The **Purple Martin** (Progne subis) is the largest North American swallow. These aerial acrobats have speed and agility in flight, and when approaching their housing, will dive from the sky at great speeds with their wings tucked.

Description and taxonomy

Purple Martins are a kind of swallow, of the genus Progne. Like other members of this genus, they are larger than most of the other swallows. The average length from bill to tail is 20 cm (7.9 in). Adults have a slightly forked tail. Adult males are entirely black with glossy steel blue sheen, the only swallow in North America with such coloration. Adult females are dark on top with some steel blue sheen, and lighter underparts. Subadult females look similar to adult females minus the steel blue sheen and browner on the back. Subadult males look very much like females, but solid black feathers emerge on their chest in a blotchy, random pattern as they molt to their adult plumage.





Question: What do Purple Martins sound like?


Purple Martins are fairly noisy, chirping and making sounds that have been described as chortles, rattles, and croaks. The various calls are said to be "throaty and rich" and can be rendered as tchew-wew, pew pew, choo, cher, zweet and zwrack. The males have a gurgling and guttural courtship song, a dawn song, and even a subsong used at the end of the breeding season.



What is our season for Purple Martins?


Scouts arrive in Wisconsin in Late March, early April


Go to PMCA and watch migration



Martins leave to begin migration in late July to mid August

As they say in real estate; Location, Location, Location!





Martins require a flyway from at least three directions.

Provide manageable Housing





Manageable means, that the house has deep compartments with pull out nest trays, and that the house can be safely raised and lowered on the pole with a boat winch without disturbing the Martins.

You must control ground and aerial predators



Predators are: Squirrels, Snakes, Raccoons, Cats, Hawks, Owls

Ground Predators







Prevent Aerial Predators, if necessary

Sharp Shin hawk

You must control Nest site competitors






English House Sparrows and European Starlings compete with martins for nest boxes

How do I control nest box competition?

You must trap, shoot, and use Starling Resistant Entrances (SREH) (No round holes allowed)

English House Sparrows and European Starlings are non-native species and are not under federal control.

You must use attraction techniques (Advertise)



Song bird Magnet







Play Dawnsong mornings starting at 4:30 to 7:30 Attach at least two decoys to your housing, move them around often Fill the nest trays with pine straw (dry pine needles, no green)

Pay attention to your colony; be on the watch for:

Green leaves, bugs, predators, nest site competition, babies




How do I maintain a colony?

Keep houses in good repair
Keep records
Supplemental feed early returning martins and in cold rainy weather
