

Introduction

It is with great pleasure that Marie and I introduce our first catalogue. My family has been involved in the growing of daffodils for a great number of years starting with Henry Buddon, the first daffodil nurseryman of New Zealand, growing his stocks on my great grandfather's land, in Riwaka one hundred and eleven years ago.

Having now exhibited daffodils successfully since 1947 and hybridised them from 1949 onwards, the time has come for the introduction of my seedlings into a wider market. Over the years I have developed a reputation for breeding vigorous plants of strong constitution. My seedlings have been raised from some of the best breeding stocks from worldwide sources. In particular my white flowers trace their pedigree lines directly to Guy L. Wilson's best strainsthe red and yellows to Richardson and O'More varieties and my pinks are of Tasmanian, Irish and American descent. From the beginning pedigrees have been accurately documented with some of my newer seedlings being six generations of my own raising

Bulbs are hot water treated and rotated into new ground every two years. Weed killers are not used.

Emphasis has been on the continual breeding of quality exhibition flowers of geometrical perfection rather than the propagation of any one variety. As such, bulb numbers of our stocks are limited.

We look forward to a long and close association with all other daffodil enthusiasts.

TERMS OF BUSINESS

All daffodil bulbs are offered subject to a satisfactory crop, and to being unsold on receipt of order. No complaints as to quality of bulbs, health, size or numbers will be entertained unless made immediately on receipt of order. We guarantee varieties true to name and of good quality. To avoid disappointment, orders should arrive not later than the 30 th January. It should be realised that in order to get the finest flowers and the best bulb increase, it is very important for daffodils to be replanted as early as possible. I cannot guarantee to execute orders received later than March 1st, as after that date all unsold bulbs will be replanted.

As stocks of some varieties are quite small, orders will be executed in strict rotation.

Payment with order is required. All prices quoted are in New Zealand dollars. Overseas payment by Bank Draft.

Orders despatched February/March.

All overseas bulbs are posted airmail and travel at the customers risk and expense. We advise overseas clients to plant on arrival.

Postage of \$5.00 to be added on all orders under \$100.00 within New Zealand.

Postage for overseas orders should be added as follows:

A large striking flower of the most wonderful and entirely distinct clear luminous greeny sulphur lemon. When fully developed the inside of the flanged trumpet passes almost to white, while the outside retains its colour, and the serrated brim is tipped with sparkling lemon.

W-Y This flower has a narrow base to the cream trumpet giving it a very elegant appearance. Smooth perianth of good form and substance.

One Flower to a stem; cup or corona more than 1/3, but less than equal to length of perianth segments.

Large Cups - (Yellow Perianth, Yellow Cup)

Golden Orb 3-4 (J.A. Hunter) Crescendo x 2Y-YO Cook Sdg

Y-Y This all yellow large cup is of good exhibition form. Vigorous with wide leaf growth, makes large bulbs Has been premier in its sub-division.

Symphonette 4 (G.E. Mitsch) Playboy x Daydream

Y-Y This flower has an excellent perianth of soft clear lemon, broad, rounded and overlapping with a white halo and a rather long somewhat flared crown. It is a welcome addition to the later yellows.

Large Cups (Yellow Perianth, White or Pink Cup)

Altun Ha 3-4 (A.J.R. Pearson) Camelot x Daydream Y-W FCC RHS 1993

The rounded petals are broad and smooth with much substance and the fluted crown expands in good proportion. When it opens, the whole flower is soft greenish lemon, but as it matures, the petals darken and the crown becomes completely white without any yellow rim. A strong grower with fine bulbs. Best flower in the show RHS 1989 and 1993.

Daydream 3 (G.E. Mitsch) Binki x (King of the North x Y-W Content) FCC RHS 1966

A very perfectly formed flower with very flat overlapping sulphur lemon perianth segments of good substance and texture: the trumpet shaped crown opens lemon coloured but quickly passes to white , an attractive white halo around the base greatly enhances the beauty of the flower. An excellent plant ; very long lasting either on plant or cut. Our stocks have shown no sign of colour break.

Y-P A smooth lemon yellow perianth of good exhibition quality, corona pink slightly expanded with a lemon frill. Increases well. Of value for breeding.

KabonovaY-P3-4 (D.S. Bell) Red Conquest x QuantasiaThe lemon perianth is of excellent form. The pastel toned

pink crown is nicely rolled of almost trumpet proportions. Time should be allowed after the flower opens for the colours to develop.

Y-W A tall stemmed flower with excellent poise and good form. Very soft pale lemon perianth with flat, broad ,pointed segments, and a long crown of similar colour slowly fading to near white. Takes considerable time to reverse, but a beautiful flower in any stage. Good for garden, cutting or exhibiting.

Y-R The yellow perianth is of good colour and is very smooth, with a crown of bright orange. Occasionally the flowers will have an extra petal, but when at its best is a difficult flower to fault. Vigorous grower, tall stem. Has won Champion awards.

Y-OOR This flower was bred from two numbered seedlings. The perianth is bright clear yellow of very good quality and substance. Y-R A very striking and richly coloured flower. The large broad over lapping perianth being a golden yellow in contrast to the slightly

expanding fiery red cup which holds its colour to the base. A strong plant with a tall stem and neck that holds the flower well.

Pacific Glow 2-3 (J.A. Hunter) (Air Marshal x Swordsman) x Y-YOO Torridon

The broad smooth perianth segments are of marvellous substance, the orange crown is straight with a frilled edge. Increases well, free flowering and an excellent exhibition flower. Promises to be of great value for breeding.

Y-YOO The yellow perianth is of good substance and smoothness. The yellow based orange crown is slightly serrated. A tall stemmed variety which produces a large percentage of exhibition blooms. A strong grower.

Should be of great value for breeding. Has won many championships.

Y-R This show flower has a smooth yellow perianth of good substance. The vase shaped crown is red fully to the base. A good exhibition flower. In my opinion the best 2Y-R raised by David Bell.

Limbo 3-4 (B.S. Duncan) Altruist xUlster Bank

O-R A very round smooth and consistent Show flower with evenly orange flushed perianth segments of excellent substance. The rather flattish bowl-shaped cup of deepest red is cleanly cut, lightly fluted and ideally proportioned. A successful exhibition flower at the English shows. \$ 15

Large Cups (All White)

Arctic Bay 4 (D. Bramley) (Lucille x Empress of Ireland) x W-W Easter Moon

An exhibition flower of good quality, having ovate shaped perianth segments and no roll to the crown. Opens pure white.

Ashmore 3-4 (J.W. Blanchard) Easter Moon x (Sdg x W-W Chinese White) AM RHS 1977

A uniform white flower of classical form that is very consistent in quality. The perianth segments are broad, round and flat. Perfectly balanced by a short bowl shaped cup with a dark green base. A strong vigorous plant with a good straight stem that carries the flower right angles to the stem. Many best flower awards.

An outstandingly beautiful flower of near trumpet
proportions and of the highest quality. The lovely smooth perianth is formed

making a most elegant foil for the trumpet that is slightly expanding, sometimes the mouth is neatly rolled. The base gleams with green lights. One of the finest flowers raised by John Lea.

A big flower of great substance with very broad smooth flat perianth and beautifully proportioned flanged trumpet crown which is green in the base. Of very great value in breeding.

A lovely flower with broad petals forming a nearly round perianth of great quality and substance. The well balanced cup, rather slender is slightly and neatly serrated at the edge. The whole flower is pure white throughout. A very good show flower. A strong vigorous plant.

W-O The large pure white perianth segments are very smooth with an expanded crown of deep orange - red neatly serrated at the edge. One of the very best from the fine varieties bred from this famous cross.

A very large and beautiful flower of rather unique colouring. The broad rounded pure white perianth is of smooth waxy texture and great substance. The large cup opens pale primrose, but when the flower matures the greater part of it passes almost to white, with a nicely rolled flange of greenish lemon. Fine tall plant and a superb exhibition flower.

Broad, smooth spade shaped perianth with a citron crown. Tall stemmed, increases well. Has been premier at NDS shows.

W-Y A flower of classical beauty and clean outline. The white
rounded perianth segments are of marvellous substance as one would expect

W-R The broad shovel shaped perianth segments are pure white and of smooth texture. The attractively serrated crown is orange - red to the base. A striking exhibition flower.


