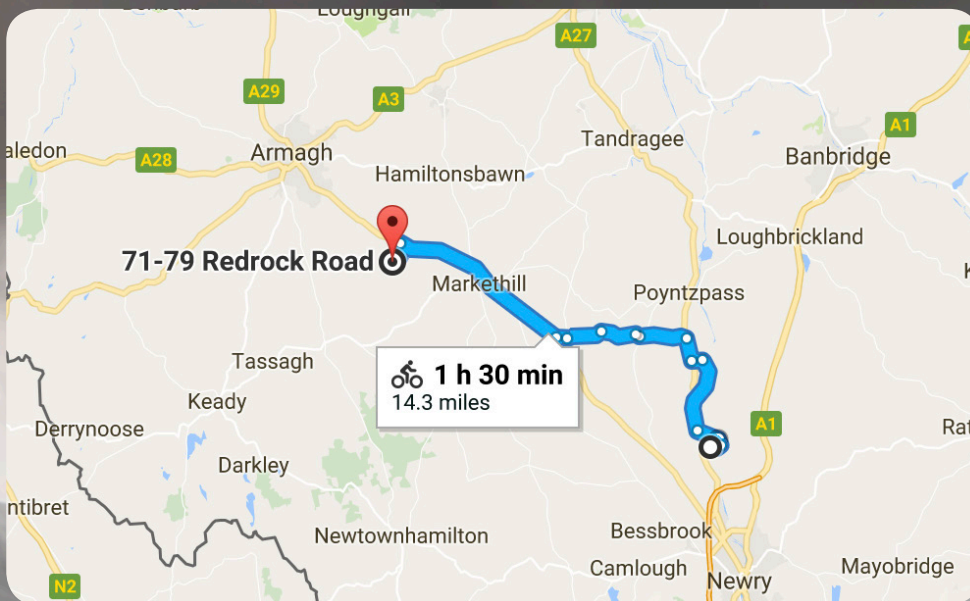




## FROM DRUMMILLER GRAVEL PIT TO CAVANAGROW QUARRY

0.0 mi	Start at Drummiller Gravel Pit 18 Drummiller Road, Drummiller, Jerrettspass, Co Down (54.229982° -6.3603652°)
0.4 mi	Head north towards Glen Rd
0.2 mi	Turn left onto Glen Rd
0.7 mi	Slight left onto Carrickrovaddy Rd
2.2 mi	Turn right
220 ft	Continue onto Drumantine Rd
0.3 mi	Turn left onto Drumantine Hill
0.7 mi	Turn right onto Newry Rd/A27
1.4 mi	Turn left onto Demoan Rd
0.1 mi	Continue onto Tyrone Ditches
1.0 mi	Turn left onto Mossview Rd
1.1 mi	Turn left onto Rathconvil Rd
46 ft	Turn right onto Ballyvally Rd/B2
0.3 mi	Turn left onto Poyntzpass Rd
5.3 mi	Turn right onto Gosford Rd/A28
0.7 mi	Turn left
0.0 mi	Arrive at Cavanagrow Quarry Redrock, Cavanagrow, Markethill, Co Armagh, BT60 1SW (54.30593° -6.5822602°)

## SAFETY ADVICE

**Please ensure you do not enter onto any quarry site.**

Ensure follow all road markings and are aware of your surroundings.

Wear appropriate clothing and be prepared for changing weather conditions.

Only undertake the route if it is within your cycling and fitness capability and ensure you schedule in refreshment breaks in along the way.

Check all of your equipment is in good condition.

Environmental conditions can change the nature of the trails within a short space of time, you should only continue if safe to do so.

It's also a good idea to ensure you have a basic first aid kit with you.

## ENVIRONMENTAL GOOD PRACTICE

We all have a responsibility to protect the countryside now and for future generations, so make sure you don't harm animals, birds, plants or trees and try to leave no trace of your visit.

Do not disturb wildlife, leave the environment as you find it and follow a path or track if there is one.
