1963. Ar un o nifer o wyliau i Ogledd Cymru fel bachgen bach fe ymwelais ag Abergele a Chastell Gwrych. Fyddwn i erioed wedi gallu dychmygu hynny, ond roedd Abergele'n mynd i ddod yn dref gartref i mi, pan yn 1992 fe gefais gynnig swydd yng Ngogledd Cymru, ac fe symudais yma gyda'm gwraig a'm mab.

Ymlaen i 2015. Fe ddeuthum yn aelod o Gyngor Tref Abergele'n cynrychioli ward Pensarn a Belgrano.

Bum mlynedd yn ddiweddarach, Hydref 2020, fe anrhydeddodd fy nghydaelodau fi gyda'r fraint arbennig o ddod yn Faer Abergele. Felly, 57 mlynedd ar ôl sefyll ar gowrt Castell Gwrych mewn côt law blastig, (wel, roedd hi'n haf yng Ngogledd Cymru), rydw i'n cael yr anrhydedd o ddod yn Faer y Dref.

A decision was made that I stay in post as Mayor until the autumn. It was a first for all Councils, nothing in the past had prevented a new Mayor being installed. All my remaining Civic events were cancelled but I was able to lay a wreath at the Cenotaph on behalf of the town during 'lockdown' on both VE Day in May and VJ Day in August. Both occasions were socially distanced with Rev. Kate Johnson and Mr. Brian Churchill sharing prayers. They were filmed and available to watch on the Abergele TV Channel on YouTube.

The staff at Abergele Town Council have to be congratulated, they worked at home for a while and have kept Council matters running very smoothly, my grateful thanks go to them all. They have now returned to the Town Hall even though it remains closed to the public. Council meetings still have to be conducted via Zoom as we can't meet in the Council Chamber, even so, members of the public have been able to join us remotely.

I would like to thank our local traders who throughout 'lockdown', made sure we didn't go without, it's now important to repay them their kindness by continuing to support them.

With the confirmation of 'I'm a Celebrity...' coming to Gwrych Castle, I was delighted to provide a TV and many radio interviews, it's a wonderful opportunity for the Castle and has highlighted our town and put it on the map for many years to come.

Sadly, this year's Remembrance Day has had to be cancelled due to COVID 19. The planning for this event starts in June and it was unimaginable at the time that surely, Remembrance Services would not be cancelled. However, whilst no-one could predict whether or not Remembrance could go ahead we stuck to Plan A and changed to Plan B as new restrictions were put into place.

Eventually, in Wales, it became clear that a full lockdown was inevitable and a decision was made to film a shortened version of the service to ensure that Remembrance is not forgotten. Plans were very swiftly converted into the component parts of the service and each segment was filmed separately before the lockdown deadline. Each filming session strictly observed social distancing rules.

The finished edit was broadcast on Remembrance Day to coincide with the usual timing of the gathering around the Cenotaph and St George Memorial and at Canolfan Dewi Sant.

What a Year !

What a year 2020 has turned out to be. No one could have predicted a national lockdown last March lasting several months. The Town Council closed its doors for the first time since its formation in 1894. No face-to-face meetings were permitted and the Mayor Making ceremony was cancelled. Cllr Shirley Jones-Roberts agreed to continue as Mayor until it was possible to hold the meeting. Welsh Government had to pass emergency legislation to allow the council to hold meetings remotely and 'ZOOM' entered everyone's vocabulary.

The Council looked at what it could do in the Community to assist. It gave emergency aid to the local Food banks and set up a scheme to assist the community with prescriptions and shopping. Not to mention a friendly ear if needed. All the

Town Councillors played their part where they could.



As summer approached and things eased off, the community started to return to a new normal. Abergele District Action Group set up a butterfly garden with the assistance of Keep Wales Tidy and the Town Council worked towards providing social space

seating in open space areas. Cllr. Charlie McCoubrey obtained grant funding for picnic tables in the park. The Christmas lights and trees have also been

installed early to bring cheer during very testing times

And then came the big news ; 'I'm a celebrity...' was coming to Gwrych castle. Rumours and excitement abound, Abergele Town Council looked at how the town could make the most of this high profile unique opportunity. 'Let's clean the streets, remove the weeds, and repaint the red telephone box,' Local businesses were offered a small grant to refresh their shopfronts ready for the arrival of media attention. With the assistance of Conwy County Council, a scheme was developed to transform the town and beach into sights of wonder and Abergele Town Council funded the

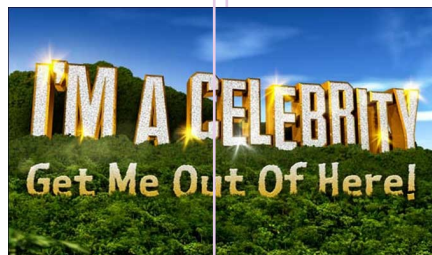

Cadair Farddol Eisteddfod Abergele

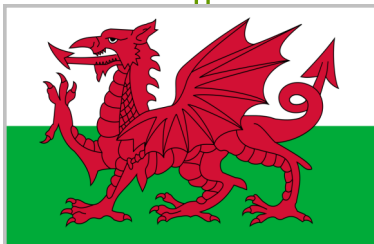
Ym mis Gorffennaf eleni fe ddychwelwyd Cadair Farddol Eisteddfod Abergele i'w thref gartref, Abergele.

In July of this year, the Abergele Eisteddfod Bardic Chair returned to its home town of Abergele.

The Council was contacted by a lady in South Wales, Mrs. Kita Williams, who offered the chair to the safe custody of the Council and will now proudly stand in the Council Chamber at the Town Hall.

Now 121 years old, the chair was designed and made by a local man, John Richard Ellis JP, a carpenter and author of the famous local book 'A History of Abergele and District'.

The chair then disappeared and little is known about it for about 80 years until it was found on a skip of rubble from a recently demolished YMCA Hostel at St. Athan in South Wales by Mrs Kita Williams.

The family cherished and looked after this piece of history for 40 years. The chair followed the family from house to house, including a public house, as they moved around Wales and the South of England with work. 40 years later it was back in Newport and still with Kita, the chair was offered to Abergele Town Council and has been gratefully accepted.

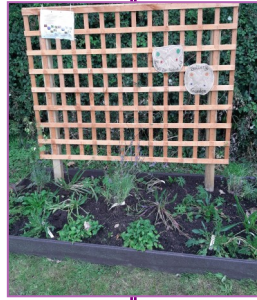

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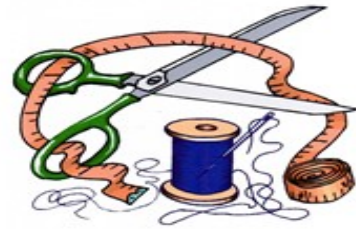
