
DESIGN - IAIN OUGHTRED


This design has grown out of the need for a boat similar to the Tammie Norrie, but of the length of the Fulmar, with the capacity for 'proper' rowing and good sailing performance, whether light or laden down.



ENNY FEE FILLS THE NEED IN IAIN'S range for a big open boat that is aimed at serious rowers and expedition sailors. She is well set up for rowers in tandem.

Like Tammie Norrie, Penny Fee's smaller sister, she will be able to carry a very small outboard, if you really must spoil her excellent looks!

With an experienced, well equipped crew, Penny Fee should have occasional open water rowing and sailing capability. Penny Fee will be able to carry a load, and cover the miles efficiently under oars and sail, yet pull up on a grassy riverside bank with a small family, or two couples and their picnic and camping equipment, enhancing the vista wherever she goes.



The similar length Fulmar, on the other hand is a really good performance sailing boat with planing potential, but not really set up for comfortable rowing with a substantial load.



Both are wonderful boats, but designed with different compromises in mind.

Quite a few clients had suggested just stretching the Tammie Norrie, but Iain felt that it would be better to do a complete redraw to increase the stability and to finesse it into the best picnic boat it could be.

Plans are A\$248 and a precut plywood kit will be \$4167.
