The first is the annual Brunsville Open, an 18-hole stroke play event slated for Sunday July 26 with a 10 a.m. shotgun start. This tournament always draws many top players from the area. In fact, the last two winners are from the Sioux City area.

Word has spread just how good Prairie Rose is, which again is a big plus for the course and our town in general.

The second tournament is the 8-inch cup 4-person scramble, to be held Sept. 20. That is always a fun tournament as the season winds to a close.
