Decorative cornice, stone buttresses, Gothic windows with stained glass and stone window labels. Tracery panel above doorway and stained glass transom.*

SPECIAL F/M - ORIGINALREMOVED:

*Original pinnacles at base of main spire have had their spires removed.*

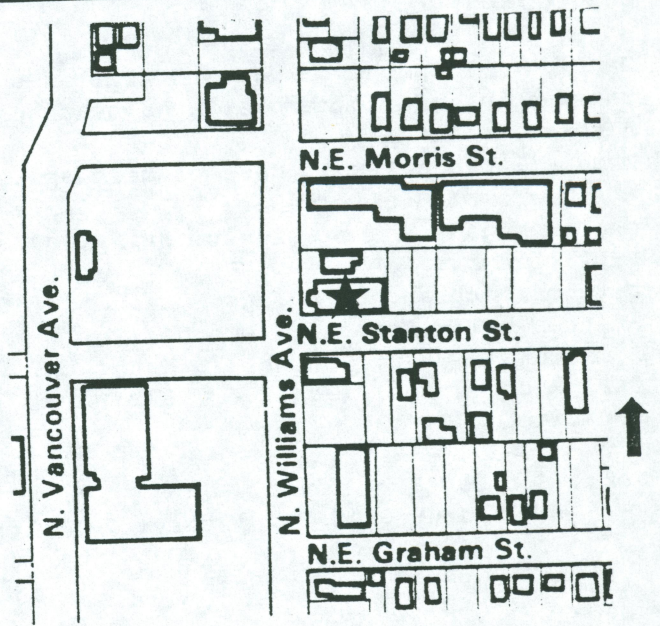
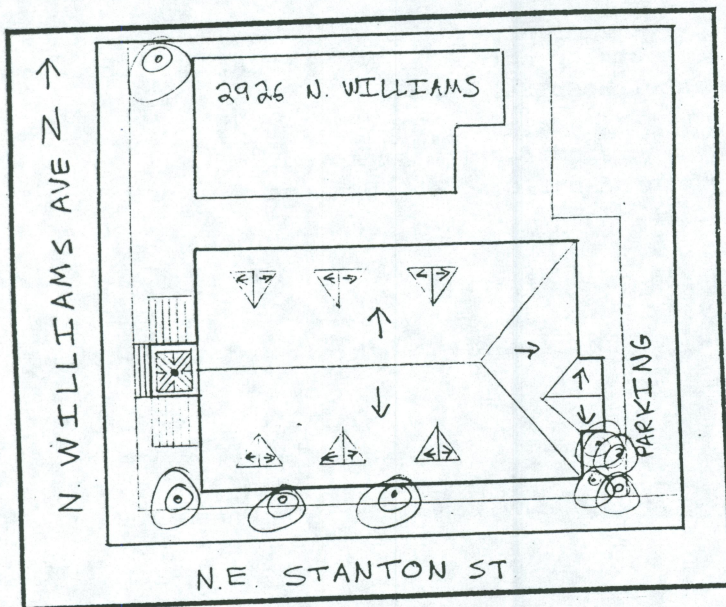
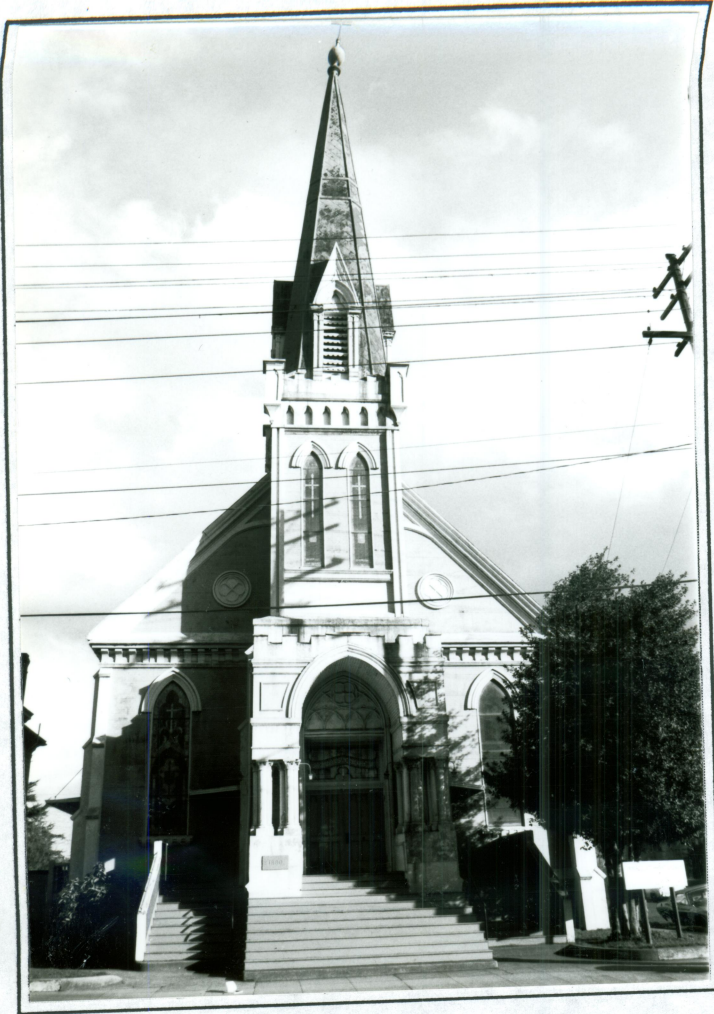
