FOREWORD

For over 30 years now I have been annually expressing my thanks for your patronage and your many fine letters of testimonial. Again it is my privilege to express my appreciation, and I note with satisfaction that many of you good folks have been regular customers over the years. This past year I retired after 39 years with the Massachusetts Life Insurance Co. and plan to do a bang up job of growing old as leisurely as possible. Consequently I am relinquishing all financial and other responsibilities of this glad business and turning it all over to the younger shoulders of Art, Jr. My main interest in the future will be giving the bees competition in the transferring of pollen from one flower to another and I hope to have a few worthwhile seedlings for your approval and pleasure.

The past season was one of extremes, the first half being extremely hot and dry and the second half one of hurricane, floods and excessive moisture. In spite of the unusual season we have harvested an excellent crop of bulbs which I am sure will please the most critical buyer. We were unable to exhibit at several shows due to impossible roads but even so had exhibits in a half dozen shows winning our share of prizes.

Again you will find many new varieties added to our list of new varieties which we feel are real additions. We refer you to our "Variety Comments" for details, and I am sure you will agree, when you grow some of them, that they are real improvements on existing varieties.

We have on trial each year many new varieties and added to those varieties seen at the shows and in other gardens, it is our privilege to review quite a parade of new ones each year. However only a fraction of those seen do we deem worthy to list in our catalogue. We do not claim to grow all of the meritorious varieties, but I am certain our catalogue contains a most comprehensive listing of exhibition winners, the most popular commercials and the most promising novelties. Our motto has always been — "only the best is good enough".

Again let me emphasize the excellence of our this years crop of bulbs. Try some! You'll be glad you did!

TERMS FOR ORDERING — All orders are cash with order or, 25% down payment, balance C.O.D. All C.O.D. orders require a down payment. All orders from the retail list will be sent postage prepaid. Orders from the wholesale list will be F.O.B., Springfield, Mass. If bulbs from both lists are ordered they will be sent F.O.B. and we will include enough extra bulbs to more than offset the express charges. All orders accepted subject to prior sale.

Orders for bulblets cannot be accepted after April 15th, for small bulbs (sizes 4, 5 & 6) after May 1st, and for large bulbs after June 15th. Orders for assortments can be accepted until July 1st.

DISCOUNTS — On all cash orders from the retail descriptive list — \$5.00 to \$10.00 — you may select 10% discount in bulbs of your own choice. \$10.00 to \$20.00 — you may select 15% discount in bulbs of your own choice. Over \$20.00 — you may select 20% discount in bulbs of your own choice.

Discounts do not apply to new introductions, collections, or wholesale prices.

On cash orders from the wholesale list — 5% discount on orders from \$25.00 to \$100. 10% discount on orders over \$100.00.

EXTRAS AND OVERCOUNT — We give extras with all orders varying with the size of the order. Just mention some of the varieties you would like to buy and we will do our best to please you. We are noted for generous overcount of number, quality, and size.

GUARANTEE — We guarantee satisfaction in every way possible. We attempt to send out only clean, healthy, true to name stock, and if in any way you are not satisfied let us know immediately and we will do our utmost to please you. Also if you are pleased we are always glad to hear from you.

SHIPPING DATES — Unless otherwise requested retail orders will be sent out between March 15 and April 15 in the order received. Wholesale orders will be shipped as soon as possible after receiving them. Order early so as to be sure we are not sold out of the varieties you want. This also gives us more time to fill your order with less chance of error and less overtime.

BULB SIZES — The retail list contains three sizes — Large, 1½" up Medium, 3½" - 1½" Small, 3½" - 3½"

Large size bulbs give the largest bloom. However, medium sized bulbs will give excellent spikes about 75% as large. Most small bulbs will bloom and at the same time grow fine bulbs for the following year.

VARIETY LISTING — In the descriptive list the variety name is given first, followed by the originator's name, its show classification and the approximate number of days needed for it to bloom. We have attempted to give a description of the varieties as we see them, listing important faults as well as good points.

Appraising The New Ones



As has been the case in the past few years, we in the Northeastern part of the country experienced more than our share of adverse growing weather. An exceptionally wet spring was followed by a hot dry July and August which ended up in a deluge of rain far greater than anything ever seen in this area before. In spite of all this we managed to appraise most all of the newer varieties we grew and to further evaluate those we had grown previously. In general, we were quite pleased with the quality of last year's introductions as well as the continued fine performance of the older varieties.

Suppose we take an imaginary walk through our fields and have a look at the newer varieties blooming there. Just by some happy circumstance every variety is in full bloom so we can see them all — each in its own special beauty and perfection.

Among the white glads we are much taken by the new *Illini White* with its tall perfect spikes — they all look like blue ribbon winners and it should be a good commercial as well. Then there is *Snowclad*, a really good cutter; *Snowdrift* with its beautiful ruffled tho sometimes misplaced florets; *Roxana* with its ruffling and faint greenish throat. It is hard to overlook the long rows of the leading exhibition whites — namely *Sierra Snow*, *Florence Nightingale*, and *Mother Fischer*. The last two are also tops as commercials. Next we view *Silver Court*, the whitest white; *Cathedral* with its formal and ruffled florets; and the tall massive *White Goddess*. As we leave the white glads, we have the thought that as a group they are perhaps stronger than any other class.

Among the blotched whites we like Queen Anne as grown from very small bulbs, Good Morning with its tall stretchy spikes and interesting rose halo, and White Sails with as many as 12 ruffled and crisp blooms open. The florets really go for White Sails too. Fine show glads are Sparkling Eyes and Crusader with their pleasing purple throats. White Tower stands at formal attention next to Presto which has outdone itself with a full row of perfect spikes.

Among the cream glads Leif Ericsson is still the leader for both exhibition and commercial purposes tho the competition is getting tough. Adorable from Holland is outstanding with florets as beautiful as Connie G but with more reliable spike production. Intrigue looks very promising from small bulbs and Jubilee is a taller easy growing version of Columbia. For the cut flower grower there are Catriona, very early and reliable, and Richard Crooks, also early but with a bold red throat.

In looking at the light yellow varieties we are impressed by the tall stately growth of *Howard V. Wright* — a fine cut flower and show glad. *Prospector* with its unrivaled beauty and *Gold Bank* with its tall ruffled spikes also look impressive.

The beauty of Gold catches our eye among the deep yellow varieties and it certainly is a topnotcher in cut flowers rivaled only by Fort Knox with its long flower head and Forsythia with its large rugged spikes and ruffled blooms. They are superior for exhibition as well. Smaller Catherine Beath has intensive color value and is a leading show winner while Golden Diana and Gelber Hercules are certainly worth growing. Conrad is a pleasing combination of red and yellow on tall slender spikes.

The buff glads seem over-powered by the newer A. B. Coutts and the older Patrol and it's a toss-up as to which is best. Patrol is perhaps brighter in color while A. B. Coutts has the larger spikes. Both can win grand championships.

Looking across the orange glads we see a dazzling display of color. Bright new Fortune looks like a top notch cut flower with its brilliant color while Regina reaffirms our former opinion that it is one of the truly great glads. A reliable grower is Display with tall easy cutting spikes. Circe leads for exhibition because of its massive spikes of deep orange while Boccherini is a leading commercial. Fire Opal has a pleasing contrast of orange and yellow—easy to see why it is becoming so popular.

Towering among the light salmon varieties are King Size, a true grant in every way, and Dolly Vardon which sometimes has blooms 7" across. These two should interest the giant glad fans. For real beauty there are shorter growing Carmen Corliss, gorgeously ruffled Gorgeous Deb, and Delight, another ruffled beauty. Mountaineer shows its ability to open as many as 10 huge formal florets and towers over beautiful little Attica, a pleasing rosy salmon and yellow blend.

Of interest in the deep salmon class are *Harbinger*, a very early commercial; *Starfire*, with one of the most striking color combinations; *Minaret*, a most reliable producer of tall model spikes; and *Broadway Melody*, the coming commercial from Holland. Most unusual is the salmon and yellow color combination of *Boise Belle* also a great show glad as is *Coral Ace*, the ruffled coral colored sport of *Burma*.

The scarlet class is led by two great varieties for both commercial and exhibition purposes — Red Wing and Dieppe. However, we are impressed by David Warr and Redskin, fine early varieties as well as by the smooth color of Tomahawk and the tall spikes of Dee Twelve with its brilliant blooms. Of interest to the commercial man is Happy End, a first early variety in a blend of salmon scarlet and cream. The largest florets are those of Harold K and Esquire, both very much worth while.

The always in demand light pink glads continue to become more numerous with the addition of the gigantic Paul Bunyon and the lovely Ruffled Dream, both good performers. Also to be seen are the majestic spikes of Pink Pride with as many as 10 huge florets open; Pink Diamond, beautifully ruffled and of perfect placement; Pall Mall a tall commercial prospect; Look, an improved version of Evangeline and one of our favorites; Pink Chiffon, valuable for its color appeal and earliness; C. D. Fortnam, a tall ruffled beauty; Susan K, the improved Heart's Desire; and Pennant with its soft pink color and up to 10-12 open formal spikes. Making an eye-catching addition to any garden are the pleasing throat blotches of Contrast, Manon, and Sheherazade.

Leading the deep pink group is *Spic and Span* still in a class all by itself. Other good ones are *Sweet 16* with lovely color and good spikes; *Friendship*, the best early pink but fine all season long; *Silcherlied* and *Jessie Mae* give nice spikes and do well on the show table. Not quite as tall is *Painted Lady*, an unusual pink, white, and scarlet color combination.

The big news of the light red glads are the perfect spikes of *Royal Stewart* — a joy to look at and grow and certainly deserving of its All America Award. Watch for it at the shows next year. Also noteworthy are *Hilltopper*, a fine new commercial with good exhibition possibilities; *Poinsettia*, the highly regarded all round variety; and *Red Tape*, with 8 and 10 open florets in formal placement.

Outstanding for its marvelous clear color and long flowerheads is *Harrisburger*, the leader of the deep red glads. Our eye is also caught by *Howard J. Warr* with its perfect tall spikes and by *Red Feather*, slightly deeper in color and capable of holding 10 open blooms. These three can make a formidable group on any show table and only time will tell which is best. Not to be overlooked is *Festival*, the giant of this class; *Red Charm*, the old standby; and *Garnet Ruffles*, the classy little 300 size red.

Growing side by side we find that Ace of Spades is the blackest of the black reds, Black Cherry and Negus open the most florets at once, Thunderbolt has the longest flowerhead, Dark David and Mrs. R. G. Errey are the largst and the tallest, and Ruffled Ebony possesses beautiful individual florets. As we think back to even 10 years ago we are amazed by the great strides made in this color class.

The rose colored glads have always rated among our favorites and this year doesn't disappoint us. Rosy Veil is a stand-out with its clear bright color and consistent 4' spikes — a coming cut flower for sure. Andrena again gives us row after row of good cutting spikes in a beautiful shade of light rose while Traveller, grown by us for the first time, makes us wonder how we had overlooked such a lovely near-perfect variety. A great addition to this class is the All America Award winner Appleblossom with its tall slender spikes and many open florets of pure white with a dainty halo on the edges of the petals.

The distinctive varieties of the medium rose class are a sight to behold as we pass through the rows. There is Wild Rose, a clean fresh color and neat spikes; Seneca, a perfect 300 size show glad; Lynne Hill, with up to 9 open blooms in an unusual shade of rose; and Rosita with its tall large spikes of crinkled and ruffled rose. Glad Tidings has full formal spikes in a true rose self-color while Burma Rose is a softer colored sport of Burma. Mallow, Madeline Hefty, and Elmer's Rose are cut in quantity for the florist's use.

Old timer Burma continues to hold sway over the deep rose varieties with its large spikes and heavily ruffled blooms. Others that look good are Lila Wallace, a fine early cut flower in a beautiful color; Truly Fair, one of the smoothest colored glads grown; and Cherbourg, a fine florist's variety.

We are always happy to view the light lavender glads for not only are we partial to that color but the new ones represent a great step forward in glad progress. The '55 introduction *Monona*, has the clean color of *Heirloom* and shows promise of more reliable produc-

tion of top quality spikes. *Princess*, becoming the leading lavender for all uses, has outdone itself this year with consistent $4\frac{1}{2}$ spikes and up to 10 florets open at once. *Tyrone*, taller than any of those in this color is getting much attention commercially while *Francesca*, another tall one, is our personal favorite for the most beautiful of all glads. The giant of this group is *Attraction*, one of the finest Canadian show glads. Long rows of *Elizabeth the Queen*, *Lavender Lace*, and *Crown Jewel* give evidence of their superior cut flower qualities. Most unusual is *Paisley* with its half moon of white on the lower petals and *Falcon* with its distinctive coloring and form. Beautiful little *Trim* has perfect 300 size show spikes and *Wedgewood* has perfectly sculptured individual florets.

The deep lavender class is well represented by *Noweta Rose* and *Parthiena* on the show table, by *Parade* for early cut flowers, and by *Col. Atkinson* for late cut flowers. Not to be left out is *Pirate Chief* with its large spikes and bold novel color effect.

Leading the purple varieties for exhibition is King David with its straight spikes and fluted florets while rows of husky growing The Rajah are being cut heavily for our orists. The newer Purple Burma is magnificent with its large ruffled spikes of rich true purple. Also eye-catching are the consistent growth of Royal Scot, a fine commercial; the rich and attractively flecked color of Wonder Boy; and the heavy texture and ruffling of Kashmir.

Adding greatly to the light blue class is *Violet Charm*, perfectly formed spikes and many open blooms. The older standbys — *Blue Beauty*, *High Life*, and *Blue Bonnett* continue to perofrm well. *Gustav Mabler* attracts attention because of its odd grayish blue color.

The majestic spikes of Salmon's Sensation are a sight to behold with their deep violet blue color and massive blooms. Also noteworthy are Indigo and Crater Lake, two fine exhibition varieties. Still a favorite is richly colored Abu Hassan.

The many and varied smoky varieties always attract the smoky fans and those who like the unusual. There are model spikes of *Tan Glo*, now the leading exhibition smoky; *Copper Lustre*, huge spikes in a smooth brown tone; *Prunella*, a fine new one from Australia; and *Southern Belle*, a smoky pink exhibition variety. Also well liked are varieties such as *Stormy Weather*, *Mesa Mist*, *Persian Rug*, and many other distinctive ones in this group.

Of much interest in the A. O. C. class are the new green varieties — Erin, Greenland, and Chartreuse. They have added a beautiful new color in the glad world and these green varieties are also good in many other respects. Copper-colored Cherokee now reigns as the top A. O. C. exhibition variety while Robinson Crusoe has a most unusual color combination with its chocolate marbling on a tan background. Others worth noting are huge Salamanca in a grayish buff color, clear toned Buckeye Bronze, and of the older varieties Vagabond Prince, Tunias Elite, R. B., and Choctaw.

Even the bulblets make spikes which the florists call for. Like Beauty's Blush and Sween Sixteen, it is one of our most rugged growers.

Our description of Campanile would not be complete without some mention of its beauty and appeal. The florets are slightly ruffled and beautifully recurved and somewhat larger than Beauty's Blush. 




