

my golf got worse and worse. I was in 11 amateur tournaments in 1931 and won only three. Putting was to blame. Among numerous other faults, I was gripping the club entirely too tight with the forefingers of my right hand. My right wrist was too right hand. My right wrist was too tense. It prevented me from having a free pendulum swing.

Many amateurs have this fault. Be sure to let the fingers of the right hand just rest sort of lightly on the club, and permit the left hand to do most of the work.

Practice is the only thing that will help you when any department of your game goes wrong, and that's all I did throughout the winter of 1931. I ironed out my difficulty to such an extent that I won eight of 11 tournaments during the spring




