### **1.1. APPROPRIATE USE**

The main use of the Panel is with 24VDC power sources according to power supply implemented.

- The surrounding area of the rear of the Panel PC should be closed and dry.
- The Panel is intended for industrial applications in machine and plant control engineering.
- The user is not entitled to change the system or open the body (except for separation of PC Box and Display Bezel) without consultation to Wonderware.

### **1.2 ITEM CHECKLIST**

Your Panel comes securely packaged in a solid shipping carton. Upon receiving your Panel, open the carton and carefully remove the contents.

The shipping carton should contain the following items:

- Panel PC 10.4", 12.1", 15", or 17"
- Drivers and Utilities CD
- Windows XP Installation CD set
- 24V DC Power cord
- CPU / Mother board User Manual
- Wonderware software CD's (InTouch, Device Integration, Industrial Application Server, etc.)
- Recovery CD or DVD set (once available, for use with external USB drive)
- Mounting cutout template
- Panel stiffeners
- AC to DC converter and AC power cables

### **1.3 IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS**

### 2. OVERVIEW

The Wonderware Touch Panel Computer is a high performance system. The compact design enables integration even in very restricted spaces. The Industrial Touch Panel PC meets the highest requirements for shock, vibration and temperature resistance. The system also provides a high resistance under tough EMC conditions.

### 3. INSTALLATION

## Attention!

The weight of the range of the Panel PC family is approximately 7 to 14 Kg (15.5 to 31 lbs.). Use 2 hands to carry it at all times.

### **3.1 PANEL PC INSTALLATION NOTES**

- The Panel PC is developed to work in a control cabinet. Therefore it must be pointed that the environmental conditions must be considered.
- When installing the Panel PC, take care that there is enough area for ventilations on rear side. For details on the Panel PC size, go to item housing dimensions.
- If you need to boot from other devices, look up for further settings for the BIOS on the single board manuals provided in the accessory kit.
- For the enclosure cutout's, a template was included in the box the Panel PC came in. If needed, it can also be downloaded from the Wonderware Tech Support website. Contact Wonderware Tech Support for more information if needed.
- The nuts needed to mount the Panel PC into the enclosure, are already available on the bezel mounting studs. You need to remove these nuts prior to installing into the enclosure, for a proper installation.
- The use of Panel PC Stiffeners is required if the enclosure housing material is less then 2.5mm (.098 or 1/10 of an inch). If there were no stiffeners in the box the Panel PC came in then please contact your Wonderware Sales person or Distributor to obtain the following part number for your specific Panel PC.

• Install any additional PC cards into the Panel PC prior to installation into the enclosure.

### 3.1.1 SEPARATION OF DISPLAY BEZEL AND PC BOX

In order to aid in the installation of the Panel PC, the Display Bezel and the PC Box can be separated. This is done by loosening 2 screws, carefully pulling the 2 pieces away from each other, and disconnecting the 3 cables that are connected to the back of the Display Bezel. Make sure to not pull the connections apart by the cable, but to grasp the connector its self, and gently wiggle them apart. When reassembling them, you'll find that there is only one connector that will fit in a particular receptacle on the back of the Display Bezel. This way, you will not inadvertently connect to the wrong receptacle.

### **3.2 CONNECT EXTERNAL DEVICES**

To get detailed information about pin-out of each connector please see the section "Technical details".

#### 3.2.1 Serial Interface RS422 / RS485

This differential serial interface enables you to connect a external device with 9 pin DSUB connector.

### 3.2.2 PS/2 Mouse

Use this connector to connect a PS/2 mouse.

#### 3.2.3 PS/2 Keyboard

Use this connector to connect a PS/2 keyboard.

#### 3.2.4 LAN1 Port

This connector provides a external interfaces 10/100 BaseT on RJ45 to connect your Panel PC to other devices in a network.

#### 3.2.5 USB port

This connector provides two external USB 2.0 interfaces

#### 3.2.6 Serial Interface COM1

Serial interface enables you to connect an external device with 9 pin DSUB connector such as mouse or modem.

#### 3.2.7 Parallel port LPT

Use this port to connect a printer or other parallel devices.

#### 3.2.8 VGA Connector

Interface to VGA/CRT monitor.

#### 3.2.9 Serial Interface COM2

Serial interface enables you to connect an external device with 9 pin DSUB connector such as mouse or modem. COM2 is selectable as an input for programming Fieldbus controller.

### 3.2.10 Hard Disk Drive Activity light

Is on when there is activity on the Hard Drive.

#### 3.2.11 Power On light

Lit when Panel PC has power, and PC is turned on.

#### 3.2.12 LAN2 Port

This connector provides a second external interface 10/100 BaseT on RJ45 to connect your Panel PC to other devices in a network.

#### 3.2.13 Reset

Reset Switch to reset the whole unit.

#### 3.2.14 Main Power IN

Use this connector to connect the power supply of 24VDC. Please note the Power requirements (See technical details section).

#### 3.2.15 ATX Power ON Switch

This button enables you to switch on and off the main system.

#### 3.2.16 PCI card slots

Allow addition of half sized PCI cards to the system. 2 slots, but one is used on systems with HDD

#### 3.2.17 Front side USB Port (on Aluminum Bezel units)

Use this port behind a the plastic cover to connect USB devices

### **3.3 CONNECT INTERNAL DEVICES**

The Panel provides additional functions which could be implemented in the system by adding PCI cards to the Panel PC.

#### 3.3.1 PCI Extension card

PCI cards are installed just the same as they are on standard PC's. To access the PCI card slots, remove the 2 screws (in red circle of image below) and then swing the cover off in the direction of the red arrows. Make sure to remove the PCI slot cover, and to install the PCI card bracket screw so that the card stays in place once installed.



### 3.3.2 CompactFlash memory card

On the top side of the Panel you will find the connector for Compact Flash (CF) card. Loosen the screw, highlighted in the red square (images below), and then place the CF card into the slot. Pay close attention that it goes in correctly. Use the ejector button to remove the CF Card

### 3.5 SOFTWARE INSTALLATION

### 3.5.1 Application software and operating system

The Panel is designed to work with different operating systems. Wonderware will deliver the panels with a pre-installed and configured OS. All drivers are installed, and located under C:\Tools folder. The current OS being delivered is XP Pro. English is the primary language, but using the Multilingual User Interface pack that comes with the OS, there is an ability to convert the User Interface to other languages.

Also pre-installed, is Wonderware InTouch, Industrial Application Server Bootstrap, and some Ethernet based Wonderware DA Servers.

You will also find that some other products have been pre-installed for your convenience and use. A PDF viewing utility and My-T-Touch on screen keyboard software for example. These products come with their own help files, and are supported by their respective creators. Wonderware Tech Support will assist as a front line support for these products, but may refer you to the product manufacturer for more difficult issues.

In addition, the Panel PC was also delivered with a software license for the Wonderware products, pre-installed. You may want to make and keep a backup copy of this file. It will only work on the Panel PC it was delivered on. In the event you have inadvertently deleted the file, contact your Tech Support provider for a replacement copy.

Wonderware also provides a Recovery CD set, for use when the system HDD has been replaced, or has become corrupted. This Recovery CD set allows you to restore the system, with the OS, drivers, and all installed software setup and ready to go. For details on how to use the Recovery CD set, please refer to the Tech Notes published on the Wonderware Support website.

The Recovery CD set also includes software product CD's that can be used to make your own custom Recovery CD's, or to create and manage system backup's.

### 3.5.2 Hardware drivers

In the event you are not going to use the supplied OS, or for some other reason need to install the hardware drives, you have some options. They can be first saved from the C:\Tools folder prior to deletion from the HDD. Also, you can download them from the Wonderware Tech Support website. If you are not finding the drivers you need, please contact Tech Support.

### 4. MAINTENANCE

The Panel is designed and produced according to DIN EN ISO 9000:2000. One of the main development intentions was to reduce the amount of service required for the unit. As a result, with the exception of changing the CMOS battery and general cleaning, there is not much servicing that will need to be done.

In the event of any problems, please contact your Wonderware Technical Support representative. Make not of any errors reported, as well as the part number and serial number of the Panel PC that is having the problem.

You can also make sure that all external hardware connections are made, and that the problem is not the result of a software configuration change that has been made since delivery of the Panel. You can always use the Recovery CD set to restore to the original software configuration, but remember to create a backup of the Wonderware software license file first.

Do not attempt to repair the internal hardware yourself.

### 6. DISPOSAL
