

Once a decade count of the population required for apportionment of seats in the US House of Representatives and block-level data needed for Redistricting

Apportionment	April 26, 2021	Total and resident state populations
Redistricting	August 12, 2021 September 16, 2021	Total and voting age populations by race and Hispanic Origin, Group Quarters population, and housing unit occupancy to the census block level
Demographic and Housing Characteristics (DHC)	2022	Population by age, race, sex, and Hispanic Origin, household, and housing unit data to the census block level



Rolling, monthly sample survey reporting estimates of socio-economic characteristics of the population annually

2020 ACS	Cancelled	COVID impact on data collection did not provide reliable data
2020 ACS "Experimental Tables"	November 2021	Limited number of tables and weights for the nation, states, and the District of Columbia
2016-2020 ACS	December 2021	Standard ACS for all areas to the census tract and block group level

- First US Census to use internet response
- Change in how the race/ethnicity question was asked and how the responses were coded
- Revised urban area criteria
- Proposed revision to metropolitan thresholds
- New confidentiality protocol Disclosure Avoidance System/Differential Privacy

2020 Census Disclosure Avoidance System/Differential Privacy

- Title 13 of the US Code requires the US Census Bureau to protect the confidentiality of Census responses. That task changes in response to changes in technology.
- DAS injects noise (privacy loss budget) into the data to protect privacy.

Perfect Privacy/No Data	2020 Census Redistricting	Complete Data/No Privacy

- Total state population, census block housing unit and GQ structures are invariant
- Census block data are very fuzzy. Use larger geographies or group smaller ones.











- The nation's population grew by 22.7 million from 2010 to 2020, but the 7.4% growth rate was the lowest since the Great Depression.
- Population growth was mostly in Metropolitan areas
 - Metro area population grew by 8.7%
 - Micro area population grew by 0.8%
 - Non-Metro or Micro area populations decreased by 2.8%
- 52% of the nation's counties lost population over the last decade
- Diversity is increasing

Share of U.S. Population by Core Based Statistical Area (CBSA) Type: 2000 and 2020











Percent Change in County Population: 2010 to 2020






2010 - 2020 Percent Change in the Total Population for North Carolina Counties



2020 Census Challenges – Count Question Resolution (CQR) Program

- CQR program run January 2022 June 2023
- Local governments may only challenge 2020 Census counts based on


Boundary	Incorrect boundaries were used
Geocoding	Housing units or GQs were counted in the wrong place (inside/outside town limits)
Coverage	Housing units or GQs in an area were not counted


Boundary case correction example:



Boundaries legally in effect on January 1, 2020



- Verify Census boundary with boundary in effect on January 1, 2020 and housing/Group Quarter structure count as of April 1, 2020 with local records.
- Census block level count of housing unit and group quarters structures




- CBSAs can be either Metropolitan (50,000 + core) or Micropolitan (10,000 50,000 core) Statistical Areas.
- CBSAs are revised every 10 years after the release of the decennial census data and the conclusion of the CQR program.
- CBSAs are made up of the core area's home county and neighboring counties with a high degree of integration with the core.
- Criteria are posted online and remain essentially the same as 2010.

2010 North Carolina PUMAs


