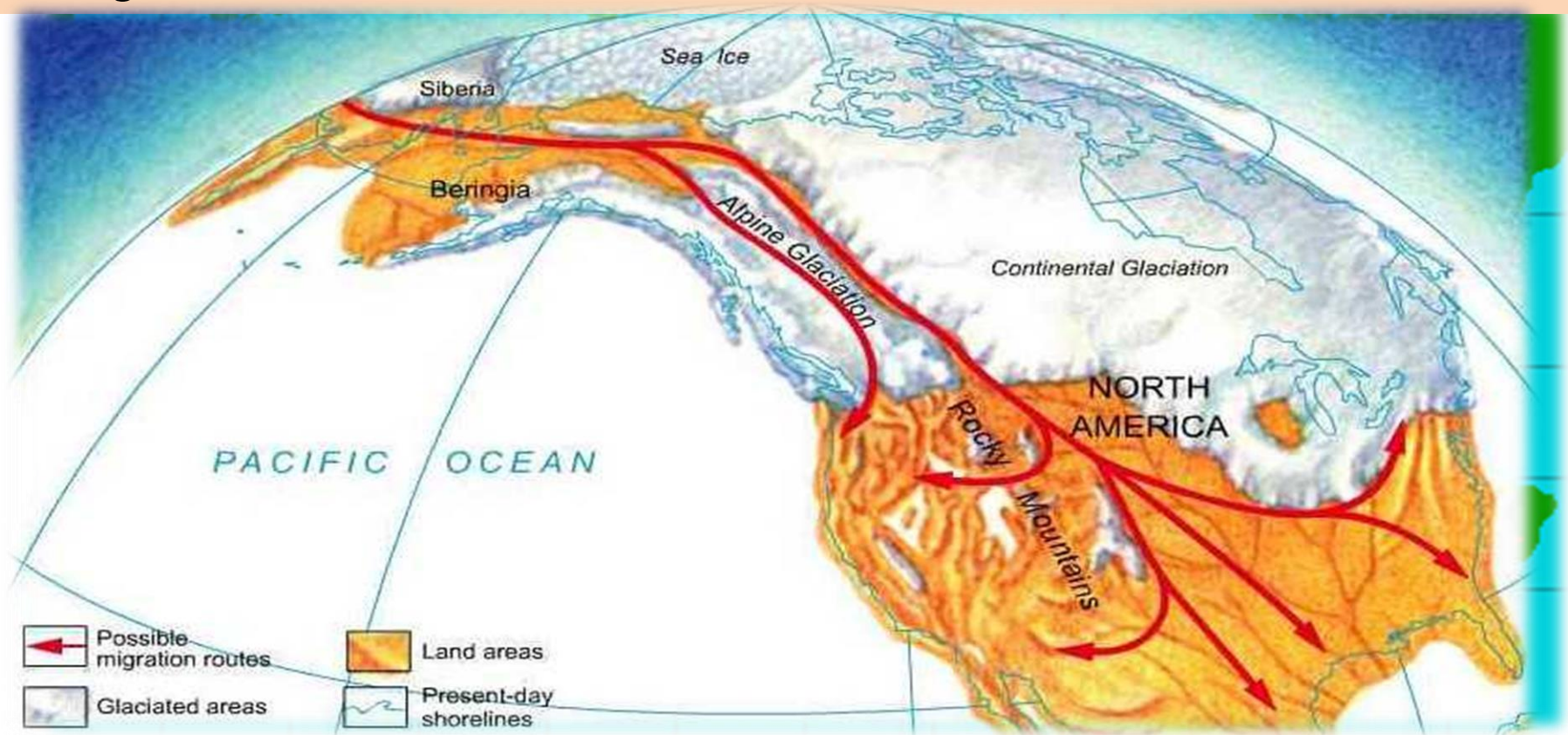

Native Americans: Introduction

Many scientists believe that **natives of North and South America came across a land or ice bridge roughly 16,000 years ago.**

This ice bridge was called Beringia. Today we call it the Bering Strait.



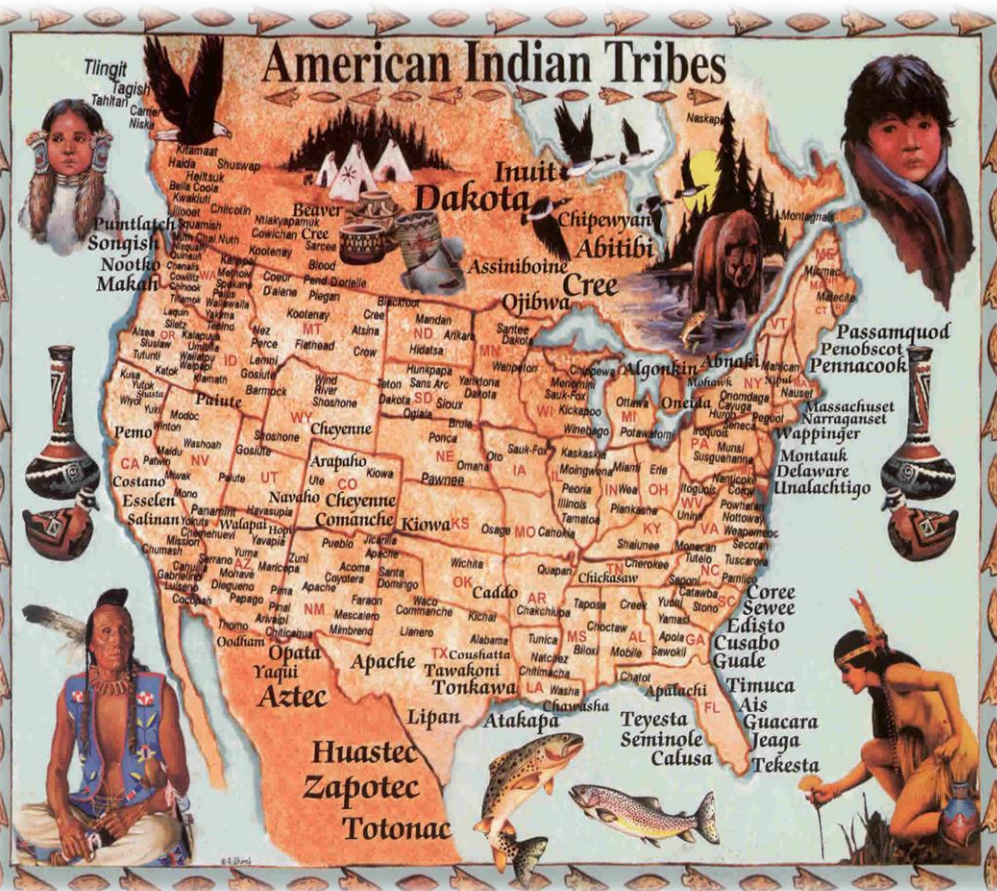
Native Americans: Introduction

Before Europeans came and started settling in the New World, and in the Americas, **there were over 600 known native tribes that lived in North America for generations.**

Some of these tribes still exist and have many descendants today, while most tribes are extinct.

Several tribes were hostile to white settlers, and many were peaceful. The following six (6) slides represent a comprehensive (alphabetical) list of the major tribes of North America prior to the white settlers.

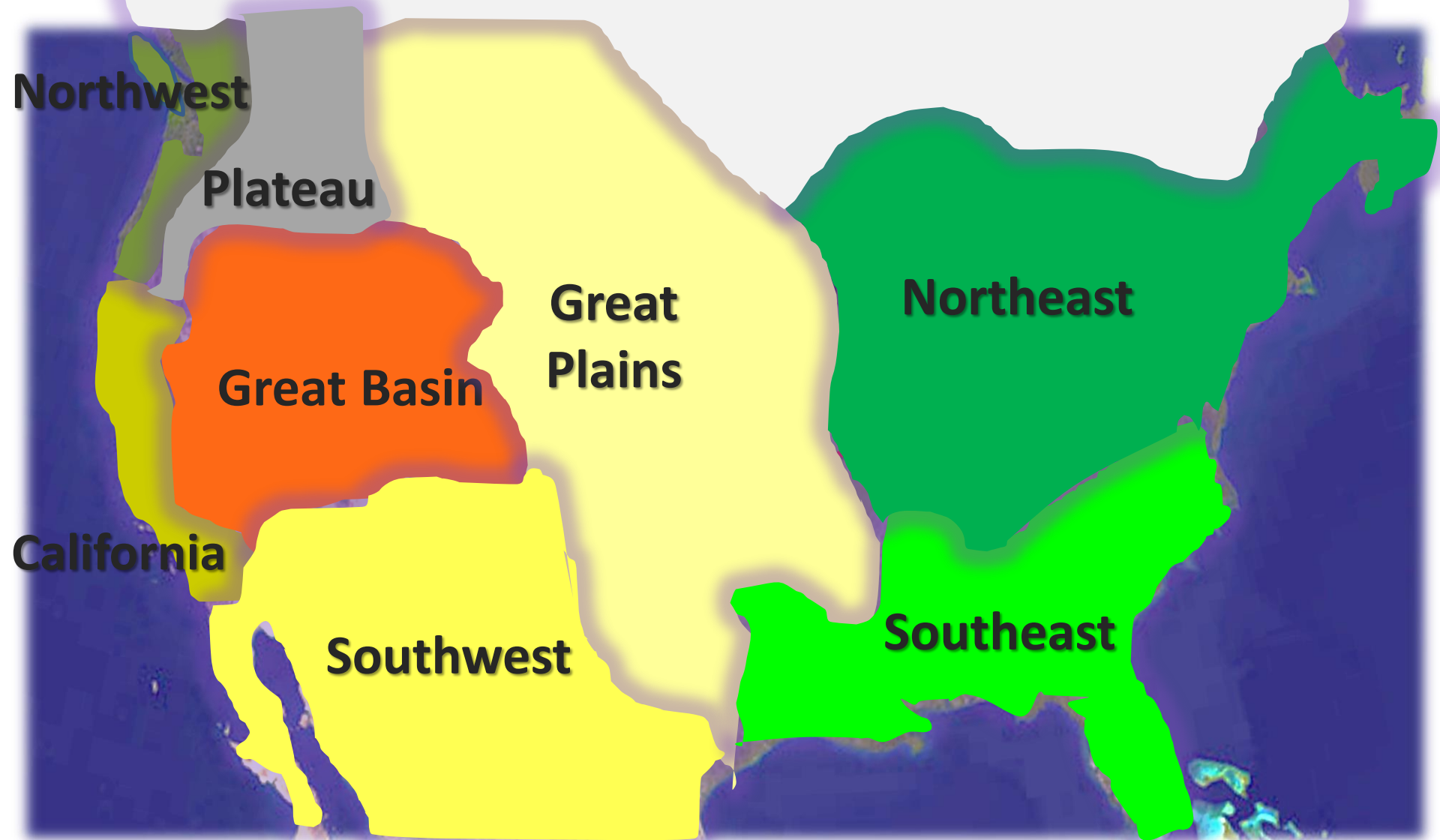
According to 2010 census data, the tribes with the largest number of descendants are the Navajo and Cherokee.

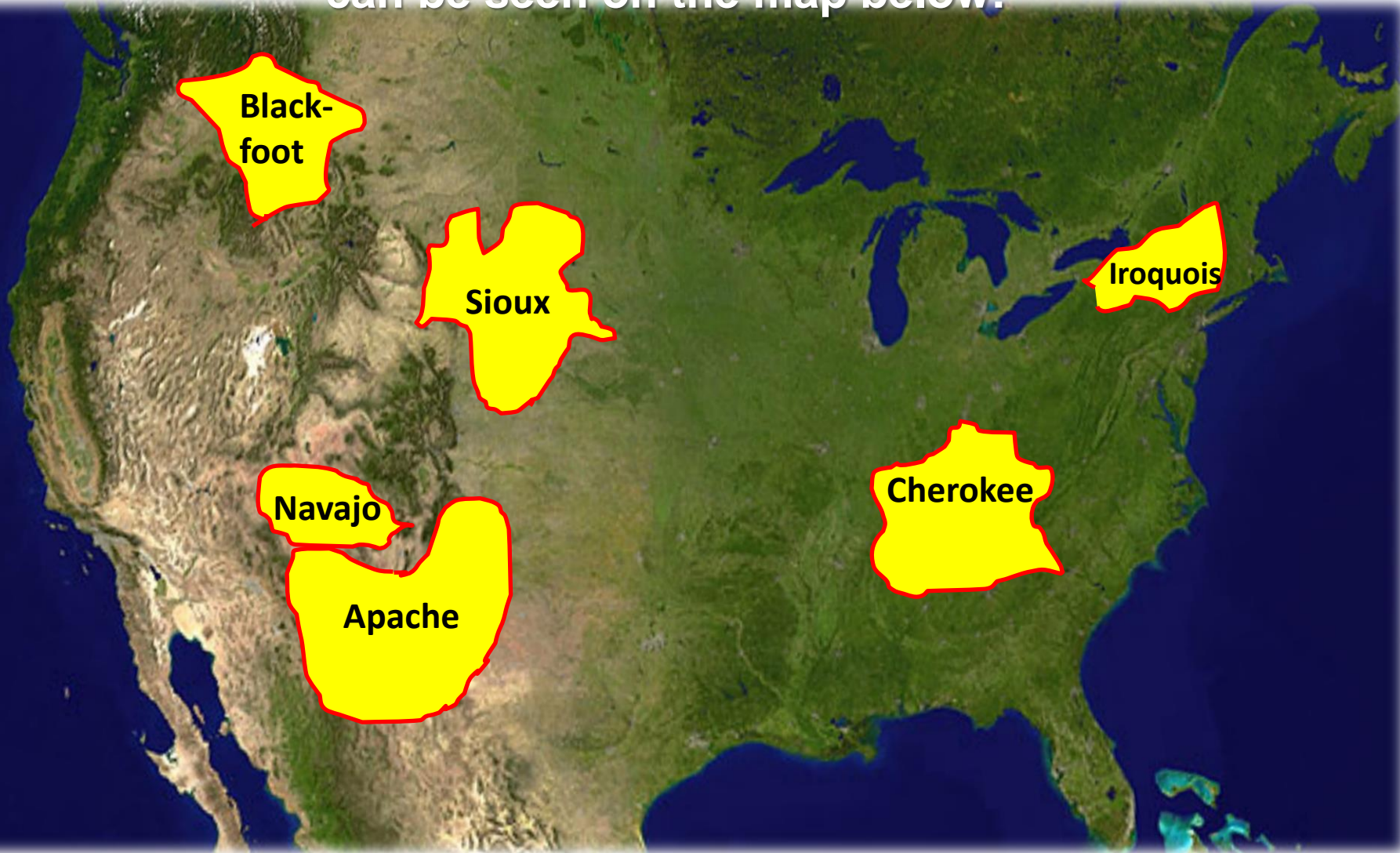

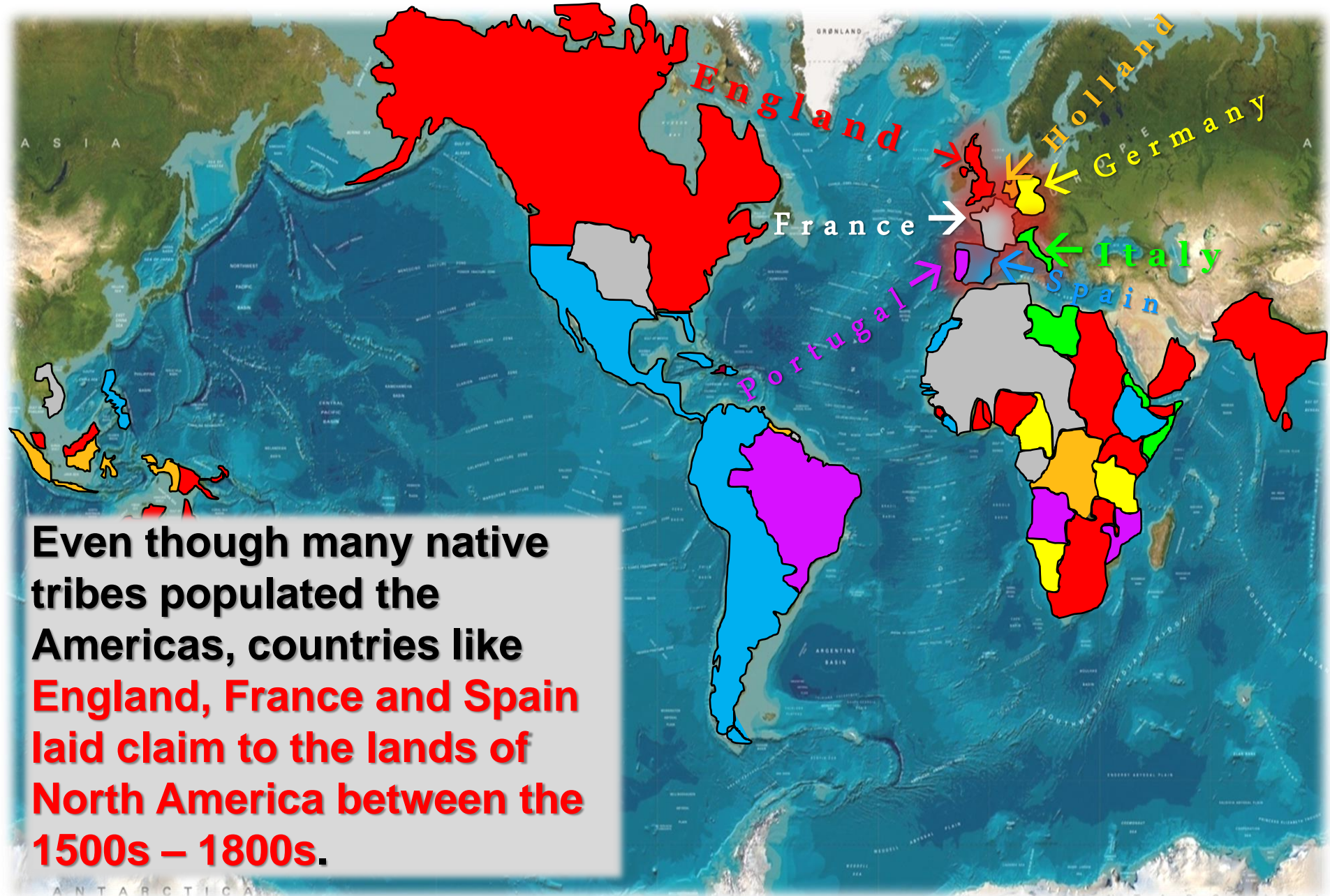

We are looking at these four regions because some of the largest tribes controlled the largest areas of land. These tribes can be seen on the map below:



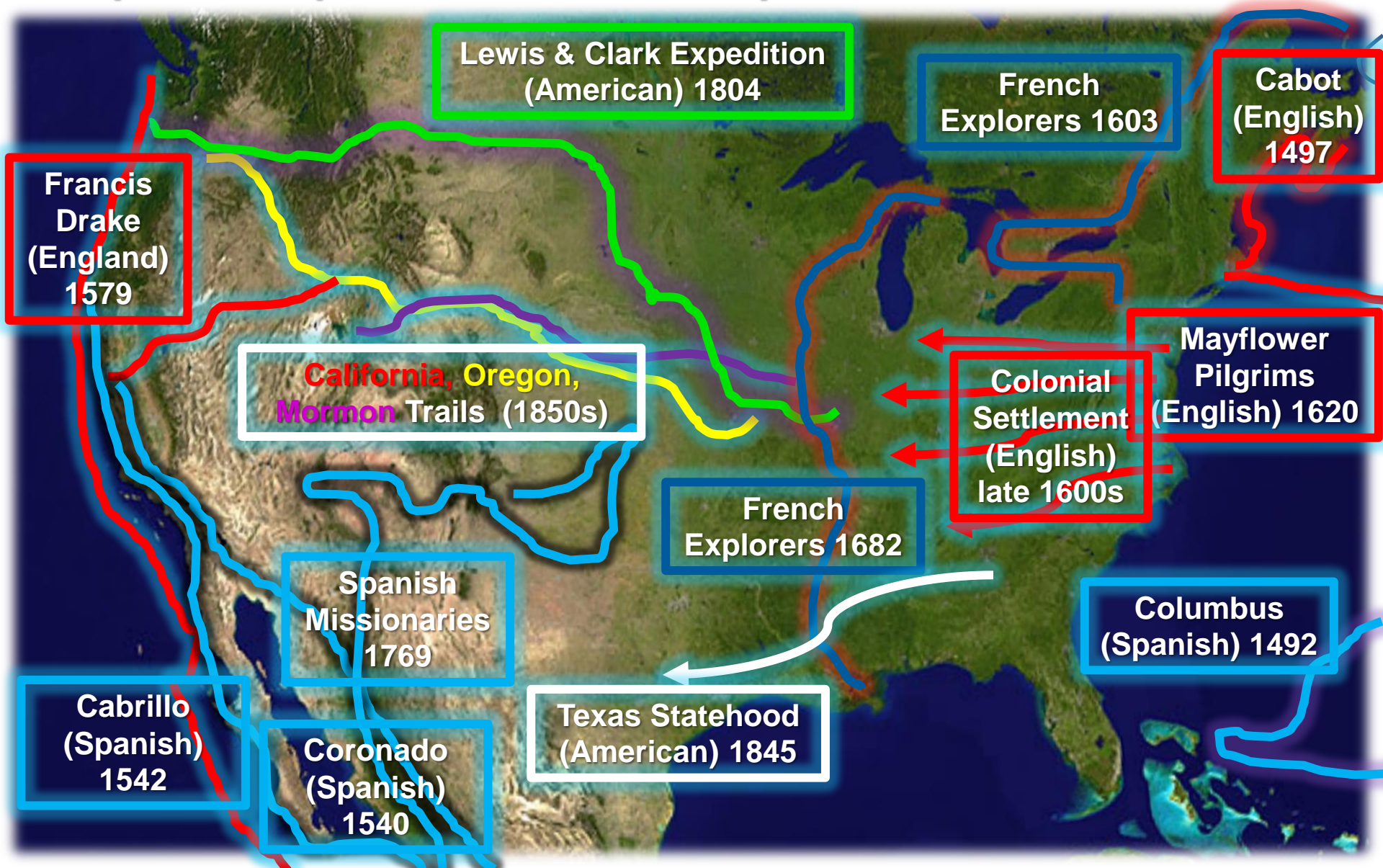


Even though many native tribes populated the Americas, countries like **England, France and Spain** laid claim to the lands of **North America between the 1500s – 1800s.**
