



Caucus Glossary

Throughout caucus season, you will hear terms and words that are unique to the political process. Become familiar with the terms below and you'll be ready to take part!

Caucus (noun)¹

- (a) a closed meeting of a group of persons belonging to the same political party or faction usually to select candidates or to decide on policy
- (b) a group of people united to promote an agreed-upon cause

Convention (noun)²

- (a) the summoning or convening of an assembly
- (b) an assembly of persons met for a common purpose; especially: a meeting of the delegates of a political party for the purpose of formulating a platform and selecting candidates for office

Delegate(s) (noun)³

(a) a person acting for another: as a representative to a convention or conference

Electioneer (verb)⁴

(a) to take an active part in an election; specifically: to work for the election of a candidate or party

Precinct (noun)⁵

(a) any one of the sections that a town or city is divided into when people vote in an election

Straw Poll or Straw Vote (noun)⁶

(a) An unofficial vote taken to obtain an indication of the general trend of opinion on a particular issue
