WHEREAS under the provisions of Part IV. of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1922 the land described in the Schedule to this Act was resumed by the Board of Land and Works:

And whereas in accordance with section eighty of the said Act full satisfaction has been made by the said Board to all persons interested in the said land out of moneys provided for the purpose by the institution known as St. Vincent's Hospital:

And whereas the said institution is a separate institution within the meaning of the said Act and the *Hospitals and Charities Act* 1928 unincorporated and under the control of the Mother Rectress and members of the Religious Order known as the Sisters of Charity:

And whereas by virtue of section eighty-one of the said *Hospitals and Charitics Act* 1922 the land described in the said Schedule was vested in the King freed and discharged from all trusts charges limitations and restrictions whatsoever and deemed to be unalienated land of the Crown:

And whereas pursuant to section eighty-three of the said Act the land described in the said Schedule was by Order in Council dated the second day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-five permanently reserved as a site for hospital purposes:

And whereas the Mother Rectress and members of the hereinbefore recited Religious Order are desirous of borrowing money for the purposes of the said institution upon the security of the land described in the said Schedule :

And whereas in order to enable money to be so borrowed it is expedient that the permanent reservation of the land described in the said Schedule be revoked and that the land described in the said Schedule be granted as hereinafter provided by the Governor in Council in the name and on behalf of His Majesty to Mary Alphonsus O'Doherty, Mary Edward Hill and Bernardine Chatham (being respectively the Mother Rectress and two other members of the hereinbefore recited Religious Order) as joint tenants:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows (that is to say):-

1. This Act may be cited as the St. Vincent's Hospital short title. Land Act 1937.

2. (1) The hereinbefore recited Order in Council dated Revocation the second day of June One thousand nine hundred and reservation of land described twenty-five relating to the land described in the Schedule in Schedule. to this Act is hereby revoked.

(2) The land described in the said Schedule shall be Land and be deemed to be unalienated land of the Crown freed schedule and discharged from all encumbrances trusts limitations and unalienated restrictions whatsoever.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in the Hospitals and Power to grant land described in the Lond Acts the Governor in Council described in described in Charities Acts or the Land Acts the Governor in Council in the name and on behalf of His Majesty may grant the Mother land described in the said Schedule in fee simple upon such and certain terms and under and subject to such covenants conditions of order of exceptions and reservations (if any) as the Governor in charity. Council thinks fit to Mary Alphonsus O'Doherty, Mary Edward Hill and Bernardine Chatham as joint tenants.
