ABSTRACT

Based upon data collected annually by the American Association of Community and Junior Colleges (AACJC), this directory provides information on 1,141 community, junior, and technical colleges and two-year branch campuses in the United States and its territories, including 1971 and 1972 data on enrollments and personnel. Following introductory material on the scope of the directory, a historical overview is presented of the junior college movement from 1900 to 1972. Next, the directory lists colleges alphabetically by state or country and provides the following information for each: location; chief administrative head; telephone number; year classes began; type of control or affiliation; AACJC membership; state recognition or accrediting agency; types of programs (i.e., transfer and/or occupational); co-educational or single-sex status of school; October 1971 enrollments broken down for full- and part-time freshman, sophomore, and unclassified students; total October 1971 enrollment; enrollment in summer session 1972; October 1972 enrollment; full- and part-time faculty and administrators in 1972-73; tuition or all-inclusive fee; and type of academic calendar. Next, tables provide statewide enrollment and personnel summaries for all institutions and for public and independent colleges and show the distribution of two-year colleges by size. Lists of changes in institutions since the previous year, community and junior college organizations, and state administrators for two-year college education conclude the directory. (AYC)

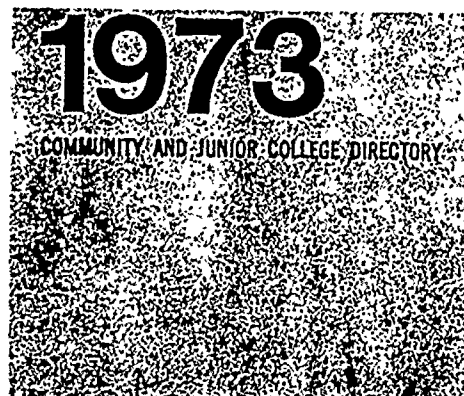

INTRODUCTION

This is the 1973 edition of the *Community and Junior College Directory*. It lists 1,141 community and junior colleges, technical institutes, and branch campuses (two-year) of four-year colleges and universities, as compared with the 1972 *Directory's* listing of 1,111 institutions. The publication once again reflects healthy growth in terms of enrollments and in numbers of institutions, though the astronomical growth of the 1960's has subsided.

The *Directory* indicates enrollments totaling 2,866,062, which represents a percentage increase of 6.9 over last year's total of 2,680,762. The increase is accounted for in part by the addition of 22 new institutions that opened in the fall of 1972, as well as the inclusion of several colleges and technical institutes not previously listed. For the first time in many years, some of the larger community colleges showed slight declines in enrollment. An analysis by the editor of this volume (p. 5) provides background on these and other changes.

In addition to the listing of colleges, the *Directory* contains names and addresses of state directors of community and junior college education and state and regional organizations of two-year colleges. Not an AACJC membership directory *per se*, the book includes names

and data for many non-profit, non-member institutions. We have tried to make it as comprehensive as possible by including non-profit educational institutions that are organized on a two-year basis, have state recognition and/or regional accreditation, and offer two-year associate degree programs.

The eighth edition of *American Junior Colleges*, published by the American Council on Education, contains more detailed information on many of the colleges listed in the *Directory*. The Association in general follows the criteria established for *American Junior Colleges* in determining the institutions to be included in the annual *Directory*. It should be noted that the *Directory* does not include information on proprietary colleges.

Staff of the publication have relied heavily on the reporting colleges for accuracy of data. We are most grateful to the institutions for their support and cooperation.

A Look at the Past

The number of two-year colleges and the number of students attending those colleges have for many years been taken as reflections of the vitality of the community and junior college "movement." For most of those years, the annual *Junior College Directory* has published these statistics for each college reporting, with summary statistics by state and for the nation.

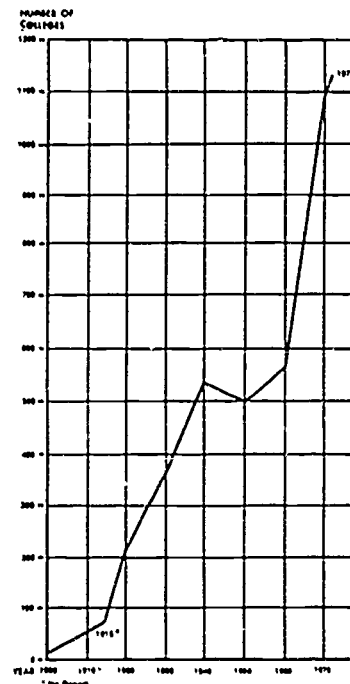
From a total of eight private colleges reporting at the beginning of the century¹ to this year's total of 1,141² public and private colleges, the numbers have increased at a fairly steady pace. Those eight colleges in 1900 reported a total enrollment of 100 students; the 1,141 colleges in 1972 report 2,866,062 students.

While the pace has been generally steady and the thrust upwards, there have been years when college and student numbers have dropped. During the years of World War II, the number of junior colleges reporting dropped from 627 in 1940 to 584 in 1943. Although the immediate post-war years brought a sudden resurgence of reporting colleges—up to 663 in 1946—the numbers slowly decreased for a few years as many two-year colleges added baccalaureate programs to their curricula and ceased to be reported as junior colleges. Since 1954, however, when 596 colleges reported, the numbers have increased each year, almost without exception, until 18 years later the number of two-year colleges has very nearly doubled. Figure 1 describes the dramatic growth in the number of colleges from 1900 to the present.

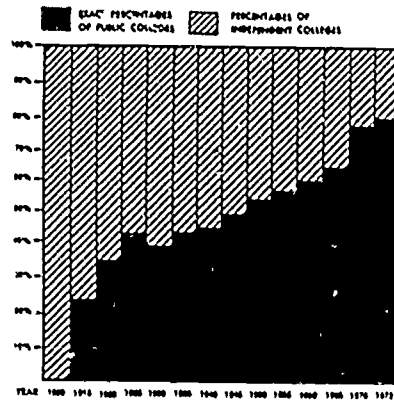

The relative proportion of public and independent colleges has changed in a generally steady pattern through the years, too. From a report of 100 percent independent in 1900 to the report of 80 percent public colleges in 1972, the ratio of public to independent appears still to be growing larger.

Figure 2 illustrates the changes in the proportion of publicly-supported and independent colleges.

Enrollment figures are somewhat more difficult to compare from year to year, unfortunately, but in general they reflect the same vitality and growth of the junior college movement. The difficulties in making comparisons of total enrollment from year to year stem from varying definitions and differing reporting and editing procedures from one year to the next.

In the early days of reporting enrollment in the nation's two-year colleges, a statistic called "total cumulative enrollment" was used for each calendar year from June 1 to May 31. This figure was supposed to be an unduplicated headcount of all students who had been enrolled through the year. For example, if (1) 100 students enrolled for the summer session, (2) 900 *different* students enrolled for the fall term, and (3) 100 *different* students enrolled for the spring, the cumulative enrollment would have been reported as 1,100.

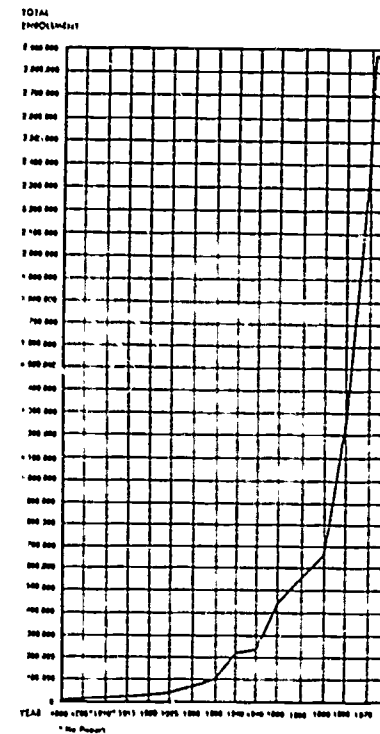
The problem of comparing enrollment data arises from the fact that in recent years statistics have been based on "opening fall enrollment." However, in the 1960 *Junior College Directory*, enrollment was reported for the previous school year (1958-59) not only as cumulative enrollment but as opening fall enrollment, 1958. For two years both figures were reported. Since the 1962 *Directory*, only opening fall enrollment figures are reported.

In an effort to render the historical data from 1900 to 1958 comparable to the more recent data, a conversion factor was formulated with which cumulative enrollment statistics could be converted to an estimate of opening fall enrollment statistics. This factor was derived

from the two-year period in which both figures were reported. Although some error in estimate surely resulted, the converted enrollment statistics are almost certainly more comparable to recent statistics than the cumulative figures reported originally.

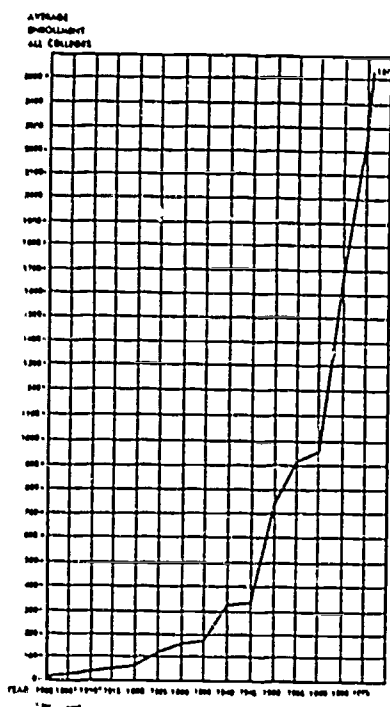
Figure 3 shows clearly the phenomenal growth of enrollment in junior colleges since 1900. All statistics used are either opening fall enrollment or estimated opening fall enrollment based on the conversion calculation described above.

As might be expected from the astonishing growth of enrollment in community and junior colleges through the years, the average enrollment has increased correspondingly. Figure 4, which indicates this increase from 1900 to 1972, traces almost the same pattern of growth as does Figure 3 (total enrollment).

In tracing the historical growth of the junior college movement as reflected in the annual statistics reported in the *Junior College Directory* each year, it is necessary to be aware of several important considerations which affect the comparability and reliability of those statistics.

One point has been noted above regarding enrollment reporting prior to the 1960 *Directory*. A second consideration is that certain editorial policy changes have affected the statistical reports from time to time. For example, in 1960 a number of university extension centers were excluded; from 1950 through 1961, "adults" and other "special" students were enrollment report categories.

Despite these considerations or caveats, the picture of growth, vitality, strength, and success of the community and junior college movement is documented by the statistics in Table 1 below.

While attention to measures of educational outcomes is (justifiably) becoming increasingly important, the validity of the mission and the successful educational achievements of the junior college movement are substantiated by the history of sustained growth in this century in the number of colleges and the number of students who have comprised the movement.

Definition of Terms

ENROLLMENT

Full-time – Students carrying at least three fourths of normal load (12 semester hours or 9 quarter hours).

Part-time – Students carrying less than three-fourths of normal full-time load (less than 12 semester hours or 9 quarter hours)

Freshmen – Students who have completed less than 28 semester hours or 42 quarter hours of college credit at time of registration.

Sophomores – Students who have completed 28 or more semester hours or 42 quarter hours of credit at time of registration.

Unclassified – Students not counted in any other category who may not have fulfilled the requirements for matriculation or who are enrolled in college-level courses for which they receive no credit. If the junior college has third-year students, these are included under unclassified.

FACULTY

Faculty – Includes all personnel who spend 50 per cent or more of their time teaching.

Administrative Staff – Includes personnel who spend 50 per cent or more of their time in administrative work.
