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Following Coleman's death, Darrell Figgis' letter to Mr Shortt, in the *Evening Herald*, 10 December 1918. " 'I would suggest that with 6 months under feeding with close unhealthy confinement, little resistance would be offered to this infection were it introduced. If these men suffer in health, as would appear inevitable from such conditions, I wish to warn you of your responsibility in this matter.'

The Irish people, in a few days, will be given an opportunity of expressing their abhorrence of the English Government's treatment of Irishmen whose crime to love their country. Let the ripost be clear and unmistakeable!"

To the Editor "Irish Independent." Co Sir-The death of Mr. Coleman in Usk mo we Prison adds another name to the long roll fro of Irish martyrs sacrificed by English milime tary despotism. Like the 100 Irishmen and ter ver women arrested last May, Mr. Coleman was arr not charged with any offence; like the rest Pr of, us, he read in newspapers the fantastic accusations of Mr. Lloyd George and of Mr. Hi 18 Shortt, and, like the rest of us, he was 501 denied the right of reply. not
