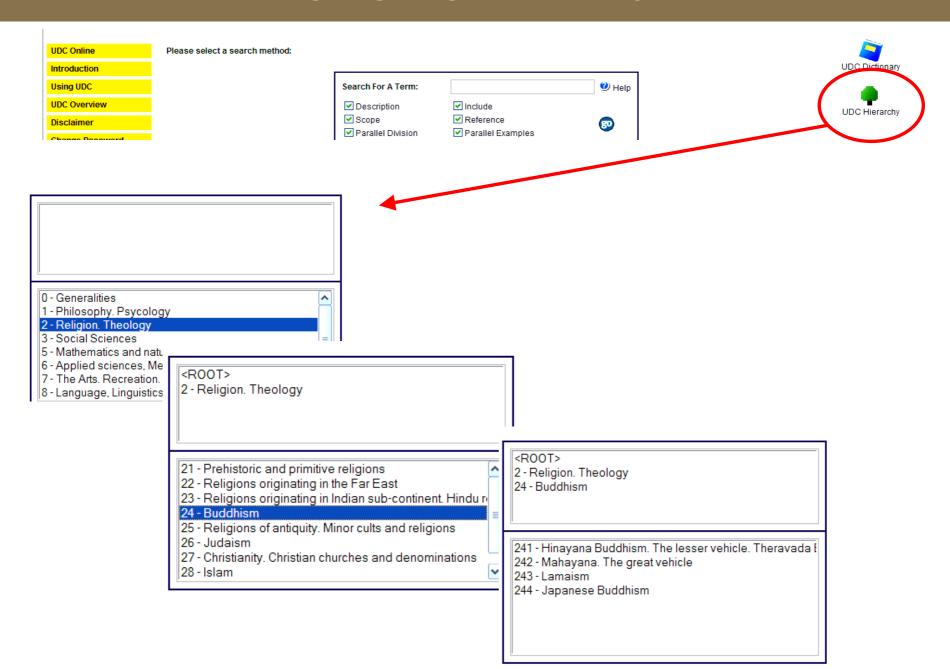


BROWSING HIERARCHY




NUMBER BUILDING FEATURE



WORKING WITH SCHEDULES ONLINE

- powerful search and browse
 - search through dictionary
 - good control over truncation/stemming
 - helps with terminology control and consistency in classification
 - easy and quick checking of related and associated classes
- quicker finding and building UDC numbers, avoiding of typos
