Ember Weeks are the weeks in which the Ember Days appear.

Rogation Days are the three days immediately preceding Holy Thursday or Ascension Day.

BIRTHS

Within three days of the birth it is necessary to make a declaration to the person in charge of the register, who will go to the house of the new-born to ascertain its existence and will extend on paper the necessary formal information.

MARRIAGES

Art. 17. Those who are about to contract matrimony will present themselves to the public official in charge of the civil register, and will inform him verbally of their intention, and the same will be noted and signed by the contracting parties and two witnesses. If the contracting parties cannot sign, same will be done by another person on their behalf.

Art. 18. This Act will contain:

1. Names and surnames of the contracting parties.
2. Age.
3. Nationality, domicile and place of birth.

4. Profession.
 5. Names and surnames of their parents, nationality, profession and domiciles.
 6. If they have been previously married, the name and surname of the previous spouses will be noted as well as the place in which they contracted matrimony and the cause of the dissolution.
- Art. 19. The future spouses must present at the same time:

1. Legalized copy of the sentence declaring annulled the previous marriage of one or both parties as the case may be.
2. Authentic declaration of persons admitted by the law, and fathers, tutors, or guardians will express their consent to the public official and will sign the Act referred to in Art. 17. Should they not be able to sign any of the witnesses may do so on their behalf.
3. Two witnesses known to both parties will declare that the contracting parties are in a condition to marry.

Art. 37. The marriage will be celebrated in the presence of the official of the Register in his office and publicly, and the contracting parties as well as tutors and parents and witnesses will sign the necessary documents required by law.

DEATHS

The next of kin, or the nearest relative or in the absence of these any person over age who may have witnessed the death can declare in the presence of the officer in charge of the register.

The Limit for registering Deaths is 24 hours after the death has taken place.

BURIALS

These cannot take place for twelve hours after death, nor exceed thirty-six excepting cases at the disposition of the Municipality and Police.

ARTICLES RESPECTING THE ORGANIC LAWS OF THE JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION, AND WHICH ARE NECESSARY TO BE KNOWN.

Art. 3 The Alcaldes will take up any question which does not exceed \$50.

Art. 4 (Reformed) The resolution of the Alcaldes are appealable to the Justice of the Peace of the respective Section when same exceeds the amount of \$ 12, and resolutions of the Justice of Peace are appealable, to the Judge of 1st instance in turn when the amount exceeds \$ 100.

Art. 11 The Justices of peace will take up, in first instance:

1st (Reformed) All Civil and Commercial matters in which the amount questioned in over \$ 50, and does not exceed \$ 500, and also in questions of meetings of Creditors, and when the sum does not exceed the amount mentioned.

And all summonses, for removing people from properties, whatever be the amount of rent payable, when no written contract exists between the parties.

Article 4.—Every coach driver is obliged to hand to the passenger a ticket containing articles 3, 4, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 20, 21, 22 and 23 and the number of the carriage.

The passenger on entering the carriage can demand this ticket.

Article 12.—Carriages of all classes private or otherwise are included in articles 8, 9, 10 and 11.

Article 13.—Carriages may be hired by the hour or per journey, it being understood that when a carriage is hired for a journey it must not be less than 20 squares from the starting point.

Article 14.—When a carriage has been engaged by a passenger it is necessary to pay for same, even if journey is not continued, excepting in cases in which the passenger may consider it unsafe to travel in, or owing to inability of conductor.

Article 15.—The coachmen who convey sick patients with visible contagious diseases will have to get their carriage disinfected wherever and in any form that the Municipal authorities may consider convenient under the penalty of \$ 50 fine.

Article 16.—Boys under 15 years of age are not allowed to drive carriages.

Article 17.—The carriages occupied in the public streets will be subject to the following tariffs:

For direct journey inside the town radius not exceeding 20 squares 0.70 c.

For first hour 1.25 and for successive hours \$ 1.00 m/n, paying for the quarter hours as fractions of time which do not reach these.

The above rates stand good in any kind of weather, the coachman being under the penalty of \$20.00 m/n fine should he charge the passenger a higher rate than that already mentioned.

No cab driver can refuse taking a passenger when he is disengaged under the penalty of a \$ 20.00 m/n fine.

The payment of carriage hire will be made in the act of discharging the driver.

Articles found in carriages should be deposited before 24 hours have elapsed in the General Police Station, to be returned to their owners after the same has proved that the goods belong to him.

Should a coachman not deliver goods found in his carriage he will be fined \$ 50.00 m/n.

All disputes between passengers and coachmen will be settled at the nearest Police Station or by an employee especially designated by the Chief of Police.

Church Feasts

The Roman Catholic days of fasting are the forty days of Lent, the Ember days the Wednesdays and Thursdays of the four weeks in advent and certain vigils or evenings prior to the greater feasts. In the American Episcopal Church the days of fasting or abstinence to be observed according to the book of Common Prayer are the forty days of Lent, the Ember Days, the three Rogation Days and all the Fridays of the year except Christmas Day. In the Greek Church the four principal fasts are those in Lent, the week succeeding Whitsuntide the fortnight before the Assumption; and forty days before Christmas.
