## INFORMATION ON UNITED NATIONS SYSTEM REGULAR AND EXTRA-BUDGETARY TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION EXPENDITURES IN 1980 FINANCED FROM SOURCES OTHER THAN UNDP

### Report of the Administrator

#### Summary

This is the latest in a series of reports containing statistical information on the technical co-operation expenditures of organizations in the United Nations system which are financed from sources other than UNDP.

Section I of the report outlines the present status of the work undertaken in the United Nations system with regard to cross-organizational expenditure reporting. It furthermore explains the coverage of the report and the nature of the data contained in the report.

Section II reviews some of the characteristics of the data provided by the specialized Agencies for 1980 expenditures and compares various features of the 1980 data with those for 1979.

Section III discusses data which have been made available from other organizations on their expenditures on operational activities in 1980, and compares them to the data provided for last year's report.

The detailed data provided by the United Nations, the Specialized Agencies, and IAEA on their 1980 non-UNDP technical co-operation activities are contained in the Annex. The data are provided by Agency, by sector, by recipient country and by source of financing. The country-by-country estimates of United Nations system expenditures on operational activities in 1980 are contained in the final table of the Annex (Table A.8).

## I. INTRODUCTION

1. Since 1973, the Administrator has been providing the Governing Council with an annual report on the magnitude and composition of the technical co-operation activities of the organizations in the United Nations system funded from sources other than UNDP. The present report continues this practice and contains data on non-UNDP financed technical co-operation expenditures incurred in 1980. As in previous years, the Specialized Agencies and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) have co-operated with UNDP in the preparation of this report by providing the data relating to non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures and contributions contained in the Annex. In conformity with the practices introduced in the reports to the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh sessions of the Council, the present report also contains data on development assistance expenditures by the World Food Programme (WFP) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) and data on certain disbursements (see para. 29) by the World Bank and the International Development Association (IDA). Sections II and III below contain a brief analysis of these data together with a preliminary overview of total United Nations system expenditures on operational activities in 1980.

2. The format of the present report closely resembles that of last year's report which introduced extensive changes<sup>1/</sup> in order to improve the coverage of the report and to relate its data to the Comprehensive Policy Review of Operational Activities for Development of the United Nations system, undertaken by the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation<sup>2/</sup>, as well as to the data contained in the report of the Secretary-General on United Nations technical co-operation activities, presented to the Governing Council each year<sup>3/</sup>.

3. Previous reports to the Council on this subject have identified other areas where improvement in reporting of United Nations system technical co-operation flows would be desirable<sup>4/</sup>. These include the classification of United Nations system operational activities for development by type of activity (with a particular view to differentiating technical co-operation from other forms of development co-operation), the classification of their sources of funding, and the standardization of Agencies' reporting on expenditures for development co-operation purposes. As indicated in a previous report to the Council<sup>5/</sup>, UNDP raised these issues at an Inter-Agency Consultative Meeting in December 1978. That Meeting recommended that further work on the subject should be undertaken within the appropriate subsidiary machinery of the Administrative Committee on Co-ordination (ACC).

4. The matter was subsequently referred to the Consultative Committee on Substantive Questions (Operational Activities) (CCSQ(OPS)) which considered, at its second regular session of 1979, the question of the responsibility for reporting to Governments on United Nations system expenditures and the definition of terms to be used in such reporting<sup>6/</sup>. It was decided that a joint working party of CCSQ(OPS) and the Consultative Committee on Administrative Questions (Financial and Budgetary Questions) (CCAQ(FB)) should be convened in December 1980 in order to examine these questions further. On the basis of a review of existing arrangements for cross-organizational reporting on United Nations system expenditures, the joint working party made a number of proposals concerning the classification of development activities by type and source of funding and the possibility of using a single data base for the three cross-organizational expenditure reports presently prepared in the United Nations system (i.e. the present report, the annual report of the Director-General to the General Assembly on operational activities for development and the ACC report on expenditures in relation to programmes)<sup>7/</sup>. It further proposed that this data base should not be in addition to the Common Register of Development Activities (CORE/1), developed and prepared by the Inter-Organization Board for Information Systems (IOB).

5. The proposals of the working party were reviewed by CCAQ(FB) at its fifty-fourth session<sup>8/</sup> in March 1981. That Committee in turn identified a number of areas where it felt that further study was needed before concrete proposals could be made to the ACC and decided that, to this end, a working party of (CCAQ(FB)) should be convened in July 1981. However, in the view of the Administrator, the areas identified by CCAQ(FB) as requiring further study involve issues of a substantive as well as a purely financial and administrative nature. UNDP has therefore proposed that the matter should be examined at the next session of CCSQ(OPS), with a view to reconvening the joint working party of CCAQ(FB) and CCSQ(OPS).

#### Coverage of the report

6. In its questionnaire to the Agencies requesting the data on 1980 non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures contained in this report, UNDP retained the classification scheme which was used for the 1979 data.<sup>9/</sup> However, in order to lessen the danger of double-counting identified in last year's report <sup>10/</sup> and generally to improve the quality and coverage of the data in the report, data on expenditures by UNDP-administered funds, the United Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) and UNICEF were obtained from the financing organizations. Agencies were consequently asked not to provide data on expenditures against these funds and, in those cases where such expenditures were reported and identified as such, the data made available by the funding organizations were substituted for those reported by Agencies.

7. The new format has been followed in this year's reporting and the resulting data are contained in Tables A.3-A.5. In reviewing these tables, it should be noted that FAO data are not broken down by source of funding; hence all FAO extra-budgetary expenditures have been classified as funded by bilateral sources since FAO reported the same data to UNDP as they did to IOB for the CORE/I data base. Should UNDP's suggestion to separately identify technical co-operation by source of funding in that data base (see paragraphs 3 and 4 above) be accepted by the ACC and its subsidiary machinery, Agencies would in the future not need to compile separately sets of data for the purposes of the present report. One major Agency, the World Health Organization (WHO), indicated in reply to the UNDP questionnaire that the World Health Assembly had authorized WHO in May 1980 to submit audited accounts of expenditures on a biennial basis. Accordingly, since WHO was no longer required to report expenditures against its regular budget to its governing bodies annually, it would not be possible to make such expenditure data available to the Governing Council. For the purposes of this report, data on WHO extra-budgetary expenditures in 1980 presented in Tables 1 and A.1 were drawn from a WHO report submitted to the World Health Assembly in May 1981<sup>11/</sup>, which did not provide a breakdown by country. In the past, similar audited reports have been used for the purposes of this report, and the same information has been used this year, to the extent that it was available. Therefore, WHO expenditure data are assumed to relate, grosso modo, to technical co-operation, unless the nature of the activities undertaken under the financing from the sources listed in that report has changed considerably in the past year. However, WHO cautioned against the use of these data for the purposes of the present report because of their preliminary nature and because, in some cases, they do not relate to technical co-operation and/or include obligations relating to 1981 expenditures. The breakdown by country of WHO expenditures listed in Table A.3 have been reported by funding organizations. The breakdown by country of the WHO contributions data listed in Table A.6 was available in the WHO report.

8. The majority of the reporting Agencies indicated in their replies, as requested, the funding sources of their expenditures. One exception was the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO), which supplied the data on its extra-budgetary expenditures in an aggregate form, i.e. broken down by country, but not by source of funding. FAO data on extra-budgetary expenditures consequently include expenditures financed from United Nations system sources, other multilateral sources, bilateral sources and "self-supporting" contributions. It was decided, in consultation with FAO, to include all the extra-budgetary expenditures incurred by that Agency under "bilateral sources of funding" (Table A.5), since the greater part of FAO extra-budgetary expenditures has been financed by bilateral funds in the past. In addition, the Universal Postal Union (UPU) and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) could not provide a breakdown by country of their expenditures. These expenditures thus appear only in the overview table on expenditures by sector (Table A.1).

## II. 1980 REGULAR PROGRAMME AND EXTRA-BUDGETARY TECHNICAL CO-OPERATION EXPENDITURES FUNDED FROM SOURCES OTHER THAN UNDP

9. The 1980 regular programme, non-UNDP extra-budgetary, and UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures of each of the Agencies are shown in Table 1, together with a breakdown by sector. Nineteen organizations and the five regional commissions of the United Nations system accounted for technical co-operation expenditures of more than \$494 million funded from sources other than UNDP. last year's report, corresponding expenditures of some \$464 million were reported by eighteen organizations and the five regional commissions<sup>12/</sup>. However, in order to make a meaningful comparison of the total non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures in 1980 with those of 1979, several adjustments must be made, taking account of the differences in coverage between the two years. With the necessary adjustments, estimated non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures by eighteen organizations and the five regional commissions were some \$383 million in 1979, and the comparable 1980 figure of \$493 million reflected an increase of 29 per cent<sup>13/</sup>.

10. With data adjusted for the exclusion of WHO's regular budget, the five larger Agencies accounted for some 75 per cent of the total reported non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures in 1979 and 76 per cent in 1980. Expenditures by FAO increased by almost 20 per cent between the two years, despite the fact that it did not report support costs for 1980 which were included in last year's data<sup>14/</sup>. Although non-UNDP-funded expenditures by the United Nations showed a considerable increase, this was largely due to the inclusion in the 1980 expenditures data of some \$4.2 million by the United Nations Office for Financial Services financed by UNFPA and to more complete reporting (see para. 6 above). Of the remaining larger Agencies, the non-UNDP-funded expenditures of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) increased by some 23 per cent and those of United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) by 26 per cent in 1980.

11. As regards the smaller Agencies, their non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures continue to fluctuate, indicating no significant overall trends. Expenditures by the Inter-Governmental Maritime Consultative Organization (IMCO) continued to increase rapidly, by some 54 per cent in 1980, while the corresponding figure for the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) rose by about 58 per cent. Expenditures by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) increased by 8 per cent between 1979 and 1980, and those by the United Nations Centre on Transnational Corporations (UNCTC) rose by some 50 per cent, to \$1.4 million. Non-UNDP funded extra-budgetary expenditures by both the UNDP Office for Projects Execution (OPE) and the United Nations Volunteers (UNV) totalled some \$17 million in 1980, as against rather more than \$12 million spent by OPE alone in 1979. In contrast with these increases, non-UNDP financed technical co-operation expenditures by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) decreased by some 13 per cent in 1980, and the World Tourism Organization's (WTO) non-UNDP expenditures fell by some \$200,000 to zero.

(a) Sectoral Distribution

12. This is the second year in which the revised ACC sectoral classification for United Nations system expenditures has been used for the classification of the data in the present report. Because of the exclusion of WHO regular budget data, the

health sector has been replaced by "agriculture, forestry and fisheries" as the sector with the highest concentration of expenditures. This sector accounted for more than 19 per cent of total expenditures in 1980 (see Table A.1). Of this amount, FAO accounted for close to 91 per cent. The second most important sector in terms of expenditures was the population sector, accounting for some 16 per cent of the total. This is partially accounted for by the more complete reporting of UNFPA expenditures mentioned above. Health becomes the third most important sector, accounting for some 12 per cent of total expenditures.

13. If the data are adjusted to take account of the missing WHO data, the relative share of the agriculture, forestry and fisheries sector remained more or less constant, the population sector expenditures increased from 4 per cent to 27 per cent of the total and the health sector declined in importance. The changing trends in the two last sectors is in part due to the fact that, in previous years, WHO reported expenditures financed by UNFPA in the health sector, whereas UNFPA regards them as belonging to the population sector. In addition, all expenditures of other Agencies funded by UNFPA have similarly been included in the population sector for 1980, whereas in the past these may also have been reported under other sectors.

14. Regular programme expenditures are concentrated in the agriculture, forestry, fisheries sector (24 per cent), followed by general development, natural resources and industry, all at about 10 per cent of regular programme expenditures. Unilateral "self-supporting" expenditures, i.e. those expenditures financed by the developing countries themselves, continue to be concentrated in the transport and communications sector (38 per cent of such expenditures) and in education (16 per cent). "Self-supporting" contributions are an important source of financing for non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures in these two sectors, accounting for 56 per cent of expenditures in transport and communications and 41 per cent in the education sector. A significant proportion of general development and development planning expenditures (25 per cent) is also financed by "self-supporting" expenditures. Other important areas of activity financed by developing countries themselves are industry, population and employment.

(b) Regular Programme Expenditures

15. As noted above, the data contained in this category are not comparable to those in previous reports because of the omission of WHO data which last year accounted for some 68 per cent of the totality of regular programme expenditures. If this is taken into account, regular programme expenditures increased by some 26 per cent, in spite of the exclusion of support costs from 1980 expenditures reported by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) which were included in 1979. As in 1979, seven organizations (UNESCO, ICAO, IMCO, International Trade Centre (ITC), WTO, UNCTC and OPE) indicated that they did not finance any technical co-operation activities from their regular budgets. With the omission of WHO, FAO accounts for the largest share of expenditures incurred against the regular budget with 34 per cent of the total, followed by IAEA and ILO (see Table A.2). In 1980, regular budget expenditures constituted close to 9 per cent of total United Nations system technical co-operation expenditures financed from sources other than UNDP; the corresponding figure for 1979 was some 12 per cent (in both cases excluding WHO). Over-all, therefore, the share of regular budgets in the funding for technical co-operation continues the downward trend noted in the past three reports on this subject.

(c) Expenditures financed from extra-budgetary resources

16. In 1980, the share of technical co-operation expenditures financed from bilateral sources (Table A.5) increased by 10 per cent, to some 60 per cent of total extra-budgetary expenditures. This is partly explained by the inclusion in this category of all FAO extra-budgetary expenditures (excepting those financed from UNDP-administered funds, UNFPA and UNICEF) amounting to almost \$97 million. This figure represents about 36 per cent of the expenditures recorded as being from bilateral sources. WHO has the second largest share of technical co-operation expenditures financed from bilateral sources; including support costs, it amounted to \$86 million, or 32 per cent of the total. In 1980, all reporting Agencies recorded expenditures in this category except OPE and WTO. UNCTC finances the totality of its non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures from bilateral contributions. Finally, ILO registered an increase from zero to some \$20 million in 1980 in expenditures in this category (see paragraph 18).

17. United Nations system sources other than UNDP were the second most important source of financing of Agency technical co-operation activities in 1980, following the pattern of 1979 (Table A.3). Such financing increased by almost 54 per cent compared with 1979. This is partly due to increased coverage of the report which did not include such expenditures for the regional commissions, and partly to the more complete reporting by funding organizations. The United Nations registered the largest increase compared with 1979 (over 200 per cent) and also accounts for the largest share of such expenditures: \$39.8 million or 34 per cent. WHO has the second largest programme of technical co-operation financed by United Nations system sources at 24 per cent of the total, and UNDP (OPE and UNV) the third largest with 15 per cent. A high proportion of these activities were undertaken by Agencies on behalf of UNFPA and UNDP-administered funds such as the United Nations Capital Development Fund, the United Nations Revolving Fund for Natural Resources Exploration, the United Nations Sudano-Sahelian Office and UNV.

18. A further \$3.9 million was accounted for by technical co-operation expenditures financed from other non-United Nations system multilateral sources (Table A.4). Half of this amount was spent by UNESCO and another 22 per cent by ICAO. The ILO reported a very substantial drop in its activities financed from multilateral sources of funds, from almost \$15 million in 1979, to only \$0.15 million in 1980. There is a corresponding increase in activities financed from bilateral sources reported by ILO.

19. One additional category of expenditures reported by Agencies was that made against "self-supporting" contributions (see last column of Table A.8). As mentioned above, FAO and WHO did not separately identify such expenditures, and the total figure of \$38.7 million reported in 1980 cannot therefore be compared to the \$49 million reported for 1979. Excluding these Agencies, such expenditures increased by 27 per cent. As in 1979, most of these expenditures are in oil-exporting countries, with Saudi Arabia accounting for more than \$12 million (more than half of which is spent by ICAO) and Libyan Arab Jamahiriya for almost \$6 million. For reasons of space, the breakdown by Agency of such expenditures is not included in the statistical annex but can be obtained from UNDP upon request.



(d) Extra-budgetary contributions to the Specialized Agencies and IAEA for technical co-operation activities in 1980

20. As with expenditures, last year's report on this subject introduced a new classification system for contributions (i.e. the amount put at the disposal of Agencies for extra-budgetary technical co-operation expenditures). Agencies were thus requested to classify their contributions by type, making a distinction between general contributions and unilateral "self-supporting" contributions, corresponding to that of expenditures. General contributions data are contained in Table A.6, classifying the sources of contributions by country, by United Nations system sources, by other multilateral sources and by other miscellaneous sources. Table A.7 contains contributions for "self-supporting" activities.

21. Seventeen organizations reported general extra-budgetary contributions of almost \$345 million received in 1980, as against \$283 million reported by 14 organizations for 1979. The three additional organizations are the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA), the Economic Commission for Latin America (ECLA) and the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP). If these latter organizations are excluded, the figure for 1980 is decreased to \$326 million, an increase of some 15 per cent over the corresponding figure for 1979.

22. General contributions by Governments directly to Agencies amounted to almost \$210 million in 1980. Omitting almost \$15 million of 1980 contributions which were received by organizations which did not report 1979 contributions, government contributions to the other 14 organizations amounted to \$195 million in 1980, an increase of some 8 per cent over the corresponding 1979 figure of \$180 million. Of the 1980 total of \$210 million, the seventeen members of the Development Assistance Committee (DAC) accounted for \$182 million. Adjusting for the different organizational coverage, reported contributions by these countries in 1980 registered an 11 per cent increase over 1979. In contrast, members of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) contributed some \$6 million to the general non-UNDP technical co-operation programmes of the United Nations system in 1980, a considerable reduction compared with the 1979 figure of some \$20 million.

23. A decrease was also registered on contributions from non-governmental organizations, which fell by over 40 per cent to some \$7.3 million in 1980. FAO and WHO are the primary recipients of contributions from non-governmental organizations and those two Agencies shared equally in the decrease in contributions from this source.

24. The data on the financing received by Agencies from other United Nations system organizations and funds are not directly comparable with those for 1979. For reasons given above, data on the financing received from UNFPA are more complete than for 1979, most particularly for the United Nations. In addition, the World Bank has been classified as a United Nations system source in the 1980 data, whereas it was included with the development banks and other non-United Nations system sources in the report on 1979 contributions. These factors and the larger organizational coverage account for most of the reported increase in the flow of development assistance funds between the organizations of the United Nations system in 1980. However, one notable feature was a reported increase of \$7 million in 1980 in the financing provided to WHO by the World Bank.

25. Adjusting for the reclassification of the World Bank referred to in the preceding paragraph, the financing received by the United Nations system from other multilateral sources increased from some \$4 million in 1979 to almost \$21 million in 1980. The vast majority of this increase was accounted for by contributions of \$14 million (compared with \$2 million in 1979) received by FAO from the Commission of the European Economic Communities.

26. In conformity with the practice introduced in the report covering 1979, Table A.7 contains data on the contributions made to the United Nations system for "self-supporting" technical co-operation activities. Such contributions exceeded \$64 million in 1980, an increase of some 28 per cent over the 1979 figure of \$50 million. Most of the 1980 total and most of the increase over 1979 was accounted for by the member countries of OPEC which contributed some \$47 million for these self-supporting activities in 1980. Of the OPEC total, the Libyan Arab Jamahiriya accounted for about one-third and Saudi Arabia a further one-third. One of the smaller agencies, ICAO, was the largest recipient of such funds, but UNESCO, FAO and the ILO also received significant amounts.

### III. ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY UNDP AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

27. Table 1 includes data on UNDP project expenditures in 1980 by Agency and by economic sector for comparative purposes. These data conform with those in document DP/511 and are provisional.<sup>15/</sup> They also include data on cost-sharing expenditures, estimated at a total of close to \$60 million.

28. Total UNDP project expenditures increased by some 23 per cent to almost \$669 million in 1980. Non-UNDP-financed technical co-operation expenditures consequently grew more rapidly (29 per cent) than UNDP expenditures. Four Agencies continue to have a majority of their technical co-operation activities financed from sources other than UNDP, namely WHO, IAEA, WIPO, UNCTC and ITC. ECLA, ESCAP and ECWA also receive more technical co-operation financing from extra-budgetary sources than from UNDP. The remaining Agencies continue to receive the larger part of their technical co-operation financing from UNDP.

29. As in last year's report, data on World Bank and IDA technical co-operation expenditures have been incorporated into the report, both in Table 1 and in Table A.8. These data comprise expenditures against World Bank loans and IDA credits under the categories "training" and "consultants". Total disbursements under these two categories were \$365 million in 1980, reflecting a decrease of some 9 per cent from \$399 million reported for 1979. World Bank loans constituted the major share of this amount with some \$233 million (down from \$268 million in 1979) and IDA credits the smaller, with \$131 million, the same level as in 1979. However, caution in the use of these data is advised since they are only proxy measures for technical co-operation and because they reflect disbursements against loans and credits rather than grants. Consequently, they should be used only as an indication of the magnitude of World Bank and IDA technical co-operation disbursements and should not be compared directly with Agency non-UNDP technical co-operation expenditures in the same year.

30. Other data on operational activities contained in Table A.8 include UNICEF and WFP. UNICEF's expenditures increased by some 17 per cent between 1979 and 1980 and the corresponding data for WFP indicate an increase of some 2 per cent. Although not technical co-operation expenditures, these data are included for comparative purposes and in order to give an overview of the total grant development assistance provided through the United Nations system in 1980.

31. A.8 contains a country-by-country summary of all the data referred to in this report. Nevertheless, it should be emphasized that the data in Table A.8 are to some extent incomplete and are in many cases preliminary. However, much of the previous possible double-counting of expenditures<sup>16/</sup> has been eliminated, and in some cases there has been a more complete reporting of overall expenditures, since some previously omitted expenditures by funding organizations, Governments and non-governmental organizations have been included. Part of the increase in the United Nations system overall expenditures on operational activities from an estimated \$1.6-\$1.7 billion in 1979, to \$1.9 billion in 1980, can therefore be explained by better coverage. A more complete picture of 1980 expenditures on operational activities of the United Nations system will be provided in the annual report on operational activities for development, to be presented to the thirty-sixth session of the General Assembly by the Director-General for Development and International Economic Co-operation.

32. As regards the extra-budgetary technical co-operation expenditures of the United Nations in 1980, they probably reflect, to a large extent, contributions received in previous years. The relatively small reported increase in non-UNDP extra-budgetary contributions to the Agencies in 1980 suggests that developing countries are unlikely to benefit from any significant growth in the activities financed from such sources in the immediate future.

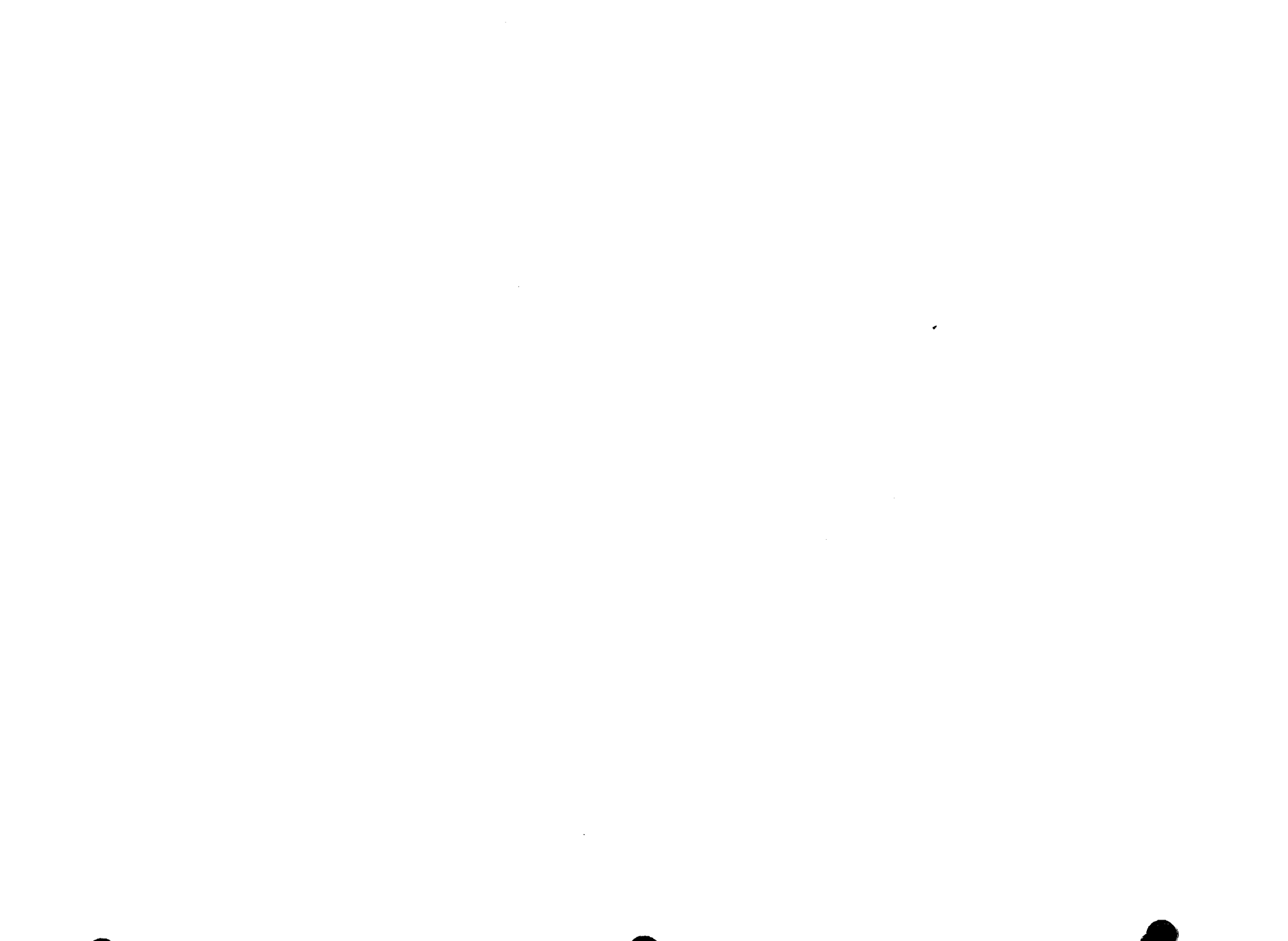
