#### 1. Title.—PROGRAMME SPECIALIST.

Post No.-CC-060.

Category and level.-Professional category (P-4).

Organizational location.—Training and Operations Section, Division of Cultural Heritage.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the direction of the head of the section and the overall supervision of the Director of the Division, the incumbent will be responsible for projects for the preservation and presentation of the cultural heritage (monuments, sites and the development of museums) in Asia. He will be responsible, in particular, for the following—

- (a) co-ordinating and developing of national projects financed under the regular programme, the programme of participation, and those financed under extra-budgetary sources such as UNDP, WFP, Funds-in-Trust, etc.;
- (b) developing of national and regional training centres;
- (c) co-ordinating the international campaigns for Herat, Afghanistan; Sukhothai, Thailand; the "Cultural Triangle"; Sri Lanka; Kathmandu Valley, Nepal; Moenjodaro, Pakistan; Hué, Viet Nam and others as they occur;
- (d) selecting, recruiting and briefing consultants and experts and planning their work;
- (e) assisting in the selection of fellows and planning their programmes;
- (f) editing reports, documents and publications resulting from the projects for which he is responsible;
- (g) assisting in promotional activities; and
- (h) undertaking other duties as required.

### Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) University degree preferably in a field concerned with the preservation and presentation of the cultural heritage or equivalent attainment.
- (b) Previous administrative experience in a national administration or international organization is desirable.
- (c) Excellent knowledge of English or French, with a working knowledge of the other language; knowledge of other languages will be an asset.

## 2. Title.—ADVISER.

Category and level.—Professional category (P-4).

Organizational location.—Social Welfare and Family Planning—Manama, Bahrain.

Functions.—For the overall planning and implementation of the project, Unesco requires the services of an Adviser in Social Welfare and Family Planning. The Adviser will work under the overall supervision of the Population Division of Unesco, and in collaboration with the Unesco Regional Population Adviser for the Arab States. The Adviser will be the leader of the international technical co-operation team assigned to the project by Unesco, with the following specific responsibilities—

- (a) advise the Social Development Section of the Department of Social Affairs—in the context of prevailing social, culture and ethical lifestyles of different communities in the country on—
  - (i) community welfare and community development programmes with special reference to women's roles;
  - (ii) activities designed to improve family life and welfare, with special attention to women's roles; and
  - (iii) developing appropriate communication and education approaches for promoting responsible parenthood and family planning in the context of socio-economic development and in the interests of maternal and child health;
- (b) assist local social welfare departments to plan and implement training programmes for social welfare workers responsible for family life education and community welfare programmes for women. These training programmes will cover household management and home economics; child care and nutrition; attitudes to family size norms, family planning and contraceptive methods; environmental health and sanitation, etc.;
- (c) contribute to the organization of seminars and workshops for social welfare workers, community leaders, and volunteers;
- (d) plan and organize the collection of socio-demographic data required for the development of communication, education and motivational programmes;
- (e) supervise the planning, production, testing, utilization and evaluation of motivational/instructional materials needed to support the communication, education and motivational programmes;
- (f) plan and implement periodical evaluation of the training programmes in terms of the subsequent performance of the trainees (both trainers and local personnel); and
- (g) prepare six-monthly progress reports on the project for the use of national authorities, Unesco and UNFPA.

- (a) Advanced university degree in health education, social welfare or sociology.
- (b) At least six years' practical field experience as a social welfare worker and/or health educator in rural communities of developing countries (preferably in the Arab States Region), with responsibilities for promoting the active participation of women in improving the quality of family life and community development.

Duration of appointment.—One year, starting as soon as possible, with possibility of extension.

International salary and allowances (P. 4).—Net of national income tax—25 per cent payable in the currency of the duty station and the rest in a currency of the staff member's choice. Category and level.—Director level (D-1).

Organizational location.—Regional Office for Science and Technology for Africa, Nairobi, Kenya.

Duties and responsibilities (I).—Under the authority of the Assistant Director-General for Natural Sciences and their application to development, the incumbent will be responsible for organizing and directing the activities of the Regional Office for Science and Technology for Africa, and in particular form.

- (a) establishing personal contacts and maintaining working relations within the region with—
  - (i) intergovernmental, governmental and non-governmental scientific organizations, research institutions, universities, learned societies and scientists;
  - (ii) the other Unesco Regional Offices in the region and the National Commissions for Unesco;
  - (iii) the Economic Commission of the United Nations and the field offices of the other United Nations agencies and programmes and the Resident Representative of UNDP; and travelling in all member states of the region for the purpose of ensuring co-ordination at the regional level of the programming and execution of Unesco's scientific and technological activities with those bodies;
- (b) assisting in the preparation, planning and execution of the various projects of the organization in the region, whether they are financed under the regular programme or from extra-budgetary resources, such as UNDP, in accordance with instructions from headquarters;
- (c) co-operating with governments and institutions in the study of scientific and technological problems; the holding of conferences and organization of symposia, seminars, training courses and other meetings on scientific and technological problems concerning the region;
- (d) continuing to provide documentation and scientific information services on the region and the general activities of Unesco:
- (e) representing the Director-General in the region in regard to scientific and related activities, as required, and attending meetings of the United Nations and of the United Nations Specialized Agencies and Programmes and other conferences on his behalf;
- (f) reporting to headquarters on all the activities of the office and assisting in the preparation of future programmes;
- (g) exercising administrative and budgetary control of the office; and
- (h) carrying out any other duties which may be assigned to him.
- (II).—Under the authority of the Assistant Director-General for Co-operation for Development and External Relations, the incumbent will, subject to the agreement of governments concerned, undertake the duties and responsibilities of the Unescorepresentative to the Governments of Kenya, Mauritius, Somalia, Tanzania and Uganda. In this capacity, he will—
  - (a) assist, advise and provide information to the governments concerned with respect to the whole range of Unesco's programme capabilities (whether financed from the regular budget or from extra-budgetary resources), and keep headquarters informed of the needs of the countries he covers;
  - (b) participate in the organization's responsibility for the conceptualization, formulation and implementation of programmes and projects, irrespective of their funding sources;
  - (c) assist the Resident Representatives of the United Nations Development Programme in performing their overall functions concerning programme planning negotiations and advise them on all questions related to Unesco's

- activities in the countries of assignment, in particular on Unesco's contribution to the country programming process, and participate in tripartite reviews of UNDP projects;
- (d) co-operate with representatives of United Nations programmes, organizations and specialized agencies and, if requested by the governments, maintain contacts with agents of bilateral and regional forms of assistance, in order to ensure co-ordination by the governments and the Resident Representatives with Unesco activities:
- the Resident Representatives with Unesco activities;

  (e) maintain liaison, on behalf of the organization, with the technical ministries, the central co-ordinating authority for international assistance and the Unesco National Commissions, as well as with representatives of other international governmental organizations associated with Unesco's programmes;
- (f) arrange for such field activities as seminars, training courses, etc.;
- (g) undertake, upon request from headquarters, programme support activities such as interviews, establishment of dossiers for personnel or fellows, follow-up on equipment matters or reports;
- (h) provide administrative supervision over all Unesco activities in the countries of assignment, using the administrative services of all the offices of the Resident Representative to the full;
- (i) report periodically to headquarters on Unesco activities in the countries of assignment in accordance with Unesco's Secretariat procedures;
- (j) undertake, in co-operation with the United Nations information centres, public information activities and assist in the Unesco Coupon Scheme;
- (k) act, as appropriate, on instructions from Unesco's Bureau of Personnel, keeping the governments informed of such activities;
- (1) deal with problems concerning regional institutions based in the countries in so far as they affect the relations between Unesco and the governments;
- (m) act as local public information officer and, as such, distribute press releases issued by headquarters, forward to headquarters press reviews and clippings of interest to Unesco, participate in radio and television programmes, show Unesco films to selected groups and organize visits by local media representatives to Unesco projects; and
- (n) carry out such other assignments as may be requested by headquarters in accordance with the general framework outlined above.

- (b) Recognized international standing as a scientist with experience of international co-operation.

# IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.:

- Kenya Gazette contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) Legislative Supplement contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) Bill Supplement contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) Act Supplement contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-

Kenya Gazette

- D.41. (1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.
- (2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
